BluntForceTrauma13 sits dead last in the Guitar Hero division, and the draft tells you exactly why. Four major reaches across sixteen rounds is not bad luck, it is a pattern, and the pattern here is a manager who fell in love with names and ignored the market. Caleb Williams landed at pick 1.03 despite an ADP of 3.06, which means this team surrendered two rounds of value on a QB6 before a single skill position was addressed. D'Andre Swift arrived in round five at an ADP of eighth, a 2.9-round premium for a player projected RB24. Neither reach was catastrophic in isolation, but stacked together they compressed the roster's ceiling before it had a chance to breathe. The receiver group reflects that compression most clearly, with Jakobi Meyers projected as the weakest projected starter at WR45, a player this team actually acquired a round late as its lone acknowledged value. One good value against four major reaches is not a trade-off. It is a verdict. The 2026 season looks long from here.

There is no generous interpretation of what FantasyClown built in the Guitar Hero division, and the draft log does not leave much room to argue otherwise. The headline disaster is the quarterback room, which consumed four picks and produced Daniel Jones (QB25), Aaron Rodgers (QB29), Geno Smith (QB30), and Deshaun Watson (QB34), a collection so bleak it reads like a support group for retired systems. Jones was taken two full rounds ahead of his ADP, Watson nearly three, and neither one justifies the panic that apparently sent FantasyClown sprinting up the board to grab them. Meanwhile, Dalton Schultz, projected at TE22 and the team's weakest projected starter, arrived three-plus rounds early as well, meaning the draft hemorrhaged value in multiple directions simultaneously. Jahmyr Gibbs and Saquon Barkley are real, and Kyle Pitts and Sam LaPorta give the team genuine upside at tight end, but the positional ranking sitting at 10th in the division and the 13th percentile of the field suggests the floor is doing most of the talking here.

Lords Chosen Ballers sit at 11th in the Guitar Hero division and in just the 13th percentile of the field, and the draft record offers little reason for optimism. The manager drafted 14 players at chalk and generated zero steals, which is not a recipe for outpacing projections. The major reaches compound that problem: Bryce Young at QB26 was pulled two rounds early, J.J. McCarthy at QB37 came off the board 3.5 rounds before the market agreed, and Kyren Williams was taken a round and a half ahead of his ADP. Those picks did not add upside, they surrendered it. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Drake Maye at QB2 are legitimate anchors, and a deep cluster of projected starters gives the roster a real floor. But the receiver corps thins out fast after D.J. Moore at WR26, and when Blake Corum, projected RB35, is your weakest starter, the margin for error is essentially gone. There are no late-round coups waiting to be discovered here, just a well-worn path toward a middling finish.

Cookin' With Love sits ninth in the Guitar Hero division and checks in at just the 43rd percentile of the field, and the draft board does not offer much reason for optimism. The manager reached on two players in a significant way: Joe Burrow cost a first-round pick at 1.09 despite an ADP of 2.05, and that kind of early premium leaves little margin for error when the rest of the roster needs to carry its weight. The receiving corps has some legitimate names, with Chris Olave (WR11), Zay Flowers (WR16), and Jaylen Waddle (WR23) projecting as starters, but the group thins out quickly, and Quentin Johnston (WR41) grades out as the weakest projected starter on the roster. Michael Pittman (WR44) was a genuine draft-day value, falling more than two rounds past his ADP, but he now lands in a Pittsburgh offense running Aaron Rodgers at age 43 under a new coaching staff still searching for an identity. That is not a situation that typically unlocks late-round upside. This roster feels like a team already out of levers before the season kicks off.

TyrodasaurusRex managed the draft board with genuine discipline, turning 13 chalk picks and two legitimate values into a roster that lands at 48th percentile and eighth in the Guitar Hero division, which is the kind of outcome that should not be mathematically possible. The clearest example of the cruelty at work is Patrick Mahomes, the headliner, the cornerstone, the entire reason Travis Kelce was worth reaching for in round six. Mahomes is reportedly ahead of schedule on his ACL and LCL recovery, which sounds like good news until you remember that "ahead of schedule" and "starting Week 1" are still two separate questions, and this roster has no real answer if the answer turns out to be no. Malik Willis sitting at QB24 as a projected starter is the contingency plan, and that alone explains why a team with De'Von Achane at RB6, Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, and a genuinely strong group of tight ends is still staring at a projection this pedestrian. The value was found. It just did not matter.

Buff-O-Licious didn't win the draft with one knockout pick. They won it by repeatedly coming out ahead on value, and that discipline shows up across the board. Eight players were taken after their ADP, including Justin Jefferson at WR6 and Malik Nabers at WR12 already locked in as projected starters before the values even started accumulating. George Pickens fell nearly a full round before this team grabbed him at WR10, and Rome Odunze slipped 1.1 rounds before landing at WR30. By the time the draft was in its final turns, Buff-O-Licious was still finding useful players where other managers had stopped paying attention. The one blemish is Fernando Mendoza, taken 2.8 rounds ahead of his ADP at QB27, a reach that stands out on an otherwise disciplined sheet. Still, with Jonathan Taylor projected at RB4 anchoring the top of the roster and a Jaxson Dart and Nabers stack adding ceiling, this team sits at 66th percentile for a reason. They built something real here, round by round.

