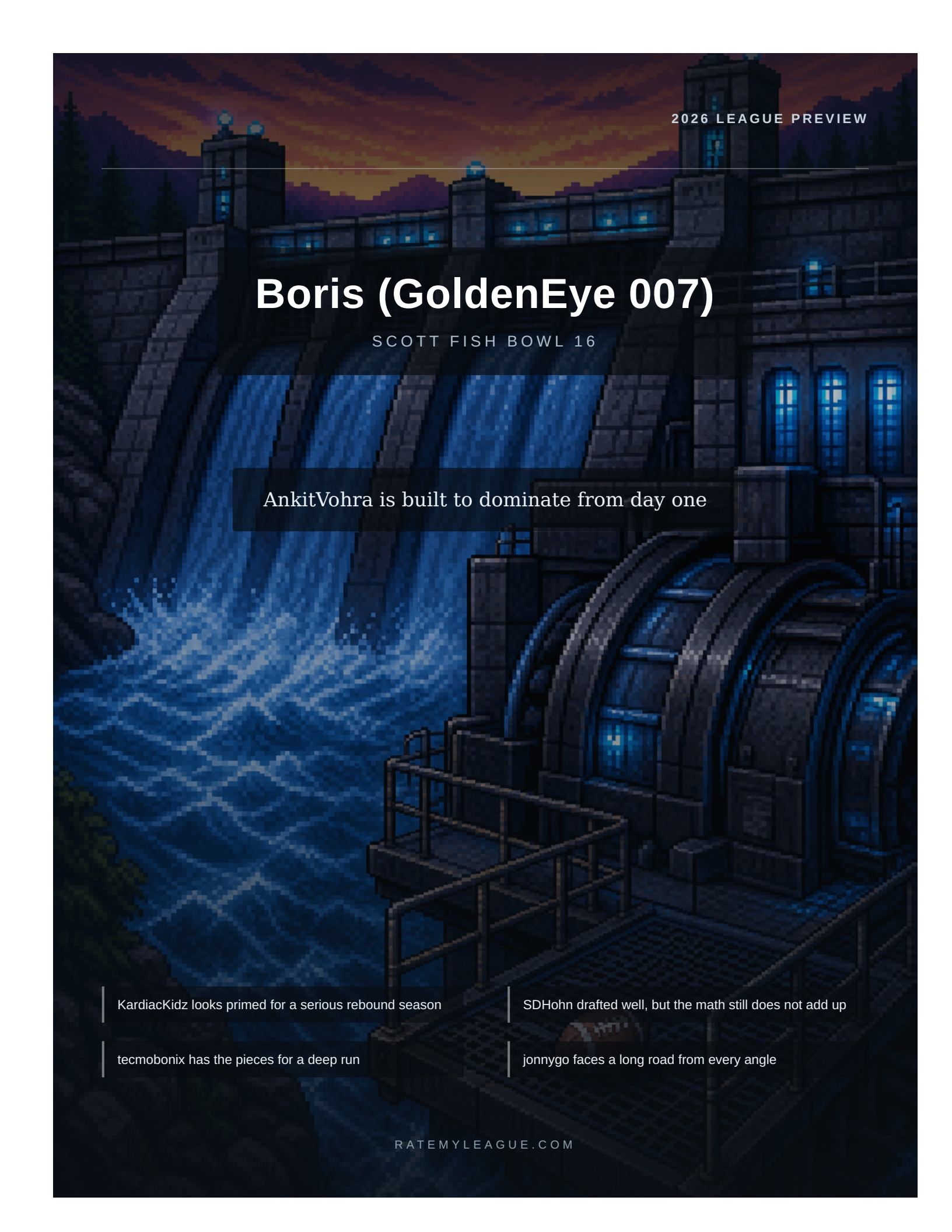

There is no spin available for jonnygo, and the draft log does not suggest any was attempted. The most damning entry is RJ Harvey, pulled off the board at 7.09 when his ADP sat at 10.05, a two-and-a-half-round overpay for a player projecting as RB28. That kind of aggression might be forgivable once, but jonnygo ran it back with Kyle Monangai at 9.09 against an ADP of 12.01, and then again with Trey Benson at 18.04 against an ADP of 21.06. Three major reaches, zero steals, and a 2025 record of 9-27 that placed this roster in the 12th percentile of scoring. The good news, if you are determined to find some, is that Drake Maye and Lamar Jackson form a legitimate QB anchor, and Malik Nabers gives the lineup a genuine WR12. But in a positionless format where sheer player quality decides everything, a draft built on anxious early triggers rather than value accumulation leaves jonnygo projected dead last in the Boris division.

