gibson225 sits near the bottom of the Burger Time division and in the 2nd percentile of the entire field, and the draft record does not suggest salvation is on the way. The foundation here is Saquon Barkley, taken 1.2 rounds ahead of his ADP as a major reach at pick 1.11, which means gibson225 overpaid for an RB8 projection when the same value was presumably available later. That is a tough way to open a draft, and the rest of the board did not bail the manager out. The receiver corps grades out weak, with Jaylen Waddle at WR23 and Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33 as the projected starters, both taken early of their ADPs, meaning gibson225 bought high rather than harvested value. Across the entire draft, there are zero steals, two values, and seven minor reaches alongside that one major one. The levers are not hidden behind an unlucky projection or a tough schedule. The draft itself is the problem, and the standings are simply agreeing.

There is no soft landing available for SuperFlexing, and the draft record does not allow for one. Five major reaches across a 20-round draft is a brutal pace, and the damage shows up where it hurts most. Jaxson Dart, taken 2.2 rounds before the market agreed, projects as QB11, which is not the kind of early-round gamble that pays for itself. The team spent another early chip on Travis Hunter, grabbed 3.6 rounds ahead of his ADP, and Hunter projects at WR62, well outside the starting lineup. Meanwhile, Brian Thomas Jr., a projected starter at WR31, arrives with real questions trailing him after a 2025 in which injuries piled up and his chemistry with Trevor Lawrence quietly became a liability. Jaxon Smith-Njigba is genuinely good, a WR3 projection that anchors the whole enterprise, but one star does not paper over a draft that spent aggressively in all the wrong places. The 26th percentile projection and a rank of 11th in the Burger Time division are, at this point, just the math confirming what the draft log already said.

There is a particular kind of fatigue that sets in when you watch a good team dissolve quietly between seasons, and WolfRunner is producing that feeling early. Last year's squad finished in the 84th percentile and went 23-13. This year's projection lands at the 27th percentile, 10th in Burger Time, and nothing about the roster construction explains why the gap should close. Josh Allen anchors everything at QB1, and his stack with D.J. Moore at WR26 is the clearest path to weekly upside, but Moore is the only receiver in the starting mix with a meaningful rank. What fills the rest of the lineup is an avalanche of tight ends, headlined by Colston Loveland at TE3 and Kyle Pitts at TE7, which is fine production on paper but does not replace the kind of multi-positional punch that carried 2025. Worse, the draft showed nine chalk selections and two major reaches, Brenton Strange and Pat Freiermuth, both at a position already covered. WolfRunner is coasting on a reputation the roster has not yet earned.

PMCG13 played the draft almost perfectly by the numbers, and somehow the roster still does not inspire much confidence, which is the specific kind of sting that stays with you. Seventeen chalk picks and just two minor reaches tell the story of a manager who stayed patient, took what the board gave, and walked away with a group that projects to the 40th percentile. The top end is real: Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Justin Jefferson at WR6 give this team a foundation most managers would trade for. But the connective tissue is soft. Mike Evans, now adjusting to San Francisco after his run in Tampa ended along with his 11-year consecutive 1,000-yard streak, projects as WR27, and that kind of bounce-back ask is exactly the sort of bet that looks reasonable in a vacuum and fragile in a lineup. Jake Ferguson falling to the 10th round when his ADP was nearly two rounds earlier counts as the draft's lone genuine win. One real value, a strong top two, and a middle tier that projects to underwhelm: PMCG13 did the work correctly and still ended up here.

drichard enters 2026 as the Burger Time division's most frustrating puzzle: good enough to beat anyone on a given week, not quite dangerous enough to frighten the genuine contenders. The foundation is real. Lamar Jackson at QB3 and Jonathan Taylor at RB4 give this roster a ceiling that most managers in the field would take without blinking, and the Jayden Daniels and Terry McLaurin stack adds a second gear when things click. What keeps drichard parked at 53rd percentile rather than climbing is the step-down behind those studs. Travis Etienne at RB18 and Chuba Hubbard at RB29 are serviceable, but Hubbard projects as the weakest starter on the roster, and Terry McLaurin at WR24 is fine without being feared. The draft was steady, five values and almost no reaches, so the roster reflects the manager's intent. Last season's 69 percent win rate proved drichard can grind out weeks. Whether 2026 ends as a deep run or a respectable also-ran comes down to whether Jackson stays healthy and McLaurin outperforms that WR24 number.

ttoups sits at the 53rd percentile, seventh in the Burger Time division, which is exactly as precarious as it sounds. The ceiling here is real: CeeDee Lamb (WR5), Malik Nabers (WR12), Ladd McConkey (WR20), and Trey McBride (TE2) give this roster a legitimate top-end core that most managers would not turn down. The problem is that the margins where seasons are actually decided cut both ways. Last year's 10-26 record and 15th-percentile scoring are recent enough to remember, and the 2026 roster does not obviously fix what went wrong. RJ Harvey (RB28) landed nearly two rounds after his ADP, which is a genuine asset, but the quarterback group, led by Cam Ward (QB23), offers little upside past streaming range. The real question is whether Lamb, Nabers, and McBride can carry enough weeks while the rest of the roster catches up, because in a format decided by thin margins, one soft stretch from the supporting cast is the difference between sneaking into the money and watching from the outside.

