Last year JWeigal went 30-6 and scored in the 97th percentile, which is the kind of season that buys a manager a lot of goodwill heading into the next draft. The problem is that goodwill does not win games, and the 2026 roster is currently projected third in the division and in the third percentile of the field, a fall so steep it should come with a parachute. The anchors are real: Joe Burrow at QB4 and Malik Nabers at WR12 are legitimate top-end pieces, and Dak Prescott gives Burrow a credible backup. But Prescott was a major reach at pick 2.01 against an ADP of 3.07, and Ray Davis came in nearly five rounds early, suggesting a draft where JWeigal paid championship prices for memories instead of market value. The supporting cast reflects it. Derrick Henry at RB12 is still viable, but the depth behind him fades quickly, and a starting tight end corps headlined by Brenton Strange at TE17 is functional rather than fearsome. The 2025 version of this team was exceptional. The 2026 version is a tribute act.

Big Shot Rob sits third in the Star Fox division and near the bottom of the entire field, and the draft chart tells you most of what you need to know about why. Four major reaches dot this roster, and they cluster right where the team needed to get it right. Brian Thomas Jr. was pulled four rounds ahead of his ADP, DK Metcalf went three rounds early, and Xavier Worthy, the projected weakest starter on the board, cost nearly five rounds of surplus capital. Paying a premium for WR49 is a tough pill to swallow in any format. Meanwhile, RJ Harvey, the running back most likely to carry production load, is projecting at RB28 and trending the wrong direction: Denver re-signed JK Dobbins and used a fourth-round pick on Jonah Coleman, leaving Harvey buried in a committee with nowhere to grow. Lamar Jackson and Brock Bowers give this team a genuine foundation to build from, but when your upside players are already priced in and your depth is thin, the margin for error is essentially gone before the season even starts.

There is no charitable read available for andyrrt1 in the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl, a team sitting at 10th in the Star Fox division and hovering around the 13th percentile of the field. The draft tells the whole story. While CeeDee Lamb falling to 2.04 looks like a gift, andyrrt1 proceeded to blow that goodwill pick by pick, reaching on Josh Downs four full rounds ahead of his ADP and on Jack Bech nearly five rounds early, both of them projected outside the WR40. Those are not bold convictions; those are panicked buttons mashed on a broken controller. The QB situation is genuinely grim, with Malik Willis projected as the weakest starter on the roster at QB24 and Geno Smith and Michael Penix Jr. waiting behind him as the kind of contingency plan that makes you feel worse, not better. This team has the shape of someone who drafted receivers in the dark and forgot that someone still has to throw them the ball.

Docadoo enters 2026 sitting ninth in the Star Fox division and in just the 34th percentile of the field, and the roster does not offer many reasons to argue with those numbers. The receiver group has genuine names at the top, Puka Nacua at WR1, Drake London at WR7, Rashee Rice at WR13, but the floor drops off quickly, and the projected weakest starter is KC Concepcion at WR50. That is a long fall from the top of the lineup to the bottom, and it matters because this format rewards depth as much as stars. The draft strategy did not do much to close that gap, producing zero steals, nine chalk picks, and nine minor reaches, the kind of board work that leaves a manager right where consensus expected them to be. Parker Washington, reached for two rounds early at WR35, is the sort of player who makes a compelling story but a nerve-racking weekly decision, a guy whose own team may not fully believe in him even after he outproduced expectations last season. There is no obvious lever left to pull here.

Flying Illini sits eighth in the Star Fox Division and at the 43rd percentile of the field, and the draft tape does not offer much reason for optimism. The RB group looks strong on paper, with Bijan Robinson (RB2) and James Cook (RB5) anchoring things, but the WR room is where this roster starts to buckle. Terry McLaurin (WR24) and Mike Evans (WR27) are serviceable projected starters, yet both were reached on relative to ADP, and Darnell Mooney came off the board nearly four rounds early for a player projecting as WR82. That is not a calculated gamble, that is paying a penthouse rate for a parking spot. The draft as a whole leaned toward reaching rather than waiting, with five minor reaches and two major ones against just one true steal, which means the market inefficiencies mostly ran the wrong direction. When your weakest projected starter is Jaylen Warren (RB27), a player also taken ahead of his ADP, you are not looking at a roster with a hidden gear waiting to be found. Flying Illini is what it is, and what it is projects to be a struggle.

