There is no spin available for sweendog2517, a team sitting at the bottom of the Crash Bandicoot division and in the 9th percentile of the field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The headline problem is the reaching, which was relentless and costly. Malachi Fields at WR90 was taken 6.4 rounds before his ADP, Jaydon Blue at RB70 was grabbed 6.1 rounds early, and Bryce Young, projected as a QB26, somehow commanded an 8th-round pick when the board would have handed him over in the 12th. Young is also the weakest projected starter, which means sweendog2517 burned premium draft capital to secure a liability. The saves are too thin to compensate. Xavier Worthy at WR49 and Jake Ferguson at TE12 both represent genuine value, falling a round and a quarter past their ADPs, but two values against five major reaches is not a transaction, it is a rout. Justin Jefferson at WR6 and De'Von Achane at RB6 give this team a real foundation, but everything drafted beneath them looks like panic buying at a flea market.

Salt City King sits at 11th in the Crash Bandicoot division and the 14th percentile of the field, and the roster construction does not offer much reason for optimism. Josh Allen is a genuine asset at QB1, and the Allen/D.J. Moore stack gives this team a real ceiling on any given week, but the supporting cast grades out as average across the board, and average rarely wins tournaments. The draft history is the part that stings: zero steals, zero values, 15 chalk picks, and two major reaches. Kyle Pitts and Dallas Goedert were both taken well ahead of their ADPs, and while Goedert returning to Philadelphia on a one-year deal is a reasonable storyline, you need more than a reasonable storyline when you've spent draft capital like it was going out of style. Goedert graded out as TE15, Pitts as TE7, and neither justifies the early investment when the rest of the roster needed shoring up. Salt City King is not without talent, but there is no obvious lever left to pull, and that is a grim place to be in a field this competitive.

Meat Streets enters 2026 sitting 10th in the Crash Bandicoot division and in just the 14th percentile of the field, and the roster does not offer much reason for optimism. The foundation is genuinely good: Brock Bowers projects as TE1, and Nico Collins (WR9) and Jaylen Waddle (WR23) give the lineup real pop at the top. The problem is that everything below that tier drops off sharply, and the draft did little to mask it. Rico Dowdle projects as RB32 and grades out as the weakest projected starter on the team, yet the manager reached nearly two rounds early to land him. Jameson Williams, taken 1.4 rounds before his ADP, projects at WR21, which is fine, but paying a premium for a player who merely clears the bar is not how you climb out of a 14th-percentile hole. The draft produced zero steals and two major reaches, which means the upside scenarios were largely surrendered before the season even started. Bowers is a genuine anchor, but one elite player does not change the math here.

Deep End Drafter did everything the draft theorists tell you to do. Sit back, let value fall, be patient. The results bear that out on paper: fourteen chalk picks, three values, zero major reaches, and a draft board that would earn a polite nod from any analytics-minded manager. And yet here sits the team at ninth in the Crash Bandicoot division, landing in the 25th tournament percentile, which is the kind of outcome that makes you question whether the process ever mattered. CeeDee Lamb at WR5 is legitimate, and James Cook at RB5 gives the roster a real anchor, but the supporting cast thins out quickly. Parker Washington is the most telling case: a WR35 projection built on one breakout season in Jacksonville, behind a team that drafted Travis Hunter second overall and still has Brian Thomas Jr waiting in the wings, which makes Washington's ceiling genuinely murky. Jayden Reed projects as the weakest starter at WR48. The math was right. The roster just never added up.

There is no clean way to spin this one. Dave & Busters Enjoyer sits eighth in the Crash Bandicoot division and in the 31st percentile of the field, and the roster itself explains why. The top of the lineup is legitimate, Drake Maye and Lamar Jackson at QB, Tyler Warren at TE4, Tucker Kraft at TE5, and Sam LaPorta at TE8 give this team a genuinely elite ceiling at those spots. But the draft produced zero steals and zero values across 19 picks, and two major reaches define the strategy: Jadarian Price, taken two full rounds ahead of his ADP, and Emanuel Wilson, pulled in a staggering 6.4 rounds early. Neither player grades out as a projected starter. Meanwhile Wan'Dale Robinson, the projected weakest starter at WR47, is the floor this team is being asked to build on. When your upside is concentrated at the top and your draft capital mostly vanished into chalk and optimistic gambles, you are not one breakout away from contending. You are just hoping the math stops being the math.

Winiforniacation sits seventh in the Crash Bandicoot division and checks in at just the 37th percentile of the field, and the draft record doesn't offer much reason for optimism. The manager went chalk on 13 of their picks, generating zero steals and only two modest values, while reaching on five players including a head-scratching four-plus rounds early on Sean Tucker, a RB65 who projects as a non-factor. The backfield is legitimately strong, with Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 anchoring the roster, but the rest of the picture dims quickly. The quarterback situation projects as a liability in all but name, with Jordan Love at QB17 as the best option and Cam Ward at QB23 as the likely fallback. That Ward connection to Carnell Tate in Tennessee is a pairing both the Titans and this roster need to work in a big way, because if it doesn't, the path to relevance in this tournament gets very narrow, very fast.

