There is no charitable read on WxFan21's 2026 draft, and the numbers do not care about your feelings. The most damning entry in the ledger is Travis Etienne, hauled in at pick 3.11 despite an ADP of 6.07, a two-and-a-half-round overpay for an RB18 projection that would have been a perfectly fine consolation prize in the sixth round and is a roster-defining mistake in the third. The reaches did not stop there. Skyler Bell, a WR103, was taken nearly seven rounds before the market said to, which is less a draft pick than a declaration of personal conviction against all available evidence. CeeDee Lamb and Drake London are genuinely good, and WxFan21 should light a candle for them every morning, because without that top-end receiver production this roster has nothing to hide behind. Sitting 12th in the Baron Samedi division and in the bottom tenth of the field, this team looks exactly like what it is: a draft that kept reaching and never stopped paying for it.

There is no sugarcoating what MattHicks is working with in the Baron Samedi division this season. Sitting 11th in the division and in just the 14th percentile of the field, this roster is projecting to struggle, and the draft did little to change the trajectory, producing zero steals and fourteen chalk picks across eighteen rounds. The top of the lineup is genuinely fine: Trey McBride at TE2 is a legitimate anchor, and Omarion Hampton at RB9 and Jeremiyah Love at RB13 give the backfield real promise. But once you move past those three names, the floor drops fast. The projected starters at receiver, Carnell Tate at WR29, Jordyn Tyson at WR34, Makai Lemon at WR40, and Xavier Worthy at WR49, form a group where WR49 is the weakest projected starter, which tells you something uncomfortable about the ceiling here. Caleb Williams at QB6 is encouraging, but a strong signal caller cannot carry a roster this thin in its supporting cast. MattHicks needed a draft that created leverage and got one that simply colored inside the lines.

NickRock21 sits 10th in the Baron Samedi division and in just the 15th percentile of the entire field, and the roster construction offers little reason for optimism. The tight end group is genuinely elite, with Tyler Warren (TE4), Tucker Kraft (TE5), Kyle Pitts (TE7), George Kittle (TE9), and Travis Kelce (TE10) all projected as starters, but in a positionless format that edge only carries so far when the rest of the lineup thins out considerably. Drake Maye (QB2) and Jayden Daniels (QB5) give NickRock21 one of the stronger quarterback situations in the field, yet those early picks came at a cost: Daniels was a major reach at 2.04 against an ADP of 2.12, and Maye was taken before his number came up as well. That draft capital could have addressed the skill positions that are now dragging this roster down, with Jayden Reed (WR48) projected as the weakest starter on the team. NickRock21 had a respectable 2025, but 2026 looks like a long climb with very few footholds left.

Browntown613 finished 64th percentile in scoring last year and somehow managed to slide to 34th percentile in the projections this time around, which tells you most of what you need to know about where this rebuild stands. The roster grades out ninth in the Baron Samedi division, and the draft did little to change the trajectory: two values against five reaches, including a haul of late-round dart throws in Kenneth Walker III and Sean Tucker that each cost capital well ahead of consensus. Walker, taken nearly a full round early at RB10, is the kind of projection that only looks good if everything breaks right. Meanwhile, the tight end situation anchors on Hunter Henry at TE18, which is a liability no matter how positionless the format gets. The one legitimate piece of hope is Bhayshul Tuten, whose path to a featured role in Jacksonville opened considerably when Travis Etienne departed for New Orleans in the offseason, but even Tuten's ceiling feels like a nice bonus rather than a roster-saving event. There is no obvious lever left to pull here, and the standings are unlikely to be kind.

Purple Pain sits at 42nd percentile and eighth in the Baron Samedi division, and the draft board doesn't offer much optimism about a turnaround. The foundation is genuinely there: Lamar Jackson at QB3 and Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 give this roster two legitimate anchors, and Smith-Njigba slipping to 1.10 against a 1.06 ADP was a minor gift. But the draft also reveals the ceiling problem. The manager burned late capital on James Conner, taken four-plus rounds before his ADP, and Trey Benson, reached nearly six rounds early, and both project as RB56 and RB64 respectively. Those are the kinds of swings that need to pay off in a big way to justify the investment, and neither player inspires that confidence. The projected weakest starter, Rhamondre Stevenson at RB31, isn't a disaster on his own, but he's the symptom of a roster where the depth behind the top two stars grades out thin and the late-round bets were expensive ones. Jackson and Smith-Njigba can carry a lot of weight, but probably not this much.

chizzill is the kind of team that wins a comfortable majority of its matchups and still finishes the season wondering what went wrong, because comfortable majorities do not win championships. The foundation is genuinely strong: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and De'Von Achane at RB6 give this roster a ceiling that most managers in the Baron Samedi division are not carrying, and Jaylen Waddle quietly upgrades his situation by leaving Miami's dysfunction for a Denver offense where Bo Nix threw more passes than anyone in the league last year. That is real. But the margins are doing a lot of heavy lifting here. Jordan Love projects as QB17, and the armor gets thin fast once you scroll past the top names. Two major reaches on draft day, including Demond Claiborne taken nearly six rounds ahead of ADP, suggest a manager willing to bet on upside that has not materialized yet. This roster sits at 51st percentile for a reason: talented enough to beat the teams below it, not quite sharp enough to scare the teams above.

