There is no flattering spin available for Sha Na Han, a team that drafted as if each pick was a dare and has the 19th-percentile tournament standing to prove it. The most damning evidence is the reach sheet: zero steals, zero values, and five minor reaches capped by three major ones, including Aaron Rodgers at QB29 taken more than two rounds ahead of his market price, and Elijah Sarratt at WR98 pulled off the board nearly four rounds early, a pick that reads less like a strategy and more like a grudge against the late rounds. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 give this roster a backbone, and the Jared Goff and Sam LaPorta stack adds a flicker of coherence, but the projected weakness at the starter line, where Romeo Doubs at WR53 represents the floor, suggests the ceiling never gets tested. After a 2025 campaign that landed in the 10th percentile of scoring, Sha Na Han arrived at 2026 and did it again, just louder.

hbennett2 played the value game the right way and still lands at 11th in the Bowser division, which is the kind of outcome that makes you question the whole enterprise. The draft was almost entirely chalk and legitimate value, with Emeka Egbuka sliding a round past his ADP into the fifth and Tony Pollard drifting into the 12th when he should have gone in the 11th. On paper that is disciplined drafting. The problem is that patient, value-conscious drafting still produced a roster with Jakobi Meyers projected as the weakest starter at WR45, and the upside above him thins out quickly beyond CeeDee Lamb at WR5. Lamar Jackson anchors the group as a QB3 and Jeremiyah Love projects as a legitimate RB13, so the foundation is real. But this roster sits in the 21st percentile of the field, and no amount of pointing at process changes that. hbennett2 did the work correctly. The draft just handed him the wrong answer anyway.

BigSteveFF sits 10th in the Bowser Division and at just the 30th percentile of the field, and the roster itself explains why. The foundation is real: Ja'Marr Chase projects as WR2, Jayden Daniels as QB5, and De'Von Achane as RB6, a trio that could carry any team on a good week. The problem is everything below them drops off a cliff. Kyle Pitts checks in at TE7, which is fine, but after that the cupboard gets thin fast, with Chuba Hubbard grading out as the weakest projected starter at RB29 and a long tail of receivers ranked in the WR60s through WR90s who exist more as lottery tickets than contributors. The draft did nothing to help the cause, producing zero steals and landing two major reaches in Ryan Floutney and Kayshon Boutte, both taken nearly three rounds before their ADPs suggested they should have been. BigSteveFF has a ceiling, but it is narrow, and when Chase or Daniels has an off week, there is no safety net waiting beneath them.

King Koopa's Troopas played the value game about as well as you can play it, and the roster still landed at 33rd percentile, which is the kind of outcome that makes a manager stare at their draft board at 2 a.m. wondering where it all went wrong. The answer is structure. Trey McBride, Tyler Warren, and Travis Kelce give this team three elite tight end options, and Joe Burrow anchors the quarterback group at QB4, so the top of the roster has genuine teeth. But the projected starter at running back is Jaylen Warren at RB27, and the next names behind him, Kenneth Gainwell, J.K. Dobbins, Jonathon Brooks, read like a committee of question marks rather than a foundation. Zach Charbonnet fell 3.6 rounds past his ADP and looked like a gift at the time. The problem is that gifts at RB42 are still RB42. You can draft responsibly, stack Brock Purdy with Mike Evans, and squeeze value at nearly every turn, and if the position that ultimately anchors your lineup is this thin at the top, the math just does not close.

NScott90 did almost everything right in the draft. Travis Etienne fell more than two rounds past his ADP and landed in the 8th round. Rico Dowdle came at a discount. Thirteen picks landed at chalk, and the reach count was modest enough to forgive. The process was disciplined, and the roster still projects eighth in the Bowser division and in the 34th percentile of the field, which is the kind of outcome that should come with an apology. The receiver group is where the math quietly collapses: Luther Burden projects as WR22 and Davante Adams as WR25, and after that the depth falls off a cliff, with Jaylin Noel at WR83 and Malachi Fields at WR90 rounding out the group. In a positionless format that rewards top-end talent at any position, NScott90 needed those receivers to carry more weight than their projections suggest they can. And the weakest projected starter is Dowdle, a player who followed up two 1,000-yard seasons in Carolina by signing into a Pittsburgh backfield where Jaylen Warren figures ahead of him. Good process, grim outcome.

Last year's clinder34 was a 90th-percentile scoring machine that went 26-10 and looked untouchable. This year's version is sitting at the 35th percentile and seventh in the Bowser Division, and that gap is the whole story. The foundation is not nothing: Justin Jefferson at WR6 and Drake London at WR7 give the lineup a legitimate top end, and the Mahomes-Rashee Rice stack adds a ceiling-raiser if Kansas City's offense clicks. But the depth drops off fast enough to matter. Carnell Tate projects at WR29, Jordyn Tyson at WR34, and KC Concepcion, the projected weakest starter, lands at WR50. That is a long fall from Jefferson and London, and it is exactly where championship rosters either hold together or unravel. The draft did not help restock the shelves, producing zero steals and fifteen chalk selections against one good value in Colston Loveland. clinder34 does not look like a team in decline so much as a team coasting on a reputation the projections no longer support.

