There is a specific kind of exhaustion that comes from managing a roster where the ceiling and the floor feel uncomfortably close together, and Russ Fisher is living it heading into 2026. The draft told the story early: reaching 3.2 rounds for Dallas Goedert, a TE15, in the fifth round when a TE15 could have been had in the ninth suggests a roster-building anxiety that never quite settled. Ashton Jeanty grades out as an RB7 and anchors the top end, but the next meaningful name is Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, and after that the projected starters drop off fast, with Chris Olave at WR11 and Mark Andrews at TE14 forming a respectable middle tier that simply was not built for tournament survival. Fisher finished 39th percentile in scoring a year ago and currently sits 12th in the BaseballStars division with an 8th-percentile tournament outlook, and nothing on this board reads as a hidden lever waiting to be pulled. This roster is what it is, and what it is may not be enough.

Katie Flower finished 18-10 last season and scored at the 72nd percentile, which makes what she's working with in 2026 feel like a cruel joke. The top of the roster is genuinely impressive: Josh Allen is a QB1, A.J. Brown checks in at WR8, and Rashee Rice and Emeka Egbuka give her real depth among projected starters. The Allen/D.J. Moore stack adds some correlated upside. But the floor drops off fast. Rhamondre Stevenson grades out at RB31, Demond Claiborne at RB63, and neither projects as anything more than a marginal contributor. The draft offered no relief, producing zero steals and zero values against six minor reaches and a major reach on KC Concepcion, who projects at WR50 and ranks as the weakest projected starter on the roster. Flower sits 11th in the BaseballStars division and at just the 22nd percentile tournament-wide. The stars at the top are real, but the infrastructure underneath them is not enough to carry this team where it needs to go.

Tim McIntosh sits ninth in the BaseballStars division and projects at just the 35th percentile of the field, and the draft record offers little reason for optimism. The clearest drag on the roster is at the quarterback spot, where Matthew Stafford cost a fourth-round pick despite projecting as merely QB14, and Daniel Jones was pulled two-plus rounds ahead of his ADP to land a QB25. Paying early-round premiums for that kind of production is the fantasy equivalent of tipping well for bad service, and it left the team scrambling to paper over the damage. Puka Nacua grades out as WR1, which is legitimately exciting, and the Stafford-Nacua stack gives the offense a connective tissue. But when your quarterback is a mid-tier option taken at elite-option cost, the stack is only as good as Stafford's aging arm on any given Sunday. Derrick Henry, Jeremiyah Love, and Breece Hall anchor the lineup, but without reliable quarterback production to complement them, this roster looks like a sports car with a lawn-mower engine under the hood.

Steve Fresa's 2026 squad lands 10th in the BaseballStars division and sits at just the 35th tournament percentile, and there is not a clean way to spin those numbers into something friendlier. The roster does have genuine building blocks: Jonathan Taylor (RB4) and De'Von Achane (RB6) give Fresa a backfield that most managers would envy, and Tyler Warren (TE4) is a legitimate difference-maker. The problem is that the rest of the depth chart quietly undercuts all of it. Baker Mayfield checks in at QB18, and the quarterback situation only gets grimmer from there with Cam Ward at QB23 and Deshaun Watson at QB34, leaving Fresa without a reliable signal-caller to keep pace in high-scoring weeks. The draft did not offer much of a remedy either: six minor reaches, one major reach in Malik Washington (WR71), and zero outright steals suggest Fresa was chasing the roster he wanted rather than the one the board was offering. Michael Pittman projects as the weakest projected starter at WR44, and that is a ceiling problem disguised as a depth problem. Taylor and Achane can carry a lot, but they cannot carry everything.

Ben Gretch did almost everything right on draft day. Thirteen chalk picks, only two minor reaches, and a draft board full of players taken at or past their ADP, including Chigoziem Okonkwo and Kenyon Sadiq falling a combined three-plus rounds to fill out the tight end group. The problem is that being disciplined and being good are not the same thing, and Gretch's roster is proof. Justin Jefferson at WR6 and Lamar Jackson at QB3 give this team a genuine ceiling, and the Jackson-Zay Flowers stack adds a layer of week-winning upside. But below that top line, the floor drops fast. Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33 is a name that was supposed to matter by now, two seasons into a career already marked by injuries and a quarterback situation in Arizona that still has not settled. Okonkwo projects as the weakest projected starter on this roster at TE19. The value was extracted correctly. The talent just was not there to extract, and that is a problem no amount of draft discipline can fix. Gretch sits eighth in the BaseballStars division and at the 43rd percentile of the field.

Zac Reed's 2026 season lives and dies in the margins, and right now the margins are leaning on a razor's edge. The upside is real: Drake Maye at QB2 was practically gifted to him, falling nearly a full round past his ADP, and Bijan Robinson anchors the roster as a projected RB2. That is a legitimate spine. But the tissue around that spine gets softer fast, and nowhere is the pressure more visible than with Jalen Hurts. Hurts has posted five consecutive top-10 fantasy finishes, built largely on a rushing touchdown volume that could shrink now that AJ Brown has departed for New England, leaving his passing game suddenly scrutinized in ways it never had to be. Pair that uncertainty with Stefon Diggs projecting as the team's weakest starter at WR56, a player Zac reached nearly four rounds early, and you have a roster where the ceiling and floor are uncomfortably close together. This is not a team that loses the season in September. It is a team that loses it in the tiebreakers.

