Gdada enters 2026 looking like a team that has already made peace with a long summer. Last season's 9-27 record was ugly, and the roster construction offers little reason to expect a dramatic reversal. The quarterback room is the clearest drag: Tyler Shough projects as QB20 and Sam Darnold as QB21, meaning Gdada is effectively starting the season with two fringe starters at the position that sets the ceiling for any lineup. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 is a genuine bright spot and Drake London at WR7 gives the team a credible top end, but the supporting cast thins out quickly, with Chuba Hubbard projecting as the weakest expected starter at RB29. The draft did little to change the trajectory, producing no steals, one major reach in Antonio Williams taken nearly two and a half rounds before his ADP, and 14 chalk picks that mostly reinforced the status quo. Sitting 12th in the Bulbasaur division and in just the 17th percentile of the field, Gdada is not a team looking for an angle. It is a team hoping the projections are wrong.

There is no sugarcoating the situation in the Bulbasaur Division: bogwood projects 11th in the division and in just the 17th percentile of the field, and the roster does not offer much reason for optimism. The foundation looks reasonable enough at first glance, with CeeDee Lamb (WR5) and Jonathan Taylor (RB4) anchoring the lineup, but past that top tier the drop-off is steep and mostly irreversible. Trevor Lawrence (QB10) is the presumed pivot, and his 2025 campaign was legitimately impressive, yet it came in one of the more confusing offensive environments in recent memory, built on contributions from unexpected sources rather than any kind of sustainable formula. Surrounding Lawrence with Cam Ward (QB23), a quarterback bogwood reached two-and-a-half rounds early to land, is a curious allocation of draft capital that never paid a dividend in this build. With 13 chalk picks, zero steals, and a draft board that never found an edge, this team looks like it was assembled hoping the market was right. It was not wrong, just insufficient.

fjc3 finished last season in the 71st percentile, which sounds fine until you realize the 2026 projections have them sliding all the way down to the 29th percentile and dead last in the Bulbasaur division. The scaffolding just isn't there to stop the fall. Joe Burrow is a legitimate QB4 and the Burrow/Tee Higgins stack gives this roster a real anchor, but below that top tier the picture gets thin fast. The running back group grades out weak, with TreVeyon Henderson the only projected starter at RB19, and the receiver depth leans heavily on contributors like Wan'Dale Robinson, a WR47 who now has to fight for targets in Tennessee after the Titans used the fourth overall pick on Carnell Tate. The draft didn't help much either, producing zero steals and one major reach in C.J. Stroud, taken more than two rounds ahead of his ADP. When your clearest path to relevance is hoping a middle-tier quarterback projection holds and your depth options are busy losing target share, you're not rebuilding. You're just waiting.

BetweenSethFF enters 2026 sitting ninth in the Bulbasaur Division, projecting at just the 36th percentile of the field, and the draft did little to change that math. The roster carries some genuine talent up top, De'Von Achane at RB6 and Justin Jefferson at WR6 are real pieces, but the returns thin out quickly, and the draft was almost entirely chalk with two major reaches eating into the late rounds. Those reaches, Jack Bech at WR94 and Elijah Sarratt at WR98, are the kind of dart throws that need to hit to justify the cost, and neither projects as anything more than a long shot at this stage. Then there is Marvin Harrison Jr., a WR33 projection who still carries big-name expectations despite two underwhelming seasons and a quarterback situation in Arizona that currently points toward Jacoby Brissett. Harrison is supposed to be a pillar, and right now he looks more like a question mark. When your ceiling depends on players answering open questions rather than closing them, ninth in the division starts to feel generous.

Keeper of the Gnomes sits at 42nd percentile in the field and eighth in the Bulbasaur division, and the draft sheet does not offer much cover for those numbers. The roster leans heavily on Jahmyr Gibbs as its anchor, and Gibbs is legitimate at RB1, but below him the depth falls off fast, with the projected weakest starter being Jayden Higgins at WR54, a number that tells you exactly how thin the margins are at the bottom of this lineup. The Caleb Williams and Luther Burden stack is a real weapon and probably the most exciting thing happening here, but Williams grades out at QB6 and Burden at WR22, meaning even the best-case scenario for that pairing is good rather than great. The draft itself was almost entirely chalk, zero steals and only one value, with Tyler Warren taken nearly a full round early. That is the profile of a team that paid up to confirm what it already had rather than find upside. There is no breakout waiting in the weeds. What you see is what you get, and what you get grades out near the bottom.

The 2026 outlook for tván1011 is about as encouraging as a pre-game injury report on your entire backfield. The receiver group is genuinely strong, anchored by Jaxon Smith-Njigba (WR3), Nico Collins (WR9), Tetairoa McMillan (WR15), and Jameson Williams (WR21) projecting as starters, and that unit alone keeps this roster from being a complete teardown candidate. But strength at one position only carries you so far in a positionless format, and the rest of the roster offers little reinforcement. The backfield projects poorly across the board, with Kenneth Gainwell (RB34) as the top option. The draft did nothing to address the imbalance, producing zero steals, one value, and two major reaches, including Sean Tucker (RB65) taken five full rounds ahead of his ADP. Last season's 39th-percentile finish was not a fluke, and a 43rd-percentile projection for 2026 suggests the Bulbasaur division is going to be a long residence at the bottom of the standings for tván1011.

