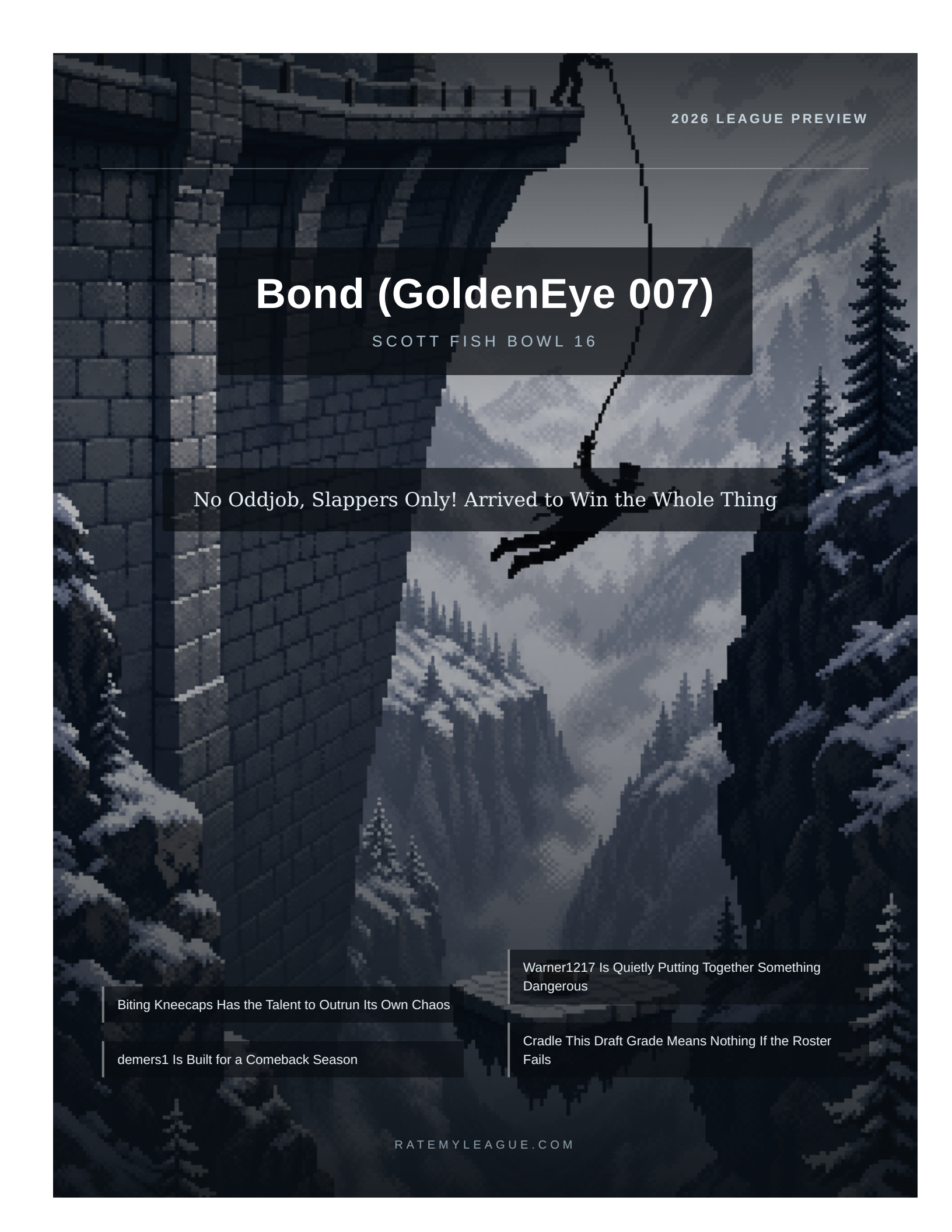

Cradle This drafted shrewdly and arrived nowhere worth being. Fifteen chalk picks, nearly everything taken at or after ADP, and the roster still sits at 12th in the Bond division with a 12th percentile projection, which is the kind of outcome that makes you question the entire exercise. The receiver group is genuinely impressive: Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4), Drake London (WR7), Zay Flowers (WR16), and Garrett Wilson (WR17) give this team as much projected firepower at the position as almost anyone in the field. The problem is that the top of the projected lineup is carrying dead weight at the most important spot. Cam Ward (QB23) is the weakest projected starter on the roster, and while Tennessee upgraded the weapons around him with Carnell Tate among others, the bet here is on a player still working through his struggles with better excuses available than last year. Good process, good receiver haul, and a quarterback who might neutralize both. That is not bad luck. That is just how drafts go sometimes, and it is exhausting.