007Sensei sits at the 46th percentile and sixth in the Bowser Division, which tells you everything you need to know: this is a roster built to compete on thin margins, not to overwhelm anyone. The foundation is genuinely elite, Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and James Cook at RB5 give the team a top-end punch that most managers in this field cannot match, and that matters enormously in a positionless format where quality concentrates at the top of a lineup. The problem is that the tier drops off quickly after that. Chris Olave at WR11 and Ladd McConkey at WR20 are solid but not the kind of names that force opponents to adjust their expectations downward. The draft was almost entirely chalk, sixteen picks at or near consensus value, which means 007Sensei is betting on the projections holding rather than on any hidden upside unlocked at the draft table. Bo Nix at QB15 and Jake Ferguson at TE12 keep the supporting cast respectable. But respectable does not win tiebreakers. The margins decide this season, and right now they are genuinely close to breaking either way.

FantasyFlowJoe didn't make headlines on draft day, but the results speak for themselves: four values landed across the board, and almost none of the damage came from the kind of aggressive swings that backfire in the second half of a season. The most important of those values sits at the RB position, where Kenneth Walker III fell a full round past his ADP before FantasyFlowJoe snapped him up, giving this roster an RB10 projection alongside Ashton Jeanty at RB7 and Chase Brown at RB11. That trio forms the kind of foundation that wins weeks quietly. Garrett Wilson at WR17 is the other headline from the value column, absorbed a round late and pairing cleanly with Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4. The main blemish is Cam Ward at QB23, a two-round reach that earns the title of weakest projected starter. But in a positionless format, the QB position carries less weight than the elite ground-game depth FantasyFlowJoe assembled. A 47th-percentile tournament projection undersells a roster built to grind out winning weeks steadily rather than pray for a ceiling game.

JustinBoone did not win the draft with one thunderous pick. This team was built through a series of quiet edges that compounded across 20-plus rounds. Five values against the board, zero major reaches, and a disciplined hand that let good players fall into the right slots. DeVonta Smith at WR14 slid nearly a full round past his ADP before Boone scooped him in the fourth. Alec Pierce at WR32 came more than a round late. David Montgomery, now repositioned with the Houston Texans after ceding ground to Jahmyr Gibbs in Detroit, landed at 9.01 with an ADP a full round earlier, giving Boone a credible RB23 at a discount. Gibbs himself projects as the RB1, and Nico Collins sits at WR9, so the upside at the top of this roster is real. The team sits at 59th percentile entering the season, squarely in the conversation without leading it, which is exactly what a draft built on consistency earns you. Not a lottery ticket, a well-constructed case.

Fish Bowls & Spiky Shells didn't land any single splashy pick that will dominate the group chat, but round after round this roster quietly came out ahead, and that kind of sustained edge is harder to build than it looks. The foundation is Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Brock Bowers at TE1, two legitimate difference-makers who anchor the starting lineup before a manager even has to think hard. Bowers is particularly worth noting: taken at 2.01 with an ADP of 1.07, he essentially fell into this team's lap half a round late, a small inefficiency that still represents real value at the top of the board. Javonte Williams, projected RB17, slipped a full round and a half past his ADP and gives this team a third high-end option that most rosters simply don't have. The draft finished with three values against zero major reaches, which is the quiet scoreboard of a manager who trusted the board instead of forcing it. Third in the division and 66th percentile tournament-wide feels like a floor more than a ceiling.

willcavanaugh25 is not hedging in 2026, this roster is built on the bet that connected offenses pay off together. The centerpiece is a Dak Prescott and George Pickens stack, which asks you to believe in a cross-team pairing where Prescott lands at QB7 and Pickens at WR10, meaning both have to deliver for the ceiling to materialize. The second stack, Matthew Stafford feeding Puka Nacua, is arguably the cleaner version, with Nacua projecting as the WR1 and Stafford as a reliable QB14 who came at value, slipping nearly a full round past his ADP. When both stacks are clicking, this lineup can generate scoring waves rather than isolated performances, and a 2025 finish in the 75th percentile in scoring suggests willcavanaugh25 knows how to load a roster for points. The 83rd percentile tournament standing and second place in Bowser Division reflect that the construction is working on paper. Quentin Johnston at WR41 is the projected weak link, but in a format this positionless, upside from Tucker Kraft at TE5 can paper over a lot.

Stacked Stacks is not hedging. This roster was built around two pairings, Drake Maye and A.J. Brown on one side, Jaxson Dart and Malik Nabers on the other, and the whole ceiling conversation starts and ends there. Maye projects as QB2 and Brown as WR8, meaning this is not a stack built on a prayer, it is a stack built on a foundation. Dart at QB11 and Nabers at WR12 give the team a near-identical pairing as a second lever, and the fact that both quarterbacks and Nabers were acquired as good values past their ADPs means the manager captured that upside without overpaying. When both stacks fire on the same week, this team is essentially untouchable, which is probably why it sits first in the Bowser division and in the 98th percentile of the field. The correlated variance that sinks lesser rosters is the entire strategy here, and Stacked Stacks drafted it with enough conviction that there is nothing accidental about it.
