While the team's youth might offer a glimmer of optimism for the distant future, their current running back situation reads like a comedy of errors, with Kaleb Johnson, David Montgomery, and Brian Robinson valiantly battling it out to see who can grasp the

mantle of most average. Meanwhile, tight ends are predictably scarce, leaving Savion Williams, an undrafted enigma, in a starting role that defies logic. Despite a late-round steal with Justin Herbert, it's hard to ignore the eyebrow-raising reaches for players like David Montgomery and the unknown wonder Phil Mafah. Indeed, FantasysPhinest enters the fray as a team primed to redefine expectations—by consistently failing to meet them.

As the 2025 fantasy football season looms, team jordanvanek faces a formidable challenge, aiming to replicate their dominant performance from 2024 where they soared to an impressive 82nd percentile finish. Now ranked eighth in their division and sitting in the 25th percentile overall, jordanvanek must navigate a more competitive landscape. Their strength undoubtedly lies in their quarterback duo, with Jayden Daniels positioned as a top-tier QB3 and Trevor Lawrence offering surprising value as QB19, acquired much later than his average draft position. Wide receiver depth, however, remains a concern with Travis Hunter leading the group at WR12, followed by Marvin Harrison Jr., Calvin Ridley, and Jordan Addison, all positioned to contribute but facing their own challenges. Tight end Dalton Kincaid, projected as a starter, poses potential risk with his TE13

ranking, crucial to the team's prospects this year. Strategic draft choices saw the team secure Lawrence at great value while reaching for players like D'Andre Swift and Travis Hunter, perhaps a gamble that could pay dividends. However, reaching significantly for Xavier Restrepo and Malik Washington might impact their overall flexibility. With a small stack bonus from the Lawrence-Hunter combination, jordanvanek must capitalize on its strengths to improve upon last year's promising high.
