Last year DynastyPrice went 26-10 and landed in the 92nd percentile, the kind of season that buys a manager serious credibility going into a new draft. The 2026 roster is quietly spending that credibility down to zero. The team sits at the 6th percentile in tournament scoring projections and ranks 12th in the division, a gap between reputation and reality so wide you could lose a franchise in it. The highest-profile decision of the draft captures the problem neatly: taking Caleb Williams at 1.12, a full round and a half ahead of consensus, burned the premium capital that should anchor a contender. Williams projects as QB6, which is fine, but fine does not justify that price on a roster where Michael Pittman, now tasked with making sense of an Aaron Rodgers offense in Pittsburgh alongside a new coaching staff searching for an identity, projects as WR44 and still qualifies as a starter. DynastyPrice is not rebuilding, which almost makes this harder to watch. They are a last-place team wearing a champion's memory.

PaperRouteP sits 11th in the BioShock Division and in the 21st percentile of the field, and the draft record offers little reason for optimism about a turnaround. The team went 0-for-the-board on steals and managed just two genuine values across the entire draft, one of which was Jalen McMillan at WR59, a player whose ceiling is roughly "useful in a pinch." The other value was A.J. Brown at WR8, which matters, but Brown alone cannot lift a roster this thin. What makes the situation grimmer is where the draft capital actually went: Lamar Jackson was taken nearly a full round before his ADP in the first round, a reach that cost real equity at the top of the draft, and Dontayvion Wicks was grabbed over three rounds early for a player who projects as WR96. That is not aggressive roster-building, that is paying a premium for the privilege of starting your seventh receiver. When your weakest projected starter is Xavier Worthy at WR49 and you have already spent your leverage, the math is just unfriendly.

There is no sugarcoating the situation for dapplschampion23 in the BioShock Division this season. Sitting 10th in the division and projecting in just the 27th percentile of the field, the roster grades out as a bottom-tier build with precious few escape hatches. The one genuine bright spot is a backfield headlined by Bijan Robinson (RB2) and James Cook (RB5), both projected starters who give the lineup a real foundation. But below that top tier, the supporting cast thins out quickly, and the receiver group is a collection of WR76s and WR95s that no amount of optimism can dress up as viable. Making matters worse, the two quarterbacks dapplschampion23 paid up for, Justin Herbert (QB8) and Brock Purdy (QB13), both carry meaningful question marks, and Purdy's situation in San Francisco is quietly alarming, with weapons disappearing around him one by one heading into camp. Fourteen chalk picks and a major reach on Elic Ayomanor at WR95 suggest a draft that never found its footing. Robinson and Cook are real, but they cannot carry this alone.

There is no clean way to spin this for Irishdoom. Sitting ninth in the BioShock Division and projecting at just the 29th percentile of the field, the roster grades out as a team hoping circumstance rescues it from a draft that leaned too hard on optimism. The clearest symptom is Cam Ward, reached nearly three rounds early at a pick that assumed a breakout that never quite arrived last year. Tennessee has done real work around him, landing Carnell Tate and Wan'Dale Robinson, so the supporting cast is no longer an excuse, but that cuts both ways: more pressure, same uncertain quarterback. Meanwhile, three major reaches across the draft and zero steals left no margin for error at the back end, where Chris Brazzell II comes in as a WR101 and Nicholas Singleton grades as a RB57. CeeDee Lamb and Saquon Barkley give this team a genuine foundation, but in a positionless format where weekly production is everything, a thin tail catches up to you fast. Irishdoom is not without hope. It just ran out of obvious ways to manufacture any.

JakeJakeAbrams finished in the 91st percentile last season, and that number is going to haunt this roster all year. The 2026 version lands at 39th percentile in tournament projections and eighth in the BioShock Division, which is the kind of drop that demands an explanation. The quarterback room looks like a genuine strength on paper, with Jayden Daniels and Jalen Hurts both projected starters, but Hurts is the cautionary tale buried inside the optimism. Five straight top-10 fantasy finishes built his reputation, yet the offseason departure of A.J. Brown to New England strips away the safety net that papered over his limitations as a passer, and if the Philadelphia offense sputters, those rushing touchdown opportunities that made him a fantasy cornerstone tend to evaporate too. Reaching nearly a full round early to secure Hurts suggests real conviction in that projection, conviction the broader numbers do not yet share. Brock Bowers at TE1 is the anchor this roster deserves, but one elite tight end and a QB room carrying significant variance is a thinner foundation than a 30-6 team's alumni status might suggest.

Ashliee's 2026 season lives and dies in the margins, and the margins are genuinely close enough to cut either way. The foundation is real: Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 form the kind of top-end anchor that keeps a roster competitive on any given week, and George Pickens at WR10 and Kyren Williams at RB15 are legitimate contributors, not filler. The issue is that the bottom of the projected lineup is where the season gets decided, and Wan'Dale Robinson projecting as the team's weakest starter at WR47 means Ashliee needs the players above him to stay healthy and productive. The quarterback situation is thin across the board, with Baker Mayfield projecting as the team's best option at QB18, but in a positionless format the signal is still less alarming than it looks on paper. The 2025 finish at the seventh percentile in scoring is the number that actually warrants attention, because this roster looks meaningfully better than that, and the gap between last year's output and this year's talent is either a correction waiting to happen or a warning being ignored.

