As the 2025 fantasy football season unfolds, the outlook for Christopher Harris (@HarrisFootball) appears rather bleak. Last year's impressive run, marked by a 93 percentile point finish and a 79% winning rate, feels like a distant memory as the team struggles to find its footing. Currently languishing at the bottom of the CharlestownChiefs division and in the 12th percentile overall, hopes for a turnaround seem slim. Despite some savvy draft moves, such as snagging Jameson Williams and Colston Loveland well below their average positions, the team faces significant hurdles. Their quarterback situation is underwhelming, with Joe Burrow taken far too early and Anthony Richardson picked ahead of his projected range, leaving little room for error. At tight end, Jonnu Smith stands as

a glaring weakness, barely making the top 15 in his position. The wide receiver corps, featuring A.J. Brown, Tyreek Hill, and Jordan Addison, offers a glimmer of hope but hardly compensates for the team's other deficiencies. While there's potential for an occasional win, the odds are stacked against Christopher Harris maintaining any semblance of last year's dominance.

These early reaches have cost the team valuable draft capital, leaving them ill-equipped to compete against stronger opponents. As the season looms, the prospects for Jayme Cernicka look grim, and without a drastic turnaround, another year of mediocrity seems inevitable.
