As Unclebottomtooth braces for the 2025 fantasy football season, optimism seems to be in short supply. Despite a strong quarterback performance from Lamar Jackson, the team finds itself languishing at the bottom of the Baltimore Blast division, ranking 12th, and struggling in the lower echelons of the overall competition, sitting in the 5th percentile. The running back core is commendable, with Kyren Williams, Kenneth Walker III, and Chuba Hubbard showing promise, but it's overshadowed by glaring weaknesses in other areas. The wide receiver lineup is particularly concerning, as Courtland Sutton and Stefon Diggs have underperformed compared to expectations, leaving Khalil Shakir as the unlikely standout, yet still not enough to lift the team. Adding to the woes, questionable draft decisions saw potential value squandered by reaching too early on players

like Matthew Stafford and Jerome Ford, whose contribution remains inconsistent at best. Despite snagging Daniel Jones later than expected, the roster's depth and balance seem insufficient to compete effectively. Unless a turnaround happens, Unclebottomtooth may remain in the shadow of their more successful counterparts this year.

the team's overall standing languishes in the 23rd percentile, painting a picture of a team poised for another year of dashed hopes and unmet potential.
