The Combine sits at the bottom of the Clash of Clans standings and projects in the 2nd percentile of the entire field, and the draft record offers little reason for optimism. The manager leaned hard into wide receiver, reaching on Zay Flowers nearly two full rounds early, then turning around and reaching again on Jake Ferguson and DeVonta Smith before the board had moved in their favor. The instinct to grab talent early is understandable, but when you burn capital across eight minor reaches and one major reach, you end up with a roster that is wide at the base and paper-thin at the top. The top projected starters, Smith at WR14 and Flowers at WR16, are legitimate, but Cam Ward projects as QB23 and is the weakest projected starter on the team, a ceiling that is hard to paper over. Trey McBride at TE2 is a genuine asset, yet even he cannot compensate for a quarterback situation this anemic. The lever that might have saved this roster was never pulled.

ssabou sits third in the Clash of Clans division and projects in the bottom three percent of the entire field, and the draft record explains a fair chunk of why. Matthew Stafford, a QB14, was taken at 4.02 against an ADP of 6.02, a two-round overpay for a player who projects as a backup to Jalen Hurts anyway. Matthew Golden, the projected weakest starter on the roster, was grabbed 2.1 rounds ahead of his ADP and comes in at WR52, which is not a player worth that kind of urgency under any construction. Those reaches matter because the value was available: Hurts himself fell nearly two rounds before ssabou landed him at 5.11, so the market was clearly beatable. A.J. Brown at WR8 and Nico Collins at WR9 give this roster a legitimate top-end, but everything behind them fades fast, and when your swing-for-upside picks are already baked into a bottom-percentile projection, there is no obvious move left that changes the math.

There is a specific kind of fantasy exhaustion that sets in when you look at a roster and realize the ceiling and the floor are basically the same room. You Made Me Eke(ler) enters 2026 sitting 10th in the Clash of Clans division and in just the 12th percentile of the field, and the draft offers little evidence that a correction is coming. Lamar Jackson anchors the lineup as a projected QB3 and Amon-Ra St. Brown grades out as a WR4, so the top end is real, but the roster logged three major reaches against just one steal, and those reaches compounded in the wrong places. Jared Goff, taken more than two rounds before his QB16 projection warranted, ate a valuable mid-round pick. Jalen McMillan came off the board over two rounds early for a WR59 projection. The depth behind the stars grades average at best, and Jalen Coker projects as the weakest projected starter at WR55. Last season's 62nd-percentile finish looks, in hindsight, like the high-water mark. The levers have been pulled.

iChubb did almost everything right on draft day. The wide receiver group is genuinely elite, with CeeDee Lamb (WR5), Justin Jefferson (WR6), Chris Olave (WR11), and Tetairoa McMillan (WR15) all projecting as starters, and Kyle Pitts (TE7) and Sam LaPorta (TE8) give the team a top-end tight end pairing most managers would envy. Nearly the entire roster came at or after ADP, which is the disciplined, process-correct way to build. So why does this team sit ninth in the Clash of Clans division at the 38th percentile? Because discipline at the margins cannot rescue you when your quarterback situation is Sam Darnold (QB21) and Daniel Jones (QB25), both taken as late-round values, both deserving of their discount. Darnold won a Super Bowl last year, but with Kenneth Walker gone and a passing game historically narrow in its distribution, there is real uncertainty about whether his fantasy output rises to meet the moment. Getting a bargain on a problem does not make it less of a problem.

kgammell1 drafted with genuine discipline. Nearly every pick landed at or after ADP, the roster carries three values by the numbers, and the reaches that did happen were minor and defensible. The cruelest part is that patient drafting got them to 40th percentile and a division rank of eighth anyway. The foundation is real: Brock Bowers at TE1 and Tyler Warren at TE4 give this team two of the most reliable weapons on the field, and a receiver corps headlined by George Pickens (WR10), Jameson Williams (WR21), and Jaylen Waddle (WR23) is legitimately impressive. But the weakest projected starter is Malik Willis at QB24, and the entire quarterback group tops out at Jordan Love at QB17, a player whose value was coaxed out of a late-round fall rather than drafted as a cornerstone. When your most important position is built entirely on afterthoughts, the rest of the roster is fighting uphill every week. kgammell1 did the homework and still ended up here. That is not bad luck. That is a structural ceiling.

DubsFF is not hedging, this roster is built to ride or die with Caleb Williams. The pairing of Williams with both Luther Burden at WR22 and Colston Loveland at TE3 means DubsFF has two live wires connected to the same switch, and when Williams is cooking, this team can go vertical in a hurry. Williams himself landed at QB6 after falling more than a round past his ADP, making him the rare steal who also doubles as the team's entire strategic identity. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 gives the roster a high-floor anchor independent of that stack, which matters when you need a floor on a week the Bears offense sputters. The risk is concentrated and obvious: a cold stretch from Williams does not just hurt one slot, it flattens the whole ceiling at once. DubsFF finished in the 79th percentile in scoring a season ago, so the talent infrastructure is real. The question in 2026 is whether correlation becomes a multiplier or a trap.

