The 2026 Scott Fish Bowl draft is supposed to be where managers build something. raisedonearth built a monument to bad process instead. Four major reaches across the board, zero steals, and the end result is a team sitting at the 6th percentile of the field with a QB group headlined by Jordan Love at QB17 and Kyler Murray at QB19, neither of whom projects to carry anyone anywhere. The receiver corps looks passable on the surface, CeeDee Lamb at WR5, Malik Nabers at WR12, DeVonta Smith at WR14, Garrett Wilson at WR17, but Nabers cost a round-and-three-quarters of surplus capital to land at pick 2.01, and Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33 came two full rounds early at 5.12. That kind of premium stacking at receiver while the rest of the roster dried up is not building depth, it is panic masquerading as strategy. The single piece of genuine draft craft here is Mark Andrews falling to

10.01 a full round past his ADP, and one lucky catch does not redeem a draft that otherwise confirms every concern the division rank suggests.

WentzdayAdams enters 2026 sitting 11th in the Candy Crush division and in just the 17th percentile of the field, and the roster does not hide much optimism. The clearest strength is at tight end, where Brock Bowers checks in as the TE1 and Dallas Goedert adds real depth behind him, but upside at tight end alone does not win tournaments. The problems surface higher on the board: Omarion Hampton projects as RB9 and is the roster's best shot at a week-winning floor, yet the manager reached nearly a full round to land him, which means the early draft capital is already spent and the returns are merely solid rather than spectacular. Further down, Carnell Tate is a WR29 who now has to produce alongside last year's top overall pick Cam Ward in Tennessee, a pairing that needs to click in a significant way before Tate becomes the difference-maker this roster desperately needs. A .500 record and 48th-percentile scoring in 2025 set the table, and nothing here suggests the table is getting reset in 2026.

The Cleveland Steamers arrive in the Candy Crush division sitting 10th in divisional rank and in the 23rd percentile of the field, and the draft record offers little reason for optimism: zero steals, one value, and a notable willingness to overpay. The most damaging example is RJ Harvey, reached three full rounds early at 7.05 despite projecting as RB28, making him the weakest projected starter on the roster. Josh Allen at QB1 and Drake Maye at QB2 are genuinely elite, and both project as starters, but in a positionless format that positional depth only goes so far when the receiver corps grades out weak, with Davante Adams the best of a group that tops out at WR25. The 2025 campaign finished at the 7th percentile in scoring, and nothing in this draft suggests a dramatic correction is coming. This team is not broken in one obvious place that a single trade could fix, it is quietly thin everywhere that counts, which is the harder kind of broken to repair.

The Sheriff is Near sits ninth in the Candy Crush division and projects in the 33rd percentile of the field, and the path back to relevance is harder to find than the team's name suggests. The receiver group is genuinely excellent, built around Justin Jefferson (WR6), A.J. Brown (WR8), and Zay Flowers (WR16), and that trio alone could carry a contender. The problem is that almost everything else is working against this roster. Justin Herbert (QB8) is the nominal ace at quarterback, but his arrow points sideways at best: the Chargers have leaned increasingly run-heavy under Jim Harbaugh, Herbert's pass attempts have declined two straight years, and even a promising Mike McDaniel offensive scheme cannot fully uncap a guy with 15 career rushing scores who survives on volume he may not get. Meanwhile the non-receiver contributors are thin, and the draft offered little rescue, producing just one steal against four reaches. Tucker Kraft (TE5) and Dalton Kincaid (TE11) are solid, but talent at the margins matters in a long tournament, and this roster does not have much of it.

hurl1977 drafted patiently, took value where it existed, reached only modestly on Rome Odunze and Makai Lemon, and somehow landed at 39th percentile anyway. That is not bad luck. That is a structural problem. The core is real: Drake London at WR7, Chris Olave at WR11, and Rashee Rice at WR13 form a projected starting group that most managers would accept without blinking, and the Patrick Mahomes and Rice stack gives this roster a ceiling that the overall ranking undersells. Trey McBride at TE2 does not hurt. But the depth thins out fast, and the quarterback situation behind Mahomes is genuinely uncomfortable. C.J. Stroud, the projected second option at QB22, has spent the last couple seasons trying to recapture what made him electric early in his career, and nothing in his recent track record suggests a breakthrough is imminent. hurl1977 did the work at the draft table and still landed in a place where the math does not quite close. Patience was rewarded. The standings, so far, are not returning the favor.

