As the 2025 fantasy football season kicks off, Bryback finds itself clinging to the bottom of the Arizona Wildcats division, sitting at a dismal 12th place. Despite boasting a solid quarterback lineup with Jalen Hurts and Bo Nix leading the charge, the team's overall performance is undermined by glaring weaknesses in the running back department, where Isiah Pacheco and Najee Harris struggle to find their footing against tougher competition. While the tight end group offers some glimmers of hope, especially with Sam LaPorta's reliable hands, the reliance on Isaiah Likely as a starter signals potential trouble spots. Although CeeDee Lamb's performance could occasionally shine at wide receiver, the inconsistency from the supporting cast of Mike Evans and Zay Flowers makes it difficult for Bryback to mount any significant challenge in the standings. The questionable draft decisions, including reaching too early for Bo Nix and Marvin Mims, have left the team without much-needed

depth and flexibility. As they enter the tournament ranked in the 11th percentile, Bryback faces an uphill battle, likely finding themselves outmatched and outmaneuvered by more balanced and strategically sound opponents.



questionable decisions, the season's prospects seem dim for zatanaz, potentially leading to more disappointments than triumphs.


