young1marroquin is sitting at the bottom of the Agent 47 division, projecting in the 7th percentile of the field, and the roster construction offers very little reason for optimism. The receiving corps has some genuine juice at the top, with Jaxon Smith-Njigba projecting as WR3 and Malik Nabers as WR12, but the backfield depth that was supposed to complement them came at a steep price. Kyren Williams was taken 1.3 rounds early and projects as only RB15, a reach that cost real draft capital without delivering a true difference-maker. Then there is the quarterback situation, where Jordan Love checks in at QB17 after being grabbed nearly two rounds ahead of schedule, and the drop-off to Fernando Mendoza at QB27 and J.J. McCarthy at QB37 is not a safety net so much as a trapdoor. With two major reaches, two minor reaches, and zero steals in the draft, this team looks like it has already spent every chip it had before the season even begins. There is no obvious lever left to pull.

Masterfrodo13 sits 11th in the Agent 47 division and in the 12th percentile of the field, and the draft record explains why: five major reaches, zero steals, and a roster that looks like the product of someone bidding against themselves all night. The most damning exhibit is Justin Herbert, taken a full round and a half before his ADP at QB8. Herbert is interesting with Mike McDaniel now running the offense, but the Chargers have spent two years winning games the old-fashioned way, and a ball-control team does not unlock a quarterback ceiling, it caps it. Masterfrodo13 paid a second-round premium for that ceiling. Then there is Rashid Shaheed, taken nearly four rounds early and projecting as WR57, and Zachariah Branch, grabbed four and a half rounds ahead of schedule at WR75. These are not bold contrarian bets, they are the reaches of someone who confused wanting a player with having a reason to take him. Brock Bowers at TE1 and Tyler Warren at TE4 are genuinely excellent, but they cannot carry a roster this structurally compromised into relevance.

There is no polite way to say this: the Holy City Ravens are projected 10th in the Agent 47 division and sit at just the 26th percentile of the field, and nothing in the roster construction suggests a reversal is coming. The receiving corps is genuinely impressive on paper, with Justin Jefferson (WR6), Emeka Egbuka (WR18), and Jameson Williams (WR21) forming a headlining trio that most managers would envy, and Joe Burrow (QB4) gives the whole operation a legitimate motor. But this is a team that drafted 13 chalk picks and posted zero steals, which means the Ravens are mostly getting what they paid for without the surplus value that separates contenders from also-rans. The most telling symptom is Christian Kirk (WR100), a player taken five-plus rounds early in round 18, which is exactly the kind of late-draft desperation that signals a manager who knew the well was running dry. When your most interesting roster decision is reaching hard for a WR100, the ceiling has already introduced itself.

LordMustard sits ninth in the Agent 47 division and at the 35th percentile of the field, and the roster does not offer much reason to expect a climb. The foundation looks promising on paper: James Cook at RB5, Saquon Barkley at RB8, and Derrick Henry at RB12 form a legitimate core, and Lamar Jackson at QB3 gives the lineup a genuine difference-maker under center. The problem is that the supporting cast falls off sharply, and the draft did little to compensate. LordMustard reached nearly a full round early for Jackson at pick 1.04 rather than letting him fall, which is fine if the rest of the draft holds up, but it did not. Stefon Diggs checks in at WR56, Luther Burden at WR22 is the brightest receiver on the roster, and Rhamondre Stevenson at RB31 projects as the weakest projected starter. With no steals recorded across the entire draft and two major reaches on the board, there is no hidden upside waiting to surface. What you see is what LordMustard gets, and right now, that is not enough.

Spike89 enters 2026 sitting eighth in the Agent 47 division and in the bottom half of the tournament field, and the roster makes it hard to argue with either number. The headliners are real: Josh Allen is a QB1, Ashton Jeanty projects as RB7, and A.J. Brown comes in at WR8, a genuine top-tier anchor. The problem is that the production drops off fast and the draft did almost nothing to paper over the gap. Across the entire roster Spike89 landed just one value, Quentin Johnston at WR41, and spent a full 2.5 rounds of draft capital early on Jadarian Price, who projects as only RB26 and enters the season as the team's weakest projected starter. That is a steep price for a player who grades out as fringe-startable. With 17 of 20 picks going at or near chalk, there was no creativity to manufacture an edge, and none of the supporting cast gives the impression that the projections are hiding a sleeper. Allen, Jeanty, and Brown are worth rooting for. The rest of this roster is asking you to squint.

pboourns enters 2026 sitting at 40th percentile in the field and seventh in the Agent 47 division, and the roster construction doesn't offer much reason for optimism. The foundation looks decent enough on paper, with Omarion Hampton projecting as RB9 and Trey McBride projecting as TE2, but pboourns paid a premium to get there, reaching over a round early for Hampton and leaning on McBride to carry significant weight at the top of the lineup. The problems compound from there. Caleb Williams grades out as QB6, which is genuinely valuable, but his backup situation is a liability in waiting, with Malik Willis projecting as QB24 and taken nearly three rounds before his market price warranted it. That reach on Willis is the kind of draft mistake that looks harmless until it isn't. The rest of the roster fills out with fringe contributors like Kaytron Allen and Darnell Mooney, players who round out a bench rather than win weeks. There is no obvious lever left to pull here, just a team that graded out near the bottom and is mostly hoping its top names stay healthy enough to matter.

