ExplosiveOutput sits 12th in the Blades of Steel division and in the 7th percentile of the entire field, and the draft record explains a good chunk of why. Three major reaches in a single draft is a quiet disaster, and two of them hit at premium positions: Chris Godwin at WR38 was taken nearly four rounds before his ADP, and David Njoku at TE29 went two rounds early despite projecting as little more than a speculative TE2. Those are picks that should have bought real upside elsewhere but instead bought mediocrity at a premium. Puka Nacua at WR1 and George Pickens at WR10 give this roster a legitimate top end, and a healthy Rashee Rice at WR13 adds real depth to that group. But the floor keeps caving in. Aaron Jones projects as the weakest projected starter at RB38, Justin Herbert grades out as QB8, and a 2025 campaign that landed in the 45th percentile of scoring is the baseline this manager is trying to improve on. There is no obvious lever left to pull, and the clock is already running.

JamieStrowhiro sits 11th in the Blades of Steel division and in just the 16th percentile of the field, and the draft record offers little reason to expect a reversal of fortune. The backfield anchored by Jonathan Taylor (RB4), Derrick Henry (RB12), and Kyren Williams (RB15) looks genuinely impressive on paper, but this is a positionless format, and the rest of the roster has to pull its weight too. It mostly doesn't. The receiver group grades out weak, with Rashid Shaheed projected as the WR57 and functioning as the projected weakest starter on the roster. The draft didn't help matters: Pat Bryant was taken 3.5 rounds before his ADP and projects as WR86, and Darnell Washington cost 4.1 rounds of premium over his ADP to land a TE38. Those are the kinds of swings that leave a roster looking like a house with a gorgeous kitchen and a collapsed roof everywhere else. Zero steals and two major reaches in a single draft is a combination that compounds quickly, and at this point there is no obvious move left to make it right.

DurangoDan sits 10th in the Blades of Steel division and ranks in just the 17th percentile of the field, and nothing about this roster suggests a dramatic reversal is coming. The receiver group is genuinely strong, with Justin Jefferson, Garrett Wilson, and Tee Higgins all projecting as starters, and Jefferson in particular carries real upside if Kyler Murray unlocks what JJ McCarthy could not in Minnesota. But strength at one position only matters if the rest of the roster can carry its weight, and here the cracks show. Matthew Stafford projects as QB14 with Sam Darnold at QB21 behind him, a quarterback room that is less a plan and more a prayer. The draft offered little help at the margins, producing two values and four minor reaches but zero steals across the entire board. After a 2025 campaign that landed in the 33rd percentile of scoring, DurangoDan needed a shakeup and instead got chalk. Jefferson is worth rooting for, but one bright spot does not change the math.

There is not much to celebrate in the Blades of Steel division for RaincityBastard, who sits ninth in the division and projects out at just the 26th percentile of the field. The top of the roster has genuine appeal: Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, Colston Loveland at TE3, and a Patrick Mahomes / Travis Kelce stack that provides a reliable scoring floor. But the roster grades out with zero steals and one good value in Tyler Allgeier, a player sitting at RB46, and the overall construction is chalk-heavy in a format where chalk rarely wins championships. The most alarming signal is what happens below that appealing surface. Trevor Lawrence, asterisked as a starter at QB10, comes with a context that resists easy confidence, given that his career year arrived through channels that were nearly impossible to predict and may not repeat. The weakest projected starter is Xavier Worthy at WR49, and with no obvious lever left to pull, RaincityBastard enters 2026 looking less like a contender and more like a team hoping the projections are very, very wrong.

BearDown3486 did almost everything right at the draft table and still landed at 8th in the Blades of Steel division, projected at just the 42nd percentile. That is the kind of outcome that haunts a manager. Josh Allen fell to 1.09 when his ADP sat at 1.05, Jacory Croskey-Merritt slipped more than two rounds past his number, and the receiver group built around Nico Collins, DeVonta Smith, and Emeka Egbuka is legitimately excellent, with Smith finally stepping into a true WR1 role in Philadelphia after years of sharing the Eagles' target tree with A.J. Brown. The values were real. The problem is that the floor underneath the top of this roster is soft, and in a positionless format where the bottom of your usable depth gets called on regularly, Rhamondre Stevenson projecting as the weakest projected starter at RB31 is the leak that the good picks at the top cannot fully seal. BearDown collected 15 chalk selections and found genuine value in four more, built a receiver group worth envying, and still projects as a

middle-of-the-field team. Sometimes the draft rewards you with a better roster than your process deserved. This was the opposite.

FFGouge enters 2026 sitting seventh in the Blades of Steel division and at the 42nd percentile of the field, and the roster tells you exactly why. The draft was largely chalk, with two major reaches doing real damage: Justin Fields, a QB38 snagged eight-plus rounds ahead of his ADP, and Eli Stowers, a TE32 pulled three rounds early. Those are the kinds of bets that need to hit for a roster on the margin to climb, and neither projection inspires confidence. The good news, such as it is, lives in Trey McBride, Sam LaPorta, and Mark Andrews, a trio of projected starters that grades out as a genuine strength. The bad news is that everything downstream gets thin fast, and the rest of the starting group lacks the upside to paper over the misses. Malik Willis, the weakest projected starter at QB24, is the floor this team could be playing on for stretches of the season, and for a roster already projected near the bottom, that is less a concern than a flashing warning light.

