Somethin' Fishy drafted like someone who convinced themselves the board was conspiring against them and decided to fight back, badly. Five major reaches across the roster tell the story: Jadarian Price pulled 3.5 rounds early, Gunnar Helm yanked 3.7 rounds early, Keaton Mitchell swiped 4.2 rounds ahead of consensus, and the whole operation has the fingerprints of a manager who kept seeing names disappear and panicked. The one legitimate steal, Sam LaPorta at TE8 sliding to 8.03, got buried under the wreckage. DeVonta Smith is a projected WR14 and offers genuine upside now that A.J. Brown is gone and the Eagles' offense is finally, actually his, but Smith propping up a roster sitting at 10th percentile in the tournament is less a reason for hope and more a reminder of how thin the margin is everywhere else. Matthew Golden projects as the weakest projected starter at WR52. The team lands 12th in the division. There is no charitable read available, and the draft results confirm it.

There is no flattering version of what Glosser13 put together here. The draft produced zero steals, zero values, and six reaches, three of them major, and the cumulative toll lands the team 11th in the RBI Baseball division and in just the 12th percentile of the entire field. The marquee name is Brock Bowers at TE1, and he is legitimately excellent, but the rest of the roster reads like a series of small gambles that never quite paid out at the register. Marvin Harrison Jr. projects as a WR33, taken two and a half rounds early. Kyle Monangai projects as a RB33, also taken ahead of his market. Nicholas Singleton clocks in at RB57. The projected weakest starter is Jalen Coker at WR55, which is not a place any manager wants to be. Rico Dowdle, who earned his way to the Steelers after back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons in Carolina, now projects as a complementary piece behind Jaylen Warren in Pittsburgh, and whether that is enough to start in a positionless format is genuinely unclear. Bowers carries this team on his back. That is a lot of weight.

Duster1982 sits 10th in the RBI Baseball division and in the 13th percentile of the field, and the roster grade makes that easy to understand. The receiver group has genuine pop, with Jaxon Smith-Njigba projecting as WR3 and Nico Collins as WR9, but the rest of the roster feels like it was assembled by someone who kept reaching and never quite landed. Five minor reaches and a major reach on T.J. Hockenson, taken nearly three full rounds ahead of his WR23 projection, describe a draft where urgency replaced patience. The biggest problem may be the one player who was supposed to tie everything together: Rashee Rice, the Mahomes stack piece taken in round three, is currently sidelined with a knee procedure, facing legal jeopardy after violating his probation, and coming off a 2025 season that was cut short by concussion symptoms. If Rice is healthy and eligible, he can change a week. Right now, neither of those things is guaranteed, and Duster1982 does not have much margin to absorb the uncertainty.

There is no charitable read available for 4th and 20, a team sitting at 18th percentile in the tournament and 9th in the RBI Baseball division after a 2026 draft that featured zero steals, zero values, and five major reaches. The most damning evidence arrives early: Courtland Sutton, a WR37, was pulled off the board 3.6 rounds ahead of his ADP, an act of generosity to the rest of the field that bought this team a middling receiver at a premium price. Deebo Samuel, a WR70, got similar treatment, taken 3.2 rounds early as though scarcity were closing in. Meanwhile the receiver group bottoms out with names like Germie Bernard and Chimere Dike anchoring the back end of the depth chart. Josh Allen is here, a legitimate QB1, and Ashton Jeanty slots in at RB7, so the foundation exists. But a roster built on two pillars and surrounded by overpaid role players and late-round dart throws is not a contender. It is a warning label.

There is something almost admirable about drafting this patiently and still ending up here. d2annese played the value game as cleanly as almost anyone in the RBI Baseball division, logging three steals and zero major reaches across a 20-round draft, and the reward is an 8th-place division ranking and a 42nd-percentile projection. The cruelest part is that the individual pieces look legitimate: Christian McCaffrey at RB3, Justin Jefferson at WR6, Harold Fannin at TE6, Chris Olave at WR11. Those are real players. But the supporting cast flattens out fast, and the quarterback situation, Baker Mayfield at QB18 with Bryce Young and Geno Smith behind him, is quietly doing a lot of damage to a roster that cannot afford it. A 2025 season spent in the 16th percentile of scoring should be the warning label here. d2annese drafted correctly by almost every procedural measure, got exactly what the market said these players were worth, and is still staring at a projection that says it probably was not enough.

Billsmafia1715 sits at the 55th percentile and seventh in the RBI Baseball division, which is exactly as exciting as it sounds and exactly as dangerous as it looks. The margins are real, and they cut both ways. Jonathan Taylor (RB4), James Cook (RB5), and Saquon Barkley (RB8) form a backfield tier that can quietly carry weeks when the passing game goes cold, and Trevor Lawrence (QB10) gives the offense a capable enough rudder to avoid disaster. The problem is what happens when the depth gets tested. Alec Pierce (WR32) is projected as a starter and brings legitimate big-play upside, but his ankle surgery and current PUP list status means he could miss the first four games, and losing a WR32 starter before the season even begins is precisely the kind of coin-flip this team cannot afford to lose. Jakobi Meyers (WR45) is the projected weakest starter, and he is not the player you want carrying the load while Pierce sits. Twelve chalk picks and one major reach on Brandon Aiyuk (WR81)

suggest a manager who drafted carefully and then flinched. There is a contender hiding somewhere in this roster, but it will take clean injury luck to find it.

