Pickle Rick sits fourth percentile in the tournament and dead last in the Asteroids division, and the draft record explains exactly how they got there: zero steals, zero values, and three major reaches that bent the board in all the wrong directions. The most damning of those is Bo Nix, a QB15 taken at 4.01, two-plus rounds ahead of his market price, burning a premium pick on a quarterback who projects as a borderline starter. Then, as if to double down on the philosophy, Kaytron Allen arrived at 13.12 despite an ADP near the twentieth round, a six-round reach on a RB61 that would be difficult to justify in any draft format. The one genuine asset here is a receiver group anchored by CeeDee Lamb and Tetairoa McMillan, but even that brightness fades when you remember that Malik Willis, projected QB24, is the expected second quarterback off this bench. Pickle Rick did not get unlucky. They reached confidently, repeatedly, and the standings will reflect it.

There is no polite way to frame an 11th-place division projection and a 16th-percentile tournament outlook, so Avengers 3.0 probably deserves the unvarnished version. The receiver and tight end groups are legitimately strong, anchored by Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4) and Colston Loveland (TE3), and Chris Olave (WR11) arriving four rounds past his ADP counts as one of the few genuine wins in a draft that otherwise leaned heavily on chalk and minor reaches. The problem is that the quarterback situation is quietly catastrophic. Kyler Murray (QB19) and Tyler Shough (QB20) are projected near the bottom of the position, and the manager paid a slight premium for Murray on top of it. In a positionless format, you can paper over a lot with elite skill players, and St. Brown and Loveland give this roster a real floor. But the ceiling is capped by passers who rank QB19 and QB20, and after a 2025 campaign that finished 64th percentile in scoring, there is no obvious lever left to pull to change that math in 2026.

The Jacksonville Jaguars enter 2026 sitting 10th in the Asteroids division and in just the 17th percentile of the field, and the draft did not offer much reason for optimism. The two most consequential decisions were both pulls in the wrong direction: Travis Kelce, projected at TE10, was taken 3.2 rounds before his ADP, and Omar Cooper Jr., projected at WR62, went 2.2 rounds early, meaning real draft capital was spent to land a depth piece. That kind of roster construction is the fantasy equivalent of maxing out a credit card on furniture for a house with a cracked foundation. The top of the lineup does have genuine value, Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Jonathan Taylor at RB4 are legitimate cornerstones, but the rest of the projected starters grade out as middling, and Trevor Lawrence at QB10 offers a ceiling that last season's 33 percent win rate suggests this roster has never been able to reach. With no obvious lever left to pull, Jacksonville looks like a team hoping variance saves them from themselves.

MrColeyCole entered this draft with real assets, Josh Allen and Saquon Barkley chief among them, and somehow turned that foundation into a 19th-percentile roster sitting ninth in the Asteroids division. The crime scene is in the draft board: three major reaches, zero steals, and a best-available philosophy that apparently meant best-available-to-MrColeyCole specifically. Pulling George Kittle at pick 4.10 when his ADP sat at 7.04 is the kind of move that looks bold in the moment and catastrophic in hindsight, because two and a half rounds of draft capital bought a TE9 who could have been had for far less. Then, deep in a draft where patience is the only currency left, the board goes Darnell Mooney and Chris Bell in back-to-back late rounds, each taken more than four rounds ahead of consensus. Mooney projects as WR82. Bell is WR87. Those are not late-round fliers, those are sunken costs wearing disguises, and they anchor a receiver group that grades out weak despite the sheer number of names on it.

davidlyonsjr did almost everything right on draft day. The value column is real: Jake Ferguson fell a round and a third before getting snagged, Dallas Goedert slipped a round past his ADP, and Cade Otton came two full rounds late. Twelve chalk picks kept the roster stable, and the four minor reaches were minor enough to forgive. So why does this team sit eighth in the Asteroids division and in just the 23rd percentile of the field? Because drafting well and drafting a winner are not the same thing, and this roster illustrates the gap with uncomfortable clarity. Justin Jefferson and A.J. Brown are legitimate WR6 and WR8 anchors, and Derrick Henry at RB12 still commands respect, but beneath that top tier the drop-off is steep, with Jordan Addison, projected WR43, representing the floor of the starting group. davidlyonsjr squeezed value out of nearly every round and still ended up with a team that

projects to struggle, which is less a failure of process than a reminder that the draft does not owe you anything for being smart.

Im the Dude is a 50th-percentile team in the Asteroids division, and that number feels exactly right in a way that is either reassuring or quietly terrifying depending on your tolerance for uncertainty. The ceiling is real: Puka Nacua projects as WR1, Malik Nabers lands at WR12 after falling nearly a round and a half past his ADP, and DeVonta Smith slots in at WR14, giving this roster genuine star-level talent at the top. The floor, though, is equally real. Smith came at a cost, taken 1.3 rounds before his ADP, and Tucker Kraft was drafted 1.8 rounds early at TE5, meaning the draft capital was committed aggressively in spots that may not have required it. Wan'Dale Robinson projects as the weakest starter at WR47, and after a 42-percent win rate in 2025, Im the Dude cannot afford many weeks where the stars go quiet and Robinson is the firewall. The margins decide this season, and right now they are pointing in both directions at once.