Last year was a disaster, plain and simple: AZG922 finished in the 5th percentile in scoring with a 6-30 record, the kind of season that makes a manager question their life choices. The 2026 roster looks like a genuine answer to that misery. The receiver group is the engine here, led by Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4), Justin Jefferson (WR6), and George Pickens (WR10), with Malik Nabers (WR12) sitting right behind them as projected starters, a collection deep enough that this team can absorb bad weeks without spiraling the way it did in 2025. The draft process held up too, with Pickens and Rome Odunze (WR30) both landing past their ADPs, giving the roster real upside at cost. The concern is at the other end, where Daniel Jones projects as a QB25 and the tight end situation offers little comfort. Still, the positionless format rewards exactly this kind of receiver-heavy construction, and sitting at the 60th percentile overall, AZG922 looks far more like a team poised to climb than one doomed to repeat last year's bottom-feeding.

Gang Green FC is not hedging. The whole enterprise is built around Joe Burrow and Ja'Marr Chase, a QB4 and WR2 running their timing routes through the same offense, and when that stack fires, the ceiling in this field is genuinely scary. The supporting cast around them is not decoration. Jalen Hurts at QB9 gives the manager a second viable trigger, and Breece Hall at RB14 and Kyren Williams at RB15 add the kind of weekly floor that keeps a correlated roster from cratering on off weeks. The draft itself was mostly chalk, which is fine when the chalk includes a Burrow who slipped two picks past his ADP and a projected starter group that returns a 67 percent win rate and a 73rd-percentile scoring season from 2025 as its baseline. The honest concern is that correlated rosters are binary by design. If Burrow and Chase disconnect for a stretch, this roster does not have the diversified upside to paper over it. But Gang Green FC clearly made peace with that trade-off before the draft started, and at 64th percentile entering the season, the range of outcomes here is wider than most.

After finishing in the bottom 10 percent of the field in 2025, jetsmaineman has rebuilt into something genuinely formidable, and the centerpiece of that transformation is a backfield anchored by Christian McCaffrey (RB3) and James Cook (RB5), two projected starters who give this team an elite floor before the rest of the roster even enters the conversation. Layer in Cam Skattebo (RB20) and the Patrick Mahomes (QB12) and Rashee Rice (WR13) stack, and the skeleton of a legitimate contender takes shape fast. A.J. Brown (WR8) arriving as a good value at 3.07 after an ADP of 2.10 is the kind of draft-room fortune that separates good rosters from great ones. The result is a team sitting third in the division and at the 69th percentile in the field, a staggering leap from where things stood a year ago. Misery was last season's story. The rebound is now being written, and the early chapters look very, very good.

MeatMansion69 enters 2026 looking like someone who actually read the manual. The foundation is undeniable: Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 give this roster a level of backfield thunder that most managers would mortgage their picks to acquire, and the receiving corps piles on with Nico Collins at WR9, Garrett Wilson at WR17, and Ladd McConkey at WR20 all projecting as starters. What separates a good draft from a great one, though, is what you do in the middle and late rounds, and that is where MeatMansion69 truly distinguished itself. Isaiah Likely landed at TE13 nearly two full rounds after his ADP suggested he would be gone, a steal by any reasonable measure, and the discipline held all the way through round seventeen, where Pat Freiermuth came off the board at TE30 more than two rounds late. Sixteen chalk picks and zero reaches tells you everything: this manager did not panic, did not overreach, and did not leave value sitting on the table. The 69th percentile projection is the floor, not the ceiling.

Last year, AllOutBlitz finished in the bottom 7 percent of the field in scoring, a campaign so grim it practically demands a rebuttal. Consider this roster the rebuttal. The foundation is almost unfair: Jonathan Taylor projects as RB4 and was quietly grabbed past his ADP, while Brock Bowers anchors the tight end position as the TE1 in the entire field. Those two alone would make a respectable lineup. Stack Jameson Williams on top, a WR21 projection who slipped a full round past his ADP and comes paired with Jared Goff for a bonus stack, and you start to understand how dramatically the arrow has reversed. Emeka Egbuka and Mike Evans project as WR18 and WR27 respectively, giving AllOutBlitz the kind of receiver depth that makes the high-end starters even more reliable. The draft was overwhelmingly chalk, but the values that did emerge were meaningful ones. A 69th-percentile tournament ranking and second place in the Baron Samedi division suggest the league already sees what last year's results obscured: this team can play.

CGRUNE9 sits first in the Baron Samedi division and in the 96th percentile of the entire field, and neither number feels like an accident. The foundation is Puka Nacua at WR1, paired with Matthew Stafford in a stack that gives this roster a high-octane engine humming through every scoring window. From there, the draft discipline is what separates this team from the pretenders: Colston Loveland at TE3 fell nearly a full round past his ADP, DeVonta Smith at WR14 slipped a round further than he had any right to, and both landed here while other managers blinked. Fourteen chalk picks and zero reaches means CGRUNE9 never panicked, never overpaid, and never burned capital chasing a name. Ashton Jeanty at RB7 anchors the backfield with genuine upside, and the projected starter group is deep enough that the weakest link, Michael Wilson at WR39, is still a contributor most managers would happily roster. This is not a team that got lucky. This is a team that knew exactly what it was doing.
