The Original Rump Shakers sit at the bottom of the Mayday division, and the draft board tells you exactly why. Four major reaches across the roster signal a manager who was chasing players rather than taking them, and the damage shows up where it hurts most. Chigoziem Okonkwo, projected TE19, cost a third-round premium over his ADP, which is a remarkable price to pay for a player who projects as a fringe starter. Josh Downs, projected WR46, was yanked three rounds early, and Elijah Sarratt, projected WR98, was taken four rounds ahead of consensus in a late round where patience is the only virtue left. Meanwhile, Kyren Williams, projected RB15, was reached on by nearly two rounds in round four, a slot where the board tends to punish aggression. Jonathan Taylor is real, Colston Loveland is real, and there are genuine pieces here, but this roster reads like a manager who fell in love with targets and stopped trusting the board. Sitting in the 6th percentile of the field, the Rump Shakers aren't just projected to struggle. They drafted their way there.

There is no polite way to dress this up: RajinCajin enters 2026 ranked 11th in the Mayday division and in just the 9th percentile of the entire field, and the roster largely earns that grade. The receiver group carries real names, Nico Collins at WR9, Brian Thomas Jr. at WR31, Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33, but six of those projected starters cluster between WR21 and WR33, a band of players who are fine without being decisive. Brock Bowers at TE1 is genuinely elite, and the Brock Purdy and George Kittle stack gives the manager something to root for on Sundays, but Purdy grades out as a QB13 in a positionless format where the quarterback spot was never a priority to begin with. The deeper problem is that the backfield offers almost nothing to lean on, with the best available option projecting as RB51, and the draft sheet shows six minor reaches and one major one in Jameson Williams at WR21, taken nearly two rounds early. Last year's 69 percent win rate feels like a high-water mark that the current roster is not built to match.

Motor City Mayhem sits at 15th percentile in the field and dead last in the Mayday Division, and the draft record explains exactly how they got there: zero steals, four major reaches, and the creative confidence of someone who needed to be talked out of every single pick. The most egregious offense is Tyquan Thornton, a WR97 taken at pick 11.03 against an ADP of 21.10, a full ten-and-a-half rounds early, which means this manager burned a premium selection on a player the rest of the field considered a late-flier dart throw. Jaylin Noel arrived six rounds ahead of schedule at WR83, and Jayden Reed came in three-and-a-half rounds early at WR48. The foundation is real, Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and De'Von Achane at RB6 give this team a credible top end, and Achane was actually a genuine value. But when the middle and back of your draft reads like a series of hunches that nobody else shared, Gibbs and Achane are just two good players asked to carry a roster that its own manager didn't trust the process to build correctly.

DrakeMayeLover enters 2026 sitting ninth in the Mayday division and in the bottom 20th percentile of the field, and the roster does not hide why. The foundation is real: Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Drake Maye at QB2 give this team a legitimate ceiling, and Tucker Kraft at TE5 adds another high-end piece. But the drop-off is steep, and there is no disguising it. Jaylen Warren projects as the weakest starter on this roster at RB27, and when your floor rests on Warren, you are one bad week away from a collapse. The draft offered no margin for error either, producing zero steals and zero values across 20 picks, with the lone notable deviation being Bo Nix taken two full rounds ahead of his ADP. Nix may work out, but reaching on a QB15 when you already own Maye is the kind of move that costs you the flexibility a bottom-tier roster desperately needs. Maye is a fun name for a team identity. It is not, by itself, a fantasy football strategy.

nate2616 enters 2026 sitting eighth in the Mayday division and right at the 45th percentile of the field, which is a polite way of saying there is no margin for error and no obvious path to creating one. The roster has real pieces: Trey McBride at TE2, A.J. Brown at WR8, and Chase Brown at RB11 form a legitimate core. The problem is how this draft was constructed around them. Five major reaches in a single draft is a quiet disaster, and the damage shows up in the middle and late rounds where nate2616 burned picks early on Matthew Stafford, Kirk Cousins, and Michael Mayer when the market said each of those players would still have been available later. Those misallocated picks left the back end of the roster thin on upside, and Kenyon Sadiq projecting as the weakest starter at TE21 is the kind of depth tax you pay for aggressive misdrafting up the board. McBride and Brown can carry a team, but not when the supporting cast was assembled with one hand tied behind its back.

No RB No Party sits at 59th percentile, which is the fantasy equivalent of a restaurant with a 3.2-star rating on Yelp: not bad enough to avoid, not good enough to recommend without hesitation. The foundation is legitimately strong, Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Tyler Warren at TE4 give this roster two anchor-quality pieces, and the manager drafted shrewdly enough to land Jeremiyah Love at RB13, Javonte Williams at RB17, and Quinshon Judkins at RB22 all past their ADPs. That is real depth, and in a positionless format, depth converts directly into lineup flexibility. But the margins are where this team gets complicated. Warren was reached a full round early at pick 2.04, and Sean Tucker, taken 3.3 rounds ahead of his RB65 projection, is the kind of late-round gamble that quietly costs a win or two when it does not pay off. Jalen Hurts and Trevor Lawrence project as QB9 and QB10 respectively, which is functional but not a separator. This roster is built to go 7-7 and spend October wondering what went wrong, or right.