Last year kevincole finished in the bottom 6 percent of the field in scoring, a miserable number that practically demands a response, and the 2026 roster looks like exactly that. The engine of the rebound is a receiver corps that kevincole essentially assembled on discount, picking up Garrett Wilson (WR17), Ladd McConkey (WR20), and D.J. Moore (WR26) each a full round or more after their ADPs suggested they'd be gone, giving this team legitimate starting-caliber production at a cost that left room to build elsewhere. Pair that receiver depth with Jonathan Taylor (RB4) anchoring the backfield and Jeremiyah Love (RB13) right behind him, and the foundation looks nothing like the roster that scraped together 3,702 points in 2025. The one blemish on the draft sheet is James Conner (RB56), reached four rounds early, but Conner's projected rank makes him a fringe contributor rather than a load-bearing piece. Sitting at the 57th percentile, kevincole isn't a contender yet, but this team is pointing in a decisively different direction than it was twelve months ago.

UrKillingMeSmalls13 lands at 57th percentile in the field, which undersells what they actually built. The foundation is legitimate: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 give this roster two players who can carry a week by themselves, and both arrived at reasonable cost. St. Brown, in particular, was a gift, sliding nearly a full round past his ADP before this team scooped him up. The draft board, though, tells a messier story. Six minor reaches and two major ones dot the card, and Jake Ferguson at TE12 stands out most, taken nearly four rounds before the market said he was due. That is a big swing on a tight end. The thing is, Ferguson projects as a starter, Wilson is stashed in the late rounds where nothing is certain anyway, and the rest of the roster is clean enough that those bets look less reckless in hindsight than they did in the moment. Conviction, luck, or some stubborn mix of both, UrKillingMeSmalls13 drafted their way into a real team.

shallam1313 landed in the 68th percentile of the field and that number undersells what this roster actually looks like when you dig into the draft sheet. The discipline is the story here: seven values or better across the board, zero major reaches, and a quiet efficiency that shows up most clearly in the tight end group, where Harold Fannin at TE6 was taken a round and a half after his ADP and Oronde Gadsden at TE16 slipped more than a round to boot. Those are not accidents, those are a manager who stayed patient while others panicked. Up front, Bijan Robinson at RB2 anchors everything, George Pickens at WR10 and Tee Higgins at WR19 give this roster genuine upside at receiver, and Colston Loveland at TE3 rounds out a starting group that is genuinely hard to attack. The floor here is high, the draft was clean, and the 2025 record of 16 wins and 57th-percentile scoring already suggests a team trending in the right direction. Agent 47 should take notice.

seigo24 didn't build this roster with one big swing. They built it by quietly winning pick after pick, and the cumulative effect lands them at 82nd percentile in the field and third in the Agent 47 division. The foundation is unimpeachable: Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Jayden Daniels at QB5 give this team a ceiling most managers will spend all season chasing. The Daniels-Terry McLaurin stack adds another layer, pairing a projected QB5 with a WR24 who catches everything he throws. What separates seigo24 from rosters with similar headliners is the draft discipline underneath those names. Chase Brown at RB11 fell nearly a full round past his ADP. Zay Flowers at WR16 fell over a round. Jordan Addison came in nearly two rounds late. None of these were lottery tickets, just competent players taken at prices the board handed over. George Kittle's Achilles recovery adds some genuine uncertainty to the TE room, but Sam LaPorta sits at TE8 and projects as a full-time starter either way. This is a roster that wins games quietly, which is often the most dangerous kind.

swampytyme didn't force anything in this draft, and the ledger reflects it. Landing Puka Nacua at WR1 a full half-round after his ADP and CeeDee Lamb at WR5 half a round late would be a fine day's work on their own, but pair those with a Prescott-Lamb stack and suddenly the floor of this roster is higher than most managers' ceilings. Brian Thomas Jr. at WR31 adds a legitimate upside dart: the 2025 regression tied to injuries and some shakiness with Trevor Lawrence is the kind of context that drags ADP down and creates exactly the discount swampytyme exploited. The draft wasn't flawless, two major reaches at receiver depth suggest some late-round conviction that wasn't always earned, but when your first two picks are value and your week-to-week lineup writes itself from WR1 on down, you've already won the draft conversation. Sitting second in the Agent 47 division and in the 86th percentile of the field, this is a team built to compete deep into the bracket without needing a single thing to go perfectly.

NyrdByrd sits atop the Agent 47 division and in the 89th percentile of the field, and the draft tells you exactly why: this roster was built through consistent execution, not a single lottery ticket. The foundation is a receiver group that would make any manager envious, headlined by Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Drake London at WR7, both of whom landed as projected starters. London arrived half a round late, Rashee Rice came in nearly a full round after his ADP, and Dalton Kincaid slid past his number by more than a round at TE11. Four values across the draft is not luck, it is a manager who stayed patient and let the board do the work. The one blemish is Keon Coleman, reached three full rounds early at WR91, but that kind of late-round gamble barely registers when the top of the lineup is this settled. NyrdByrd did not force anything. The board bent toward them, and they were ready when it did.
