Don't forget the quarter sits third in the Arthur Morgan division and in the third percentile of the entire field, which is not a coincidence so much as a confession. The draft tells the story plainly: zero steals, zero values, and seven major reaches against a player pool that never rewarded the aggression. Baker Mayfield and Bryce Young are the projected starters at quarterback, QB18 and QB26 respectively, and Young as the projected weakest starter on the roster is the kind of detail that follows a team around like a bad smell. The receiver group is long, Nico Collins at WR9 and Zay Flowers at WR16 giving it a real top end, but Flowers was taken a full round and a third before his ADP, and the pattern holds from there through Alec Pierce, Khalil Shakir, and Germie Bernard, each pulled earlier than the market supported by margins that compound into something approaching a draft-wide strategy of paying full price for everything and premium price for most of it. Bijan Robinson at RB2 is legitimately good. He is also, at this point, basically a hostage.

Last year's Sunday Morning Outlaws finished in the 90th percentile, and this year's version is projected 17th percentile, sitting 11th in the Arthur Morgan division. That is not a slump. That is a cliff. The most painful part is that the core has not obviously collapsed, it has just quietly thinned in the ways that matter most. Drake Maye is a legitimate QB2 and the Patrick Mahomes insurance policy costs nothing in regret, but below that top line the roster relies on Malik Nabers at WR12, Tucker Kraft at TE5, and a collection of middling contributors like Jayden Reed, projected WR48 and the weakest projected starter on the board. Nabers is a real piece, and Maye coming off an MVP-runner-up season with A.J. Brown now in the fold gives this team a genuine upside thread to pull. But upside threads are what teams in the bottom fifth of the field tell themselves about while winners are cashing. Sunday Morning Outlaws wore the crown in 2025. In 2026, they are being asked to remember what it felt like.

There is no polite way to say this: Dutch is a Dick is in trouble. Sitting 10th in the Arthur Morgan division and in just the 23rd percentile of the field, the roster grades out near the bottom of the tournament, and the draft offered almost no lifeline. Of 20 picks, not a single one qualified as a steal, two were major reaches, and the most notable bargain was Mark Andrews sliding a round past his ADP. That is a thin margin for error when your projected floor is already this low. The skeleton of a good team is here, sure, Lamar Jackson and CeeDee Lamb are legitimate difference-makers, and the Jackson/Andrews stack gives the lineup a real ceiling play. But last season's 6-30 record and a 5th-percentile scoring finish made clear that ceiling moments are rare and floors collapse fast. Lamb and Jackson can only carry so much weight, and with Hunter Henry grading out as the weakest projected starter at TE18, there is no obvious lever left to pull. This season feels less like a rebuild and more like a sentence.

The Aberdeen Pig Farmers sit ninth in the Arthur Morgan division and in the bottom third of the tournament field, and the roster tells you exactly why. The weapons are genuinely excellent: Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, Trey McBride at TE2, Garrett Wilson at WR17, and Luther Burden at WR22 give this team a ceiling that most managers would envy. But ceilings only matter if the floor doesn't collapse first, and the floor here is the quarterback situation, where Kyler Murray projects as a QB19, C.J. Stroud as a QB22, and Fernando Mendoza as a QB27. That is not a competition for a starting job so much as a race to mediocrity. The draft didn't surface any steals to course-correct, just 13 chalk selections and a handful of reaches, including Demond Claiborne taken nearly three rounds ahead of his ADP. The Pig Farmers have the skill-position talent to win any given week, but with that kind of signal-caller drag pulling against them, ninth place looks less like a ceiling and more like an honest assessment.

The White Arabians did almost everything right on draft day and still landed at 39th percentile, which is the kind of outcome that makes you question whether draft grade analysis means anything at all. Fourteen of their picks came at or after ADP, including genuine value on Dak Prescott at QB7 and Jared Goff at QB16, both of whom fell well past their market prices. Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and De'Von Achane at RB6 form a legitimate top-end core. So where does it fall apart? The middle of the roster never materialized into anything threatening. Tetairoa McMillan projects as WR15 and Kyle Pitts as TE7, which are fine, but fine does not carry a team sitting eighth in the Arthur Morgan division. The projected weakest starter is Jadarian Price at RB26, and while positional rank is not a death sentence in a positionless format, it signals that the floor drops off quickly once the top names are accounted for. They drafted smart and built a roster that looks complete on a spreadsheet and underwhelms everywhere else.

DavisMattek is the kind of team that wins the weeks it should and drops the ones it shouldn't, finishing somewhere in the middle of the standings and wondering exactly where things went sideways. The foundation is legitimately strong: Ja'Marr Chase at WR2, George Pickens at WR10, and Rashee Rice at WR13 form a projected starting group that most managers in this field would take without blinking, and Caleb Williams at QB6 arriving three rounds after his ADP is the sort of quiet draft-day win that doesn't show up on highlight reels but absolutely shows up in weekly scores. The problem is that the margins cut both ways. Williams stacking with Rome Odunze adds a ceiling-boosting correlation, but Kaytron Allen was taken three rounds ahead of his ADP to land at RB61, and Tyreek Hill was reached nearly three rounds early to project at WR77. Those late-round gambles surrendered draft capital that could have shored up the bottom of a lineup where Xavier Worthy, the projected weakest starter, has to hold down a spot. Last season's 8th-percentile finish isn't a sentence, but it's context worth carrying into 2026.

