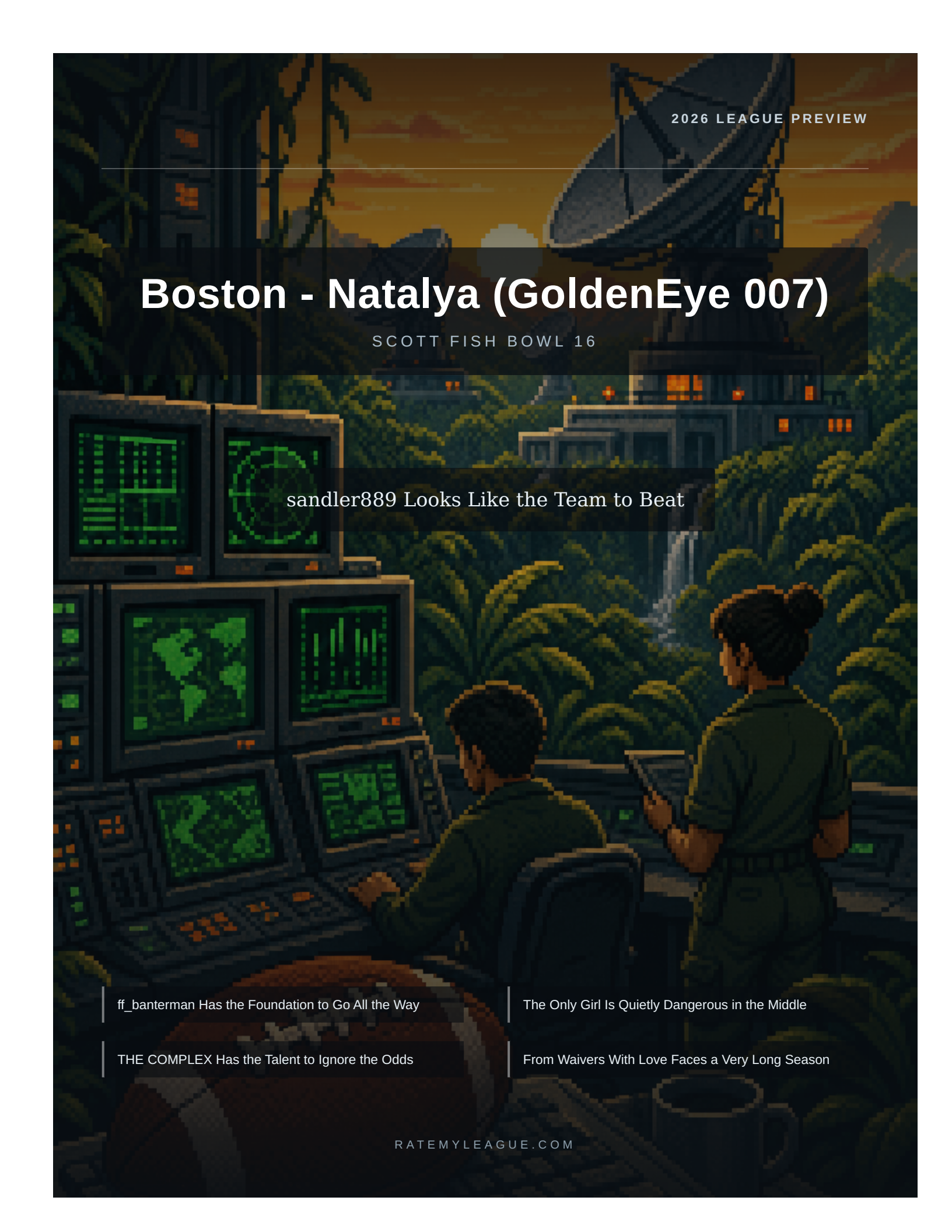

There is no spin available for vtoitop123, currently projected to finish 12th in the Natalya Division and in just the 6th percentile of the entire field. The draft tells the story plainly: zero steals, one value, and three major reaches that bled the roster before the middle rounds even arrived. Kenneth Walker III at RB10 was yanked 1.1 rounds ahead of his ADP in the second round, Kyle Monangai was grabbed nearly four rounds early and projects as the team's weakest projected starter at RB33, and David Njoku was hauled in three rounds before the market thought he was due. The one moment that worked, Luther Burden sliding to a sixth-round pick despite his legitimate WR22 projection and a Bears offense that appears ready to finally unleash him, got swallowed up by everything around it. A Bo Nix and Jaylen Waddle stack connecting a QB15 to a WR23 offers the faintest pulse of upside, but this roster reads less like a plan and more like a draft-day anxiety attack that never found a bottom.

