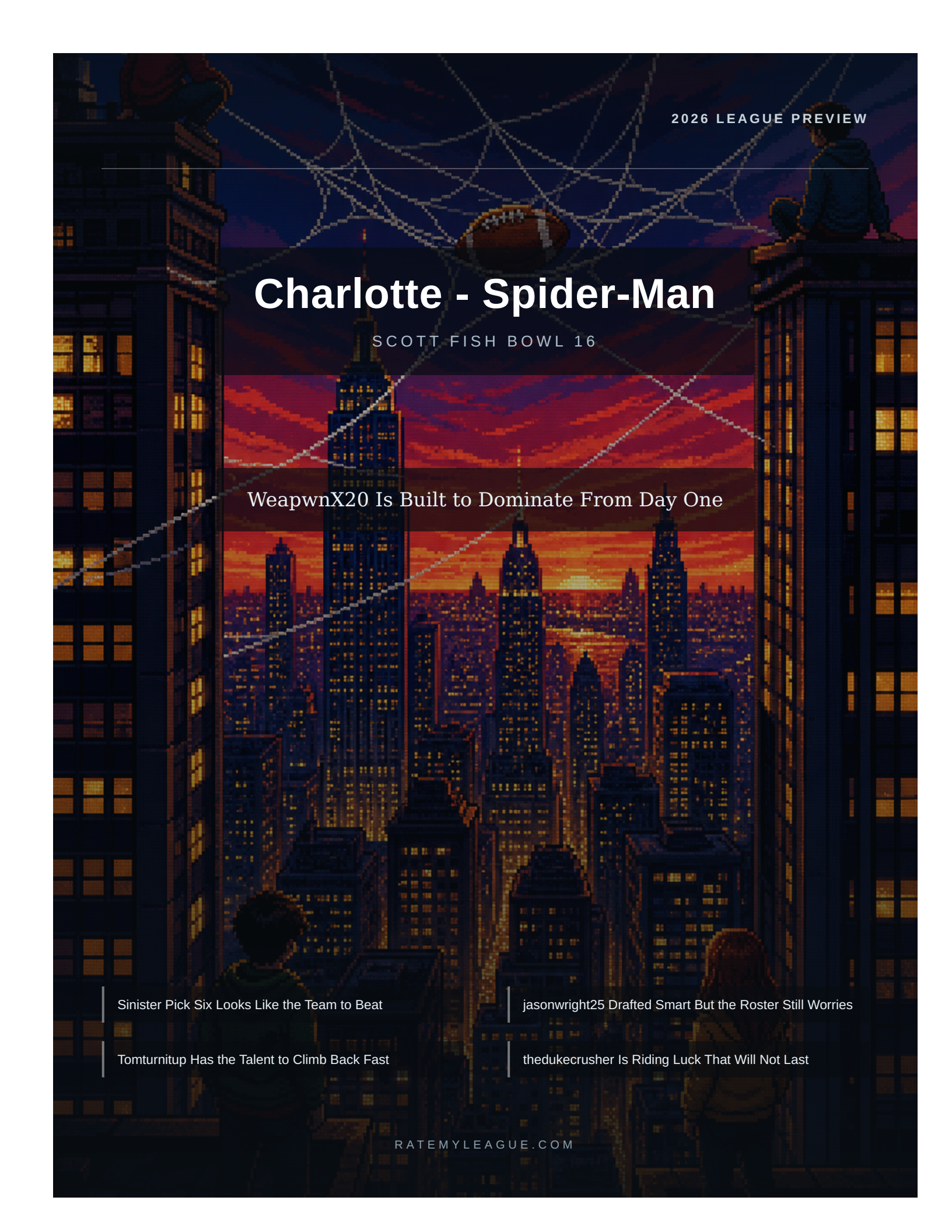

There is no polite way to dress this up: FightingMongoose135 enters 2026 sitting 12th in the Man division and in just the 16th percentile of the field, and the roster grades offer little reason for optimism. The top of the lineup has genuine appeal, Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and Malik Nabers at WR12 are legitimate difference-makers, but the supporting cast falls off sharply, and a draft that produced zero steals and zero values while logging six minor reaches and a major reach on Oronde Gadsden two full rounds ahead of his ADP suggests the manager was chasing upside that the market had already priced away. The situation at the back of the projected lineup is particularly grim: Bryce Young grades out as the weakest projected starter at QB26, a number that is hard to paper over. Quinshon Judkins offers a flicker of hope, a promising player returning from a fractured fibula who could outperform his RB22 projection if he comes back clean, but banking a season on one player's medical clearance is

less a strategy than a wish. After a 32nd-percentile finish in 2025, FightingMongoose135 needed a draft that changed the conversation. This one didn't.

