There is no charitable read on treyj989's 2026 draft, and the numbers do not ask you to find one. Eight major reaches across the roster tell the whole story, but the one that stings most is Michael Pittman, a WR44 projection pulled four-plus rounds ahead of consensus at pick 5.10, a slot where tournament contenders are locking in foundational pieces, not gambling on a receiver who is not even a projected starter. The draft architecture around it compounds the damage: T.J. Hockenson, Michael Mayer, Tory Horton, all taken well before the market agreed they were worth selecting, all representing opportunity cost at a stage of the draft where value compounds. Amon-Ra St. Brown and A.J. Brown are legitimately elite, and a receiver corps this deep at the top can carry a lot, but treyj989 spent the middle and late rounds chasing ghosts, inflating the roster with reaches rather than building depth behind the strengths. Division rank twelve says the rest of the Boris division has already noticed. The tournament agrees: second percentile.

AndrewLeduc enters 2026 sitting 11th in the Boris Division and in just the 7th percentile of the field, and the roster makes it easy to understand why. The backfield is genuinely strong, anchored by James Cook (RB5), Ashton Jeanty (RB7), and Chase Brown (RB11), all projected starters who give this team a real foundation. The problem is everything above them. The receiver group craters fast after Luther Burden (WR22) and DK Metcalf (WR36), with Jakobi Meyers projected as the weakest starter at WR45 and nothing behind him to inspire confidence. The quarterback situation is worse: Tyler Shough (QB20) and Cam Ward (QB23) are the options, and neither one is going to save a lineup when the rest of it is struggling. What makes this harder to stomach is the draft history. Cook and Josh Jacobs both came at major reaches, which means AndrewLeduc paid early-round premiums to build a backfield that cannot carry a team by itself, while the positions that needed shoring up got whatever was left over.

Pick 11 in the Boris division is sitting at 23rd percentile and staring at a long season with very few escape hatches. The foundation looks promising enough on paper: Drake Maye and Caleb Williams give the roster genuine QB upside, and CeeDee Lamb at WR5 is the kind of anchor most managers would kill for. But the draft story underneath that surface is quietly damning. Seven minor reaches and a major reach on Kyren Williams, taken nearly two full rounds ahead of his ADP, suggest a manager who kept paying premiums to shore up depth rather than letting value come to them. The result is a roster that graded out average at running back and average at receiver, with David Njoku and Mason Taylor projecting as TE29 and TE35 respectively, which is a soft underbelly no amount of Williams-to-Odunze stack magic will paper over. When Rico Dowdle at RB32 is your projected weakest starter, you are not one waiver claim away from fixing this. The ceiling is real. The floor is right where it looks.

There is not much to celebrate in the Boris Division basement, where HateTrain sits ninth and projects out at just the 30th percentile of the field. The roster has its moments, Drake London grading out at WR7 and Trey McBride at TE2 give the team a genuine foundation, but the draft capital spent to build around those anchors was often wasted in ways that are hard to forgive. Jadarian Price, the team's weakest projected starter at RB26, was pulled off the board 2.1 rounds ahead of his ADP in Round 7, eating premium draft currency for a player who could have been had for far less. Meanwhile, the manager logged three major reaches total against zero steals, which means HateTrain consistently overpaid and never once found a bargain. The math is brutal: the upside is capped, the margins were spent before the season started, and there is no obvious lever left to pull. Derrick Henry at RB12 and London at WR7 can keep the lights on, but this roster is short on the kind of depth that wins in late October.

adoyle1994 did almost everything right in the draft. Lamar Jackson fell to pick 2.08, more than half a round past his ADP, and Baker Mayfield slid nearly two full rounds before being scooped up at 9.05. Four values, zero major reaches, and a quarterback room that looks genuinely functional. The problem is that patience in the draft room does not automatically translate to production on the field, and this roster sits at 37th percentile with a division rank of eighth to prove it. The running back group is legitimately strong, with Jahmyr Gibbs projecting as RB1 and four other backs inside RB23, but David Montgomery landing in Houston to compete with Woody Marks for a starting role is the kind of depth that looks better on paper than it performs in practice. Beyond that running back depth, the projected starters thin out quickly, with Marvin Harrison Jr. projecting as WR33 and Kenyon Sadiq as TE21 anchoring the rest of the lineup. adoyle1994 played the process correctly and still drew a bad outcome, which is the part of fantasy football no draft strategy can fully insure against.

I am in-VINC-EE-ble! didn't build this roster on one flashy move. It was built pick by pick, with five value selections against the field and a draft that largely held the line on discipline. Josh Allen landing at 1.09 when his ADP sat at 1.05 is a small thing, but small things compound, and the same logic applies to Justin Jefferson slipping to 2.04 despite an ADP of 1.12, a meaningful gain on a WR6 projection. The Allen and D.J. Moore stack gives the team a connected upside thread that doesn't depend on everything breaking right at once. Tyler Warren, Sam LaPorta, and George Kittle form a projected starting group that sits among the stronger positional collections in the field, with Kittle himself arriving a full round past his ADP at TE9. The one blemish is Rachaad White, a 2.9-round reach at RB39 that stands as the lone major reach in an otherwise measured draft. Sitting 57th percentile and sixth in the Boris Division, this team isn't a contender yet, but it earned its spot in the conversation.

