There is a version of WholePorkChops that looks encouraging on the surface: Bijan Robinson checking in at RB2, Kenneth Walker III at RB10, and a Caleb Williams / Luther Burden stack that could pay dividends on big passing days. The problem is that the encouraging version does not survive contact with the rest of the roster. Williams was taken a full round early at a position where the drop-off to Kyler Murray at QB19 is steep, and then Murray himself was reached for again in the seventh. The draft produced zero steals and zero values across nineteen picks, and the two major reaches, Williams and Kyle Monangai at RB33, both cost capital that could have shored up the depth around those anchors. Burden sits at WR22 and is essentially carrying the receiving corps alone, with Deebo Samuel at WR70 as the next option. Sitting dead last in the Duke Nuke Em: Zero Hour division and in just the 13th percentile of the field, WholePorkChops has already used its picks and has no obvious lever left to pull.

Touchdownosaurus finished 73rd percentile in scoring last year and still lands at 11th in the Duke Nuke Em: Zero Hour division heading into 2026, which tells you something uncomfortable about the ceiling here. The roster is built around a genuinely impressive backfield, with Christian McCaffrey, Ashton Jeanty, Chase Brown, Jeremiyah Love, Javonte Williams, and Travis Etienne all projecting as starters, but in a positionless format that depth only carries you so far when the quarterback situation reads like a support group. Bryce Young at QB26, Fernando Mendoza at QB27, and Deshaun Watson at QB34 are not players you build around, they are players you apologize for. The draft did nothing to inspire confidence either, with 17 chalk picks and no steals or values found anywhere on the board. Touchdownosaurus is sitting at the 20th tournament percentile before a snap is played, and the levers that

usually fix a roster like this, a late-round steal, a draft-day bargain, a hidden gem at quarterback, were never pulled. This one may require patience that the standings will not reward.

Team 11B sits 10th in the Duke Nuke Em: Zero Hour division and in the 27th percentile of the field, and the roster grades out in a way that makes it genuinely hard to find a path forward. The headliner is Joe Burrow, a QB4 talent who, when healthy, is as good as it gets at the position, but "when healthy" is doing an enormous amount of work in that sentence. His last two seasons have each been derailed by significant injuries, and a manager banking on a full Burrow campaign is essentially betting against a pattern that keeps repeating itself. Jonathan Taylor at RB4 is real, and Zay Flowers at WR16 was a modest draft-day value, but the starter pool thins out quickly after those two names. Jalen Coker projects as the weakest starter on the roster, and the draft yielded zero steals against 13 chalk picks, which means there is no hidden gem to unearth and no late-round lottery ticket quietly lurking on the bench. This roster is more or less what it looks like, and what it looks like is a team hoping for fortune it has not yet earned.

Triple Threat sits ninth in the Duke Nuke Em: Zero Hour division and checks in at just the 29th percentile of the field, and the draft record does not offer much cause for optimism. Fifteen chalk picks and a major reach on Courtland Sutton, taken two full rounds before his ADP, suggest a team built without margin for error. The receiver group is legitimately strong, with Jaxon Smith-Njigba, George Pickens, Tee Higgins, Davante Adams, and DK Metcalf all projecting as starters, but in a positionless format, roster quality flows from top to bottom, and when the top of this roster runs out, it runs out fast. Drake Maye projects as a QB2, which is a genuine asset, but behind Maye the quarterback depth falls off a cliff, and the backfield offers Rhamondre Stevenson at RB31 as its best option. There is no obvious lever left to pull here, no hidden upside waiting to emerge. This roster looks like a team that peaked during the draft and is already hoping for injuries elsewhere.

Desert VooDoo enters 2026 sitting eighth in the Duke Nuke Em: Zero Hour division and in just the 38th tournament percentile, which is a polite way of saying the roster is quietly losing the argument before the season even starts. The foundation is genuinely there: Lamar Jackson projects as a QB3, Saquon Barkley grades out as an RB8 despite being a mild draft-day gift, and Amon-Ra St. Brown is a legitimate WR4. That trio is real. The problem is the falloff is steep and the draft did nothing to soften it, producing zero steals and a cluster of minor reaches that mostly reinforced the mediocre middle of the roster. Trevor Lawrence was taken nearly a round early to come in as a QB10, Daniel Jones was grabbed a round and a half ahead of schedule to slot in at QB25, and Bucky Irving cost a round of premium to land at RB21. Paying early for middling projections is not a strategy, it is a budget, and Desert VooDoo has spent most of theirs propping up a ceiling that still is not very high.

The ceiling here is real but the floor is genuinely concerning, and in the Duke Nuke Em: Zero Hour division, bpsae is sitting at seventh with a 39th-percentile projection that leaves almost no margin for error. The draft tells a lot of the story. Patrick Mahomes cost a third-round pick on a QB12 projection, a 2.2-round reach that would sting less if the rest of the board had come together cleanly, but Emmett Johnson arriving nearly four rounds early as an RB54 is the kind of swing that rarely pays off and frequently haunts a roster. Brock Bowers at TE1 is a genuine pillar, and Drake London and Rashee Rice give this team real upside in the right week, but those bright spots have to carry a lot of weight when Jaylen Warren is the projected weakest starter and Travis Kelce, however welcome his return is, is currently projecting as TE10 rather than the force he once was. bpsae is not without weapons, but the draft gave this team very little rope, and the standings suggest it is already running short.