There is a particular kind of tired that settles in when you look at a roster and realize the ceiling and the floor are basically the same thing, and Brockness Monster is living in that feeling heading into 2026. The team sits 11th in the Man division and in just the 17th percentile of the field, and the draft did almost nothing to change the trajectory: zero steals, a majority chalk picks, and a Carson Beck selection that arrived nearly six rounds ahead of his QB40 projection, burning a late pick on a quarterback who grades out as a clear third option behind Josh Allen and Brock Purdy. The receiver group is the real weight on the chest, projecting as weak with DeVonta Smith leading a unit that bottoms out quickly. Allen and Purdy give this roster a legitimate foundation, but foundation is not a team, and Brockness Monster cannot generate enough projected scoring from the rest of the lineup to paper over the gap. Last season's 39 percent win rate looks less like a bad break and more like a preview.

There is a particular kind of exhaustion that comes not from one catastrophic decision but from a dozen small ones adding up, and MarshySpeed knows that feeling heading into 2026. The roster sits at the 20th percentile of the field and tenth in the Man division, and the draft did almost nothing to change the trajectory: zero steals, fourteen chalk picks, and two major reaches that represent the team's clearest swings. One of those was Matthew Stafford at QB14, pulled four rounds ahead of his ADP, a gamble that cost real capital on a quarterback who grades out as a mid-tier starter. The other was Tyler Warren at TE4, which looks more defensible given Brock Bowers at TE1 and Isaiah Likely at TE13 rounding out a genuinely strong position group. The problem is that strength does not offset the weakness elsewhere: the top projected skill players outside that group are Luther Burden at WR22 and TreVeyon Henderson at RB19, solid but not difference-makers. Michael Pittman lands in Pittsburgh alongside a 43-

year-old Aaron Rodgers and a coaching staff still searching for an identity, which is the kind of situation that rarely rescues a fantasy season. MarshySpeed is not broken, just quietly, stubbornly behind.

Last year thedukecrusher went 26-10, scored in the 98th percentile, and looked like a team that had figured something out. This year's roster sits 9th in the division and projects to the 27th percentile, and that distance between who they were and who they are is the whole story. The receiver group is genuinely strong, A.J. Brown at WR8, George Pickens at WR10, Jameson Williams at WR21, and Trey McBride at TE2 giving the team a real nucleus, but the manager paid forward prices to build it, reaching on Brown by nearly a round and taking Kittle more than a round early, which is the kind of draft that feels confident in the moment and complicated in the standings. What's missing is any quarterback who projects to matter: Sam Darnold at QB21, C.J. Stroud at QB22, Geno Smith at QB30, the projected starters form a group that no amount of receiver depth can fully offset in a format this competitive. The reputation is 98th percentile. The projection is 27th. That gap doesn't close by itself.

jasonwright25 drafted like a patient, disciplined manager and still landed in the 30th percentile, which is the kind of outcome that should come with a formal apology from the universe. The draft was genuinely well-executed: five values, no major reaches, and a top of the roster headlined by Ceedee Lamb (WR5) and Justin Jefferson (WR6) that most managers would envy. Trevor Lawrence (QB10) fell nearly a round and a quarter past his ADP and arrives with genuine momentum after a career year that was somehow more impressive for how disorganized the circumstances around him were. The problem is that below Lamb, Jefferson, and Lawrence, the roster runs thin fast. Jaylen Warren (RB27) is the projected weakest starter, and Jordan Mason (RB41) and Kimani Vidal (RB60) are not exactly the cavalry. jasonwright25 correctly identified value at nearly every turn and still projects eighth in the division, the cruelest possible grade a draft can earn: technically correct, functionally insufficient.

Last year boss2274 posted an 80th percentile scoring season and a 22-14 record, so expectations arriving in 2026 carry real weight. The problem is that this roster is sitting at the 31st percentile and seventh in the division, and the gap between those two data points is not a minor correction, it is a full collapse of the premise. The loudest reason is Rashee Rice, who projects as a WR13 starter but brings a biography that would exhaust a crisis management firm: probation violations, a reported jail stint, a knee procedure, and a concussion history that already cost him most of 2025. Rice can still be a difference maker when healthy and active, but banking on that feels less like optimism and more like denial. Joe Burrow at QB4 is real, and the Mahomes-Rice stack offers upside if Rice ever actually plays, but two major reaches in the draft, including J.K. Dobbins at RB36 taken nearly three rounds early, suggest a manager who may have overestimated his own hand. The 80th percentile version of this team is not walking through that door.

Doc Ock sits at 40th percentile and sixth in the division, which is a polite way of saying this roster is built to win close games or lose them, never to dominate. The foundation is legitimate: Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Drake London at WR7 give this team a ceiling most managers in the Man division would trade for. But the margins get thin fast. The projected starters drop off quickly after that top tier, with RJ Harvey at RB28 likely deciding whether Doc Ock finishes fourth or eighth in a given week. The draft was almost aggressively safe, 15 chalk picks and zero steals, though Justin Herbert falling nearly a round past his ADP to fill the QB slot qualifies as a quiet win. The receiver depth beyond London is a collection of WR63-and-beyond names that will require sharp waiver instincts to supplement. Nothing here screams contender, nothing screams rebuild. Doc Ock is a team that will live and die by matchups, and that is both its strategy and its risk.