duklavon is the kind of team that makes you squint at the standings trying to figure out where it lands, because sixth in the Bulbasaur division and 53rd percentile in the field is exactly where teams go to haunt themselves. The ceiling is real: Puka Nacua at WR1 and George Pickens at WR10 give this roster a pair of projected starters who can carry weeks outright, and the depth behind them keeps the floor from collapsing. But the margins are where this gets uncomfortable. George Kittle at TE9 is the kind of player who changes lineups when healthy, and the Achilles' tear that ended his 2025 season means his Week 1 availability is genuinely uncertain, not just preseason noise. Pair that with Brock Purdy at QB13 as the best quarterback option and a projected weakness at the position, and duklavon has a path to winning weeks and a path to dropping them that run uncomfortably close together. Nothing here breaks a season. Nothing here locks one up either.

Mt. Olympus didn't win the draft with one flashy move, they won it by refusing to lose individual battles. The centerpiece is a tight end group headlined by Brock Bowers (TE1), Colston Loveland (TE3), Tucker Kraft (TE5), and Travis Kelce (TE10), all projected starters, which means this team is consistently deploying elite production at a position where most rosters are scraping. That kind of sustained advantage compounds over a long tournament. Then there's Kyren Williams, snagged at pick 8.05 when his ADP sat at 5.10, a RB15 projection landing nearly three rounds late. Malik Nabers (WR12) brings genuine upside after a training camp that quieted the loudest ACL concerns, with his value still climbing back from a July floor of WR21 toward something closer to his ceiling. The one blemish is J.J. McCarthy (QB37), drafted nearly seven rounds ahead of consensus, which is a real overpay at a position that doesn't move the needle in this format. But one expensive mistake doesn't undo a draft where the hits kept coming quietly and consistently.

The board called mrsbourque reckless, and the board may owe an apology. Three major reaches define this draft on paper: Isiah Pacheco pulled 3.6 rounds before his ADP, Brian Robinson nearly 2.5 rounds early, Cooper Kupp almost 3 full rounds ahead of consensus. Those are the kinds of moves that get a manager laughed out of draft rooms. And yet the roster that emerged sits at the 67th percentile of the field, built around Bijan Robinson at RB2, Jayden Daniels at QB5, and a receiving corps headlined by A.J. Brown at WR8 with Brian Thomas Jr. and Jordyn Tyson providing real depth behind him. Derrick Henry fell a full round past his ADP and mrsbourque was right there to collect him at RB12. What looks like chaos on the draft ledger resolves, somehow, into genuine conviction at the top. After a brutal 2025 at the third percentile in scoring, this team has the look of a manager who studied, decided, and refused to blink. Whether that reads as genius or gamble probably gets settled somewhere around Week 12.

DynstyDadStache didn't win the draft with one flashy pick. They won it by consistently getting more than they paid for, round after round. Travis Etienne at RB18 slipping nearly two rounds past his ADP was the kind of quiet theft that only shows up when you go back and look at the tape, and Bhayshul Tuten falling a similar distance into the ninth round gave this squad a second projected starter at running back without burning premium capital. Layer in Drake Maye at QB2 and Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 anchoring the lineup, and DynstyDadStache had its foundation locked before most managers finished their first cup of coffee. The draft wasn't perfect, Zach Charbonnet taken two full rounds ahead of his ADP stands out as the one moment the cursor moved too fast, but one overpay across sixteen rounds is a passing grade by any honest measure. Sitting third in the division and in the 70th percentile of the field, this roster wasn't built on a gamble. It was built on doing the boring stuff right.

There was no single moment in jaber's draft where the room gasped, no lottery-ticket swing that either made or broke the room's opinion of the manager. There was just round after round of getting it right. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 anchors a receiver group that is genuinely elite at the top, and Chris Olave at WR11 and Garrett Wilson at WR17 ensure that the production behind Chase does not drop off a cliff. The real story, though, is the value threading through the middle rounds: Quinshon Judkins, projected RB22, slid a full round and a half past his ADP into jaber's lap, and Denzel Boston fell an equivalent distance to land at WR58. Neither pick is glamorous, but both represent the kind of quiet market efficiency that separates managers who finish in the 73rd percentile from managers who wonder why they keep falling short. The one blemish is Keon Coleman, reached on by more than three rounds, but one miscalculation does not unravel a draft built almost entirely on discipline. Sitting second in the Bulbasaur division, jaber has earned that standing the boring, effective way.

patwrightqb sits first in the Bulbasaur Division and at the 76th tournament percentile, and the draft sheet tells you exactly why. Start with the value column: Kenneth Walker III lands at RB10 while getting drafted at 4.11, a round and a half after his ADP had already passed. Lamar Jackson comes in at QB3 and fell nearly a full round to 2.11. James Cook, projected RB5, cost a 3.02 pick when the board was practically giving him away. That is three cornerstone players acquired at a discount, and the roster around them is deep enough that patwrightqb can absorb the one real cloud hanging over it, Josh Jacobs' ongoing legal situation, without the whole thing unraveling. Jacobs projects as RB16, meaningful but not load-bearing, which is exactly the right place for a question mark to live on a well-constructed roster. The two major reaches, Bucky Irving and Brenton Strange, are the only wrinkles, and neither one is disqualifying. This draft was disciplined from top to bottom, and the standings are already showing it.
