There is a version of this draft that almost makes sense, and then you look closer and realize there isn't. coachretzlaff1 landed nine major reaches across the board, zero steals, and zero values, which is a draft philosophy in the same way that driving with your eyes closed is a driving philosophy. The receiver group has real names, Puka Nacua at WR1, Zay Flowers at WR16, Jameson Williams at WR21, but each of those was taken well before the market agreed, inflating the cost of a group that was always going to be available at a friendlier price. The Goff-Williams stack is a legitimate touch, and Goff's four straight top-10 finishes make him a steadier asset than his QB16 projection suggests, but a quarterback this locked to the pocket has a hard ceiling, and the rest of the roster doesn't give coachretzlaff1 the margin for error that a boom-or-bust QB demands. At 2nd percentile in the tournament and last in the Oregon Trail division, this team isn't being unfairly judged. The draft simply said what it said.

Max_Jensen10 sits 11th in the Oregon Trail Division and in just the 16th percentile of the field, and nothing about this roster suggests a dramatic reversal is coming. The receiver group is the one genuine bright spot, with Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4) and Drake London (WR7) giving the team a legitimate top-end punch, but the floor collapses quickly after that, and strong receivers can only carry so much weight in a positionless format where overall roster depth decides your fate. Derrick Henry (RB12) is a decent anchor, but the backfield grades average at best, and the quarterback situation is quietly brutal: Jayden Daniels (QB5) is a fine asset, but Malik Willis (QB24) is projected as the secondary option, and Michael Penix Jr. (QB33) was reached for two rounds before his draft price. The draft board tells its own story: six minor reaches, one major reach in Ray Davis (RB62), and zero steals. Max_Jensen10 did not uncover hidden value in this draft, and at this point there is no obvious lever left to pull.

There is a path forward for bobducharme in the Oregon Trail division, but it is narrow, poorly lit, and someone has removed the guardrails. The receiver group is genuinely strong, with CeeDee Lamb (WR5), Malik Nabers (WR12), and Tetairoa McMillan (WR15) forming a top tier that most managers would envy, and Davante Adams (WR25) and D.J. Moore (WR26) providing real depth behind them. The problem is that in a positionless format, those receivers need a quarterback capable of keeping pace with the rest of the field, and this roster does not have one. C.J. Stroud (QB22) and Bryce Young (QB26) are the projected starters at the position, and Young ranks as the single weakest projected starter on the entire team. Jonathan Taylor (RB4) is a legitimate anchor, and Travis Kelce (TE10) still contributes, but bobducharme sits 10th in the division and in just the 18th percentile of the field. The ceiling here depends on receivers carrying a roster that the quarterback room simply cannot elevate.

Team Allegedly did almost everything right on draft day, and that is exactly what makes this roster so frustrating to look at. Of the 20 picks, 13 landed at chalk and four came as genuine values, including Trevor Lawrence falling a full round and a half past his ADP and Chigoziem Okonkwo sliding more than a round to give the team a usable TE19. No steals, sure, but disciplined drafting by any reasonable standard. The problem is that discipline without upside is just a polite way to lose. Justin Jefferson anchors this roster at WR6, and George Pickens at WR10 gives the Dak Prescott stack some actual teeth, but below that the starting lineup leans on Jayden Reed as the projected weakest starter at WR48, which is a long way to fall. A 37th percentile tournament projection and a ninth-place division standing suggest the market priced these players correctly, which is the quiet cruelty here: Team Allegedly found fair value at nearly every turn and built a roster that is, allegedly, just not good enough.

Mike Fuller's 2026 squad is the kind of roster that looks better on paper than it figures to play out on the field, which is a polite way of saying the paper is also pretty thin. The good news is real: Josh Allen grades out as QB1, Tucker Kraft projects as TE5, and Sam LaPorta sits right behind him at TE8, giving Fuller a genuinely strong top of the board. The problem is that the bottom collapses fast. Kenneth Gainwell, projected as RB34, is the weakest projected starter, and the rest of the backfield offers depth charts rather than difference-makers. The draft did Fuller no favors either, producing zero steals, one major reach in Jack Bech at WR94, and a pattern of chalk picks that suggests the roster is roughly what it looks like, no hidden value waiting to emerge. Fuller came in at the 44th tournament percentile and sits eighth in the Oregon Trail division, and with no obvious upside lever left to pull, it is hard to see the path to a different outcome.

RealDiehl3 sits at the 53rd percentile, which is the fantasy equivalent of being told your bloodwork came back "mostly fine." The foundation is genuinely impressive: Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Nico Collins at WR9 give this roster a ceiling that most managers in the Oregon Trail division would envy, and Patrick Mahomes at QB12 keeps the floor from caving in. But the margins are where seasons like this get decided, and the margins here are fragile. Dalton Kincaid, a projected starter at TE11, would be a real asset paired with Josh Allen if he can stay upright, but Bills GM Brandon Beane's "too early to tell" assessment on Kincaid's knee is not exactly a confidence builder. Meanwhile, Michael Pittman at WR44 is the weakest projected starter on the roster, a name that wins you nothing by itself. RealDiehl3 went 44 percent in 2025 and will need Chase and Collins to carry their weight every single week just to stay relevant. There is a good team buried in here. Whether it surfaces depends entirely on health and the kind of quiet consistency that rarely announces itself until it's either there or it isn't.