TheGamblers didn't walk away from draft day with one headline grab, they just kept winning small edges until the ledger looked very good. The clearest example is Lamar Jackson, a QB3 projection sitting there at pick 2.11 while the room apparently forgot about him. That kind of slip doesn't happen often in a field this competitive, and TheGamblers cashed it. Mark Andrews at TE14 fell even further, nearly two and a half rounds past his ADP, and pairing him with Jackson in a stack adds a ceiling that straight value picks rarely deliver on their own. The Brock Purdy and Mike Evans stack gives this team a second gear if Jackson has an off week. The draft wasn't flawless, Rico Dowdle was taken more than two rounds ahead of his ADP and projects as the weakest projected starter at RB32, but that's a minor blemish on an otherwise disciplined board. Sitting 67th percentile in the tournament through the draft alone, TheGamblers earned their standing the quiet way, pick by pick.

SturndagoFF sat down at this draft and repeatedly ignored the room, and the results are hard to argue with. The two moves that draw the most eyebrow-raises are the major reaches: Justin Fields at QB38, taken nearly six rounds ahead of consensus, and Skyler Bell at WR103, grabbed almost six rounds early as well. Neither pick looks like a bargain on paper. Both look like a manager who had a plan and stuck to it regardless of social pressure. The rest of the roster backs that confidence up. Josh Allen at QB1 gives this team a genuine weekly floor that most opponents cannot match, and the Baker Mayfield and Emeka Egbuka stack adds a secondary scoring axis that can quietly torch a matchup. Throw in Ashton Jeanty at RB7, Nico Collins at WR9, and Rashee Rice at WR13, and SturndagoFF is sitting at 72nd percentile in the field because the top of this roster earned it. Whether the Fields and Bell reaches prove visionary or stubborn is the question that will define this season, but right now the bold calls look a lot more like conviction than a coin flip.

jakejones24 lands at 84th percentile and third in the division, and the draft sheet tells you exactly why: 14 chalk picks, two steals, and zero major reaches. That kind of discipline is rarer than it sounds in a tournament where managers routinely panic-reach or chase upside off a cliff. The foundation here is a receiver corps that is genuinely difficult to pick apart, with Puka Nacua (WR1), A.J. Brown (WR8), and Drake London (WR7) all projected starters alongside Tetairoa McMillan (WR15) and Jameson Williams (WR21). That is a lot of firepower before you even get to the late-round construction, where Dallas Goedert (TE15) fell two full rounds past his ADP and Gunnar Helm (TE26) slid more than three. Finding one player that late who outran his market is luck. Finding two is process. The weakest projected starter on this roster is Jordan Addison at WR43, which tells you everything about the floor jakejones24 built here. Clean draft, clean roster, clean outlook.

adambomb91 landed at 84th percentile in this field, fourth in the Guitar Hero division, and the box score on how they got there is genuinely strange. Three major reaches in a single draft is not a strategy most managers would advertise, yet the results are hard to argue with. Harold Fannin, pulled 1.4 rounds ahead of his ADP, sits as a TE6 projected starter. Kenneth Gainwell, grabbed 2.5 rounds early, projects at RB34. Shedeur Sanders, taken 3.2 rounds before the market thought he was worth touching, lands at QB32. None of those are world-beaters on their own, but none of them blew up in adambomb91's face either, which is not what the draft room skeptics would have predicted. Meanwhile, Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Trey McBride at TE2 give this roster a genuine ceiling to hang everything else on. The uncomfortable question is whether adambomb91 saw something the consensus missed, or simply reached three times and got away with it. The roster does not answer that. It just works.

EagleOfTheNorth didn't need a miracle pick to build something worth respecting in the Guitar Hero division, just a draft where the math kept breaking right. The foundation is Ja'Marr Chase at WR2, landed at 1.06 when the board could have easily gone another way, and Colston Loveland at TE3 followed a similar pattern, slipping nearly a round past his ADP into a pick that now looks quietly brilliant. Then the depth compounds the advantage: Josh Downs, projected WR46, fell more than two full rounds before EagleOfTheNorth picked him up at 12.07, the kind of late-round find that separates a good draft from a great one. Layer in Ladd McConkey at WR20, Terry McLaurin at WR24, and the Jayden Daniels-McLaurin stack that turns every Washington game into a double-dip, and this roster has both a summit and a floor that most managers would envy. Sitting second in the division and in the 87th percentile of the field, EagleOfTheNorth looks less like a team that got lucky and more like a team that simply paid attention.

HarrisR2391 didn't need a miracle pick to land at the top of the Guitar Hero division and in the 91st percentile of the field. The roster got there the old-fashioned way: consistently getting more than fair value, round after round. Dak Prescott at QB7 slid almost a full round past his ADP, CeeDee Lamb at WR5 fell far enough to feel like a gift, and Garrett Wilson at WR17 and Jayden Reed at WR48 each added another round of surplus value on top of that. Stack Prescott and Lamb together and you've got a built-in multiplier on big game weeks. Brock Bowers at TE1 and Tyler Warren at TE4 give this team an embarrassment of riches at a position where most managers are scrambling. Parker Washington slots in as a depth piece with real intrigue, a player who somehow led the Jaguars in targets and receiving yards last year despite every organizational signal pointing elsewhere, though whether that production is repeatable is a fair question. There were no grand slams here. Just a draft that kept winning the small moments.