From Waivers With Love sits 11th in the Natalya Division and in the bottom 15 percent of the field, and the draft record does not offer much hope that the manager found a hidden exit. Josh Allen at QB1 is the unquestioned centerpiece, but six minor reaches and two major reaches suggest a drafter who kept reaching for the next Allen and never quite found one. The most glaring example is Rashee Rice, taken 1.2 rounds early at pick 2.12 to land a WR13, a fine player but not the kind of surplus value that compensates for a roster built slightly behind the curve at every other tier. The backfield grades weak across the board, and while the receiver group projects as average, the starter ceiling is capped by Juwan Johnson at TE20 as the projected weakest link. Allen can paper over a lot of cracks on a given week, but papering over every crack every week is not a strategy so much as a prayer, and prayer has a notoriously poor track record in the Scott Fish Bowl.

Last year, bsaad was a machine, posting a 23-13 record and finishing in the 86th percentile of scoring. This year's roster looks like a team that inherited the reputation without the receipts. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Nico Collins at WR9 are genuinely elite, and Colston Loveland at TE3 was arguably the best value of the draft, sliding nearly a full round past his ADP. But outside those three, the projected starters start to thin fast, and the QB situation is a quiet disaster waiting to announce itself loudly: C.J. Stroud checks in at QB22, Aaron Rodgers at QB29, and Deshaun Watson at QB34, a rotation that reads less like depth and more like a support group. The draft itself offered little relief, producing zero steals and leaning heavily on chalk and minor reaches. bsaad now sits at 21st percentile in tournament projections and 10th in the division. The gap between what this team was and what it is projected to be is not a bump in the road. It is the road.

OddJob sits ninth in the Natalya Division and in the 21st percentile of the field, and the draft record explains exactly how it got there: zero steals, four major reaches, and a late-round strategy that reads like someone panic-buying at a clearance rack. The major reaches alone tell the story. Chris Brazzell II (WR101) was taken six full rounds ahead of his ADP, Chimere Dike (WR84) nearly four rounds early, and Troy Franklin (WR80) four rounds early as well, all in a draft where those picks could have secured legitimately rostered contributors. Instead, OddJob burned late capital chasing names that project as roster filler. The lone bright spot is Jahmyr Gibbs (RB1), who fell slightly past his ADP and is a genuine anchor, but one elite player cannot carry a lineup whose weakest projected starter is Xavier Worthy (WR49) and whose depth relies on health from Dalton Kincaid, a tight end whose own team's front office wouldn't commit to calling him healthy. There is no charitable read here.

Operation: Fish Bowl is in trouble, and the draft did not do much to hide it. The roster slots in at 39th percentile tournament-wide and sits eighth in the Natalya division, which is about as uncomfortable a seat as there is. The foundation looks appealing on paper, Jonathan Taylor at RB4, De'Von Achane at RB6, and Tyler Warren at TE4 among the projected starters, but the cracks appear fast once you look at how this team was assembled. The manager reached nearly a full round early on Achane, who was already going to be a first-round pick, and burned a ninth-round selection on Khalil Shakir, a WR51 who cost two-plus rounds of surplus value. Neither move added upside, and both bled away the draft capital that could have addressed the roster's real ceiling problem: Malik Willis and Michael Penix Jr. project as QB24 and QB33, a tandem that gives this team almost nothing to work with at the position. With no obvious trade chips left and the back end of the lineup relying on Chuba Hubbard as the projected weakest starter, Operation: Fish Bowl looks like a team that is already out of levers to pull.

WR Nation is the team that fits perfectly in the middle of a tournament bracket, not menacing enough to make opponents sweat but not soft enough to donate points to anyone's résumé. The foundation is genuinely good: Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Trey McBride at TE2 give this roster a ceiling that most squads in the Natalya division would envy, and Garrett Wilson at WR17 and Emeka Egbuka at WR18 keep the depth from dropping off a cliff behind them. The trouble is in the margins, which is exactly where this team's season gets decided. Cam Ward at QB23 is the weakest projected starter on the roster, and the fact that the manager took Ward 2.6 rounds ahead of his ADP means real draft capital went into propping up that position. That is a bet that has to hit. A year ago this roster finished at the 43rd percentile in scoring, and the 2026 projection slots them at the 44th. The math is not screaming growth. Ward either justifies the reach or this team finishes right where it started.

