InfAmos drafted like someone who found the cheat codes but entered them wrong. The most damning evidence sits at quarterback, where Jordan Love checks in at QB17 and C.J. Stroud at QB22, a duo that projects to bleed points in a positionless format where elite quarterback production is one of the cleanest edges available. That backfield wound up costing this team twice: once by anchoring the top of the lineup with middling output, and again because the draft capital spent reaching for Kyle Monangai 2.4 rounds early and Braelon Allen 2.7 rounds early could have bought better. Tyler Warren is legitimately good at TE4, but InfAmos grabbed him nearly a full round before his ADP too, so even the one area that projects well carries the fingerprints of a manager who paid premium on everything and got market rate back. Zero steals, zero values, three major reaches, a 2025 scoring floor at the 30th percentile, and a current division rank of 12th: the ledger does not require interpretation.

BCamara30 sits 11th in the Bond division and in just the 18th percentile of the full field, and the roster offers little reason to argue with either number. The core is anchored by Ashton Jeanty at RB7 and Drake Maye at QB2, two legitimate difference-makers, but the supporting cast falls off a cliff almost immediately. Marvin Harrison Jr. checks in at WR33 and Christian Watson at WR28, which is not the kind of receiver room that wins championships, and Juwan Johnson at TE20 is the projected weakest starter on the squad. The draft board compounds the concern: across 18 picks, BCamara30 produced zero steals and only two values of note, Tyler Shough and Zach Charbonnet, both of whom slid late rather than being outmaneuvered in the middle rounds where rosters are actually built. Last year's 52nd-percentile scoring finish looked passable on paper, but the 2026 projections suggest regression rather than a bounce-back. Jeanty and Maye are real, everything else is hope dressed up as a roster.

There is no polite way to say this: Relax Your Tight End is sitting 10th in the Bond Division and in just the 27th percentile of the field, and the draft did not offer much of a rescue. Zero steals, zero values, and two major reaches headline a haul that looks like someone drove to the store for milk and came back with a jar of pickle juice. Jonah Coleman, taken three full rounds before his ADP, and Kaytron Allen, grabbed nearly three rounds early, are the kinds of swings that only pay off if everything breaks right, and nothing about this roster suggests everything will break right. The good news is real: Josh Allen at QB1 anchors the lineup, and De'Von Achane at RB6 gives this team a genuine weekly difference-maker. But after Achane, the talent curve flattens quickly, and RJ Harvey projects as the weakest starter at RB28, which is a thin margin for error. Allen and Achane are capable of carrying a squad, but they cannot carry this one by themselves.

pciulla finished 2025 as a legitimately good team, cracking the 79th percentile in scoring, so there is some real pedigree here. But the 2026 outlook is grim, and the draft did almost nothing to change that trajectory. Out of 20 picks, pciulla landed zero steals and just one value, Jake Ferguson falling a round past his ADP, which is a thin return for a full draft. The structural problem is at receiver, where Jakobi Meyers projects as the WR45 and the best projected starter on that side of the roster. Joe Burrow and Brock Bowers give this team a legitimate ceiling at their positions, QB4 and TE1 respectively, and the running back group has real depth with Breece Hall at RB14 and Josh Jacobs at RB16. But when those top players have quiet weeks, pciulla is reaching down to names like Xavier Worthy and Rashid Shaheed to stay competitive. Sitting ninth in the Bond division and at the 33rd percentile of the field, this roster is built to survive, not to win.

Ryfo13 finished in the 76th percentile last season and arrives in 2026 looking like a team that spent the offseason quietly losing ground. The roster checks in at just the 45th tournament percentile and sits eighth in the Bond division, and the draft did little to change the trajectory. Of 19 picks, not one qualifies as a steal, one as a value, and the lone major reach, Keenan Allen at WR99, summarizes the problem neatly: ryfo13 burned a late pick on a player projected near the bottom of his position and got there nearly four rounds early. The one bright spot is Jahmyr Gibbs, a projected RB1, but a single elite player does not win tournaments, and the quarterback situation offers no comfort, with Matthew Stafford projecting as QB14 and Malik Willis as QB24 among the starters. This is a roster with a ceiling player and a floor everywhere else, the kind of team that flatters its highlight reel while the scoreboard tells a different story.

Zero RB lives at the tournament's exact midpoint, 51st percentile, and that number tells the whole story: this is a team built to compete in every game and win none of them easily. The receiver group is legitimately good, with Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, Drake London at WR7, and Chris Olave and Malik Nabers projected as WR11 and WR12 respectively, giving the lineup a real floor that most managers in the Bond division cannot match. But floors do not win championships, and the ceiling questions are real. Brock Purdy comes in as a QB13 and Baker Mayfield as a QB18, passable starters who will not blow up a scoresheet in the good way. The draft was almost entirely chalk, 18 of 20 selections at or near ADP, which means this roster is mostly what it looks like, no hidden upside baked in. Jauan Jennings falling nearly four rounds past his ADP to round 18 is the one genuine steal, but a WR63 is a lottery ticket, not a foundation. Last year's 67 percent win rate suggests this manager knows how to play close, and in a format where margins decide everything, that might be just enough.