Sampson didn't win the draft on one flashy pick. They won it by accumulating small edges across nearly every round, and the receiver group is where that approach paid off most visibly. Ja'Marr Chase (WR2), Drake London (WR7), Chris Olave (WR11), and Zay Flowers (WR16) are all projected starters, and London alone qualified as a value, taken slightly past his ADP while delivering a top-ten projection. That is the draft in miniature: not home runs, just consistently getting a little more than you paid for. Jaxson Dart (QB11) fits the same mold, a player taken more than a round past his ADP who carries genuine upside even if his durability and passing volume remain open questions heading into the year. There is a Tyler Shough and Olave stack adding a bonus layer of ceiling. The floor concerns are real, with Dart's injury history and a 39 percent win rate last year lurking in the background, but this roster has the kind of quiet depth that tends to look smarter as a season unfolds. Sixth in the Mayday Division feels like an underestimate.

RicAvery didn't build this roster with one flashy pick. They built it by repeatedly landing players a little later than they should have been available. Breece Hall at RB14 fell a round and a half past his ADP. Tony Pollard at RB30 did the same. Zach Charbonnet at RB42 slid more than four full rounds before RicAvery scooped him up at 18.07. Stack those quiet wins alongside a projected starting corps that includes Lamar Jackson at QB3, Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, and Rashee Rice at WR13, and you have a team that earned its 64th-percentile tournament standing the unglamorous way, by consistently coming out ahead on value without forcing the moment. The one real concern is the tight end group, where Greg Dulcich and Gunnar Helm project at TE25 and TE26 respectively, and Dulcich cost a reach of nearly three rounds to get there. That position won't win RicAvery anything, but this roster has enough collective upside that it doesn't need to.

PtsbyHand23 didn't win the draft with one flashy pick. They won it by consistently coming out ahead on value, and the roster reflects exactly that. Bijan Robinson, projected RB2, slipped to pick 1.08 despite an ADP of 1.04, a small gap that nonetheless signals a manager paying attention. Ashton Jeanty at RB7 fell nearly a full round past his ADP before PtsbyHand23 scooped him up. TreVeyon Henderson at RB19 landed 1.3 rounds late. That's not luck compounding, that's a draft strategy that kept finding the market slightly wrong and capitalizing every time. The Joe Burrow and Tee Higgins stack adds connective tissue to a lineup already built on positional strength, and Mark Andrews at TE14, acquired 1.4 rounds past his ADP, quietly rounds out a group with real ceiling. The reaches on Darnell Mooney and Rashod Bateman in the late rounds are fair concerns, but they're bargaining chips in a deep pool, not anchors. Sitting at 70th percentile overall with a 4-seed in the Mayday Division, this team arrived prepared.

Cap didn't make headlines on draft day, and that's kind of the point. The most telling number on this roster isn't any single player's rank, it's the four values against just two reaches, a quiet signal that Cap consistently let the board come to him rather than forcing moves. Kyle Pitts at TE7 is the clearest example: a projected starter secured a round and a half after his ADP, a small edge that compounds when it shows up again and again. The receiver group is where that patience really accumulates. Puka Nacua at WR1, George Pickens at WR10, Emeka Egbuka at WR18, and Jaylen Waddle at WR23 form a projected starting corps that would make most managers in this field quietly nervous. The Baker Mayfield and Egbuka stack adds a correlation bonus on top of it all. Cap lands at 71st percentile in the tournament and third in the division, a reflection of a draft that never needed a signature moment because it kept winning the small ones.

matthewdwood82 didn't win the 2026 draft with one flashy move. He won it by consistently coming out ahead, pick after pick. James Cook, the RB5, slid to 2.08 when his ADP sat at 2.04, a small gap that still counts. Harold Fannin fell a full 1.3 rounds to 6.08, landing matthewdwood82 a TE6 at a discount most managers didn't see coming. Malik Nabers arrived at 4.08 despite an ADP of 3.11, and David Montgomery followed the same script, tumbling 1.3 rounds to give the roster a legitimate RB23 well below market rate. None of these are lottery-ticket gambles, they're the quiet accumulation of edge that separates good drafts from great ones. Add the Jayden Daniels and Terry McLaurin stack and a projected top six percent finish, and this roster looks less like a construction project and more like a finished product. Sometimes the most admirable thing a manager can do is simply not make mistakes.

Peteroverzet sits first in the Mayday division and in the 96th percentile of the entire field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. Seven values, zero reaches, and a roster that reads like someone actually did their homework before draft day. The headliners are obvious: CeeDee Lamb at WR5 and Justin Jefferson at WR6 give this team a ceiling that most managers would trade their entire bench to touch. The Jefferson situation deserves attention, too. After a difficult 2025 with JJ McCarthy under center, Jefferson lands here paired with Kyler Murray in Minnesota, a stack that looks less like a gamble and more like a correction. If Murray is the answer the Vikings clearly believe he is, Jefferson's WR6 projection may be conservative. Derrick Henry fell nearly two full rounds past his ADP, and D'Andre Swift and Bhayshul Tuten were each taken well after the market expected. This is not a team that got lucky. It is a team that was patient, disciplined, and right.