After finishing 2025 in the bottom 4 percent of the field in scoring, Tomturnitup needed a roster that looked nothing like last year's, and this one delivers. The foundation is genuinely exciting: Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 is the kind of top-end anchor that separates contenders from pretenders, and Drake Maye sliding to QB2 despite an ADP of QB2 is exactly the fortune that rewards patience in a snake draft. Derrick Henry at RB12 and Kyren Williams at RB15 give this team a reliable backfield core, and the fact that Henry fell nearly a full round past his ADP is the kind of quiet draft-room win that compounds over a season. There are real concerns, Juwan Johnson projects as the weakest starter at TE20, and the Michael Penix Jr. reach at nearly three rounds early is a gamble that could look fine or costly depending on how his season unfolds. But this roster sits at the 65th percentile in the field, and for a team that was essentially nonexistent in 2025, that is not a ceiling to apologize for. The rebound is real.

WeapwnX20 is exactly what you want to see in a serious Scott Fish Bowl entry: a roster built on conviction, not chaos. The backfield alone reads like a fantasy manager's mood board, with Ashton Jeanty at RB7 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 anchoring a group that also includes Travis Etienne (RB18) and Cam Skattebo (RB20), the latter a genuine value after sliding more than a round past his ADP. The draft discipline shows up everywhere, with six values extracted across the board and just one minor reach on the entire sheet. Bo Nix is the fascinating centerpiece at QB15, a quarterback who has led the league in pass attempts and now gets Jaylen Waddle added to his target tree, making the Nix-Waddle stack feel less like a gamble and more like a calculated bet on volume with upside. Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Chris Olave at WR11 give the receiving corps genuine teeth. At 76th percentile entering 2026, WeapwnX20 did not get here by accident. This is a clean, confident build.

GRITTYLIONS land at 83rd percentile in the field and third in the division, and the draft record explains exactly why: 18 chalk picks and almost nothing wasted on the extremes. That kind of discipline rarely announces itself loudly, but it compounds. The backbone here is Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1, a projected starter who gives this roster a ceiling-raiser at the top of the board, and Omarion Hampton at RB9 slides in right alongside him despite being taken a little ahead of his ADP, a minor reach that looks entirely defensible given the production the position promises. Then there is the Jared Goff and Sam LaPorta stack, which rewards the GRITTYLIONS with bonus upside on a Detroit offense that returns its full complement of weapons and has quietly made Goff one of the safest weekly producers in the format four years running. Alec Pierce falling a full round past his ADP and landing at WR32 is the kind of quiet win that turns a good roster into a complete one. Nothing flashy, nothing broken, just consistent forward pressure across 20 rounds.

windtalka didn't need a home run to build one of the stronger rosters in the Man division, just round after round of quiet, compounding correctness. The foundation is hard to argue with: Bijan Robinson at RB2 is a projected-starter-level asset that most managers would anchor a title run around, and Colston Loveland at TE3 gives windtalka an elite option at a position where the drop-off is steep. What makes this roster interesting beyond those headliners is how the supporting cast was assembled. Five values against ADP, spread across the board, means windtalka was consistently getting players slightly later than the market expected, and that patience compounds. Bhayshul Tuten, landing at RB25, is the clearest example of upside hiding in the middle rounds: with Travis Etienne gone to New Orleans, the Jacksonville backfield is genuinely open, and Tuten's athletic profile makes him the most credible claimant. There is one true blemish, a reach on Christian Kirk that goes four-plus rounds early, but a single miscalculation in a draft this consistent is easy to absorb. windtalka sits second in the division and in the 88th percentile for good reason.

Sinister Pick Six didn't win the draft with one thunderbolt pick. They won it the way a good poker player wins a long session, by consistently taking the better side of each exchange. Lamar Jackson at QB3 slid nearly a full round past his ADP and landed at 3.01, giving this roster a legitimate elite quarterback at a mild discount. Puka Nacua projects as WR1, Zay Flowers checks in at WR16, and the Jackson-Flowers stack adds a layer of ceiling that pure positional rank can't fully capture. Then at the back end, Dalton Kincaid fell 1.1 rounds and Greg Dulcich fell 1.7, meaning the depth came essentially for free. Four values, twelve chalk, zero major reaches across the entire board. That draft profile doesn't scream, it accumulates, and the result is a team sitting first in the Man division and at the 93rd percentile of the field. Sinister Pick Six didn't need a heist. They just refused to lose a trade.