NateGeck sits at 54th percentile in the field, which is another way of saying this team will be decided by the kind of coin flips that make fantasy managers stare at ceilings at 11pm on a Tuesday. The foundation is genuinely good: Jaxon Smith-Njigba projects as WR3 and Nico Collins as WR9, and that kind of top-end production is what separates teams that contend from teams that just show up. The problem is the floor. Quentin Johnston projects as the weakest projected starter at WR41, and in a positionless format where every slot matters, that drag at the bottom of the lineup is the exact margin this team cannot afford to bleed. The 2025 campaign went 13-23 with 30th percentile scoring, so NateGeck knows firsthand how quickly a middling roster becomes a losing one when the wrong players get touched by variance. The receiver group has the ceiling to make noise. Whether Johnston and the back end of this roster can stop being the story is the only question that actually matters.

ColinO13 didn't force anything in this draft, and the roster reflects it. The foundation is elite: Jahmyr Gibbs projects as RB1, and he landed at pick 1.07 when his ADP was sitting at 1.03, a small slip that ColinO13 was right there to catch. That kind of patient discipline repeated itself throughout the middle and late rounds, where Cam Skattebo (RB20) and Bhayshul Tuten (RB25) both fell past their ADPs and into waiting hands. Tuten is the name to watch here. With Travis Etienne gone to New Orleans, Jacksonville's backfield is genuinely open, and Tuten's athletic profile and draft pedigree put him ahead of the competition in that room. Stack in a Jordan Love and Christian Watson connection for upside, and George Pickens projecting at WR10 as a starter, and this roster has legitimate firepower at every level. The 2025 campaign went 31-5 and landed in the 98th percentile in scoring, so ColinO13 clearly knows how to build one of these. Nothing flashy, just consistently right.

adonald27 didn't need a signature moment in this draft, just a steady accumulation of advantages that quietly added up to something impressive. The headliner is Trey McBride at TE2, a projected starter who gives this roster an edge at a position where most managers are settling for considerably less. The wide receiver group anchors around Rashee Rice (WR13) and Terry McLaurin (WR24), with Luther Burden coming along as a WR22 value after falling a full round past his ADP. That Jayden Daniels and McLaurin share an offense is a natural stack that costs nothing extra and pays dividends whenever Washington's offense clicks. Daniels himself was the one aggressive move, taken nearly a round before his ADP suggested he'd be available, but at QB5 the price looks reasonable in hindsight. Add David Montgomery and Bucky Irving each arriving late relative to their ADP, and the pattern becomes clear: adonald27 identified the market inefficiencies early and just kept cashing them in. At 70th percentile entering the season, the ceiling is real.

Better than 12th lands at third in the division and the 91st percentile of the field, and the draft tells you exactly why: no heists, just five genuine values and eleven picks right at market price, with zero major reaches along the way. That kind of quiet discipline compounds. Bijan Robinson at RB2 was taken at 1.08 when the room had him at 1.04, a small gap that barely registers, but add Ashton Jeanty at RB7, Breece Hall at RB14, and Josh Jacobs at RB16 and the top of this roster has real teeth. Tyler Warren at TE4 holds down another premium spot. The one place where the picture clouds a little is Brock Purdy, a projected starter whose supporting cast in San Francisco is genuinely difficult to read right now, with injury questions surrounding several of his key weapons. Purdy was productive when healthy last season and Mike Evans is now in the mix, but there are more open questions than settled answers around him. The name fits: this team earned its standing one sensible decision at a time.

thefantasycfo didn't win the draft in one flashy moment, they won it in the margins, round after round. Kenneth Walker III falling 1.2 rounds past his ADP in the fourth, Caleb Williams sliding nearly two full rounds to 5.05, Harold Fannin drifting past his number into the sixth: none of those moves looks like a heist on its own, but stack them together and you've got a roster sitting at 94th percentile in the field with genuine top-end talent. Brock Bowers at TE1 is the kind of anchor that quietly decides close weeks, and pairing him with Fannin at TE6 means the position never becomes a problem. The foundation runs deep at running back too, with Omarion Hampton at RB9, Walker at RB10, and Travis Etienne at RB18 all projecting as starters. The two quarterback reaches are real, and Daniel Jones at QB25 is the honest weak link, but in a positionless format the rest of this roster has more than enough to carry the weight. Second in the Asteroids division is the floor here, not the ceiling.

There are clean drafts, and then there are statements, and ddeakin made a statement. Landing Lamar Jackson at 2.12 when the board had him going nearly a full round earlier is the kind of draft-room patience that separates disciplined managers from the ones chasing names, and pairing him with Mark Andrews as a stack only multiplies the value already captured on that pick. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 anchors a receiving corps where Garrett Wilson, Ladd McConkey, and Rome Odunze all project as starters, meaning the floor here is genuinely difficult to find. Drake Maye slipping to 3.01 despite an ADP of 2.02 gave ddeakin quarterback depth that most managers would trade a mid-round pick to have, and Quinshon Judkins falling 1.2 rounds past his number rounds out a draft with zero reaches anywhere on the board. The 2025 campaign finished at the 60th percentile in scoring, respectable but not yet reflecting what this roster construction can produce. Sitting first in the Asteroids division and at the 97th tournament percentile, 2026 looks like the year the process pays the dividend it has always promised.
