There is no charitable read available for Allinmike510 in the Gran Turismo division. The draft tells the whole story: four major reaches, four minor reaches, zero steals, and a team that currently sits at the 2nd percentile of the field. The most damning choices came early, when this manager burned first-round capital on Colston Loveland at 1.11, nearly a full round ahead of his ADP, then doubled down by taking Tyler Warren at 2.02, another round-plus early. Two tight ends in the first two picks is an aggressive gamble that had better pay off in a positionless format, and it might, but the cost was surrendering draft equity at the very moment it was most valuable. Then comes the back half of the draft, where Demond Claiborne arrived nearly five rounds early and Jonathon Brooks nearly three rounds early, burning late-round picks on unproven depth. Malik Nabers and D'Andre Swift give this roster a real floor, but a team that went 11-25 with a 9th-percentile scoring finish in 2025 needed a disciplined rebuild, not a draft that reads like someone was picking with one eye closed.

There is a particular kind of tired that comes from watching a roster that should work, on paper, somehow refuse to. DirtyJimmy37 finished the 2025 season at 28 percent wins and in the 31st percentile of scoring, and the 2026 projection, sitting 11th in Gran Turismo and in just the 14th percentile of the field, suggests the lesson hasn't been learned so much as repeated. Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 are genuinely excellent, and in a positionless format that kind of top-end quality should float a lineup. The problem is what surrounds them. The quarterback situation tops out at Baker Mayfield as a projected QB18, and the draft didn't exactly help itself there, with five minor reaches and two major ones, including Stefon Diggs pulled nearly four rounds ahead of consensus. That's the kind of draft capital that compounds a bad situation rather than solving it. Robinson and Jeanty are real. Everything else feels like hoping the tide comes in.

There is a particular kind of exhaustion that comes not from losing but from looking at a roster and realizing the ceiling is already visible from the ground floor. Satch44 sits 10th in the Gran Turismo division and in just the 15th percentile of the field, and the draft did not provide much of an escape hatch. The manager committed two major reaches in the first two rounds, spending a first-round pick on Joe Burrow (QB4) and a second on Caleb Williams (QB6), which is an aggressive posture that only pays off if you've loaded the rest of the roster with surplus value. That surplus never materialized. The best find was Jakobi Meyers (WR45), who fell two full rounds past his ADP, but landing a WR45 late does not move the needle much. Ladd McConkey (WR20) and Saquon Barkley (RB8) give this team a real floor, but the projected lineup leans heavily on players like RJ Harvey (RB28) to hold things together, and that is not a comfortable place to rest a season.

IMbrewski won 67 percent of their games in 2025 and scored at a 73rd-percentile clip, which makes what happened in 2026 drafting feel like watching someone blow a comfortable lead in the fourth quarter. The roster grades out 9th in the Gran Turismo division and sits at just the 37th percentile of the field, and the draft decisions explain a good chunk of why. Josh Jacobs, projected RB16, was taken 1.6 rounds ahead of his ADP, Sean Tucker came off the board four full rounds early despite projecting as RB65, and Tyreek Hill cost 3.3 rounds of premium for a WR77 projection. Those are not calculated gambles, those are the kind of reaches that drain the draft capital a team needs to build depth around a genuine anchor. Josh Allen is a legitimate QB1 and A.J. Brown projects as WR8, so the nucleus exists. But when your supporting cast is being propped up by Chuba Hubbard as a projected starter and Hill as a late-lineup option, the margin for error is essentially zero, and this roster already used most of it on draft day.

The marksmen enter 2026 ranked eighth in the Gran Turismo division and sitting at the 39th percentile of the field, and the draft did little to change the math. Four major reaches define the offseason story: Brian Robinson, James Conner, and Mac Jones were all taken well ahead of their ADPs, and Wan'Dale Robinson, projected at WR47, cost a seventh-round pick when the market said he was a tenth-rounder. Those are the kinds of moves that leave a team thin on surplus value before the season even starts. The receiver corps has genuine stars, Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, Zay Flowers at WR16, and Jaylen Waddle at WR23 among the projected starters, and Drake Maye projects as a QB2, so this is not a roster without talent. But the floor is set by the weakest projected starters, and Robinson projecting at WR47 is a soft floor. After a 2025 that landed in the 17th percentile of scoring, marksmen needed a draft that bought them upside on margin. Instead, they paid premium prices for the margins, and the standings are likely to reflect it.

TimboDAsavage sits at 47th percentile heading into 2026, which is exactly as uncomfortable as it sounds. The receiver corps is genuinely impressive, with Puka Nacua projecting as WR1, Nico Collins at WR9, and Rashee Rice at WR13 giving this roster a ceiling that most teams in the Gran Turismo division cannot match. But ceilings only matter if the floor holds, and that is where the uncertainty creeps in. Sam Darnold at QB21 and Malik Willis at QB24 are not the kind of names that inspire confidence behind a strong supporting cast, and with Quentin Johnston projected as the weakest starter at WR41, the margin between a good week and a forgettable one is thinner than this roster deserves. The 2025 campaign ended 16-20, which is not a disaster but is not a foundation either. TimboDAsavage drafts mostly chalk with a few minor reaches, including Rice and Jake Ferguson taken

earlier than consensus, which signals conviction rather than caution. Whether that conviction pays off depends entirely on whether the top of this roster stays healthy and the bottom never gets called upon.