There is a particular kind of fantasy misery reserved for teams that drafted sensibly and still ended up nowhere, and gilgameshman6 appears to be living it in 2026. The roster sits at the 14th percentile tournament-wide and 11th in the Boris division, and the draft offers almost no explanation for optimism: 15 chalk picks, zero steals, and a best-available find that amounts to Geno Smith sliding a round and a half. The foundation is real, Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and James Cook at RB5 give this team a legitimate floor, but the receiver group fades fast, with Jordan Addison projected as the weakest projected starter at WR43 and nothing behind him that changes the math. Trevor Lawrence, a minor reach at QB10, is good enough if everything breaks right, and everything breaking right is precisely the kind of conditional sentence that haunts fantasy managers in November. gilgameshman6 won 61 percent of matchups last season and scored at the 72nd percentile in points. The production was there. The roster in front of them now is not.

SDHohn drafted like someone who read every ADP sheet twice and still got mugged by the math. The value was real: Jalen Nailor fell nearly three rounds before being scooped at 16.10, C.J. Stroud slid more than a round past his number, and across the whole board there were fourteen chalk picks and only one true reach worth worrying about. That is a disciplined draft. And yet the team sits 10th in the Boris division, projecting in the 20th percentile of the field, because patience and process do not override the underlying talent ceiling. The top of the roster is Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1, which is a genuine anchor, but the receiving corps projects weakly and the best quarterback situation is Justin Herbert, who has watched his pass attempts slide under Jim Harbaugh and now faces another offensive identity shift with Mike McDaniel. Herbert could break out or he could be a game-manager with a ceiling again. That uncertainty is baked into every projection here, and there are not enough proven names behind him to absorb the variance.

There is no sugarcoating the arithmetic here. StickyZ enters 2026 sitting ninth in the Boris Division and in just the 22nd percentile of the field, and the roster, stripped of flattery, does not offer much reason to revise that forecast upward. The top of the lineup is genuinely strong, Josh Allen at QB1 and Tucker Kraft at TE5 giving the team a real foundation, but the supporting cast grades out as a slow leak rather than a burst pipe. The wide receiver group is where hope goes to quietly retire: D.J. Moore at WR26 is a projected starter, and after him the next meaningful name is Tyreek Hill at a projected WR77, a player StickyZ reached roughly 2.7 rounds ahead of consensus to acquire. That is a steep price for a depth piece. Meanwhile, the draft generated zero steals and two major reaches, meaning the manager paid tomorrow's prices for today's uncertainty and did not find a single bargain to offset it. Last season's 44th-percentile finish already felt modest. This one is shaping up to be worse.

There is no gentle way to frame what tefirman51 is looking at heading into 2026: a roster sitting at the 23rd percentile of the field, ranked eighth in the Boris Division, with almost no obvious path back to relevance. The backfield is genuinely impressive, with Bijan Robinson (RB2), Saquon Barkley (RB8), and Derrick Henry (RB12) all projected starters, and the tight end group around Kyle Pitts (TE7), Sam LaPorta (TE8), and George Kittle (TE9) looks similarly deep on paper. But that last name carries an asterisk within the asterisk: Kittle is recovering from an Achilles tear, and "on track for Week 1" is the kind of optimism that has burned fantasy managers before. Strip away the hope on Kittle, and what this roster actually lacks is any quarterback worth starting with confidence, with Kyler Murray (QB19) and Cam Ward (QB23) headlining a QB room that grades out as genuinely weak. The draft offered almost no relief, producing zero steals against six reaches. tefirman51 has built a foundation that looks strong at first glance but is quietly undermined at the position that matters most.

The 2026 outlook for fammirantetfj is about as encouraging as a rain delay in the fourth quarter. Sitting seventh in the Boris Division and projected at just the 25th tournament percentile, this roster has real problems at the top, where it counts most. The wide receiver group grades out weak, with Emeka Egbuka at WR18 leading the way and DK Metcalf at WR36 as the next projected starter, which is a thin ceiling for a field this competitive. The draft process made things worse, not better: four major reaches, including Sean Tucker taken nearly five rounds before his ADP and Ray Davis gobbled up 3.6 rounds early, which means fammirantetfj paid premium prices for players ranked RB65 and RB62 respectively. Brock Bowers at TE1 and Colston Loveland at TE3 are genuine assets, and the Caleb Williams and Loveland stack has real upside, but when your weakest projected starter is Rhamondre Stevenson at RB31, the margin for error is essentially zero and this roster has already spent most of it at the draft table.

