tactical advantage, but the path to climbing the rankings is fraught with challenges. As they brace for the season, PFFBeckett faces a steep uphill battle to emerge from the shadows of their current standings.

Their running back situation is equally troubling, with James Cook merely average at RB15 and Isaac Guerendo languishing at RB46. The questionable decision-making in player selection didn't stop there; fishbag888 significantly reached for Dak Prescott, Khalil Shakir, and Christian Kirk, while the acquisition of Stefon Diggs and Darnell Mooney also cost them dearly in value. These missteps have left them floundering near the bottom of their division at rank 11 and struggling in the overall competition in

the 15th percentile. As they embark on this challenging season, fishbag888 must navigate these setbacks if they wish to move beyond a frustratingly underwhelming campaign.