Last year, THEJakeEarl finished in the 8th percentile in scoring, a genuinely ugly number that is hard to spin. This roster looks like the correction. The receiver group carries the load: Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4) and Rashee Rice (WR13) give the team a legitimate top-end punch, and Mike Evans (WR27) and Brian Thomas Jr. (WR31) extend that depth in a format where managers field their best players in almost any mix. Trey McBride (TE2) landing at pick 2.03 when his ADP sat at 1.08 is the kind of quiet win that compounds across a full season. The draft was mostly disciplined, with four values and ten chalk picks against a single major reach in Troy Franklin (WR80), taken nearly three rounds early. The projections put THEJakeEarl at 74th percentile in the field, a swing from the basement to comfortably above average. After a season that felt like driving with a flat tire the whole way, the tread is back.

Bills & Gills did not win their draft with a single bold swing. They won it by repeatedly coming out ahead on value, and the cumulative effect is a roster sitting at the 77th percentile of the field. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Jonathan Taylor at RB4 are the foundation, and the fact that McCaffrey slipped past his ADP to land at 2.02 is exactly the kind of quiet edge that separates good drafts from great ones. Jared Goff at QB16 fell nearly two full rounds past his ADP, DK Metcalf at WR36 slipped a round and a half, and Isaiah Likely at TE13 came in a round later than the market expected. Five values on the board without a single steal is not luck, it is a manager who stayed patient and let the draft come to them. The Jaxson Dart and Likely stack adds a bonus connection on top of an already well-constructed roster. Bills & Gills are a legitimate threat in the Crash Bandicoot division.

mimiola23 didn't land any splashy steals, but this roster was built the way good drafts actually get built: five values scattered across the board, almost no major mistakes, and a clear edge at the top. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 is the kind of anchor that makes a starting lineup easy to construct, and the receiving corps around him runs surprisingly deep, with Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 and Emeka Egbuka at WR18 both projected as starters after both fell past their ADPs. Christian Watson, another value, slots in as a WR28 with genuine upside. The team lands at 79th percentile in the field and fourth in the Crash Bandicoot division, which is exactly where a quiet, disciplined draft tends to put you: not flashy enough to draw attention, but good enough to make noise when it matters. The one legitimate question is Dalton Kincaid, whose knee has been a persistent concern and whose Bills GM hasn't offered much reassurance about his availability. If Kincaid gives you a full season, this roster has real teeth.

davesnyder92 finished third in the division and in the 81st percentile of the field, and the draft tells you exactly why: this roster was built on consistent execution rather than any single moment of brilliance. Patrick Mahomes at QB12 slipping to the sixth round was a gift, and pairing him with Travis Kelce creates a stack that should produce points in bunches. Colston Loveland at TE3 fell nearly a full round past his ADP, landing davesnyder92 a genuinely elite option at a position where elite options are scarce. Then there is the Jaxon Smith-Njigba and A.J. Brown combination at WR3 and WR8 respectively, anchoring a receiver group that has legitimate top-end pop. And with Brown now in New England, DeVonta Smith steps out of his shadow in Philadelphia with every target, every scramble drill, every fourth-quarter drive belonging to him in a way it never quite did before. Four values, thirteen chalk picks, and only one major reach across the entire board. davesnyder92 did not swing for the fences once and still walked out of the draft ahead.

Dream Team lands at 82nd percentile in the field and second in the Crash Bandicoot division, and the draft record explains exactly why: five values, thirteen chalk, one minor reach, and nothing catastrophic anywhere on the board. That kind of quiet consistency is harder to execute than it looks. The values were spread and meaningful, with Malik Nabers slipping to the fourth round despite projecting as WR12, George Kittle falling more than a round past his ADP to land as the TE9, and Jaylen Warren sliding into the eleventh round at RB27. None of those are lottery tickets, they are just good players acquired at a discount. The foundation underneath them is Jahmyr Gibbs, the projected RB1 and the kind of anchor that makes every subsequent decision easier. Layered on top is the Jayden Daniels and Terry McLaurin stack, adding correlation upside to a roster that already does not need to gamble. Dream Team did not swing for the fences. They just kept winning the smaller arguments, and the cumulative result is a team that belongs in the conversation.

SimonSayz24 sits atop the Crash Bandicoot division in 2026, and the draft tells you exactly why. This roster was not built on a single home-run swing but on a relentless accumulation of correct decisions. Joe Burrow at QB4 slid past his ADP by more than half a round, and Derrick Henry fell a full round before SimonSayz24 scooped him at RB12, the kind of patient opportunism that compounds over a full draft. Pair Burrow with a Matthew Stafford and Puka Nacua stack, where Nacua projects as WR1, and the ceiling on any given week gets very interesting. Kenneth Walker III at RB10 rounds out a backfield that gives this roster genuine week-winning potential at the top. The draft was not flawless, with Christian Kirk reached more than six rounds early at WR100, but two values, fourteen chalk picks, and a division-leading standing at the 89th tournament percentile suggest a manager who understands the difference between noise and signal. SimonSayz24 is not here to surprise anyone. They are here to win.