MAGNUM did almost everything right at the draft table. Jayden Daniels fell nearly a full round past his ADP, Colston Loveland cost only half a round of premium to secure a TE3, and fifteen picks landed at chalk value or better. The discipline is real. The ceiling is not. The problem is that drafting well and drafting a good team are not always the same thing, and this roster lands in the 42nd percentile as evidence. The positionless format rewards depth at the top, and while Loveland and Kyle Pitts project as TE3 and TE7, the receiver group stalls out quickly after Terry McLaurin at WR24. Daniels stacking with McLaurin is a legitimate upside play, but McLaurin is the only receiver among the projected starters who clears the top 30 at his position. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 is a genuine anchor, and Chase Brown at RB11 gives the team a real second punch, but MAGNUM needed those picks to cover for a receiver group that runs thin fast. They valued their way into a middle-of-the-division projection, which is the draft's quiet cruelty delivered on time.

jcerar731 sits at 45th percentile and sixth in the Candy Crush division, which is the fantasy equivalent of being exactly as good as you look. The roster has genuine upside anchored by Jonathan Taylor (RB4) and Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4), two projected starters capable of winning weeks on their own, and Jeremiyah Love (RB13) and Josh Jacobs (RB16) give the lineup real depth behind them. The problem is the margins, and the margins here are thin. The quarterback situation, featuring Fernando Mendoza (QB27), Geno Smith (QB30), and Kirk Cousins (QB35), projects as the weakest part of the roster, and jcerar731 reached early for both Mendoza and Smith, meaning those picks cost real draft capital for below-average production. The floor gets slippery fast once Taylor or St. Brown has a bad week and the QB room offers no stabilizing force. Michael Wilson (WR39) projects as the weakest starter, which tells you where the soft underbelly is. This team can beat anyone on a given week and lose to anyone just as easily.

There was no moment in jothomps016's draft where the room gasped, no lottery ticket swung on a prayer, just round after round of sound decisions that quietly built something worth watching in the Candy Crush division. The foundation is a backfield headlined by Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and Saquon Barkley at RB8, two projections that represent genuine top-tier production, and James Cook slotting in at RB5 after falling nearly a full round past his ADP, which counts as the closest thing to a windfall this draft produced. Trevor Lawrence ties the room together in a more interesting way than his QB10 projection suggests on paper. Lawrence's career year came under genuinely strange circumstances, with his presumed weapons underperforming and a collection of secondary contributors stepping up to carry the load, and the fact that he produced in spite of the noise rather than because of a tidy situation makes him a more reliable anchor than his middling rank implies. This roster sat at the 59th percentile entering 2026, and that feels like a floor more than a ceiling.

SnazzyCat24 didn't win the draft with a single flashy move. They just kept coming out ahead, pick after pick, and the roster reflects it. Puka Nacua at WR1 is the headliner, but the story underneath him is just as good: George Pickens at WR10, Ashton Jeanty at RB7, and Jalen Hurts landing four rounds after his ADP as a legitimate QB9. That last one is the kind of quiet win that separates good drafters from lucky ones. Hurts alone gives this team a floor most managers would envy. The one name worth watching is Brock Purdy, who comes in as a QB13 projection with a receiving corps full of question marks, from Kittle's Achilles recovery to Ricky Pearsall's reported availability concerns. Purdy isn't a drag on this roster, but he's the one spot where circumstance could outrun talent. Everywhere else, SnazzyCat24 simply drafted well, finished 78th percentile in a competitive field, and enters 2026 with a team that quietly belongs in the conversation.

Purple People Eaters didn't win the draft with one flashy pick. They won it by consistently finding the next guy a little later than they should have. Lamar Jackson at QB3 slid a half-round past his ADP and landed at 2.10. Sam LaPorta at TE8 fell more than a round. Jadarian Price at RB26 gave them another projected starter taken late in the tenth. Add Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 anchoring the whole operation and Kenneth Walker III at RB10 right behind him, and you have a core that would make any manager in the Candy Crush division feel comfortable. The team does carry one real question mark at the back end. Tyler Shough sits at QB20, and while he showed polish in Year 1, he's 27 years old entering Year 2 with improvement already built into his projection, which is a tighter ceiling than most managers want from a backup. Still, landing at 81st percentile in the field and third in the division is not an accident. It's what quietly good drafting looks like when the receipts come in.

theboyyyy did not stumble into an 86th percentile roster. This is a draft built with patience and a sharp eye for when the board is doing you favors. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, Nico Collins at WR9, and Tyler Warren at TE4 give this team a projected starting core that most managers in the Candy Crush division would trade for on the spot, and the draft that assembled it shows only two minor reaches against two steals and two values. The steals are worth naming: Dak Prescott fell two full rounds past his ADP before theboyyyy scooped him up at QB7, and Travis Kelce slid 2.2 rounds before landing here at TE10. That kind of discipline, sitting on your hands while value drifts toward you, is exactly what separates clean drafts from frantic ones. After a brutal 2025 that ranked in the 4th percentile in scoring, the rebuild looks complete. The talent is real, the process was sound, and the Candy Crush division just got a genuine problem to solve.

benthebear did not build this roster with one flashy swing. He built it by winning small battles repeatedly, and the cumulative effect lands him first in the Candy Crush division and in the 91st percentile of the field. The foundation is legitimately elite: Bijan Robinson at RB2 and De'Von Achane at RB6 give this team a top-end that most managers would envy, and Joe Burrow fell nearly a full round past his ADP at 2.12, meaning benthebear essentially picked up a QB4 at a discount. That kind of quiet discipline showed up again late in the draft, where Jaxson Dart landed 1.6 rounds after his ADP and both Brenton Strange and Chigoziem Okonkwo slid past theirs as well. Four values across the board with zero steals sounds understated, and that is exactly the point. This roster was not built on luck or one calculated gamble. It was built on a drafter who consistently waited out the room and came away ahead, and the standings already reflect it.