DEEEEEEEEEZNUTZ sits at the tournament's exact midpoint, 50th percentile, and the roster reads the same way: impressive in places, soft in others, and ultimately decided by whoever blinks first in a close week. Josh Allen at QB1 and a starting pair of Sam LaPorta (TE8) and George Kittle (TE9) give this team a genuine ceiling, but Kittle came at a cost, taken 2.5 rounds ahead of his ADP, which means the manager paid full price and then some for that luxury. The receiver group is where the margin narrows uncomfortably, with projected starters Rome Odunze (WR30), Chris Godwin (WR38), and Michael Pittman (WR44) forming a band of players who can beat you in the right matchup and disappear in the wrong one. Matthew Stafford adds intrigue as a QB14 fallback, a 37-year-old coming off an MVP season with the Rams now grooming his replacement, so the urgency of now is real. This team does not lose the room outright. It just needs the margins to cooperate.

The Santa Fe Grays didn't build this roster on a single marquee moment, they just kept winning small battles until the margin added up. The draft tells the story: five value picks and one outright steal, against only two minor reaches and nothing catastrophic. Jake Ferguson, projected TE12, was the headliner of that patience, slipping more than two full rounds past his ADP before the Grays quietly took him at 10.05. Pair him with Trey McBride at TE2, and that position alone is doing serious heavy lifting. The quarterback situation is equally tidy: Jayden Daniels, QB5, was taken a touch early, but his stack with projected starter Terry McLaurin gives the Grays a built-in correlation bonus that could pop on a big Washington afternoon. Garrett Wilson at WR17 fell more than a round past his ADP and landed as a starter. None of these moves made anybody gasp at the draft table, but they stacked up quietly, and sitting 55th percentile in the field, the Grays have the kind of floor that tends to be worth more than it looks in October.

Los Chingones built something genuinely worth watching in the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl, and the draft log makes it more interesting, not less. The foundation is undeniable: Ja'Marr Chase (WR2) and A.J. Brown (WR8) give this team a top-end that most managers would trade half their roster to acquire. But where it gets fun is the conviction play at pick 3.01, where the manager grabbed Emeka Egbuka (WR18) a full round and a half before the market said he was available. That is not a misclick. That is a manager who saw something, paid the toll, and came out with a projected starter anyway. The same stubborn certainty showed up later with Dylan Sampson (RB53), taken 4.2 rounds ahead of consensus. Both reaches landed players who are projected contributors, which means either the scouting was sharp or the luck was extraordinary, and the honest answer is probably some of both. Sitting at 56th percentile in the field and fourth in the division, this roster is positioned to do real damage if the conviction reads hold.

After finishing 2025 at the 1st percentile in scoring, King Baby has arrived in 2026 looking less like a rebuilding project and more like a reckoning. The foundation of this comeback is a backfield that would make most managers weep: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1, Omarion Hampton at RB9, Derrick Henry at RB12, and Josh Jacobs at RB16 form a projected starting corps of uncommon depth and force. Colston Loveland slots in at TE3 and anchors a group that was drafted with genuine patience, Gibbs landing as a value at 1.07 against an ADP of 1.03. The receiver corps is the one soft spot the projections expose, with Marvin Harrison Jr. sitting at WR33 and Matthew Golden at WR52 as the clearest names on that side, though Harrison's presence at least gives the team a ceiling worth believing in. King Baby sits third in the division and in the 59th percentile of the field, which after last year's catastrophe reads less like a middling result and more like a full-throated resurrection.

Traposaurus didn't build this roster on one flashy swing. They built it by consistently coming out ahead, and the results speak for themselves: a second-place division standing and the 70th percentile of the overall field. The foundation starts with a receiving corps that is genuinely elite. CeeDee Lamb at WR5 and Justin Jefferson at WR6 are both projected starters, and getting Lamb at pick 2.03 when his ADP sat at 1.11 was the kind of quiet win that separates disciplined drafters from the rest. Malik Nabers at WR12 gives the team a Dart stack that adds a bonus layer of upside, and the projected starters keep coming down the depth chart with Jameson Williams at WR21 and D.J. Moore at WR26. Tucker Kraft at TE5 is the steal of the draft, sliding to 7.10 despite an ADP of 4.12, and he figures to be one of the more valuable players at his position in this tournament. This roster was not built for one spectacular night. It was built to be good every single week.

GridironGangstas sit first in the Duke Nuke Em: Zero Hour division and in the 98th percentile of the entire field, and the draft record explains exactly why: eight values, zero steals, which means this roster was built not on lightning-strike luck but on a manager who simply kept winning the small battles. Puka Nacua at WR1, Nico Collins at WR9, and Tyler Warren at TE4 form a starting core that would be the envy of most rooms, and the manager found Harold Fannin at TE6 a full round and a half after the market expected him to go. The WR group is where the quiet competence really shows: DeVonta Smith at WR14 slipped nearly a full round past his ADP, and Mike Evans, now reunited with a 49ers offense after his departure from Tampa Bay, projects as a WR27 who comes with the added intrigue of a fresh situation. The floor here is Quentin Johnston at WR41, and even that is a player the manager grabbed a round late. There are no marquee heists on this sheet, just a draft that kept coming out ahead, pick after pick after pick.