Fannin The Flames did not manufacture this roster through one bold gamble or a single lottery ticket that cashed. They just kept coming out ahead, pick after pick, round after round. Caleb Williams at QB6 anchors a stack with Colston Loveland, who projects as TE3 and gives this team one of the cleaner quarterback-to-tight-end combos in the field. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 is the kind of foundational piece that lets a manager breathe, and when Parker Washington slipped two full rounds past his ADP, the team quietly added a WR35 for a WR18 price. Jacory Croskey-Merritt fell even further, landing at RB40 value in round 16. Neither steal demanded a trophy speech, but both reflect a draft that kept finding edges while most of the board was moving on. A 2025 finish in the 80th percentile in scoring suggests the process has been working. Sixth in the Oregon Trail division is a reasonable place to start the conversation. The ceiling is higher.

gman21788 finished last season at 47% wins and 59th percentile in scoring, so the jump to 72nd percentile in projected tournament standing tells you this draft did something right. The question worth asking is whether "right" and "disciplined" mean the same thing here, because the draft chart logged three major reaches. Mason Taylor came off the board 4.7 rounds ahead of his ADP. Sean Tucker went 6.8 rounds early. Ja'Kobi Lane got grabbed three rounds before the field wanted him. And yet the roster that emerged has Bijan Robinson at RB2, Omarion Hampton at RB9, and Joe Burrow stacked with Tee Higgins as projected starters. That is a legitimate core, built despite the draft board working against the process. The one cloud worth watching is Jalen Hurts, projected at QB9, who now enters the season without AJ Brown after that offseason trade to New England. Five straight top-10 fantasy finishes create a certain amount of faith, but this is the first time that faith will be tested without his best

weapon. gman21788 reached for their guys and got a good roster. The Oregon Trail will decide if the conviction was earned.

Jaxson Darts Farts came to the Scott Fish Bowl with a plan and executed it cleanly. The centerpiece is Jaxson Dart, projected QB11 and snagged more than two rounds past his ADP, which is the kind of patience at the position that separates disciplined drafters from impulsive ones. Pair that with a backfield anchored by De'Von Achane (RB6) and Jeremiyah Love (RB13), both projected starters, and this team has genuine weekly ceiling baked in before you even get to the tight end situation. That situation, for the record, is extraordinary: Trey McBride at TE2 and Tyler Warren at TE4 are both projected starters, giving this roster a positional advantage that compounds across a long season. Chris Godwin came in at WR38, also a value relative to his ADP, which means the manager was finding discounts at multiple positions without forcing anything. Seventeen chalk picks and zero reaches tell the rest of the story. Sitting at the 81st percentile entering the season, Jaxson Darts Farts looks less like a lucky draw and more like a well-built machine.

Jason Sargent did not build this roster by swinging for the fences and missing. He built it by being right, repeatedly, in ways the board rewarded him for. James Cook, projected RB5, slipped a full round past his ADP and Sargent was there to collect. Jordan Mason, projected RB41, fell three rounds beyond where the field valued him, and again Sargent did not blink. Those two acquisitions alone sketch the portrait of a drafter who stays disciplined while the room drifts, and the cumulative effect shows up in the standings: 82nd percentile in the tournament, third in the Oregon Trail division, built on a foundation of Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, Ashton Jeanty at RB7, and Breece Hall at RB14 anchoring the projected starters. The quarterback situation is modest, but this is a positionless format, and what Sargent has at the skill positions is not modest at all. Eighteen picks landed at or near consensus value, and the two that deviated from it deviated in his favor. That is not luck. That is a drafter who did his homework and cashed the grade.

Alex Thompson's draft in the Scott Fish Bowl looks less like a lucky heist and more like a methodical accumulation of small advantages that quietly added up to something real. The headliner is Lamar Jackson, a QB3 projection landed at pick 2.11 when the board simply let him slide, and Jackson anchors a starting core that also includes Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and Saquon Barkley at RB8, two of the most dependable weekly contributors in the field. What makes the roster compelling beyond those names is how the middle rounds held up. Brock Purdy came at pick 6.11 despite a QB13 projection, Jaylen Warren slipped a full round past his ADP, and late options like Gunnar Helm and Pat Freiermuth arrived with genuine upside at TE26 and TE30 respectively. Thompson reached slightly for Bhayshul Tuten and absorbed one late swing on Elijah Sarratt, but those are minor blemishes on a draft that produced five values and a steal without ever gambling the roster on a single pick. Currently sitting second in the Oregon Trail division and projecting into the 82nd percentile, this team earned its standing one quiet win at a time.

Last year was ugly for jkdaly, a 12-24 record and a 20th-percentile scoring season that left little to feel good about. The 2026 roster reads like a direct rebuttal. Drake Maye at QB2 and Justin Herbert at QB8 give this team legitimate firepower at the position, and Herbert was a genuine draft-day heist, sliding to pick 6.07 against an ADP of 3.09. Pair that quarterback depth with Brock Bowers at TE1 and Kyle Pitts at TE7, and jkdaly is fielding elite production at two of the most impactful spots on the board. Chase Brown at RB11 and Cam Skattebo at RB20 round out a starting group that projects as genuinely formidable, not just functional. The whole thing adds up to a division-leading team sitting at the 93rd percentile of the field, a swing of staggering distance from where things stood twelve months ago. The floor was found in 2025. Everything about this build suggests jkdaly found the ceiling shortly after.