Chrispy McCreams didn't make headlines on draft day, and that's kind of the point. The foundation here is Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, two projected starters who give this roster a ceiling most teams in the BioShock division would envy, and St. Brown arriving at pick 2.02 when his ADP sat at 1.10 is the kind of quiet win that compounds over a season. Matthew Stafford landing two full rounds past his ADP adds legitimate QB depth without costing a premium. Jaxson Dart was the one place the draft leaned forward, taken 1.3 rounds early at QB11, though the upside there is real enough to justify the gamble. The 2025 campaign was a 50-percent-win mediocrity that deserves to be left in the past, and the upgraded talent suggests it will be. Sitting 62nd percentile in the field heading into 2026, Chrispy McCreams looks less like a pretender than a team that simply did the work round by round and let the board come to them.

Inglourious Basterds didn't need a dramatic moment to build something worth watching. They just kept coming out ahead, pick after pick. Puka Nacua at WR1 fell nearly a full round past his ADP of 1.01, meaning the manager landed the top projected receiver in the sport without even jumping ahead of consensus. Chris Olave, a projected WR11 and a locked-in starter, slipped another 0.8 rounds before being claimed at 4.08. Then, quietly, Oronde Gadsden, projected TE16, dropped more than a round before being scooped at 10.08. Stack those three values on top of Tyler Warren at TE4 and Travis Kelce at TE10, both starters, and the starting lineup carries real upside before you even factor in Garrett Wilson at WR17. The Inglourious Basterds sit 61st percentile in the tournament field entering 2026, which undersells a roster built less on one big swing and more on a draft where patience and preparation kept paying dividends.

Dont even trip dawg. didn't need a lottery ticket to build something worth watching in the BioShock division, just a steady hand and a draft that kept finding the right player at the right price. The foundation is genuinely elite: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and De'Von Achane at RB6 give this roster a ceiling that most managers in the field can't touch, and a tight end room anchored by Sam LaPorta at TE8, Jake Ferguson at TE12, and Mark Andrews at TE14 means the positional advantage compounds every single week. The Dak Prescott and Ferguson stack, plus the Jared Goff and LaPorta pairing, layers in bonus upside without requiring any desperation swings. Four values against one major reach is exactly the kind of quiet draft that holds up in October. The one genuine question mark is Dalton Kincaid, whose knee has been an ongoing concern and whose availability for 2026 is still uncertain, but even if Kincaid never suits up, this roster doesn't need him to stay in the conversation. Sitting fourth in the division at the 64th percentile, there's runway here.

There was no lottery ticket moment in dhuckman's draft, no swing-for-the-fences pick that either wins the room or sends you home early. Just round after round of coming out slightly ahead, and that adds up. The centerpiece is a receiving corps that would make most managers in the BioShock division genuinely uncomfortable: Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, Justin Jefferson at WR6, Rashee Rice at WR13, and Zay Flowers at WR16, all projected starters, all acquired without drama. Jefferson alone looks like a minor heist, taken at 2.05 when the field had him going at 1.12. Add Emeka Egbuka at WR18 and Josh Downs at WR46, both of whom fell past their ADPs and landed in dhuckman's lap, and the depth chart keeps producing value well into the middle rounds. The Mahomes-Rice stack layers upside onto a foundation that was already steady. A 26-10 record and 93rd-percentile scoring in 2025 suggest this is not a manager who gets lucky. Third in the division and the 74th percentile in 2026 feels, if anything, conservative.

Gtownjon didn't make headlines on draft day, and that's exactly the point. This roster was built the way good rosters get built: round after round of sensible decisions that quietly added up to something formidable. The foundation is elite, with Joe Burrow (QB4) and Trey McBride (TE2) projecting as two of the very best at their positions, and Tucker Kraft (TE5) right behind McBride as a projected starter in his own right. The backfield is anchored by Omarion Hampton (RB9) and Chase Brown (RB11), with Brown arriving a shade later than his talent warranted, a modest but real edge. Then there's Jakobi Meyers, snagged at pick 12.04 when his ADP said he should have been off the board around round ten. As the team's weakest projected starter at WR45, Meyers isn't going to win games by himself, but landing a WR45 two rounds into the fourth quarter of the draft is the kind of quiet win that separates disciplined managers from everyone else. Sitting second in the BioShock Division and in the 81st percentile of the field, Gtownjon looks like a team that earned its standing one smart pick at a time.

Pick 6 Fantasy did not build this roster by swinging for the fences on one transformative pick. They built it by repeatedly being right. Drake London at WR7, Malik Nabers at WR12, and DeVonta Smith at WR14 all slid past their ADPs, and Pick 6 was waiting each time, collecting elite projected starters at a modest discount while the rest of the room looked elsewhere. Kyle Pitts at TE7 fell a full round and a half past his ADP and landed in the same cart. None of these were lottery tickets, none required a bold gamble, just disciplined execution at the board. The one genuine blemish is Bryce Young, taken 2.5 rounds ahead of his QB26 projection, a reach that sticks out precisely because everything else in this draft was so measured. Still, the top of this roster is formidable enough that Young is a luxury concern rather than a structural one. Division-leading and sitting in the 89th percentile of the field, Pick 6 Fantasy arrived at 2026 having earned every bit of it, pick by patient pick.
