JoeySweats went 25-11 last year and scored in the 87th percentile, which is the kind of résumé that earns you quiet respect walking into a draft room. The 2026 roster, however, is not cashing those checks. The team sits at the 8th percentile in tournament scoring projections and ranks 12th in the division, and the gap between where JoeySweats has been and where this roster projects to go is genuinely uncomfortable to stare at. The foundation is real: Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Jonathan Taylor at RB4 give the lineup a bruising core, and Taylor arriving as a value at 2.05 against a 2.01 ADP is at least a minor consolation. But the draft leaned heavy on quarterbacks early, with Jaxson Dart taken 1.8 rounds before his ADP and Cam Ward pulled nearly three full rounds ahead of his. Ward projects as the weakest starter on the roster, and Tennessee's upgraded weapons around him might clarify his ceiling more than raise it. When three of your major reaches are quarterbacks and a late-round running back, last year's percentile stops feeling like a foundation and starts feeling like a farewell.

Ryanh had a genuinely good 2025, finishing at 67 percent wins and in the 72nd percentile in scoring, which makes what comes next feel a little cruel. The 2026 projections have this roster sitting 10th in the Jaws division and in just the 18th percentile of the field, and the draft did not do much to change that trajectory. There were no steals, six minor reaches, and one major one in Stefon Diggs, a WR56 taken nearly three rounds before his ADP would have suggested. The QB situation looks promising on paper, with Lamar Jackson projected as QB3 and Justin Herbert as QB8, but in a positionless format the ceiling of your starters matters as much as your depth, and beyond Jackson and Herbert the cupboard gets thin fast. Ashton Jeanty projects as RB7 and George Pickens as WR10, but the projected starters after them grade out as largely middling contributors, and Terrance Ferguson at TE28 offers almost nothing at the position. Ryanh is not rebuilding, exactly. The team just looks like one where the good pieces are not quite good enough and there are no remaining levers to pull.

There is something exhausting about watching a 94th-percentile team try to defend its own reputation. Jaws of Victory sits 11th in the division and projects at just the 18th percentile this year, and the draft record does a reasonable job of explaining why. Three major reaches, zero steals, and an early-round gamble on Matthew Stafford at QB14 that cost roughly three and a half rounds of draft capital are not the fingerprints of a team building on last year's foundation. Josh Allen anchors the roster and is genuinely good, but Stafford's presence as a projected co-starter means real draft equity went somewhere it probably should not have. Sam LaPorta was pulled nearly a round and a half before his price, and Rhamondre Stevenson, projected the weakest starter on the board, was taken almost two rounds early. Drake London and Zay Flowers give this team a real ceiling, but ceilings require floors, and right now the floor looks like a team that spent 2025's goodwill instead of building on it.

JonyMaine37185 drafted with genuine discipline, collecting value after value and finishing with just one major reach on the entire board, yet the roster still lands 9th in the Jaws division and in the 34th percentile of the field, which is the kind of outcome that makes you question whether process matters at all. The foundation is legitimately strong: Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Colston Loveland at TE3 are the kind of anchors most managers would trade a kidney for, and Rashee Rice at WR13 and Jaylen Waddle at WR23 give the lineup real depth behind them. But the engine sputters when you reach the backfield, where Chase Brown at RB11 is the only back projected to do anything meaningful before the drop-off arrives fast and hard. The quarterback situation is worse: Baker Mayfield at QB18 and Kyler Murray at QB19 are the starters, and Murray cost a reach at that. There are good players here. The math simply does not cooperate, and good process without a good outcome is just a participation trophy with better footnotes.

Diarrhea Lettuce arrives in 2026 sitting at 45th percentile in the field and eighth in the Jaws division, which is a tough place to be when the roster offers no obvious escape hatch. The backfield is genuinely strong, Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and James Cook at RB5 give this team a real foundation, but the wide receiver group is where the floor caves in, with Luther Burden projecting as a WR22 and the cupboard getting thin fast after that. The draft strategy didn't help matters: four major reaches, including Carson Beck pulled 7.7 rounds ahead of his ADP and Xavier Worthy grabbed two full rounds early, are the kinds of bets that look fine if they hit and quietly sink a season if they don't. The Patrick Mahomes and Travis Kelce stack is a legitimate luxury, but Mahomes projects as QB12 rather than the slam-dunk QB1 of seasons past, meaning this team is counting on a lot of things breaking right at once. Right now, the math just isn't cooperating.

StadiumRantCEO is the fantasy equivalent of a team that finishes 9-8 and spends the offseason arguing it deserved better, and honestly, they might have a point. The core is genuinely solid: Drake Maye at QB2 and Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 give this roster a ceiling that seventh in the Jaws division does not fully reflect, and a 51st percentile tournament projection is the kind of number that either looks embarrassingly low in hindsight or exactly right depending on which version of Breece Hall shows up at RB14. The draft was almost aggressively safe, with 14 chalk picks, no steals, and one real value in Jayden Daniels landing three rounds past his expected ADP. The reach that stings is Kimani Vidal, taken more than four rounds early for a player projected RB60, the sort of speculative late-round swing that rarely changes a season but can absolutely decide a close week. This is a team that wins in the margins when everything clicks and loses in the margins when it does not, and in the Scott Fish Bowl, that is most of the teams that ever mattered.