Grindberger with Cheese finished 2025 at 86 percent wins and 99th percentile in scoring, which means 2026 carries expectations this roster may not be built to fully honor. The ceiling is real: Puka Nacua projects as WR1, and a starting corps that includes Rashee Rice (WR13), Zay Flowers (WR16), and Garrett Wilson (WR17) gives this team genuine firepower at the top. But the margins the division will eventually find are hiding in the draft board. The manager reached more than a round early on Rice and nearly a round and a half early on Flowers, paying a premium on players already slotted as projected starters rather than manufacturing surplus value elsewhere. Meanwhile Jared Goff projects as QB16 and Tyler Shough as QB20, which is not catastrophic in a positionless format but is not nothing either. Sixth in the division and 54th percentile in the field says the same thing the roster does: this team lives right on the line between fine and forgettable, and the tiebreaker goes to whoever drafts smarter at the margins.

joshisrad didn't build this team on one flashy swing, and that's precisely what makes it interesting. The foundation is undeniable: Bijan Robinson at RB2 and James Cook at RB5 give this roster a ceiling that most managers in the Burger Time division simply can't match, and Cook arriving at 2.09 when his ADP sat at 2.04 is the kind of quiet efficiency that compounds over an entire draft. Bo Nix slots in as a projected QB15, but the context here is genuinely encouraging, as Denver's addition of Jaylen Waddle gives Nix a second legitimate weapon alongside Courtland Sutton, and a quarterback who led the league in pass attempts in 2025 carries a floor that makes the positional rank look conservative. Derrick Henry at RB12 fell nearly a full round past his ADP, and Oronde Gadsden at TE16 slipped over a round. Four values, almost no true steals, and twelve chalk picks tell you everything: joshisrad didn't need luck. The draft just kept going right.

CoachFrye5 did not build this roster with one flashy swing. They built it pick by pick, and the cumulative effect is a team that sits at the 67th percentile with a real ceiling. The foundation is elite: Joe Burrow at QB4 stacked with Tee Higgins at WR19 gives this roster a connected high-floor engine, and Brock Bowers at TE1 paired with Tyler Warren at TE4 means CoachFrye5 is simply winning the tight end position against almost everyone in the field. Jeremiyah Love at RB13 was a genuine value, taken a full round after his ADP suggested he would be gone, and Sam Darnold at QB21 arrived even later than that, giving CoachFrye5 insurance at a position where most managers scramble. Matthew Golden was taken 2.4 rounds ahead of schedule, which is the one place the draft log raises an eyebrow, but the surrounding talent absorbs that kind of bet. After a 25th-percentile finish in 2025, this is a roster that looks like a correction waiting to happen.

CHUBZBURGER didn't need a blockbuster move to build one of the stronger rosters in the field, just a draft that kept finding leverage round after round. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 anchors the whole operation, and getting De'Von Achane as a projected RB6 a full round after his ADP suggests a manager who was patient enough to let value come to them rather than chase it. That same discipline showed up late when J.K. Dobbins landed at RB36 nearly three rounds after the market expected him to go, the kind of late-round addition that quietly separates good rosters from great ones. Nico Collins at WR9 gives the team a legitimate second weapon, and the Matthew Stafford and Davante Adams stack adds a ceiling-raising correlation play that could pay off in a big week. Sitting at 77th percentile after a 2025 that landed in the 99th percentile in scoring, the bar is high, but CHUBZBURGER built this roster the right way, steadily and without regret.

Slider didn't need a heist to build one of the better rosters in the Burger Time division. This team won the draft the quiet way, accumulating advantages pick by pick until they added up to something real. Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and A.J. Brown at WR8 give the team a receiver corps that projects near the top of the field, and while Brown was a minor reach at 2.05, that is the kind of reach you make without apology. Then the back half of the draft kept delivering: Breece Hall fell a full round past his ADP, Jaylen Warren dropped even further, and Keaton Mitchell slid nearly two rounds before Slider scooped him up. Four values across the roster, zero major reaches, that is a draft that consistently came out ahead of the board. The one honest question is at the quarterback position, where Jordan Love carries real NFL credibility but has never translated that into top-ten fantasy output, and the Packers have yet to solve their receiver room around him. Slider sits second in the division and in the 83rd percentile of the field, and the foundation here looks sturdy enough to hold.

Beermakersfan didn't swing for the fences and miss, didn't stumble into something lucky, just drafted with the kind of quiet discipline that ends up at the top of the Burger Time division and in the 85th percentile of the field. The foundation is real: Jahmyr Gibbs projects as RB1, and George Pickens checks in at WR10 while stacking with Dak Prescott, who was a mild reach at pick 2.11 but whose QB7 projection justifies the urgency. Around that core, Beermakersfan collected value after value, landing Josh Jacobs a full round past his ADP and DeVonta Smith later than anyone had a right to expect. The Jacobs situation deserves an honest mention, with an offseason arrest clouding his standing even as charges remain unfiled and details stay unsettled, so there is real uncertainty baked into that RB16 projection. But even discounting Jacobs, the rest of this roster hums. Seven values against zero steals might sound modest, but when they compound across a lineup this deep, the math starts to look awfully good for Beermakersfan.
