Scatt Catts sits dead last in the Birdo division and at the 7th percentile of the entire field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The most damning entry is Matthew Stafford, a QB14 taken in the second round at a time when virtually every other manager was building their skill-position foundation. That reach cost Scatt Catts 3.3 rounds of draft capital on a quarterback who projects as a low-end starter at best, and the problem compounds from there. Kaelon Black, a RB71, was scooped up nine full rounds ahead of his ADP, meaning the manager panicked at a position when patience would have returned equal or better value later. The lone bright spot, Puka Nacua projecting as WR1, is almost cruel in this context, a genuinely elite asset anchoring a roster that was undermined from the second pick onward. Kenneth Gainwell, the projected weakest starter at RB34, was himself a major reach. When your floor piece was also an overpay, the math was broken before the season ever started.

FYFSimon drafted with the patience of someone who has read every ADP sheet twice and still gets burned, because nearly every pick landed at or after market price and the roster still sits 11th in the Birdo division and in the 17th percentile of the field. The WR group is genuinely impressive: CeeDee Lamb at WR5, Justin Jefferson at WR6, Malik Nabers at WR12, and Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 are all projected starters, all acquired at or past ADP, all exactly the kind of value accumulation that should translate into points. It does not translate, at least not in the projections, because the rest of the roster does not keep pace. Jadarian Price projects as the weakest starter, Kenyon Sadiq sits at TE21, and neither Kyler Murray nor Bryce Young inspires much confidence at QB19 and QB26 respectively. The Murray and Jefferson stack adds a modest structural bonus, but a stack does not fix a ceiling when the floor is this unsteady. FYFSimon did the homework. The grade is still a C.

DHHTyler enters 2026 sitting 10th in the Birdo division and in just the 17th percentile of the field, and nothing about how this roster was assembled suggests the trajectory is about to change. The draft was a study in going against the house and losing, with three major reaches that will quietly haunt every close matchup. Blake Corum, taken two full rounds ahead of his ADP, grades out as RB35. Jaydon Blue, ripped off the board an almost incomprehensible 8.2 rounds early, projects as RB70. Christian Kirk, another aggressive early pull, lands at WR100. Those are not calculated gambles that nearly paid off; they are value simply left on the table. Meanwhile, the top of the roster does offer something to hold onto, as Ashton Jeanty projects at RB7 and Garrett Wilson at WR17, but a 2025 campaign that finished in just the 9th percentile of scoring suggests that good players at the top cannot carry enough dead weight at the bottom. DHHTyler is not rebuilding. DHHTyler is just behind.

Giantmistake enters 2026 sitting ninth in the Birdo division and in just the 27th percentile of the field, and the roster does not offer many reasons to argue with those numbers. The draft tells a familiar story of a team that forced the issue in the wrong spots: four major reaches, including Demond Claiborne taken nearly six rounds ahead of his ADP and Ryan Flourney grabbed three rounds early, while the one true steal of the draft was Tyler Shough, a QB20 projection who fell two-plus rounds into their lap and is unlikely to move the needle at that position. Brock Bowers is a genuine TE1 anchor, and if Dalton Kincaid can shake the knee injury that has shadowed him since late 2024, the tight end depth is the one area that punches above its weight. But Brandon Beane himself said it was "too early to tell" whether Kincaid would be healthy, which is not exactly a ringing endorsement for a team that needs everything to break right. There is no obvious lever left to pull, and at 27th percentile, there is not much runway for that to change.

London Mafia ran a disciplined draft, finishing with 14 chalk picks, two genuine values, and zero major reaches, which is the kind of sheet that earns a nod in the recap thread. The problem is what that discipline actually built. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and George Pickens at WR10 are legitimate anchors, and Colston Loveland at TE3 gives the roster a real weapon at a premium spot. But Chase and Pickens need a quarterback to throw them the ball, and Jared Goff at QB16 is the projected starter, taken a round early no less, with Jacoby Brissett at QB28 waiting behind him like a very polite backup plan. The value picks were real: Brissett fell more than three rounds past his ADP, and Adonai Mitchell slid nearly two. They just fell into a roster that is projected 33rd percentile anyway, sitting eighth in the Birdo division. London Mafia did the math correctly at every pick and somehow still arrived at the wrong answer.

The 2026 outlook for juliapapworth is the kind that makes you want to change the subject. Sitting seventh in the Birdo Division and projecting at just the 38th percentile of the field, this roster has real talent at the top, De'Von Achane at RB6 and Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 are legitimate difference-makers, but the floor drops off quickly enough to matter. The projected weakest starter tells the story: Matthew Golden, a WR52 who ranked eighth among his draft class in receiving yardage in 2025 and is now entering a make-or-break year in a Green Bay receiver room that has thinned out around him without necessarily clearing a path to stardom. That is the player standing between this team and a bottom-of-the-lineup disaster. The draft offered little salvation, producing just one steal against four reaches, including Ted Hurst taken three full rounds before the market agreed he was worth selecting. Last year's 22 percent win rate was not a fluke to overcome so much as a ceiling to escape, and right now the escape route is not obvious.

