Majorboss88 arrives in Castle Wolfenstein's 2026 season sitting 12th in the division and in just the 4th percentile of the field, and the roster offers little reason to expect a turnaround. The QB situation is genuinely strong, Drake Maye and Lamar Jackson projecting as QB2 and QB3 respectively, but that firepower sits atop a foundation that grades out as merely average everywhere else. The draft made things worse in spots. Rhamondre Stevenson, the team's weakest projected starter at RB31, was pulled three-plus rounds ahead of his ADP, and Bhayshul Tuten cost a pick at 6.01 to land an RB25. Paying early for middling production is the fantasy equivalent of tipping badly at a restaurant you didn't enjoy. Rashee Rice and Tee Higgins give the receiving corps some real footing at WR13 and WR19, but the late-round bailouts, Jakobi Meyers and Khalil Shakir, both fell well past their ADPs and still project only as fringe starters. After a 9-27 showing in 2025, there is no obvious lever left to pull here.

Biskey6 sits 11th in Castle Wolfenstein and in the bottom 10 percent of the field, and the draft record explains exactly how that happened: three major reaches, five minor reaches, and not a single steal across the entire board. The reaches weren't scattered accidents either, they were a pattern. RJ Harvey came off the board at 7.09 with an ADP of 10.05, a nearly three-round overpay for an RB28. Terrance Ferguson, a TE28, got pulled at 12.04 when the market said 14.06. Jayden Daniels, projected QB5, cost a 2.04 pick when he was sitting there as a 2.12 value. Each of those early triggers rippled through the rest of the draft, collapsing the middle rounds before they could do any repair work. Josh Allen at 1.09 is a genuine bright spot, and the Allen/D.J. Moore stack gives this roster a real ceiling, but when your weakest projected starter is Xavier Worthy and the path there was paved with anxious, above-market selections, ceiling conversations feel like a courtesy.

The most honest summary of martinrmcgregor's 2026 campaign in Castle Wolfenstein is this: tenth in the division, 22nd percentile in the field, and a draft sheet that reads like a confession. Five major reaches against zero steals is not bad luck, it is a pattern, and the pattern is damning. Jordan James at RB67 was pulled a jaw-dropping 7.4 rounds before his ADP, making him the single most aggressively reached-for player on a roster full of aggressively reached-for players. Cam Skattebo, projected RB20, cost 2.4 rounds of draft capital above market, and Kenneth Walker III came off the board 0.7 rounds early at pick 2.09. The result is a roster where Trey McBride at TE2 is genuinely elite and the Jordan Love and Christian Watson stack adds a touch of upside, but those bright spots are surrounded by the wreckage of a manager who kept jumping the line and kept being wrong about why. Last year's 47th-percentile scoring suggests this team was already behind the curve before a single reach was made this spring.

EricJohnFlynn enters 2026 sitting ninth in Castle Wolfenstein and in the 35th percentile of the field, and the roster doesn't offer much reason for optimism. The receiver group is genuinely strong, with Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Justin Jefferson at WR6 anchoring a unit that could carry a contender, but the problem is everything else is barely keeping up. Brock Purdy checks in at QB13 and Kyler Murray at QB19, which is functional without being exciting, and the tight end situation bottoms out with T.J. Hockenson at TE23 and Jake Tonges at TE34, a pair that projects as a weekly anchor around Flynn's ankle. Last season produced a 7-29 record and a 13th-percentile scoring finish, and the draft didn't generate the kind of surplus value that signals a turnaround, logging zero steals and one major reach in Pat Bryant at WR86, taken more than three rounds ahead of where the market valued him. St. Brown and Jefferson are real, but two stars at the top can only compensate so much for a roster that grades out this thin everywhere else.

Deccy played the patience game about as well as anyone in Castle Wolfenstein, collecting five values against zero steals, landing Matthew Stafford seven picks after his ADP and Tank Dell nearly two rounds after his. The discipline is real and it deserves credit. The problem is that discipline bought a roster sitting at 44th percentile and eighth in the division, which is the draft equivalent of doing everything right on a math test and still failing. The top of the lineup is genuinely compelling: Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, Drake London at WR7, Harold Fannin at TE6, and Kyle Pitts at TE7 give Deccy as strong a projected starting core as most managers in this field can claim. But the depth fades fast, and the one moment of real aggression backfired badly, reaching seven full rounds early for Jalen Tolbert, a projected WR102 who offers almost nothing if the names above him stumble. Good process, questionable outcome, and a floor that depends entirely on a ceiling that has not always been reliable.

The Turd Fergusons are exactly the kind of team that wins 67 percent of their games one year and spends the next summer staring at a roster wondering where the ceiling went. The 2026 version sits at 57th percentile and seventh in Castle Wolfenstein, which is a perfectly accurate portrait of a team built on a spectacular tight end core and a receiver room that ranges from elite to serviceable, held hostage by almost nothing at quarterback. Brock Bowers at TE1, Tyler Warren at TE4, and Sam LaPorta at TE8 represent genuine advantages that will win individual matchups all season long, and the values on DeVonta Smith, Terry McLaurin, and Marvin Harrison Jr. suggest a manager who stayed patient and let the board come to them. But Cam Ward at QB23 is the thread that, if it unravels, takes the whole sweater with it. The margins here are real and they are thin, and in a tournament where the difference between a winning record and an early exit is a handful of points per week, Ward may be the one number that matters most.

