There is no diplomatic way to say this: sknsfn26 is in trouble. Sitting 12th in the Baron Samedi division and projected in just the 7th percentile of the field, the roster has real talent at the top but no margin for error anywhere beneath it. Jayden Daniels at QB5 and Justin Jefferson at WR6 are genuine weapons, and the draft board showed conviction, but conviction costs something when it comes packaged with three major reaches. Kyren Williams was taken nearly two rounds early, Jaydon Blue was grabbed almost seven rounds ahead of schedule, and neither move looks like it bought anything the board would not have eventually delivered. The Daniels reach at pick 1.10 for a QB5 is the one that stings most, because it set the price for everything that followed. When your draft is built on overpaying and your projected finishes grade out near the bottom of the tournament, there is no magic trade to make, no waiver wire savior hiding in the data. The ceiling exists, the floor is closer.

There is no spin available for BPx707, and the draft record confirms it: zero steals, zero values, and three major reaches on a roster that lands in the 12th percentile of the field. The most damaging of those reaches is Skyler Bell, grabbed 9.2 rounds ahead of his ADP, a pick that consumed real draft capital on a WR103 projection while the team's quarterback situation festered into something genuinely grim. Sam Darnold, Malik Willis, and Jacoby Brissett are the three signal-callers on this roster, with Willis projected as the weakest starter at QB24, and the most optimistic read there is that it barely matters because the rest of the options are not better. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, Tyler Warren at TE4, and Garrett Wilson at WR17 give BPx707 a real ceiling on good weeks, but this team is ranked 11th in the Baron Samedi division because the floor is a trapdoor, and BPx707 built it themselves, one reach at a time.

There is a specific kind of fantasy misery that comes not from bad luck but from clear-eyed arithmetic, and clenchtherhino is staring straight into it. Sitting 10th in the Baron Samedi division and in just the 18th percentile of the field, this roster grades out as one of the weaker entries in the tournament, and the draft did little to change that trajectory. Josh Allen at QB1 is genuinely elite, and De'Von Achane at RB6 gives this team a real weapon, but the drop-off from those two to the rest of the projected starters is steep and unforgiving. Tyjae Spears, the most glaring draft mistake at 2.8 rounds early and now projecting as a borderline RB47, exemplifies the problem: clenchtherhino paid premium prices for players who did not deliver premium value. With 12 chalk picks, zero steals, and one major reach already baked in, there is no hidden upside lurking in this roster, no late-round gem to flip the narrative. Allen is real. Everything around him is a prayer.

Troutfinger enters 2026 sitting ninth in the Baron Samedi division and at just the 32nd tournament percentile, and nothing about this draft suggests the tide is turning. The roster is built around a genuinely strong backfield, Saquon Barkley at RB8 and Omarion Hampton at RB9 forming a legitimate foundation, but the draft sheet is riddled with the kind of optimism that costs you later: five major reaches in a single draft, including Aaron Rodgers pulled more than three and a half rounds early and Elijah Sarratt taken nearly five rounds ahead of his ADP. That is not asset accumulation, that is wishful thinking priced at a premium. The receiver room grades average at best, with Amon-Ra St. Brown a bright spot at WR4 but Michael Pittman checking in at WR44 and the depth falling off sharply after that. Troutfinger came in at the 30th percentile in scoring last season, and this roster, drafted without a single steal or value, gives no obvious reason to expect a different outcome.

newbost is sitting at 43rd percentile and seventh in the Baron Samedi division, and it is hard to find the thread that unravels this into something better. The roster has genuine firepower at the top, Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Jonathan Taylor at RB4 are legitimate difference-makers, and Breece Hall at RB14 was a smart pickup after falling a full round past his ADP. But the position-agnostic format of the Scott Fish Bowl rewards quality depth, and past that elite tier the roster gets thin quickly. The quarterback situation is particularly grim: Tyler Shough projects as QB20, C.J. Stroud as QB22, and Daniel Jones as QB25, a group that represents three different flavors of disappointing. Stroud and Jones were both reached for before their ADP, so the cost was real and the return is murky. Chris Olave at WR11 and Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 offer some hope, but the weakest projected starter is Stroud, and this format does not let you hide a liability like that for long.

Team Pahukula80 played the draft almost exactly right on paper. Eighteen chalk picks and just one major reach, that reach being Ashton Jeanty at RB7 taken a mere 0.7 rounds early, a number so small it barely qualifies as a complaint. The lone steal, Woody Marks falling nearly three full rounds to RB44, is the kind of patient drafting that earns you a nod in the recap thread. And yet here this roster sits, projected 8th in the Baron Samedi division and at the 43rd percentile of the field, which is the fantasy equivalent of doing everything the checklist said and still failing the test. CeeDee Lamb at WR5 is a genuine anchor, and Jeanty alongside Chase Brown and Jeremiyah Love gives the top of this roster real teeth. But the projected starters thin out quickly after that, and with Brenton Strange at TE17 penciled in as the weakest projected starter, there is no hidden floor propping this thing up. Pahukula80 found value. The value just did not find wins.

