Adding to the uncertainty, Southgate's decision to reach for Jared Goff earlier than his ADP suggests may prove

costly, especially considering the fragile stack bonus with Jameson Williams. Coming off a poor 2024 season where they languished in the scoring basement and managed a meager win percentage, any hope for improvement seems like a distant dream for this beleaguered team.
