There is no polite way to say this: Kwhill is projected sixth percentile in the field, last in the Abby division, and the draft did not generate the kind of surplus value that might paper over a thin roster. The receiving corps is the cruelest part of the picture, with Jayden Reed at WR48 and Xavier Worthy at WR49 serving as the projected top options at their position, a pairing that ranks among the weakest in the tournament. The backfield carries real names, Lamar Jackson at QB3 and Jeremiyah Love at RB13 and Chase Brown at RB11 give the team a pulse, but the draft was heavy on chalk and reaches, including five minor reaches and two major ones, so those names were mostly paid for at full price or above it. Kwhill's path to contention would require a wave of breakout performances from players projected well outside the top 30, and hoping for that many things to break right at once is less a strategy than a wish.

Live Free or Die sits at 11th in the Abby division and the 10th percentile of the field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. Of the 19 picks on this roster, nine qualify as major reaches, meaning this manager spent the entire draft paying a tax that no amount of upside can refund. The most damning evidence comes in the middle rounds, where Patrick Mahomes was taken 2.2 rounds early at QB12 and Jordan Love followed 2.1 rounds early at QB17, a commitment of draft capital to the quarterback position that would require both players to wildly outperform their projections just to break even. Then there is Malik Nabers, the one genuine piece of good news, a WR2 talent who fell to 4.08 and arrives carrying a recovering ACL that his own coach described as "not simple." Nabers looked sharp in training camp and his value is climbing, but betting on him as a cornerstone of a roster built this carelessly is less a strategy than a prayer. The two values on this sheet do not paper over the nine reaches. They just make the damage slightly easier to itemize.

There is no angle here that flatters xrpshark, so let's not pretend otherwise. The most damning evidence sits right in the middle of the draft: Fernando Mendoza, a QB27, was yanked off the board nearly six full rounds ahead of his ADP. Six rounds. In a positionless format where the premium on any individual position is already deflated, xrpshark spent a mid-round pick on a player projected well outside the top 20 at his position, then doubled down by taking Bo Nix at QB15 roughly a round and a half early. That is not a quarterback strategy, that is a panic spiral disguised as a plan. The receiver group does not rescue any of this: Davante Adams at WR25 leads a group where the projected starters are Jordyn Tyson at WR34 and Romeo Doubs at WR53. Bijan Robinson at RB2 and James Cook at RB5 are genuinely excellent and deserve better than this, but even they cannot papier-mache over a draft that produced zero steals, seven minor reaches, and two major ones. xrpshark sits 10th in the Abby division and in the bottom quarter of the field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why.

Missing Moira is sitting ninth in the Abby division and in the bottom third of the entire field, and the draft log does not offer much hope that the manager found hidden edges to close the gap. Four major reaches litter the board, and two of them landed on running backs: Tank Bigsby at RB55 and Mike Washington Jr. at RB59, each taken three or four rounds ahead of consensus. That is a brutal return on draft capital in a positionless format where every pick is a direct trade-off against better players elsewhere. The headliner, Jalen Hurts, projects as QB9 and still anchors a legitimate stack with Dallas Goedert, but Hurts enters 2026 without A.J. Brown, who was dealt to New England in the offseason, and if that passing offense sputters, the rushing touchdowns that have defined his fantasy value for five straight top-ten seasons will follow. Brock Bowers at TE1 and Brown at WR8 are genuine assets, but this roster needed a draft that added value, and instead it gave it away.

Jorrico came to this draft with a plan and executed it with discipline, finding De'Von Achane at RB6 a full round past his ADP, landing Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33 nearly two rounds late, and snagging C.J. Stroud as the deepest value on the board. By the numbers, this is the draft of someone who waited patiently while others panicked. The cruel twist is that the patience did not actually buy anything useful. The receiver group tops out at Harrison and Rome Odunze at WR30, both projected starters on a roster that needed the late-round surplus to deliver upside it simply did not. Jorrico sits eighth in the Abby division and in the 39th percentile of the field, which is exactly the kind of standing that makes a clean draft feel like a personal insult. Coming off a 92nd-percentile scoring season in 2025, the expectation was continuation, not regression. Instead, the lesson here is that doing the process correctly and ending up below average is its own specific category of bad luck.

DrunkTree sits at the 48th percentile and seventh in the Abby division, which tells you everything about where this season lives: not in the penthouse, not in the basement, but in that uncomfortable middle floor where every point matters. The roster's ceiling runs through Jaxon Smith-Njigba (WR3) and Colston Loveland (TE3), two genuinely elite projected starters, and the Caleb Williams / Loveland stack gives DrunkTree a weekly floor that most middle-of-the-pack rosters can't manufacture. The problem is that the draft had a habit of jumping at quarterbacks before the market agreed, reaching on Williams, Kirk Cousins, and Baker Mayfield at a combined cost of over five rounds of draft capital. That's real equity left on the table. DeVonta Smith (WR14) and Ladd McConkey (WR20) keep the scoring potential honest, but Tony Pollard (RB30) anchoring the backfield as the projected weakest starter is the kind of soft spot that opponents with sharper edges will find. DrunkTree won't embarrass anyone. Whether it beats anyone worth beating is the whole question.