pjudkins sits at the 52nd percentile, which is exactly as comfortable and exactly as precarious as it sounds. The foundation is genuinely impressive: Brock Bowers at TE1, a receiving corps anchored by Nico Collins (WR9), Malik Nabers (WR12), Zay Flowers (WR16), and Ladd McConkey (WR20) gives this roster a ceiling that most managers in Baron Samedi would envy. But the margins are where this season gets complicated. The draft leaned heavily on chalk, and the three major reaches are worth noting: Nabers was drafted 1.3 rounds early, Stefon Diggs was taken 2.3 rounds ahead of his ADP, and Michael Mayer cost 3.8 rounds more than the market priced him. Early-round aggression on Nabers looks defensible given where he landed projection-wise, but Diggs at WR56 and Mayer at TE39 are the kind of decisions that quietly haunt a team when the standings tighten. This is not a roster that collapses, and it is not one that runs away from the field. It is a roster that lives and dies by whether the close calls break right.

pfunk305 finished 2025 at the 30th percentile and came back swinging harder, which is either growth or stubbornness, and right now it looks like growth. The 2026 roster sits at the 62nd percentile, and the draft board shows how they got there: two major reaches, three minor ones, and zero steals. Normally that is a confession. Here it reads more like a manifesto. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 anchors everything, and the supporting cast around him is genuinely deep, headlined by Josh Jacobs, who fell 1.3 rounds past his ADP and landed at RB16 as something close to a gift. Then there is Bhayshul Tuten, the most interesting reach of the bunch. Travis Etienne is gone to New Orleans, the Jacksonville backfield is unsettled, and suddenly Tuten's athletic profile has room to mean something real. That is the whole draft in miniature: pfun305 kept pulling triggers early and kept finding players with plausible paths to payoff. Whether conviction or luck drove those decisions, the roster they built does not much care.

JakeAndersonPGA didn't build this roster with one flashy move. They built it by winning small battles throughout the draft, and those small battles add up. A.J. Brown at WR8 fell nearly a full round past his ADP, and TreVeyon Henderson at RB19 slipped more than a round before this team grabbed him, giving the lineup a pair of projected starters acquired at a discount before the middle rounds even arrived. Trey McBride projects as TE2, a genuine positional advantage that quietly elevates the entire lineup's ceiling. The one blemish worth noting is J.J. McCarthy, reached roughly five rounds early, though the positionless format softens the sting of a QB swing that doesn't pan out. The 2025 season ended at 59th percentile in scoring, respectable but not dominant, and a 4th-place division standing suggests there's still a gap to close against the best in Baron Samedi. At 65th percentile tournament-wide, this is a team that has earned a conversation, not a coronation, but it is absolutely in the conversation.

Taymone is not building a menu here and hoping something tastes good. The entire plan runs through Joe Burrow and Ja'Marr Chase, a QB4 and WR2 locked together in the highest-upside stack in the division, and the surrounding cast is quietly built to amplify that same ceiling rather than hedge against it. Jameson Williams at WR21 and Alec Pierce at WR32 give the lineup legitimate secondary options with their own boom potential, while Colston Loveland at TE3 and Tucker Kraft at TE5 ensure the tight end spot never bleeds points in a week when the stack is cooking. Parker Washington at WR35 was the one reach on the board, taken nearly two rounds early, and that willingness to pay a small premium says something about how deliberately this roster was constructed. When Burrow is threading the needle and Chase is eating in the red zone, taymone is a week-winner. That correlation is the design. At 80th percentile and sitting third in the division, the foundation is legitimate. The only real question is how many Sundays Burrow and Chase decide to show up at the same time.

TheArlingtonOwl didn't build this roster with one flashy swing. They built it by consistently being in the right place at the right draft board moment, and the cumulative effect is something worth respecting. Drake Maye at QB2 slid half a round past his ADP, Derrick Henry at RB12 fell more than a round, and David Montgomery at RB23 dropped another round and change into the lap of a manager patient enough to let the board come to them. Five values and only three minor reaches across the entire draft is a profile that screams discipline, not luck. The starting corps anchors around Bijan Robinson at RB2, Maye, and George Pickens at WR10, and the Dak Prescott and Pickens stack gives the team a ceiling that a flat floor never quite captures. The 2025 season was a coin flip, but this roster sits at the 91st percentile and second in the Baron Samedi division. That gap between last year and this year is not noise. It is the draft doing its job.

barrazjm didn't win this draft with one flashy pick, they won it by staying patient and letting the board come to them. The clearest evidence is the wide receiver group, where Drake London (WR7) fell five spots past his ADP in the second round and Rashee Rice (WR13) slid nearly a full round before barrazjm scooped him in the fourth, and then Puka Nacua (WR1) anchors the whole thing as a projected top option at the position. That's not luck, that's a manager who knew their prices and didn't flinch. The running back depth tells a similar story, with D'Andre Swift (RB24) arriving a full round late and Kenneth Walker III (RB10) giving the roster a genuine weekly difference-maker. Five values across the draft against zero major reaches puts barrazjm in a place most managers can't claim: sitting at first in the Baron Samedi division, projecting into the 94th percentile of the field, with a roster built on discipline rather than desperation.