Dirty Mike and the Boyz sits at the 51st percentile, which is about as middle of the road as it gets, and the roster reflects exactly that. The foundation is genuinely strong: Bijan Robinson (RB2) and Omarion Hampton (RB9) give this team a high floor every single week, and Malik Nabers (WR12), Tetairoa McMillan (WR15), and Ladd McConkey (WR20) form a receiving group that can hang with almost anyone in the Jaws division. The problem is that the margins punish teams that draft chalk, and this roster is overwhelmingly chalk, with 14 such picks against zero steals. The one area where the manager showed conviction, a four-plus round reach on Trey Benson (RB64), lands on a player projected well outside the relevant tier. Meanwhile, the quarterback situation is quietly the season's hinge: Jordan Love (QB17) and C.J. Stroud (QB22) are both projected starters, both injury-flagged, and Stroud is the weakest projected starter on the roster. When the margins decide a season, a shaky QB room is exactly where those margins come due.

The board had opinions about 007th Pick, and those opinions were mostly wrong. The most glaring example is Tyler Allgeier, taken nearly four rounds ahead of his ADP, a move that looks reckless on paper until you consider what surrounds him: Jeremiyah Love at RB13 and Javonte Williams at RB17, both projected starters who came to this manager at a discount, Love falling over a round past his ADP and Williams sliding a full two rounds. That is not a lucky accident alongside a bad decision, that is a manager who clearly had a board and trusted it in both directions. The same conviction shows at tight end, where Brock Bowers at TE1 and Tyler Warren at TE4 form a projected-starter duo that most teams in this field simply cannot match. Six reaches against three values is not a clean draft record, and a 52nd-percentile tournament ranking reflects that honestly. But this roster has genuine upside baked into its best players, and that is usually the part that matters when the season gets interesting.

peterh413 didn't make headlines on draft day, and that's kind of the point. There was no lottery-ticket swing, no moment where the room collectively gasped. Instead, pick after pick landed slightly ahead of schedule, and the cumulative effect is a receiver group that reads like a fever dream: Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, A.J. Brown at WR8, Nico Collins at WR9, and Chris Olave at WR11, all projected starters, all acquired with the kind of quiet efficiency that only shows up when you study the final board. Olave alone fell nearly a full round past his ADP, and the pattern held all draft long, six values total with zero major reaches to offset them. The QB situation with Jared Goff is modest, but Goff stacks with Jameson Williams, which at least adds a connective tissue play to the ceiling. A 2025 campaign that finished in the 28th percentile in scoring is the only real shadow here, but this roster looks considerably sharper than that, and 66th percentile tournament standing suggests the rest of the field is starting to notice.

There was no lottery ticket moment in tlussier12's draft, no swinging for the fences on a polarizing name, just round after round of coming out slightly ahead. That discipline shows up most clearly at tight end, where Trey McBride (TE2) and Kyle Pitts (TE7) give this roster a positional advantage that most managers spend entire drafts chasing and never find. The value picks reinforce the same picture: DeVonta Smith (WR14) slipped a round and a half past his ADP and landed exactly where tlussier12 was waiting, and Keaton Mitchell (RB49) followed nearly two rounds later than he should have. The Jalen Hurts and Smith stack adds a correlation bonus on top of already strong individual projections. One minor reach on Tank Bigsby (RB55) barely dents the ledger. The result is a team sitting third in the division and at the 71st percentile of the field, not because of one spectacular swing, but because the math kept breaking the right way.

DisfattBidge70 lands at second in the Jaws division and the 87th percentile of the field, and the draft tells you exactly how it happened: no flashy heists, just a manager who kept finding players after their average draft position had already come and gone. Five values across the roster, and the best of them land in the spots that matter most. CeeDee Lamb at WR5 and Justin Jefferson at WR6 form a top-end that most managers in this field would trade a late-round pick to own, and Emeka Egbuka at WR18 arrived a full round and a half late, quietly making that group even harder to beat. On the ground, Travis Etienne slid a round and a half past his number too, giving DisfattBidge70 a projected starter at RB18 at a steep discount. The quarterback room is where projection has real work to do, with Tyler Shough checking in at QB20, but in a positionless format, the ceiling on this roster is set by Lamb and Jefferson, and that ceiling is very high.

Gonna Need A Bigger Boat didn't win its division on the back of one splashy move. It won by drafting consistently well and letting the small edges compound. Tucker Kraft falling more than two rounds past his ADP to land at 7.02 is the clearest example, turning a TE5 projection into one of the best value acquisitions in the Jaws division. George Kittle arriving at 8.11 despite a TE9 projection added another layer to a position group that quietly became one of the team's best assets. The top of the roster is legitimate: Puka Nacua projects as WR1, Saquon Barkley sits at RB8, and Joe Burrow comes in at QB4 after sliding half a round past his ADP. The one projection worth watching is Michael Pittman, who projects WR44 and now heads to Pittsburgh to catch passes from an Aaron Rodgers at 43 alongside a new coaching staff still searching for an identity. If that offense never clicks, Pittman stays on the bench. But this team is built well enough that it barely needs him to.
