Fisher Price drafted like someone who wandered into the auction knowing exactly two things: CeeDee Lamb and Justin Jefferson are good. Everything surrounding that correct observation fell apart in real time. The manager zeroed steals, zeroed values, and still somehow managed to reach on nearly every pick, culminating in the tournament's most dispiriting flex: burning a third-round pick equivalent on Eli Stowers, a TE32 who arrived 3.4 rounds ahead of his ADP as if urgency alone could conjure production. The Lamb and Jefferson headlines are real, but a roster sitting at the 8th percentile of the field and 12th in the Pitfall division does not get there by accident. It gets there by spending late picks on Tyjae Spears and Kenyon Sadiq before the market agreed they were worth chasing, compounding the reach problem all the way down the board. The stacks with Dak Prescott and Kyler Murray add a theoretical ceiling, but ceilings require floors, and this roster's floor is a long way down.

There is no sugarcoating the math for XXXORCIST in 2026. Sitting 11th in the Pitfall division and in just the 9th percentile of the tournament, this roster is staring at a very steep wall. The draft did not help matters: three major reaches dot the board, including Derrick Henry pulled nearly two rounds ahead of his ADP to land at RB12, and Malik Willis burned an eighth-round pick on a QB24 projection. Those are the kinds of bets that need to hit clean to justify the cost, and the returns look shaky at current projections. Lamar Jackson anchors the top of the roster at QB3 and his stack with Zay Flowers at WR16 gives the team a real ceiling in any week those two go off together, but that is roughly where the upside stops. Rhamondre Stevenson projects as the weakest expected starter at RB31, and a team living in the 9th percentile does not have the margin to absorb a slow week from anyone. XXXORCIST is not without talent, it is just without enough of it.

There is no polite way to dress this up: mckech3 is sitting 10th in the Pitfall division and projects in just the 13th percentile of the entire field, and the draft did not provide much of a rescue operation. The roster features eight minor reaches and a major reach in Ted Hurst, a WR85 who was pulled three-plus rounds before his ADP, which is the kind of investment that tends to look worse as a season progresses, not better. The one genuine bright spot is Christian McCaffrey at RB3, grabbed at 2.01 when his ADP sat at 1.09, a real find. But after McCaffrey, the receiver group thins out fast, with Emeka Egbuka projecting at WR18 and Brian Thomas Jr. at WR31 as the next best options, and that is a steep drop-off in a positionless format where ceiling matters enormously. Drake Maye grades out as a QB2, which is legitimate upside, but when the projected weakest starter is Jaylen Warren at RB27 and the team finished near the middle of the scoring pack in 2025, the margin for error here is essentially gone before the first week even kicks off.

TeamNotorius lands in the 16th percentile of the field and sits ninth in the Pitfall division, and squinting at this roster does not reveal an obvious path out of that basement. The quarterback situation is the clearest anchor: Bo Nix projects as a QB15, yet TeamNotorius reached nearly two full rounds early to get him, which is a steep premium to pay for a player who grades out as merely average at the position. That kind of draft capital misalignment matters when the roster is already thin on upside, and nothing downstream fixes it. Trey McBride at TE2 is a genuine asset and George Pickens at WR10 gives this team something to build around, but projected starters Kenneth Walker III (RB10) and Travis Etienne (RB18) were both taken ahead of their ADPs, meaning TeamNotorius spent aggressively in the middle rounds to secure players the market had already priced correctly. You cannot keep overpaying for chalk and expect the standings to cooperate. The ceiling here looks suspiciously close to the floor.

scxpress enters 2026 sitting at the 26th percentile of the field and eighth in the Pitfall Division, and the draft did little to improve that outlook. The roster has real anchor pieces, Josh Allen at QB1 and Jonathan Taylor at RB4 are legitimately elite, but the manager spent most of the draft chasing depth at inflated prices rather than reinforcing the middle of the lineup. Four major reaches dot the draft sheet, including Tony Pollard taken nearly three rounds early and Braelon Allen grabbed more than three rounds before the market agreed, and the projected starters reflect the consequences. Jalen Coker grades out as the weakest projected starter at WR55, and he cost a tenth-round pick when the market had him valued two-plus rounds later. Allen and Taylor can carry a lot of weight, but in a positionless format where everyone is squeezing value out of every slot, building around two stars and a collection of overpaid depth is a plan that tends to plateau early and have no second gear when it matters.

Cavalanche enters 2026 sitting seventh in the Pitfall division and at just the 35th tournament percentile, and the draft ledger does not inspire much confidence that the gap will close. The roster's crown jewels are real, Saquon Barkley at RB8 and Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 give this team a legitimate top-end foundation, but the middle of the roster is where things quietly fall apart. Three major reaches in the draft, most painfully Kyle Monangai taken 3.5 rounds ahead of his ADP and Tank Bigsby grabbed 3.0 rounds early, mean avalanche spent premium capital chasing depth that projects out at RB33 and RB55 respectively. The projected starter at the weakest spot, Xavier Worthy at WR49, reflects a lineup where the floor drops off sharply behind the stars. Jordan Love's presence compounds the concern, because as hand-crafted as his game is for winning real NFL games, he has never cracked the top ten in fantasy scoring and remains tethered to a receiving room still lacking a true alpha. Cavalanche's ceiling is visible, but the floor has too many trapdoors to ignore.