General Ourumov enters 2026 sitting 11th in the Bond division and projected in just the 15th percentile of the field, and the roster tells you why. The top end is real: Joe Burrow (QB4) and CeeDee Lamb (WR5) are legitimate anchors, and the Caleb Williams/Rome Odunze stack gives this team a ceiling play if Chicago's offense takes a step forward. But the floor is where things get uncomfortable. Kyle Monangai (RB33) projects as the weakest starter on the roster, and the manager burned a 9.12 pick to get him when the market had him closer to Round 12, a two-round overpay that now looks like a significant misallocation of draft capital. The draft as a whole generated zero steals and landed two major reaches, meaning this team largely paid full price or above for what it got. Last year's 73rd-percentile scoring finish showed genuine upside, but the 2026 projection does not reflect that optimism, and right now there is no obvious move on the board that changes the math.

Paintball Mode Explode enters 2026 sitting 10th in the Bond Division and in just the 27th percentile of the field, and there is not much in the draft record to suggest a turnaround is coming. The roster's best hope is at the top, where Drake Maye projects as QB2 and Jonathan Taylor checks in at RB4, a legitimate one-two punch that could keep this team afloat on its best weeks. The problem is the support structure around them. The receiver group is genuinely thin, with Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 the only projected starter who grades out as a difference-maker, and the draft did little to address the depth below him. Worse, two of the roster's late picks look like outright whiffs: Tyler Allgeier was taken 3.1 rounds ahead of his ADP and Sean Tucker a staggering 5.3 rounds early, rounds that could have been spent shoring up the margins. When your most realistic path to survival runs entirely through Maye and Taylor staying healthy, you are not managing a team so much as crossing your fingers.

There is no pretty way to frame a 27th-percentile roster sitting ninth in the Bond Division, so the Facility Toilet Guards will not be getting one. The foundation is real enough: Justin Herbert at QB8, Bijan Robinson at RB2, and Tyler Warren at TE4 give this team a legitimate top tier. But fantasy is won in the middle and back of a lineup, and that is precisely where the Guards fall apart. The wide receiver group grades out weak, with Parker Washington at WR35 leading a corps that slides quickly into WR67 territory and below. Worse, the draft did little to unearth hidden value, logging zero steals against six reaches of varying severity. Rico Dowdle, the projected weakest starter, is a back who carved out a 1,000-yard season in Carolina only to land in Pittsburgh chasing touches behind Jaylen Warren, which is not the profile of a player who fixes anything. A 7-29 record last year told a story, and this roster, constructed the way it was, suggests the Guards have not found a different ending.

childplease08 did everything right and still wound up in the wrong place. There are no major reaches on this roster, three genuine values, and the draft ran almost entirely to chalk, which is usually the résumé of a manager who knows what they are doing. The problem is that knowing what something is worth and assembling a winner are two different skills. The receiver group is the soft underbelly: Tee Higgins at WR19 is the headliner, but he was taken more than a round early, and behind him sit Michael Wilson at WR39 and Jakobi Meyers at WR45, both projected starters, both fine, neither frightening. The backfield is legitimately strong, James Cook at RB5 leading a group that runs deep, and Josh Allen anchors the whole operation. But a draft that produced zero steals and leans this hard on competent running backs and a thin receiver corps is asking the format to reward patience over upside. It finished 30th percentile last season, and the 2026 projection of 28th suggests the lesson has not yet landed.

Derek9rx enters the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl sitting seventh in the Bond division and in just the 36th percentile of the field, and the roster tells you exactly why. The receiving corps is genuinely elite at the top, with Ja'Marr Chase (WR2), Chris Olave (WR11), and DeVonta Smith (WR14) all projecting as starters, and that group alone would make most managers jealous. The problem is that the rest of the roster is doing very little to keep pace with it. Tank Bigsby (RB55) and Ray Davis (RB62) are the only running backs on the roster, and Dalton Schultz (TE22) projects as the weakest starter on the team. The draft did not do much to improve the outlook, either: derek9rx reached on nine players relative to ADP, including Ray Davis by 3.4 rounds, which is a steep price to pay for an RB62. When your best hope is that the receivers carry everything and none of the bottom of the roster hurts you, you are not building a contender, you are building a prayer.

Sh*tty Klobb is the kind of team that wins exactly as many games as it should and leaves you with nothing interesting to say at the bar. The ceiling is real: Brock Bowers at TE1, Colston Loveland at TE3, and Harold Fannin at TE6 give this roster genuine elite talent at the top, and Malik Nabers, Ladd McConkey, and Brian Thomas Jr. form a credible WR core that keeps the floor from caving in. The problem is the margins, and the draft is where those margins got negotiated poorly. Four major reaches litter this sheet, headlined by a Demond Claiborne grab that came 5.2 rounds ahead of his ADP, a T.J. Hockenson pull 3.8 rounds early, and a Braelon Allen selection nearly three rounds ahead of schedule. That's a lot of draft capital spent betting on upside that isn't reflected in the projections. A team sitting 48th percentile and sixth in the Bond Division after a 75-percent win season in 2025 needed to press advantages, not manufacture them. The margins here are thin, and the draft did nothing to widen them.