GrandPrizeWinner is a 52nd-percentile team wearing a very convincing costume, and the margins will absolutely decide whether the disguise holds. The core is genuinely good: CeeDee Lamb (WR5) and Justin Jefferson (WR6) are legitimate difference-makers, and the Dak Prescott / Lamb stack gives the lineup a ceiling that most mid-division rosters can only dream about from a safe distance. Saquon Barkley (RB8) arriving three spots later than his ADP suggests a manager who drafts patiently rather than desperately, which is a fine character trait heading into a long season. But last year's 33% win rate and 6th-percentile scoring are the kind of numbers that don't just evaporate because the calendar flipped. The depth behind the stars fades quickly, and Kyle Pitts (TE7) will need to actually resemble a TE7 for this to work. Nothing on this roster screams disaster, nothing screams championship,

and that is precisely the problem for a team sitting 6th in the Bond Division. The margin for error here is approximately the width of a field goal upright.

There's no single moment from the #DicksOutForHarambe draft that makes you slam the table, but round after round this roster just quietly came out ahead. Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Omarion Hampton at RB9 give the lineup a foundation that most managers in this field would envy, and Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 adds a top-shelf pass catcher to sit alongside them. The draft was almost relentlessly efficient, 15 chalk picks and only one major reach in Justin Fields, who won't cost much to carry at QB38. The Jaxson Dart and Isaiah Likely stack is a sensible bonus on top of an already-settled core, and Rico Dowdle at RB32 representing the weakest projected starter tells you everything about the depth this team built. Coming off a 34th-percentile scoring season in 2025, the upgrade in top-end talent here is real. At 63rd percentile in the tournament, #DicksOutForHarambe is positioned not as a dark horse but as a team that simply did their homework and showed up ready.

Wildcat Formation finished 25-11 a year ago and came into 2026 drafting like they had something to prove, reaching on player after player and daring the consensus to disagree. The consensus, for the most part, lost. Nicholas Singleton at RB57 and Ray Davis at RB62 were each pulled two-plus rounds ahead of their ADPs, the kind of moves that get managers laughed off draft recap threads, and yet the projected starting lineup here is genuinely difficult to attack. A.J. Brown at WR8, DeVonta Smith at WR14, and Luther Burden at WR22 form a top-end receiving group that would anchor most contenders, and Trey McBride at TE2 paired with Sam LaPorta at TE8 and George Kittle at TE9 gives this roster an embarrassment of options at the position. The total bill was four minor reaches and two major ones, zero steals, and a roster that landed in the 67th percentile of the field. That is not a glowing grade on process, but process does not play games. The roster does, and this one is built to compete.

There was no lottery-ticket gamble that made jac3600's draft, just a steady accumulation of correct decisions that added up to something genuinely dangerous. The receiver group is the engine: Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 is a foundational piece any contender would build around, and the tier behind him, Garrett Wilson, Jaylen Waddle, and D.J. Moore, all projected starters, gives this roster a ceiling most managers would envy. The quarterback situation is quietly one of the draft's better outcomes, with Caleb Williams projecting as QB6 and Bo Nix landing at QB15 after sliding a full round past his ADP, a clean value that cost nothing extra. Nix also stacks with Waddle, and Williams pairs with Colston Loveland, who projects TE3, giving jac3600 two built-in correlation plays to amplify upside weeks. The running back group is the thinnest part of the projection, with Rhamondre Stevenson as the top back at RB31, but in a positionless format, that concern is mostly theoretical when the top of your roster looks like this. Third in the Bond division and sitting at the 73rd percentile, this is a team that drafted like someone who did their homework twice.

High T didn't win the draft room with one splashy pick. They won it by staying disciplined and letting the board come to them. The foundation is built around Bijan Robinson (RB2) and James Cook (RB5), a pair of projected top-five backs who give this team a floor most managers would envy, and Cook was actually available past his ADP at 2.08, making that selection a clean win before the manager ever got to round three. Trevor Lawrence (QB10) adds another layer of upside worth taking seriously: after years of unfulfilled promise, Lawrence broke through last season with over 4,000 yards, nearly 30 passing scores, and a career-high nine rushing touchdowns, doing it in one of the more unpredictable offensive environments in the league. The supporting cast fills in efficiently, with Kenneth Walker III (RB10) and Tetairoa McMillan (WR15) rounding out a starting group that projects into the upper tier of the field. The 2025 team finished at the 97th percentile in scoring. The 2026 version looks built to compete in the same zip code.

BestBallBob sits atop the Bond division and in the top 10 percent of the field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. There was no lucky home run, just a steady accumulation of edge. Lamar Jackson, projected QB3, slid nearly a full round past his ADP and landed at 2.11, a quiet steal that anchors the entire roster. From there, the pattern held: five picks that came in measurably past their average draft positions, including Chuba Hubbard at RB29 and Tony Pollard at RB30, each grabbed more than a round and a half late. On the receiving side, Puka Nacua projects as WR1, Tee Higgins as WR19, and Jameson Williams as WR21, a receiving corps that would make any manager envious. Yes, Dontayvion Wicks was the one genuine reach, taken nearly five rounds early, and Deebo Samuel cost a little extra too. But in a draft full of chalk, BestBallBob threaded enough needles to build something that looks like a division winner for a reason.