CurtisHenry24 didn't win the draft with one flashy pick. They won it by doing almost everything correctly for seventeen rounds. The clearest evidence is the receiving corps, where Ja'Marr Chase (WR2), A.J. Brown (WR8), and Malik Nabers (WR12) form a projected-starter group that most managers would trade their entire draft capital to assemble, with Jameson Williams (WR21) and Terry McLaurin (WR24) extending the depth well past where it needed to go. The Jared Goff and Williams stack adds a ceiling that pure floor-builders often sacrifice. The one area worth watching is Dalton Kincaid, snagged as a value at TE11 when he fell past his ADP, but the Bills tight end carries real health uncertainty after a knee injury that has lingered into 2026 and that Buffalo's front office hasn't fully cleared. If Kincaid misses time, the production is there elsewhere to absorb it. A 65th-percentile

tournament finish and a 61-percent win rate last season suggest a team that already knows how to convert a well-built roster into results, and this version is better constructed than the last one.

seanpatterson1 didn't win the draft with one knockout pick. They won it by staying patient and letting the board come to them, collecting four values without a single reach across the entire roster. The wide receiver group is the engine here: Puka Nacua at WR1 and George Pickens at WR10 give this team a genuine top-of-the-lineup foundation, with Emeka Egbuka (WR18) and Brian Thomas Jr. (WR31) providing the kind of depth that keeps weekly floors high. Then the patient approach pays off late: Travis Kelce landed at TE10 a full round and a half after his ADP suggested he'd be gone, and Jordan Addison, Xavier Worthy, and KC Concepcion all fell past their projections in the final rounds, turning the back of the draft into a quiet bonus. A Dak Prescott and Pickens stack adds some upside correlation when it clicks. The result is a team currently sitting 66th percentile in the field, which feels more like a floor than a ceiling given how consistently this draft avoided mistakes.

Im Keeping the Supplies didn't win the draft with one thunderbolt pick. They won it the way a good poker player wins a session: quietly, consistently, never overplaying their hand. The foundation is undeniable, with Lamar Jackson at QB3 and Trey McBride at TE2 giving this roster a ceiling that most managers in the RBI Baseball division can't match. From there, the real story is how the value accumulated without drama. Caleb Williams fell more than two full rounds past his ADP, landing at QB6 with almost no cost attached. Jaylen Warren slipped a similar distance into the late rounds. Neither pick required a gamble, just patience while the board cooperated. The reaches for James Conner and Ty Simpson are worth watching, both taken meaningfully earlier than consensus suggested, and they represent the clearest way this roster could underperform its 72nd-percentile projection. But a team built this cleanly from the top down, with Ladd McConkey and Jaylen Waddle rounding out the starting core, is built to absorb a late-round miss or two without flinching.

StraightSchott didn't win the draft with one flashy swing. They won it pick by pick, round by round, in a way that only shows up when you zoom out and look at the whole board. The foundation is genuinely elite: CeeDee Lamb at WR5 and Tyler Warren at TE4 are the kind of projected starters that anchor a contender, and they're surrounded by real contributors rather than filler. Kenneth Walker III, projected RB10, was the one clear bargain, sliding nearly a full round past his ADP at 4.04, and Breece Hall at RB14 gives this team a second premium option in the backfield. The draft chart reads almost entirely chalk, which sounds boring until you remember that chalk at the top of the board means StraightSchott simply did not miss on the players who mattered most. The 2025 season, 88th percentile in scoring and a 28-8 record, suggests this manager knows how to convert a well-built roster into actual points. Third in the division and 76th percentile entering 2026, the ceiling here is not theoretical.

PopesFFH landed in the 86th percentile of the field not by swinging for the fences on a single hero pick but by consistently winning small battles throughout the draft. The clearest example is the quarterback room, where Drake Maye and Jayden Daniels, both projected starters ranked QB2 and QB5 respectively, give this team a ceiling most managers would trade half their roster to access. Maye slid past his ADP, so PopesFFH essentially got a discount on a player projected to finish second among all quarterbacks. That kind of quiet efficiency repeated itself across the board: David Montgomery, Chigoziem Okonkwo, and Denzel Boston all came later than their consensus value suggested they should. Four values and a steal across a single draft is not luck, it is execution. The floor here is also credible, with Tee Higgins, D.J. Moore, and Mike Evans providing a wide receiver core that keeps the lineup competitive even if the upside plays take a week off. This is a roster built to grind, and in a long season that matters.

VikingsVoice sits first in the RBI Baseball division and in the 93rd percentile of the field, and the draft sheet tells you exactly why. This roster was built with the kind of quiet discipline that doesn't make noise on draft day but ages beautifully by Week 1. Bijan Robinson at RB2 anchors the whole operation, and Omarion Hampton at RB9 and Derrick Henry at RB12 keep the floor elevated well into the depth chart. What really separates this build, though, is how efficiently VikingsVoice extracted value without overreaching. Davante Adams fell a full round past his ADP into a Matthew Stafford stack, which is the sort of happy accident you manufacture with patience and board awareness. Colston Loveland at TE3 is a projected starter who outranks almost every tight end in the field. The two minor reaches on Kenneth Gainwell and Jonah Coleman are the only wrinkles on an otherwise clean sheet, and calling them wrinkles is generous. When the weakest projected starter is Michael Pittman at WR44, you are not managing problems, you are managing preferences.