NathanHopfner is not a team that announces itself. It is a team that quietly accumulates enough to make you nervous by Week 10. The foundation is real: Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and CeeDee Lamb at WR5 are the kind of anchors that keep a roster respectable on bad weeks and terrifying on good ones, and the fact that Lamb landed at 2.03 when his ADP sat at 1.11 suggests at least one moment of genuine draft-room fortune. But fortune is not the same as ceiling, and that distinction matters here. The projected starters are competent without being dominant, the draft leaned heavily chalk with one major reach in Tre Tucker at WR65, and Kyle Pitts at TE7 offers upside that always seems to arrive in installments rather than all at once. A 54th-percentile tournament projection and a 6th-place division ranking say the same thing in different fonts: this roster wins when McCaffrey and Lamb are both cooking and loses the close ones when they are not. The margins decide everything, and the margins are genuinely unclear.

MasterIDP landed in the 68th percentile of the field not because of one splashy pick but because the draft board kept breaking their way, round after round. Tyler Warren fell a full round past his ADP and landed at TE4, which is the kind of quiet win that compounds over a long season. Jerry Jeudy slipped more than two rounds and gives the roster legitimate WR66 upside at a fraction of the cost. Meanwhile, the headliners held up their end: Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 give MasterIDP a foundation that most managers in the Blades of Steel division would trade for without hesitation, and Jameson Williams at WR21 and Davante Adams at WR25 keep the depth honest. The three minor reaches, including Deebo Samuel two rounds early, are easy to forgive when six other picks outperformed their market price. This roster was not built on a single gamble. It was built the way good drafts usually are: by winning small, repeatedly.

Dr. Evil Eddie did not win the draft with one thunderbolt pick. He won it the same way a good poker player wins a session: quietly, repeatedly, and just enough ahead of the house. Malik Nabers at WR12 and Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33 both slid more than a round past their ADPs, and Eddie was there both times to collect. That kind of patience across a draft compounds fast, and the results show it: a roster sitting at the 72nd percentile with a receiving corps anchored by Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and A.J. Brown at WR8 projecting as starters. Harold Fannin adds a credible TE6 option, and while the Browns' quarterback situation is genuinely ugly, Fannin's play last season was strong enough that any marginal improvement to that offense could push his production higher. The 2025 squad went 27-9 and scored at the 89th percentile, so the foundation here is not wishful thinking. In the

Blades of Steel, fourth place is where this roster currently sits, but the gap between projection and ceiling looks like real opportunity.

Oggie didn't win the draft with one flashy swing, and that's exactly what makes this roster worth admiring. The foundation is legitimate: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and De'Von Achane at RB6 give this team a ceiling that most managers in the Blades of Steel division can't match. From there, oggie just kept cashing in quietly. Jaxson Dart fell nearly two rounds past his ADP and lands as QB11, Jaylen Warren slipped to RB27 at a discount, and Matthew Golden came a round and a half late at WR52. Four values across the draft, zero dramatic gambles required. Yes, Mike Washington Jr. was taken nearly five rounds early, and that reach will draw some eye rolls, but one overpay doesn't unravel a draft built on patience and positioning. The 2025 season went sideways at 39 percent wins, but this roster is materially better constructed, and sitting at the 73rd percentile heading into 2026, oggie has quietly assembled something that deserves to be taken seriously.

kgentes2 landed at the 83rd percentile in the Blades of Steel division and it is not hard to see why. The foundation here is legitimately elite: Brock Bowers at TE1 is the kind of anchor that makes every lineup decision easier, and Drake London at WR7 paired with Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 gives this team two projected starters who can carry a week on their own. What makes the draft truly clean, though, is the discipline shown in the middle and late rounds. RJ Harvey fell more than three full rounds past his ADP and landed here at pick 13.07, which is the kind of gift that separates sharp managers from the field. Jeremiyah Love and Bucky Irving were each snagged a round-plus after consensus, adding real depth at real cost. The one blemish is Terrance Ferguson, taken two rounds early, but one reach in a draft this tidy is a footnote, not a flaw. This roster was built with patience and it shows.

dustywilson17 didn't win the Blades of Steel with one haymaker pick. They won it by consistently coming out ahead on exchange after exchange, and the standings reflect it: division rank 1, 94th percentile in the field. The foundation is undeniable, Bijan Robinson at RB2 and James Cook at RB5 anchoring a group that runs deep enough that the projected weakest starter is Chuba Hubbard at RB29. Cook himself is worth dwelling on, taken at 3.03 when the market had him pegged a full round earlier, a clean example of the patient, accumulative approach that defines this roster. Cam Skattebo at RB20 arrived the same way, slipping nearly two rounds past his expected draft position. Then there is Bo Nix, a QB15 projection who has finished as a top 10 fantasy quarterback in each of his two seasons, with Jaylen Waddle now added to Denver's receiving corps alongside Courtland Sutton. The floor is real, the ceiling is genuinely worth watching, and dustywilson17 drafted him at chalk. No single moment made this team. That is exactly the point.
