As Trotta23 embarks on the 2025 fantasy football season, the team finds itself in a challenging position, considerably distant from the heights of last year's impressive performances. Their dominance in 2024, marked by a stellar 94th percentile point finish and a commanding winning percentage, is now a fading memory as they struggle to regain that form. In the division, they sit at a lowly tenth, and they're only in the 10th percentile overall, suggesting a difficult road ahead. The quarterback situation remains a glaring issue, with Brock Purdy and Michael Penix Jr. both struggling to provide the stability needed for success. In contrast, their tight end corps, led by Trey McBride and supported by David Njoku and Tucker Kraft, offers a glimmer of hope in this TE Premium setup. However, the running back position is a significant concern, with Tyjae Spears as a starter despite

being ranked outside the top 40 at his position. The wide receiver group falls short of expectations, ranking ninth in the division, placing heavy reliance on Nico Collins and Calvin Ridley to elevate their game. Questionable draft decisions have exacerbated the roster's weaknesses, with Michael Penix Jr. and Chase Brown selected earlier than their typical draft positions, costing the team valuable opportunities to strengthen other areas. As the season unfolds, Trotta23 will need to navigate these challenges carefully, seeking out every advantage to climb out of their current standings and rediscover the winning formula that once propelled them to near the top.

Anthony Richardson and Daniel Jones has left a bitter taste, overshadowing any potential gains. The season ahead seems a daunting uphill climb, as Glass Cannon faces the daunting task of clawing out of a lowly position with little margin for error.

Although the team managed to secure Dak Prescott well below his projected draft position, the decision to reach for CeeDee Lamb and Dylan Sampson earlier than necessary may

come back to haunt them. The stacks of Mahomes with Xavier Worthy and Prescott with Lamb offer glimmers of hope, but without significant improvement elsewhere, BJEverett2002 faces an uphill battle in what promises to be a challenging season.

Though tight end positions could use some reinforcement, the strategic choices made during drafts could pay off big dividends. Currently sitting at rank 5 in the

Auburn Tigers division and in the 63rd percentile overall, DoctorSquatch is positioned to surprise, compete fiercely, and perhaps climb to new heights this season.