Warner1217 didn't build this roster with one flashy move. They built it by winning the small moments, and when you zoom out, those small moments add up to something real. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 anchors the whole operation, a minor reach at 1.05 that barely qualifies as a reach at all given where his talent sits. Behind him, Omarion Hampton at RB9 and Quinshon Judkins at RB22 keep the quality from falling off a cliff. Then there is A.J. Brown, projected WR8, now catching passes from Drake Maye in New England, a pairing that should produce exactly the kind of production Brown has always been capable of when he stays healthy, which has been the perpetual asterisk on his career. Rashee Rice at WR13 gives the lineup another legitimate top-end piece. The quarterback situation, capped by Jordan Love at QB17, is the one area where Warner1217 is leaning on projection rather than certainty, but the rest of the roster is built well enough to carry that weight. Sitting at the 60th percentile, this team has every reason to climb.

The Lauckness Monsters did not have a flashy draft, and that is precisely the point. This is a roster built on consistent acquisition, the kind where you look up at the end and realize the manager just kept winning exchanges. Puka Nacua at WR1 anchors everything, and the supporting cast behind him reads like a series of quiet victories: George Pickens at WR10, Jameson Williams at WR21, and Kyren Williams at RB15, the last of whom fell more than a round past his ADP and landed as a legitimate starter. The Dak Prescott and Pickens stack adds a multiplier on top of an already-sturdy foundation. The one genuine cloud over this roster is Josh Jacobs, a projected RB16 whose fantasy standing is currently secondary to a real-world situation involving an offseason arrest and unresolved domestic violence accusations. How that resolves matters far more than any rankings. Still, this team posted a 93rd-percentile scoring season in 2025 and sits at 69th percentile entering 2026, built the same unhurried way: round after round of coming out ahead.

After finishing 2025 in the bottom 13 percent of the field, demers1 has rebuilt into something that looks genuinely dangerous. The centerpiece is Lamar Jackson, a QB3 projection landed at pick 2.12 when his ADP sat at 2.03, a steal that gave this roster an elite foundation without overpaying. Pair Jackson with Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and Nico Collins at WR9, and demers1 suddenly has three projected starters who can carry a week on their own. The supporting cast is real too: Emeka Egbuka at WR18, Jordyn Tyson at WR34, and Kyle Pitts at TE7 fill out a starting lineup that has legitimate upside at nearly every spot. Last season this team scored 3,902 points and won just a third of its matchups. This roster, sitting third in the division and in the 70th percentile of the field, is a different animal entirely. The collapse of 2025 looks less like a referendum on demers1 the manager and more like a bad hand finally replaced.

Biting Kneecaps finished 2025 at the 60th percentile and came back in 2026 determined to do better, apparently by ignoring the consensus entirely. Three major reaches, two minor reaches, and yet here we are staring at a roster that projects second in the Bond division and 76th percentile in the field. The centerpiece of that stubbornness is Kenneth Walker III, RB10, pulled 0.8 rounds before the market said he was available. Paired with De'Von Achane at RB6, a player who fell nearly a full round into Biting Kneecaps' lap, and suddenly the aggressive posture looks less like gambling and more like a manager who simply knew what they wanted and went and got it. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 anchors the receiving group with the kind of quiet authority that makes a whole lineup harder to attack. David Montgomery, now in Houston pushing for carries after his role in Detroit quietly evaporated, gives this team the sort of low-cost upside that can swing a close season. The board said reach. The roster says right.

No Oddjob, Slappers Only! sits in first place in the Bond Division and checks in at the 99th percentile of the entire field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. This roster was built with surgical patience: eight values and one steal across 20 picks, zero reaches of any kind. The headliners are legitimate. Ashton Jeanty lands as RB7 despite slipping more than a round past his ADP, and Jayden Daniels projects as QB5 after similarly falling into this manager's lap at 4.02. Trey McBride at TE2 anchors the receiving corps, and even the weakest projected starter, Oronde Gadsden, finished 11th among tight ends in receiving yards last season before the late addition of David Njoku to the Chargers depth chart introduced some uncertainty. That is the one mild cloud on an otherwise spotless sky. Everything else reflects a manager who identified what the board was giving and took it, every single round. Clean process, elite result.