Scott Pianowski sits at 54th percentile in the field and seventh in the BaseballStars division, which is about as on-the-nose a middle-of-the-pack profile as you can construct. The margins decide this. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 is a genuine difference-maker, and Colston Loveland at TE3 was a quiet win on draft day, falling nearly a full round past his ADP. Those two give Pianowski a ceiling. The problem is the floor has some cracks. Trevor Lawrence arrives off a legitimately strong season, 4,000 yards and nearly 30 passing touchdowns, but that campaign came with enough noise around it that trusting him as a locked-in QB10 requires some faith. Then there is Juwan Johnson, the projected weakest starter on the board at TE20, taken nearly two and a half rounds ahead of where the market had him. That is the kind of reach that quietly costs managers in a tight race. Pianowski is not in rebuild mode and not in contention mode. He is in prove-it mode, where every healthy week from Smith-Njigba and every soft matchup for Lawrence either builds a case or quietly closes one.

Patrick Daugherty didn't swing for the fences in the Scott Fish Bowl draft so much as he just kept getting the right price on everything. The steals tell the story: Travis Etienne at RB18 fell more than two full rounds past his ADP before Daugherty grabbed him in the eighth, Jake Ferguson came off the board two and a half rounds late as a TE12 starter, and Malik Willis landed in the twelfth round despite projecting as QB24. None of those are lottery tickets, they're just good players acquired at a discount, compounding into a roster that projects above the field. The one question worth asking is whether Daugherty paid too early for Malik Nabers, taken a full round ahead of his ADP, but Nabers projects as a WR12 starter, so the premium was for a real asset. A 2025 finish at 45th percentile in scoring gives the skeptics something to point at, but the draft structure here is measurably better, and this team sits at 55th percentile in the field going in.

Ben Fiorucci didn't stumble into correlation, he engineered it. The centerpiece is the Burrow-Chase stack, which is less a pairing than a philosophy: Joe Burrow sits at QB4 and Ja'Marr Chase at WR2, meaning when Cincinnati lights up a scoreboard, Fiorucci collects from both ends of the wire. That alone would be enough to build around, but he doubled down with a second stack, pairing Jared Goff with Jameson Williams, giving the roster a backup generator with its own ceiling. The logic is elegant: a single breakout game from either quarterback doesn't just help, it cascades. The draft supports the vision without being reckless, four values acquired and zero major reaches, with Burrow himself landing two spots past his ADP. At 67th percentile in the field, this team isn't a sleeper so much as a loaded weapon pointed at the right target. If the stacks fire, Fiorucci won't need luck. He'll just need Burrow to keep throwing to Chase, which, historically, is not a lot to ask.

Jay Towle did not come to the Scott Fish Bowl to mess around. Landing at 77th percentile and third in the BaseballStars division, this roster reads like a masterclass in patience and board awareness. The backfield anchors everything: Christian McCaffrey at RB3, Omarion Hampton at RB9, and Kenneth Walker III at RB10 form a projected starting core that most managers would trade their entire draft for, and Towle got both Hampton and Walker below their ADPs. Then there is the late-round discipline. Jadarian Price fell more than two full rounds to pick 11.11, landing a projected RB26 for nearly nothing. Brenton Strange pulled the same trick at TE, sliding more than two rounds past his ADP to give Towle a TE17 in round 12. Six values and two steals across the board tells you this was not luck, it was a manager who knew his prices and waited everyone else out. The only blemishes are a pair of receiver reaches late, but CeeDee Lamb at WR5 absorbs a lot of sins at the top of the lineup.

Adam Ronis did not swing for the fences and miss, he just kept making smart decisions until the board told the story for him. The foundation is undeniable: Brock Bowers at TE1 gives Ronis a positional advantage he can cash in almost every week, and Drake London at WR7 and DeVonta Smith at WR14 form a receiver corps that quietly got more interesting this offseason. Smith spent five years playing second fiddle to AJ Brown in Philadelphia, but Brown is gone now, and what looked like a WR14 projection last year might be underselling what Smith does in a featured role. Then there are the late-round dividends: Bhayshul Tuten fell more than two rounds past his ADP before Ronis scooped him up at RB25, and Tyrone Tracy slipped nearly three full rounds to become an RB43 at a discount. Two major values buried in the back half of the draft, both at positions where Ronis needed them. The roster finished 77th percentile in a loaded field, and nothing about how it was built looks lucky.

Andy Hall did not build this roster with one audacious swing. He built it pick by pick, and the cumulative effect is a team sitting first in the BaseballStars division at the 78th tournament percentile. The spine of the roster runs through the tight end position, where Trey McBride at TE2, Harold Fannin at TE6, Travis Kelce at TE10, and Isaiah Likely at TE13 give Hall a tier of pass-catchers that most managers can only approximate with one slot. Fannin was technically a minor reach at TE6, but reaching less than a round for a projected starter at that rank is the kind of decision that looks obvious in hindsight. The James Cook at RB5, Saquon Barkley at RB8 combination anchors the backfield, and David Montgomery at RB23 arriving in the tenth round when his ADP sat in the eighth is the sort of quiet draft-room patience that defines how this whole roster came together. Hall did not out-maneuver the field on any single pick. He just kept coming out ahead on the next one.