Lara21 sits sixth in the Boris Division and in just the 31st percentile of the field, and the draft record does little to inspire confidence in a turnaround. The roster leans heavily on chalk, and where lara21 did deviate from consensus, the results were mostly costly: J.K. Dobbins, the team's weakest projected starter at RB36, was pulled two full rounds ahead of his ADP, buying a back projected firmly in the second tier of the position at a first-tier price. Jaxson Smith-Njigba at WR3 is a genuine anchor and De'Von Achane at RB6 gives the lineup real upside, but the supporting cast falls off quickly, with Marvin Harrison Jr. sitting at WR33 and Kyren Williams at RB15 carrying the bulk of the secondary production. Those two were the team's best draft values, yet even they were reaches relative to ADP. There is no hidden gem waiting to be discovered here, no late-round lottery ticket that changes the math. This roster is largely what it looks like, and what it looks like is a team that will be fighting for scraps come October.

SamFactor did not build this roster with one giant swing. They built it pick by pick, and the ledger reflects that: three values, thirteen chalk, and only one major reach across the entire draft. That one reach, Brock Purdy at QB13 taken a round and a half early in the fourth, is the one moment worth scrutinizing, though landing Patrick Mahomes at QB12 and stacking him with Travis Kelce at TE10 gives this team a weekly floor that most managers would envy. The real backbone, though, is the running back group, where Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 form a top tier that compounds nicely with George Pickens at WR10 and Luther Burden at WR22 providing consistent upside in the passing game. Sitting fifth in the Boris Division and at the 50th tournament percentile heading into 2026, SamFactor is not a trendy pick, but a 2025 campaign that finished in the 61st percentile in scoring suggests this team quietly knows what it is doing.

PistolPete98 sits at 77th percentile heading into 2026, and the draft record tells the story cleanly: no splashy steals, just a roster built round by round by a manager who consistently got value. The foundation is Puka Nacua at WR1, snagged six picks past his ADP, which is the kind of quiet win that compounds over a full season. DeVonta Smith at WR14 adds genuine upside, because this is the year Smith finally runs a receiver room outright, with A.J. Brown gone to New England and a collection of unproven targets behind him in Philadelphia. Terry McLaurin at WR24 and Christian Watson at WR28 round out a receiver group that would carry most rosters on its own, and Joe Burrow at QB4 gives the whole lineup a reliable ceiling. Even late in the draft, PistolPete98 found Michael Pittman at WR44 and Ryan Flourney at WR69 after both slid past their ADPs. There is no single headline pick here, just a draft where almost every decision came out slightly ahead, and that tends to add up.

Sitting third in the division and in the top 10 percent of the field, tecmobonix built this roster the way good teams actually get built: not with one headline swing, but by winning the small edges over and over. The clearest example is the receiver group, where Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and CeeDee Lamb at WR5 form a top-end that most managers would sign off on immediately, and Garrett Wilson came along at WR17 after sliding more than a round past his ADP. Tyler Warren fell nearly a round late at TE4, which is the kind of quiet gift that separates a good draft from a great one. Add a Dak Prescott and Lamb stack to the mix and there is legitimate upside baked into the ceiling, not just the floor. The weakest projected starter is Jaylen Warren at RB27, which is a real number but not a crisis in a positionless format where the stronger players at the top of this roster do the heavy lifting. After a 99th-percentile scoring season in 2025, the expectation here is continuation, not correction.

After finishing in the bottom 19 percent of the field in 2026 scoring, KardiacKidz enters 2026 looking less like a team in rebuild mode and more like a reckoning arriving on schedule. The engine of this revival is a receiver corps that reads like a fever dream, anchored by Ja'Marr Chase at WR2, Drake London at WR7, and Nico Collins at WR9, three projected starters who would headline most rosters on their own before you even get to Zay Flowers at WR16 and Jameson Williams at WR21. The quarterback situation is steadier than it looks: Jared Goff has quietly finished as a top 10 quarterback four straight seasons in six-point passing leagues, and his stack with Williams gives this team a built-in ceiling booster on the right week. Bo Nix arriving as a value at QB15, taken a full round and a half past his ADP, adds genuine depth without sacrificing anything. The 92nd percentile tournament projection and second-place division standing are not projections built on hope. They are built on firepower, and 2025's wreckage has never looked like better fuel.

AnkitVohra sits atop the Boris Division and in the 99th percentile of the entire field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. Thirteen values, zero reaches, zero steals needed because the board kept delivering. Justin Jefferson at WR6 slid past his ADP, A.J. Brown at WR8 followed right behind him, and Trey McBride at TE2 anchors a tight end group that adds Harold Fannin at TE6, Jake Ferguson at TE12, and Dallas Goedert at TE15, every one of them taken at a discount. That is not luck, that is a manager who knew his prices and waited. The discipline extends all the way down the roster, where Matthew Stafford at QB14 fell a full round and a half and Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 dropped more than a round before AnkitVohra scooped him up. The weakest projected starter on this team is Goedert at TE15. Most managers would frame that as a strength. AnkitVohra built a roster where it reads like a minor quibble.