The Thundering Heard didn't win their draft with one blockbuster move. They won it pick by pick, round by round, consistently taking players at prices the market hadn't caught up to yet. Isaiah Likely is the clearest example: a tight end following John Harbaugh to New York, stepping into a light room with a real chance to eat, and the Heard landed him a full round after his ADP suggested he'd be gone. Mark Andrews came off the board in nearly identical fashion. Both project as starters, both cost less than they should have. Tyler Warren at TE4 anchors the whole operation, and the receiver corps is deep enough that Parker Washington, the projected weak link at WR35, is the floor rather than the ceiling. Five values against zero steals and zero major reaches of consequence tell the story: this team didn't gamble, it just kept winning small. A 27-9 record last season proves the front office knows how to convert a well-built roster into results, and there's no reason to think 2026 will look different.

jgipe69 landed at the 69th percentile and fifth in the Abby division, which sounds middling until you actually look at what they built. The foundation is legitimately strong: Josh Allen at QB1 anchored the first pick, and the receiver group stacks up with Nico Collins at WR9, Chris Olave at WR11, D.J. Moore at WR26, and Brian Thomas Jr. at WR31 all projecting as starters. The Allen-Moore stack is a genuine bonus. The draft board, though, tells a more complicated story. Five minor reaches and three major ones, including Pat Bryant taken nearly four and a half rounds early and Mason Taylor grabbed almost three rounds ahead of consensus. None of those players cracked the top of their positional ranks, but jgipe69 kept layering value on top anyway, catching Olave and Thomas as they slipped past their ADPs. The result is a team that drafted like someone who knew exactly what they wanted and refused to wait for the market to agree. Whether that looks like genius or gamble depends entirely on how Bryant and Taylor develop.

blinkwage didn't build this roster by hunting for one transformative swing. They built it by being right, repeatedly, in the middle rounds. Tucker Kraft landing at TE5 after falling more than two rounds past his ADP is the kind of acquisition that quietly tilts a season. Jameson Williams at WR21 came off the board nearly two rounds late. Sam Darnold at QB21 slid past his ADP by over two rounds. None of those names are splashy, but three players falling that far past consensus value in a single draft is a pattern, not luck. The stacks with Matthew Stafford and Puka Nacua and Jared Goff and Williams give the roster multiple ceiling-raising combinations baked in from opening day. The Stafford reach of more than three rounds early is real and worth watching, but the overall draft balance still sits at 74th percentile in the field, comfortably above the division's fourth-place projection. blinkwage didn't outwork the room on one pick. They just kept winning the small negotiations, and those add up.

ChrisCring12 didn't win the draft with one flashy move, they won it by consistently coming out ahead on pick after pick. The centerpiece is Justin Jefferson, projected WR6 and landed at 2.09 when his ADP had him going a full round earlier, a quiet windfall that set the tone for everything that followed. Drake London at WR7 slipped to the third round when the board had him priced in the second, giving this team two elite-caliber starters at a discount before most managers had finished their first cup of coffee. Pair Jefferson with Kyler Murray, and the stack adds a layer of upside that could swing weeks in ChrisCring12's favor when both are cooking. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 anchors the backfield without apology, and Harold Fannin at TE6 means the position rarely costs this team anything in a given week. Sitting second in the Abby division and at the 74th tournament percentile, ChrisCring12 built a contender the old-fashioned way: patient, precise, and almost never paying full price.

MrGedot walked into this draft like someone who had done the homework twice and still showed up early. The foundation is Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4), Rashee Rice (WR13), and Garrett Wilson (WR17), three projected starters who give this roster a ceiling most managers in the Abby division simply cannot match. Then Trey McBride (TE2) anchors the tight end group at a position where positional advantage compounds week after week. What separates a good SFB draft from a great one, though, is the discipline to collect value without chasing it, and MrGedot threaded that needle across nearly the entire board. George Kittle (TE9) fell nearly three rounds past his ADP before landing at 10.01, a gift taken cleanly. Christian Watson (WR28) and Carnell Tate (WR29) both slid over a round each and now project as starters. Against a field where most managers burn picks on ego, MrGedot built with patience, and it shows. Third in the division and 74th percentile overall is the floor, not the ceiling, for a roster this well constructed.

SuperSquatch sits atop the Abby division and in the 92nd percentile of the entire field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. This roster was built with patience and precision: five values, one outright steal, and zero reaches anywhere on the board. The headliners are legitimate, Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and CeeDee Lamb at WR5 anchoring a lineup that does not ask marginal players to carry weight. Lamb himself came at a discount, slipping to pick 2.03 despite an ADP of 1.11, and Emeka Egbuka followed at WR18 a full round and change after he should have been gone. Then there is the tight end depth, where Travis Kelce, Dalton Kincaid, and Jake Ferguson all project as starters, Kincaid arriving nearly two rounds late and Ferguson locked into a Cowboys stack alongside Dak Prescott and Lamb. Even the late-round work was clean, Pat Freiermuth landing three rounds past his ADP at pick 18.03. There is nothing sloppy here, nothing desperate, nothing to explain away.