Last year You're Alright Girl finished in the 2nd percentile in scoring, a historically bad result that makes this year's roster feel like a different franchise entirely. The engine of the rebound is straightforward: Joe Burrow at QB4 paired with Tee Higgins at WR19 is one of the cleaner stacks in the field, a real-life connection that translates directly to correlated upside. Add Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Tyler Warren at TE4, and the top of this lineup is genuinely formidable. The draft was patient rather than flashy, heavy on chalk but with five values sprinkled in, including Trevor Lawrence falling a round and a half to 6.05. Lawrence at QB10 as a secondary option gives this team genuine insurance at the position. The floor here is dramatically higher than a year ago, which is not a high bar to clear, but clearing it comfortably is exactly what You're Alright Girl projects to do. A 63rd-percentile finish would feel like a championship after 2025.

There was no single moment in danwithers' draft that made the room go quiet, and that's kind of the point. This is a roster built on accumulation, where the good decisions kept coming without anyone noticing. The receiver group is where it shows most clearly: Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and Drake London at WR7 give this team a genuine top-end ceiling, with Emeka Egbuka at WR18 waiting as a capable third option in the mix. The draft itself reflects the same discipline, 15 chalk picks with only three minor reaches and nothing catastrophic, which means danwithers was rarely forced to overpay for production. The one swing that didn't fully connect was David Njoku landing at TE29 despite being taken well ahead of where the market had him, but that's a depth quibble on a team sitting at 63rd percentile in a field where most managers are hoping for one good week to run. After a 40th-percentile scoring season in 2025, this roster looks like a step forward, not a leap, but in the Scott Fish Bowl, a step forward is often enough to matter.

NFLeeds didn't win the draft in one flashy moment. They won it across twenty rounds of patient, consistent execution. The foundation is hard to argue with: Justin Jefferson at WR6, Brock Bowers at TE1, and Jalen Hurts at QB9 give this roster a ceiling most managers in the Arthur Morgan division would trade their whole bench to touch. But the real story is how the middle rounds held up. Jordan Mason fell 2.2 rounds past his ADP before NFLeeds scooped him at RB41. David Montgomery slipped a round and a half before landing at 9.11. Blake Corum followed a similar script. None of those picks made highlight reels on draft night, but that's exactly the point: value accumulates quietly, and by the end of the draft NFLeeds had logged five picks that outpaced expectation without a single major reach on the board. The Hurts and DeVonta Smith stack adds a correlation bonus that could pay dividends in high-scoring weeks. At 69th percentile, this team sits right on the edge of dangerous.

There was no single moment in dp9055's draft that made the room gasp, and that's kind of the point. This roster was built through steady, compounding advantages, most notably landing Matthew Stafford at QB14 a full 2.7 rounds past his ADP, then pairing him with Puka Nacua at WR1 for one of the cleaner stacks in the field. Nacua at the top and A.J. Brown at WR8 give this team a genuine one-two punch, and Brown's move to New England alongside Drake Maye's MVP-caliber arm makes his projection feel conservative if he can stay healthy. Layer in Chris Olave at WR11 in a second Stafford-adjacent stack, Ladd McConkey at WR20, and Jameson Williams at WR21, and the lineup depth doesn't just look good, it looks redundant in the best possible way. Dallas Goedert at TE15 is the softest spot, but calling him a weakness on this roster feels ungenerous. Third in the Arthur Morgan division and comfortably in the top 20 percent of the field, dp9055 looks like a team that simply drafted better than most.

SleeperSeahawks is sitting at the 82nd percentile in the Scott Fish Bowl field, and the draft board tells you exactly why: five values, fourteen chalk picks, zero reaches. This is a roster built with the quiet confidence of someone who knew their number and never flinched. James Cook lands at RB5 and was still on the board at 2.09 when his ADP said 2.04, a small gift that compounds nicely alongside Ashton Jeanty at RB7 and Derrick Henry at RB12, both projected starters delivering genuine top-tier production. The discipline extends into the later rounds, where Sam LaPorta falls a full round past his ADP and walks into a starting role as TE8. Josh Allen anchors the passing game as QB1, and his connection with D.J. Moore gives the roster a legitimate stack that could pop on the right week. Malik Willis, freshly signed in Miami and built to produce even when the wins aren't coming, adds meaningful QB depth behind Allen. The weakest projected starter is Rhamondre Stevenson at RB31. That sentence should tell you everything about how well this roster was constructed.

mattmarlow82 didn't stumble into a 99th-percentile roster. This draft was built with the kind of deliberate patience that separates architects from gamblers. Jayden Daniels, projected QB5, fell nearly two rounds past his ADP and landed at 4.07, a discount that would embarrass most draft rooms. Kyren Williams, projected RB15, arrived another round and a half late. Those aren't accidents. Across the entire board, mattmarlow82 logged seven good values, one steal, and zero major reaches, a draft card so clean it reads like a proof of concept for how SFB is supposed to be played. The starting core is anchored by Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1, buttressed by Kenneth Walker III at RB10, Williams, and Colston Loveland at TE3, with Daniels and Justin Herbert providing real upside at quarterback. The 2025 record of 24-12 with a 76th-percentile scoring finish confirms this manager already knows how to translate draft capital into wins. Division rank one, tournament percentile 99th. There is nothing here to apologize for.