Shedite didn't need a heist to build this roster, just a draft that kept quietly winning the negotiation. The headliner is Christian McCaffrey, an RB3 projection that anchors the whole operation, but the sharper move might be what happened at quarterback. Caleb Williams landed at QB6 nearly a full round after his ADP suggested he would, and Jalen Hurts fell even further, sliding two and a half rounds past his market price to become arguably the cleanest value on the board. Both quarterbacks stack with projected starters, Williams connecting with Rome Odunze and Colston Loveland, which layers in ceiling the raw rankings alone don't fully capture. Derrick Henry at RB12 and Bucky Irving at RB21 keep the depth credible behind McCaffrey, and while the receiver group is the softest section of the roster, Odunze and DK Metcalf project as legitimate contributors. Fourteen chalk picks and just one major reach paint a picture of a manager who trusted the process and let the board come to them. Sitting 61st percentile overall with upside woven throughout, Shedite belongs in the conversation.

tritchie965 lands at 65th percentile in the field, and that number undersells what happened in this draft. There was no lottery ticket, no moment where the manager swung for the fences and got lucky. There were just pick after pick that quietly came out ahead. Joe Burrow at QB4 anchors the quarterback room, but the real craftwork shows up behind him: Bo Nix at QB15 fell a full round and a half past his ADP, and he arrives in 2026 having led the league in pass attempts, now throwing to Jaylen Waddle in Denver. That Nix-Waddle stack gives tritchie965 a built-in multiplier on what is already a safe-floor asset. Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Chris Olave at WR11 give the top of the roster genuine teeth, and Tucker Kraft at TE5 is the kind of quietly excellent piece that separates good drafts from great ones. No single move defines this team. It just kept winning small exchanges until it had a roster worth respecting.

Glove01 didn't build this roster with one thunderbolt pick. They built it the way you build a lead, steadily, pick by pick, and the cumulative effect lands them in the 69th percentile of the field with a case that they belong even higher. The foundation is legitimate: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and James Cook at RB5 give this team two projected starters who can carry a week by themselves, and Cook arriving a half-round past his ADP is exactly the kind of quiet win that separates competent drafters from good ones. Jaxson Dart arriving nearly two full rounds late is another. The receiver group is thin at the top, with Emeka Egbuka projecting at WR18 as the clear headliner, but in a positionless format the depth at running back more than compensates. The one genuine cloud on the horizon is Oronde Gadsden, a projected starter at TE16 whose offseason got complicated when the Chargers signed David Njoku, a former top-10 tight end whose presence is hard to dismiss even at 30. Glove01 is a well-constructed team. They just need Gadsden to hold his ground.

DamoHowley lands at third in the division and the 75th percentile of the field, and that standing reflects exactly how this roster was built: not on one flashy gamble, but on a draft that kept winning small battles. The headliner is Puka Nacua, projected WR1 and taken at 1.06 against an ADP of 1.01, a half-step of value that sounds minor until you realize securing the top receiver in the format at a slight discount is the kind of thing most managers fumble. The bigger move came later, when Justin Herbert fell to 6.07 despite projecting as QB8, nearly three full rounds past his ADP, and DamoHowley was there to take him alongside stack partner Ladd McConkey, a projected WR20 starter. Ashton Jeanty projects as RB7, Chase Brown as RB11, and Travis Kelce checks in as TE10, so the floor across the starting lineup is genuinely high. The one wrinkle is Mike Washington Jr., reached nearly three rounds early and projecting as RB59, but on a roster this solid, one late flier barely registers.

SuarezPower didn't build this roster with one flashy swing. They built it pick by pick, and the cumulative effect is a team that sits second in Castle Wolfenstein and at the 83rd percentile of the field. The foundation is legitimate: Ja'Marr Chase projects as WR2, De'Von Achane as RB6, and Patrick Mahomes as QB12, and all three landed at or past their ADP, meaning SuarezPower paid fair-to-discounted prices for elite production. George Pickens at WR10 and Jameson Williams at WR21 add genuine upside to the starting core, and the Mahomes-adjacent Jared Goff and Williams stack gives the team a secondary scoring surge when Detroit opens up. None of those moves look like genius in isolation. That's the point. This is a roster built on consistency over cleverness, where four players came in as values and the draft as a whole trends toward chalk rather than panic. In a tournament full of managers swinging for the fences, SuarezPower just kept getting on base.

DannyLorentz sits first in Castle Wolfenstein and in the 95th percentile of the entire field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The headline move was landing Dak Prescott, a projected QB7, more than two full rounds after his ADP suggested he would be gone, and then pairing him immediately with CeeDee Lamb, a projected WR5, who also slipped past his number. That Prescott-Lamb stack is the kind of upside engine that wins weekly matchups and carries playoff runs, and DannyLorentz got it at a discount. The discipline extended up and down the board: Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 give this roster two of the most dependable fantasy backs in the sport, and Barkley himself came at a modest markdown from his ADP. Five values and a steal across twenty rounds, zero reaches, and a projected floor anchored by Tetairoa McMillan and Carnell Tate adds up to something simple to say and hard to execute: DannyLorentz did not waste a pick.