KendallFFT is a team that lives and dies by small edges, and right now those edges are pointing in opposite directions. The upside is real: CeeDee Lamb at WR5 was a genuine draft-day steal, slipping nearly a full round past his ADP, and Harold Fannin at TE6 and Isaiah Likely at TE13 give the lineup a strong floor at a position that separates competitive rosters from pretenders. But the ceiling has a crack running straight through it. Brian Thomas Jr. at WR31 was taken more than two rounds early, and the skepticism is earned. His 2025 was a step backward, clouded by injuries and a nagging question about whether his chemistry with Trevor Lawrence was ever really there or just a byproduct of circumstances. Lawrence himself, projected QB10, adds another layer of uncertainty. A 52nd-percentile team coming off a 33-percent win rate does not need its key contributors to underperform their projections; it needs them to beat those projections. KendallFFT has the pieces to finish middle of the Gran Turismo pack, which is exactly the kind of outcome that feels like nothing at all.

GRADAS didn't need a lottery ticket to build this roster, just steady, disciplined drafting that kept coming out ahead. Lamar Jackson at QB3 and Brock Bowers at TE1 are the kind of foundational pieces that make a lineup difficult to beat week after week, and getting Jackson at pick 2.08 when his ADP sat at 2.03 is the sort of quiet win that compounds over a season. Jalen Hurts fell nearly a full round and a half past his ADP, landing at QB9 as a projected starter alongside Jackson, which means GRADAS is fielding elite quarterback talent without having paid full price for it. Alec Pierce at WR32 adds an upside swing: one of the league's premier big-play threats who just signed a top-tier contract, though his PUP list status creates real early-season uncertainty that the team will need to monitor. None of this was built on a single dramatic heist. It was built pick by pick, and at 66th percentile in both the standings and scoring last year, GRADAS has the foundation to move that number meaningfully higher.

Sitting at 78th percentile and fourth in the Gran Turismo division, nak97 built this roster the right way: patient, precise, and almost entirely without wasted picks. The foundational piece is the Jordan Love / Tucker Kraft stack, and the way nak97 landed it tells you everything about how this draft went. Love fell nearly three full rounds past his ADP before nak97 scooped him at QB17, then turned around and grabbed Kraft at TE5 to complete the connection. That is not luck, that is discipline. The receiver room is anchored by Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Justin Jefferson at WR6, two genuine difference-makers who give this lineup a ceiling most managers in this field would envy. Underneath them, a backfield featuring Breece Hall, Javonte Williams, and Travis Etienne all projecting as starters keeps the floor high. Two steals, two values, and zero major reaches across the entire board: nak97 did not force anything, and the roster shows it. Clean from top to bottom.

bonehed80 didn't need a single blockbuster moment to build one of the more quietly dangerous rosters in the Gran Turismo division. The draft just kept grinding forward, round after round, with the market consistently undervaluing what this team was picking up. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 fell into lap at 2.01 when the board had him pegged almost a full round earlier, and Brock Purdy, sitting at QB13, was still there at 8.01, more than two rounds past his ADP. Neither of those is luck exactly, it's what happens when a manager knows where the board is soft and stays patient enough to let it come to them. Jayden Daniels at QB5 added another layer in round four, and Jameson Williams at WR21 filled out the projected starting group with a round of cushion to spare. The result is a team that projects at the 80th percentile and sits third in the division, built not on one splashy swing but on a draft that simply never flinched.

untitledfantasy didn't win the draft with one flashy move, they won it by being right more often than they were wrong, and the roster reflects exactly that. Patrick Mahomes at QB12 slipped to pick 6.11, more than a round past his ADP, and Jared Goff at QB16 fell even further, nearly three rounds, to 9.02, giving this team two legitimate quarterback options without mortgaging anything to get them. The receiver group is where the quiet competence really accumulates: Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 anchors the whole operation, and Drake London at WR7 arrived at 2.11 after sliding past his ADP, a subtle coup that most managers probably didn't notice until it was too late. Kyle Pitts at TE7 adds another layer, and after years of being fantasy's most talented disappointment, his TE5 finish in 2025 suggests the potential was always real and is now something closer to reliable. Sitting second in the Gran Turismo division and in the 93rd percentile of the field, untitledfantasy drafted like someone who simply paid attention when nobody else was.

DynastyMD6129 sits atop the Gran Turismo division at the 94th percentile, and the draft board tells you exactly how it happened: not one explosive gamble, just a steady accumulation of edges that compounded into something real. James Cook at RB5 slid a few spots past his ADP at pick 2.09, and Dak Prescott at QB7 came off the board nearly two rounds after his market price, gifting DynastyMD6129 a Prescott/George Pickens stack at a meaningful discount. Matthew Stafford at QB14 fell an entire two-and-a-half rounds past his ADP, which is the kind of draft equity that quietly separates a good roster from a great one. Trey McBride at TE2 was a minor reach at 1.04, but paying a little early for a projected top-two tight end is a feature, not a flaw. The 2025 record of 28-8 with an 88th-percentile scoring season confirms this is not a new trick. DynastyMD6129 drafts with a methodical patience that makes the final product look inevitable.