The Only Girl is a team built on respectable floors and almost no ceilings, which is exactly the profile that finishes 6th in a division and 46th percentile in the field. The foundation is genuinely strong: Brock Bowers at TE1 is a weekly weapon, and Drake Maye at QB2 was the clearest value on the board, slipping to 2.09 despite an ADP of 2.02. Those two alone give this roster a legitimate anchor. The receiver group fills out the starts around them, with Chris Olave at WR11 and Tee Higgins at WR19 projecting as productive contributors, but the depth thins quickly, and Wan'Dale Robinson at WR47 is the projected final starter, the kind of name that wins you close matchups when he hits and costs you those same matchups when he doesn't. After a 2025 season that landed in the 7th percentile for scoring, there's real pressure on the top end to outperform projections. Bowers and Maye have the range to do that. Whether the margins fall the right way is the whole question.

ryanshaynes89 didn't swing for the fences and whiff, didn't stumble into value on accident. This was a draft built pick by pick, and the cumulative effect is a roster that genuinely competes. The foundation is Bijan Robinson at RB2, a top-three fantasy asset by any reasonable measure, and the supporting cast around him is what separates this team from the middle of the pack. Jeremiyah Love at RB13, Josh Jacobs at RB16, Travis Etienne at RB18, and Bucky Irving at RB21 give ryanshaynes89 a starting group whose weakest projected contributor is RJ Harvey at RB28, which is a fine problem to have. The Jalen Hurts and Dallas Goedert stack adds connective tissue at the top of the lineup, though Hurts enters 2026 without A.J. Brown for the first time in years, and how his passing holds up without that weapon will determine whether the stack pays off or merely looks good on paper. George Kittle at

TE9 came in a round late relative to his ADP, a quiet piece of draft execution that reflects how this roster was assembled across the board: steadily, shrewdly, and without a wasted swing.

Everybody Love Everybody didn't build this roster around one flashy cornerstone move. They built it pick by pick, and the cumulative effect is a team sitting at the 81st percentile of the field. The spine of this thing is real: CeeDee Lamb (WR5) and Justin Jefferson (WR6) give the team two genuinely elite options, while Omarion Hampton (RB9) and Chase Brown (RB11) were both acquired at or past their ADPs, meaning the manager paid fair or better prices for projected starters. Tucker Kraft (TE5) is the kind of pick that rewards patience, taken a full round after his ADP and projecting as a top-five option at his position, and the Packers' thinner receiver room this offseason only helps his case to reclaim the starring role he was building toward before a November ACL tear interrupted things. The draft did include two reaches, but five values and a steal elsewhere kept the ledger comfortably in the black. This roster didn't arrive through drama. It arrived through discipline.

THE COMPLEX finished 42nd percentile last year and came back with a chip on their shoulder, drafting like a manager who knew exactly what they wanted and refused to wait for the board to agree. The three major reaches tell the real story: Alvin Kamara at RB50, Cooper Kupp at WR88, Skyler Bell at WR103, all taken rounds before the market said to. On paper, that looks like a manager chasing names. On the roster, it looks like depth that let them spend early capital on Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and a quarterback room headlined by Lamar Jackson at QB3 and Caleb Williams at QB6, both taken at mild value. The Jackson and Mark Andrews stack gives this team a reliable scoring floor on weeks when the rest of the lineup needs it. Third in the division and 83rd percentile overall, THE COMPLEX looks like a team that earned its standing the inconvenient way, betting on conviction when the consensus said wait, and so far the roster is making the argument for them.

ff_banterman didn't build this roster on one splashy move. They built it by being right, over and over again. Puka Nacua at WR1 and A.J. Brown at WR8 anchor a receiver group that would make most managers blush, and the front office didn't pay full price for either. Joe Burrow landed a half-round late at QB4, Derrick Henry slipped nearly a round to RB12, and Rico Dowdle fell more than a round before ff_banterman scooped him at RB32. Five values and a steal across a single draft is not luck, it's a process. The Matthew Stafford and Nacua stack adds another layer, pairing two players whose connection is already proven chemistry on the field, even if Stafford's 2026 comes with genuine uncertainty about how long he stays the starter in Los Angeles. A 2025 finish in the 99th percentile in scoring and a 72 percent win rate signal that this manager knows how to turn a well-built roster into actual points. Landing at 88th percentile in the field and second in the Natalya Division already, this looks like a team that earned its spot in the conversation without ever needing to force it.

sandler889 sits at the top of the Natalya division and in the 97th percentile of the entire field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The backfield headlined by Christian McCaffrey (RB3), Ashton Jeanty (RB7), and Saquon Barkley (RB8) is the kind of top-end concentration that wins tournaments, and sandler889 landed both Jeanty and Barkley at a combined discount of more than two rounds off ADP. That is not luck, that is patience. Patrick Mahomes (QB12) fell a full two rounds past his ADP before sandler889 scooped him, and the Mahomes and Travis Kelce (TE10) stack that came with him arrives pre-loaded with playoff-round upside. Drake London (WR7) anchors the pass-catcher group as a projected starter, and Kyle Pitts (TE7) gives this roster another starter-caliber weapon. The two minor reaches on the board, Kenyon Sadiq and Cade Otton, are late-round depth bets that cost nothing meaningful. Eighteen picks and not a single major reach. Clean sheet, top of the division, nothing to apologize for.