After finishing in the bottom 14 percent of scoring in 2025, thejoeywright enters 2026 looking like a completely different operation, and the receiver corps is the engine driving that turnaround. Jaxon Smith-Njigba (WR3), A.J. Brown (WR8), Rashee Rice (WR13), and DeVonta Smith (WR14) form a projected-starter group that most managers in the Birdo division would trade their draft capital to acquire, and Rice arriving a full 1.2 rounds after his ADP means thejoeywright got him at a discount on top of everything else. George Kittle (TE9) anchors the tight end spot with reliable upside, giving this lineup a strong floor at another key position. The quarterback situation is lighter, with Baker Mayfield (QB18), Sam Darnold (QB21), and Daniel Jones (QB25) offering volume over star power, but in a positionless format the question is never position-by-position balance, it is simply how many good players you can field, and thejoeywright has enough of them to expect a serious climb up the standings in 2026.

Shirvan's 2026 roster doesn't have a single headline move that explains why it works, it just keeps working from top to bottom. The foundation is legitimate: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 give this team a ceiling that most managers in the Birdo division can't match, and Nico Collins at WR9 slides in as a projectable weekly weapon rather than a hope play. What separates a good draft from a quiet one is whether the manager got there without overpaying, and for the most part shirvan did. Josh Jacobs at RB16 arrived a round and a half after his ADP suggested he should have been gone, and C.J. Stroud at QB22 fell nearly three full rounds before shirvan collected him in the twelfth. DK Metcalf is the one spot where cost outpaced consensus, taken more than two rounds early, but with the top-end firepower this roster already carries, one premium paid is a minor footnote. Landing at the 65th percentile of the field, shirvan is not here to surprise anyone. The draft just quietly built something worth watching.

JakeEstes didn't make headlines on draft day, and that's kind of the point. While others were swinging for the fences, this roster got built the right way: round after round of sound decisions that quietly accumulated into something real. The foundation is legitimately elite, with Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Jonathan Taylor at RB4 giving this team a top-end that most managers in the Scott Fish Bowl would envy. From there, JakeEstes kept finding value, most notably landing Tony Pollard at RB30 nearly three full rounds after his ADP and Caleb Williams at QB6 just past his projected spot. Those aren't lottery tickets; those are the product of patience and preparation. Yes, Zachariah Branch and Keenan Allen were taken earlier than the consensus suggested, and Harold Fannin at TE6 rounds out a starting group with genuine upside. At the 66th percentile entering 2026, JakeEstes isn't the loudest name in the Birdo division, but this is a roster that got built correctly, and those tend to have a way of making noise in October.

tsmorse0423 lands at third in the division and the 74th percentile of the field, and the draft record tells you exactly why: fourteen chalk picks, one steal, two values, and just three minor reaches, a ledger that reads less like a highlight reel and more like a craftsman's invoice. The foundation is genuinely elite, Josh Allen at QB1 paired with Joe Burrow at QB4, and the Burrow-Tee Higgins stack adds a layer of correlated upside that sharpens on big nights. Burrow himself was a quiet win, slipping 0.8 rounds past his ADP before tsmorse0423 stepped in at 3.02. Layer in Omarion Hampton at RB9 and Luther Burden at WR22 among the projected starters, and the top of this roster carries real weight. Fernando Mendoza at QB27 arriving in the sixteenth round when his ADP sat in the twelfth is the kind of late-round insurance that feels minor until it isn't. Nothing here was stolen at gunpoint, just a manager who kept showing up to the right spot at the right time.

KyleIsNotThePitts didn't win the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl draft with one knockout pick. They won it by not losing. Sitting at 83rd percentile and second in the Birdo division, this is a roster built on a quiet kind of discipline, the kind where the board does the work. Trey McBride at TE2, Tyler Warren at TE4, and Sam LaPorta at TE8 headline a starting group that would make most managers in this field genuinely jealous, and none of them came at a premium that hurt elsewhere. The draft board cooperated too: Brock Purdy slid more than two full rounds past his ADP, and Jaylen Warren followed a similar path late. Neither pick required much courage, just patience and attention. Drake London at WR7 anchors the skill position depth alongside Davante Adams at WR25, and Kenneth Walker III at RB10 was another quiet win, taken less than a round after his ADP suggested he should have gone. This team didn't force anything. It just kept showing up ahead of schedule.

DannyCorless sits at the top of the Birdo division and in the 97th percentile of the entire field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The foundation is immaculate: Lamar Jackson at QB3 was sitting there at pick 3.07 when his ADP said he should have been gone more than a round earlier, and that kind of gift at the top sets the tone for everything downstream. Bijan Robinson at RB2 and James Cook at RB5 give the lineup a legitimate one-two punch before most managers have finished their coffee, and the Jackson/Zay Flowers stack adds a ceiling-raising bonus on top of an already well-constructed core. The draft discipline continued late, with Bucky Irving and RJ Harvey each falling over two rounds past their ADPs before DannyCorless quietly collected them both. Marvin Harrison Jr. brings obvious upside if his health finally cooperates, though Arizona's quarterback situation keeps that upside conditional. Three steals, two values, and just one minor reach across the entire board. Clean is the word.