Mr. McGibblets is the kind of team that won't show up on anyone's fear radar, which is precisely why the margins matter. James Cook at RB5 and Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 are genuine difference-makers, the sort of projected production that keeps a team competitive week after week without ever feeling dominant. The concern is that the rest of the lineup leans on players where the gap between a good week and a bad one is wider than you'd like. George Kittle, projected TE9, carries real upside alongside real uncertainty: an Achilles tear late in 2025 leaves his availability in Week 1 genuinely in question, and in a format where every point counts, banking on a TE9 who may or may not be on the field is a thin wire to walk. The 2025 résumé, 67 percent wins and 61st percentile in scoring, confirms a team that can compete but hasn't quite cracked the threshold where luck stops mattering. Sixth in the Pitfall division and sitting at the 49th percentile, Mr. McGibblets isn't losing sleep and isn't inspiring it either.

Splitsquad did not walk away from draft day with one headline pick and a prayer. They walked away with a roster that kept beating the board, quietly and repeatedly. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 anchors the top end, and Caleb Williams gives the team a QB6 projection with a built-in stack alongside Rome Odunze, a pairing that inflates both ceilings when the Bears offense clicks. The real craftwork, though, was at the margins. Travis Kelce slid nearly two full rounds past his ADP, and Splitsquad was sitting there at 9.01 to scoop a TE10 projection at a significant discount. Jakobi Meyers cost a 12th-round pick despite an ADP that suggested he belonged off the board in round ten, giving the team credible depth at the back of the roster without spending real capital. The result is a squad that finishes 64th percentile in the field, fifth in the Pitfall division, not because of one inspired swing but because the draft rarely, if ever, lost a pick. That quiet consistency is usually worth more than the one brilliant gamble that everyone remembers.

RazzBDon came out of the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl draft sitting at 71st percentile in the field, and the funny thing is the draft sheet looks like a cautionary tale. Two major reaches, two minor reaches, zero steals. The board clearly had opinions about this manager, and this manager clearly did not care. Take Alvin Kamara, pulled three full rounds ahead of his ADP at RB50, a pick that makes traditional draft graders wince. Or Fernando Mendoza, a QB27 yanked two rounds early in a format where most managers are not rostering three quarterbacks at all. On paper, those are the moves that sink teams. On the roster, they barely register, because Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 are projected starters who make the rest of the conversation almost academic. Patrick Mahomes fell a full round and a half past his ADP, and RazzBDon was there to collect. The reaches did not cost them the premium players. Whether that is draft vision or just fortunate sequencing, the result is the same: a team that looks considerably better than its draft log has any right to suggest.

MattGiraldi didn't need a single home-run swing to land in the top 15 percent of the field. The draft just kept quietly winning. Brock Bowers at TE1, Tyler Warren at TE4, and Tucker Kraft at TE5 give this roster a ceiling at the position that most managers would trade their first pick to own, but the real story is how the rest of the board filled in. Brock Purdy came in at QB13 a full round and a half after his ADP suggested he would, and Cam Ward, projected QB23, slid more than two rounds past his number before MattGiraldi scooped him up. Add De'Von Achane at RB6 and Rashee Rice at WR13 anchoring the skill positions, and you are looking at a starting lineup that doesn't have a soft underbelly. The 2025 record of 17-19 is the one honest argument against optimism here, but the roster construction in 2026 belongs to a manager who did his homework and let the board come to him.

GEbraham is what happens when a manager shows up to draft day with a plan and the patience to execute it. The centerpiece is a receiving corps that would make most SFB teams sick with envy: Puka Nacua at WR1, Drake London at WR7, Nico Collins at WR9, and Malik Nabers at WR12 all projecting as starters, with Nabers himself representing the single best piece of value on the roster, a WR12 scooped up at 6.11 when his ADP sat three full rounds earlier at 3.11. Chris Godwin falling two rounds past his ADP in round 11 is the kind of late-draft discipline that separates good SFB drafters from great ones. The Matthew Stafford stacks with both Nacua and Davante Adams give this team a real multiplier effect on game days. If there is a soft spot, it is C.J. Stroud, who has been chasing his early career form through injuries and inconsistent line play, but a team sitting in 95th percentile and second in the Pitfall Division does not need Stroud to carry anything. It needs him to show up.

The Tee Baggers sit first in the Pitfall Division and in the 99th percentile of the entire field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. This roster was built with discipline: twenty picks, zero reaches, and value captured at nearly every turn. The foundation is elite, anchored by Joe Burrow at QB4 stacked alongside both Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Tee Higgins at WR19, giving this team a ceiling that most managers in this tournament are simply not holding. But the separation from good rosters to great ones usually comes in the middle and late rounds, and that is precisely where Tee Baggers went to work. Colston Loveland fell nearly a full round past his ADP and projects as a TE3. Dallas Goedert slipped 2.2 rounds and landed at TE15. AJ Barner dropped 2.7 rounds and adds TE24 depth behind them. Finding one tight end value in a draft is luck. Finding three is a process. This is what a clean SFB draft looks like.