halfpointssuck sits at the 57th percentile, which is exactly the kind of placement that keeps you up at night without ever giving you a real reason to panic. The margins here are not abstract, they are named Brock Bowers and Joe Burrow. Bowers projects as TE1 and Burrow as QB4, and in a positionless format those are the kinds of anchors that do not just pad a lineup, they decide whether a close week tips your way or theirs. The problem is that Jordan Addison, the weakest projected starter at WR43, was the draft's biggest value play, taken 2.5 rounds after his ADP, and value is only useful if the player delivers. If Addison earns that roster spot, this team has enough upside at the top to beat divisions, not just fill them. If he does not, halfpointssuck is exactly what their division rank of seventh suggests: a team that wins the weeks it should and loses the ones that matter by a possession. The margin between those two outcomes is thinner than the name implies.

Last year, George Seiferts Shades finished in the bottom 7 percent of scoring, and that kind of season leaves a mark. The 2026 version of this roster looks like a team that did its homework over the offseason. The headliner is Jayden Daniels, projected at QB5 and stacked with Terry McLaurin, giving this team a high-ceiling connection at the top of the lineup. Jalen Hurts at QB9 adds a second elite arm, and the manager landed both past their ADPs, which matters in a draft where patience is usually punished. De'Von Achane at RB6 gives the team a genuine weekly difference-maker, and Puka Nacua at WR1 is the kind of top-end receiver that last year's squad simply did not have. Dalton Kincaid and Dallas Goedert, projected at TE11 and TE15 respectively, provide starter-quality depth at tight end, with Kincaid arriving more than a round after his ADP. Sitting at the 75th percentile of the field, this is a roster built to bury the memory of 2025 and it has the pieces to do exactly that.

There was no single moment in mreedy29's draft that made the room stop and stare, and that's exactly the point. This is a roster built on accumulation, the kind where you look up after fifteen rounds and realize the ground has quietly shifted in one manager's favor. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Jonathan Taylor at RB4 give the lineup a foundation that most teams in the Boris division would envy, and Trevor Lawrence arriving 1.2 rounds past his ADP is the sort of quiet transaction that separates disciplined drafters from everyone else. Lawrence's context matters here too: a career year built on nearly 30 passing scores and 9 rushing touchdowns, achieved almost in spite of his supporting cast, suggests a quarterback who has genuinely arrived rather than borrowed someone else's ceiling. Pair him with Malik Nabers via the Dart stack and the offense has real connective tissue. No heists, no theatrics, just a draft that consistently came out ahead. The 76th percentile projection and last year's 92nd percentile scoring say the same thing in different languages.

Expedition SFB16 sits at 76th percentile and third in the division, and the draft sheet explains exactly why: this roster was built with patience and precision. The receiver group is the engine, anchored by Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and fanning out through George Pickens, Chris Olave, Jameson Williams, and Jaylen Waddle, all projected starters, all acquired without panic. But the real craftsmanship shows in the value column. Kyle Pitts landed at TE7 nearly two rounds after his ADP suggested he would. C.J. Stroud slid more than five full rounds past his ADP, gifting the team a QB22 at the back end of the draft at a price that would embarrass most buyers. Pile on values at Woody Marks and Brian Robinson and you have a roster where almost nothing was overpaid for. One minor reach on Kaytron Allen at the end barely registers against thirteen chalk picks and four genuine bargains. Expedition SFB16 did not get lucky. It drafted like it had done this before.

There was no lottery ticket moment in wahoomustang's draft, no desperate swing at upside that either makes or breaks a season. What there was, consistently, was patience turning into profit. Patrick Mahomes slid to the seventh round despite projecting as QB12, and wahoomustang was there. Harold Fannin, projecting TE6, fell a round and a half past his ADP and landed quietly in round six. Dak Prescott, a projected QB7, arrived more than a round late. None of those acquisitions made headlines on draft day, and that was precisely the point. Add Saquon Barkley and Jaxon Smith-Njigba as cornerstones, with Omarion Hampton projecting as RB9 giving the lineup a second elite backfield option, and the floor here is genuinely high. The weakest projected starter is Makai Lemon at WR40, which is a remarkably comfortable worst-case scenario. Sitting second in the Boris Division and 86th

percentile tournament-wide, wahoomustang did not outsmart the room on one spectacular pick. It just never let the room outsmart it.

BijanDijon sits atop the Boris Division and in the 96th percentile of the field, and the blueprint is almost annoyingly sensible: no lottery tickets, no panic, just a draft that consistently extracted more than it paid for. Jordan Love came off the board at 8.12 despite an ADP of 7.06, Brian Thomas Jr. landed at 9.01 when the market had him priced a round and a half earlier, and Justin Herbert fell a full 1.3 rounds before this team scooped him up as a QB8 anchor. That disciplined accumulation shows up across the projected starters, where Bijan Robinson projects as RB2, Nico Collins sits at WR9, and Tetairoa McMillan adds WR15 value that also arrived slightly late to its price. The Love and Christian Watson stack layers in a secondary scoring ceiling that makes the whole construction feel less like a collection of individual wins and more like a coherent argument. After a middling 2025 finish, BijanDijon has built the kind of roster that does not need things to break right because it already did the breaking in the draft room.