schalmers94 didn't win the draft with one thunderbolt pick. They won it by quietly accumulating value across nearly every round, and the ledger backs that up: five good values, one major steal, and only a handful of reaches against a roster that finished in the 92nd percentile of scoring last season. The headliner is Puka Nacua at WR1, a projectable top receiver on a team that should let him eat, and the supporting cast around him is where the draft really earns its grade. Garrett Wilson came in as a reach at pick 2.11, but landing a projected WR17 in the second round is the kind of overpay that looks embarrassing until it doesn't, and Tee Higgins at WR19 and Terry McLaurin at WR24 give schalmers94 real depth at the position that matters most in this format. Meanwhile, Bhayshul Tuten fell nearly three full rounds past his ADP into round 11, landing as a projected RB25 at a price that should not have been available. Sitting sixth in the Clash of Clans division and 64th percentile overall, there is room to climb, and the draft gives legitimate reason to believe they will.

kclout didn't win the draft with one thunderbolt pick. They won it by consistently being in the right place. De'Von Achane slid nearly a full round past his ADP and landed at 3.05, giving kclout an RB6 projection at a round-three price. Drake Maye fell half a round to 2.08, which is the kind of quiet discount that separates careful drafters from lucky ones. Pair those values with Jahmyr Gibbs projecting as the RB1 and a backfield that runs several starters deep, and the foundation here is genuinely difficult to argue with. The receiver group projects more modestly, with Davante Adams at WR25 leading the way, but in a positionless format the strength at the top of this roster does most of the talking anyway. The result is a team sitting at the 74th percentile of the field, fifth in the Clash of Clans division, and firmly in the conversation. Not a heist, not a gamble, just a draft that kept coming out ahead of the board.

Razzball_TLB did not win the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl draft with a single thunderclap moment. They won it pick by pick, round by round, in the way that actually holds up over a long season. The backbone of this roster is a stacked group of projected starters: Bijan Robinson at RB2, James Cook at RB5, Kenneth Walker III at RB10, and Kyren Williams at RB15, each of them a credible weekly contributor in a positionless format where depth at the top translates directly to points. Walker and Bucky Irving were the clearest examples of the draft's underlying discipline, both sliding past their ADPs by more than a round and landing in Razzball_TLB's hands without any creative maneuvering required. Dak Prescott projects as a QB7, a quietly useful asset. The one moment where the draft logic wobbled was Sean Tucker, taken more than five rounds ahead of consensus, but one late-round reach does not rewrite a story this coherent. Landing in the 79th percentile of the field with that roster construction is not an accident. It is the predictable result of a manager who kept doing the boring thing correctly.

OhNoltsMike lands at 88th percentile and third in the division, and the draft log explains exactly why: this roster was built on consistent execution rather than any single inspired moment. Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 both slipped past their ADPs, giving the team two legitimate cornerstones without having to overpay for either. Then, when RJ Harvey tumbled a full two rounds past his expected price in round twelve, Mike was positioned to collect him at RB28, the kind of quiet accumulation that separates good drafters from lucky ones. Josh Allen anchors the quarterback room as QB1, and Harold Fannin at TE6 provides above-average upside at a position where most managers are scraping. The wide receiver group is the thinnest part of the projection, but in a positionless format the top-end depth everywhere else more than compensates. There are no dramatic stories here, no miraculous late-round finds, just a manager who kept coming out ahead on deal after deal until the roster quietly became one worth watching.

delisaamy sits second in the Clash of Clans division and in the 91st percentile of the entire field, and the draft board explains exactly why. The foundation is immaculate: Joe Burrow at QB4 and Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 form one of the most potent stacks in the tournament, and the manager landed Burrow a full round later than his ADP suggested he'd be available. That kind of patience at a pick like 2.12 is a skill, not luck. Derrick Henry at RB12 and Josh Jacobs at RB16 both slid past their expected draft slots too, giving this roster a run of genuine value that compounds quickly. The cherry on top is C.J. Stroud, projected QB22, who tumbled more than three full rounds past his ADP and landed at 12.12 for essentially nothing. One steal, five values, and zero major reaches across the entire draft. delisaamy didn't force anything, didn't panic, and didn't overpay. The board cooperated, and this manager was disciplined enough to take everything it offered.

FFBirdGang doesn't have a flashy origin story here, just a draft that kept winning small battles until the scoreboard looked like this: first in the Clash of Clans division and sitting at the 93rd percentile tournament-wide. The engine is a backfield that any manager would covet, with Christian McCaffrey at RB3, Saquon Barkley at RB8, and Breece Hall at RB14 all projecting as starters, giving this roster a foundation that simply doesn't bend under pressure. The receiving corps adds real punch through Drake London at WR7 and Malik Nabers at WR12, both projected starters who keep the ceiling elevated. What ties it together is the draft philosophy: 17 chalk picks signal a manager who trusted the board rather than chasing upside, and then Trevor Lawrence, projected QB10, fell nearly three full rounds past his ADP and landed at 7.09, the kind of quiet gift that separates good drafts from great ones. Nothing about this roster was built on a single dramatic swing. It was just consistently right.