CaptLaw sits at the 49th percentile, which sounds like a participation ribbon until you realize that every win or loss this season probably turns on one or two players performing exactly as projected versus just slightly better or worse. The anchor of that margin story is Amon-Ra St. Brown, the WR4, who gives this roster a genuine ceiling-raiser at the top of the lineup. But the more interesting pressure point is Harold Fannin, projected TE6, who earned that rank behind a strong debut season in Cleveland before the Browns handed him a quarterback situation that currently points toward Deshaun Watson. Any target competition from the team's newly drafted receivers, any Watson regression, and Fannin slides from weekly starter to weekly question mark, which is the exact kind of quiet rot that costs a middle-of-the-pack roster its playoff spot. CaptLaw is not scary, not soft, just finely balanced between the field and the standings, and Fannin's ceiling might be the single variable that tips that balance.

dorsey80 enters 2026 as the Scott Fish Bowl's definitive swing vote, a team too good to dismiss and too flawed to fear, and the whole season comes down to how thin the margins actually are. The foundation is legitimate: Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Jonathan Taylor at RB4 give this roster a top end that most teams in the Star Fox division cannot match, and the supporting cast of Jeremiyah Love, Josh Jacobs, and TreVeyon Henderson keeps the weekly floor from collapsing. But the receiving talent thins out fast, with Jameson Williams at WR21 functioning as the only reliable pass-catcher above replacement level, and the quarterback situation is a five-man philosophical debate headlined by Matthew Stafford at QB14 and four alternatives who project somewhere between serviceable and concerning. What saves the draft grade is timing: Stafford and Travis Kelce both fell two-plus rounds past their ADPs, meaning dorsey80 absorbed the value without overpaying. That kind of quiet

efficiency is exactly what a 51st-percentile roster needs to creep into the conversation, because in a format this competitive, margin is the only currency that moves the standings.

ChicagoSpartan did not swing for the fences and miss, they just kept making the right call, round after round. The clearest example is Jordan Love, snagged at pick 9.07 despite an ADP of 7.06, meaning a QB17 projection landed nearly two full rounds late. That is not luck, that is patience paying off. Mark Andrews came the same way, sliding to 10.06 despite an ADP closer to the eighth round, giving the roster a projected TE14 at a discount most managers never sniffed. The one blemish worth noting is Saquon Barkley, taken about three quarters of a round ahead of his ADP, though when you are landing a projected RB8 the price is usually worth the anxiety. The projected starting group, anchored by Josh Allen at QB1 alongside Kenneth Walker III, Bucky Irving, and Quinshon Judkins, is the product of a draft that trusted process over panic. A 57th percentile tournament standing and a 67th percentile scoring season last year suggest a team that belongs in the conversation, and the 2026 roster gives no reason to think that changes.

The Mud Dogs do not dabble in correlation, they have built their entire ceiling around it. Caleb Williams connects to both Rome Odunze and Colston Loveland, giving this roster two active stacks from a single QB1-caliber arm, and Justin Herbert layers in a third pairing with Ladd McConkey at WR20. When those chains fire together, the scoring potential is genuinely frightening. When they do not, the floor drops fast, because this team's plan and its upside are the same thing. That is not a criticism so much as a description of the bet being made, and at 80th percentile in the field it is a bet placed from a position of real strength. Herbert came at a discount of nearly two rounds off his ADP, and Dalton Kincaid landed more than a round late at TE11, so the infrastructure around the stacks cost less than it should have. Jahmyr Gibbs anchors the ground game as the projected RB1. The Mud Dogs are not hedged and they are not apologizing for it.

Annabelle Acres is not a team you poke holes in, because the holes are not there. Sitting at 82nd percentile in the field and third in the Star Fox Division, this roster was built with the kind of quiet confidence that only shows up when a manager actually knows what they are doing. The foundation is real: Justin Jefferson at WR6 anchors the lineup, Tucker Kraft at TE5 and Kyle Pitts at TE7 give the team two genuinely elite options at a position that routinely separates contenders from pretenders, and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 gives Annabelle Acres a top-end backfield weapon worth building around. The draft execution was equally clean, highlighted by Brock Purdy falling a full two and a half rounds past his ADP to land at a price that bordered on embarrassing, and George Pickens sliding nearly a full round to round out a receiver corps that already features Jefferson and Chris Olave at WR11. Two steals, two values, zero major reaches. This is what a deliberate, disciplined SFB draft looks like when the manager does not flinch.

AdamSto04 didn't build this roster with one thunderbolt pick. They built it the way good drafters actually do: round after round, getting more than they paid for. Drake Maye at QB2 slid a full round past his ADP and landed at 3.02. Kyren Williams at RB15 fell more than a round before AdamSto04 scooped him at 7.02. And then Bo Nix, projected QB15, tumbled nearly three full rounds past his average draft position before being claimed at 8.11. That is not luck, that is a manager who came in with a plan and let the board come to them. Stack Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Nico Collins at WR9 on top of that patient approach and you have a starting group that looks less like a fantasy roster and more like a statement. The result is a team sitting second in the Star Fox division and in the 86th percentile of the field, a number that reflects what happens when nothing flashy is needed because the fundamentals were never in question.

After finishing in the bottom 6 percent of the field in scoring last season, Star Fox Adventure = GOAT has rebuilt itself into a legitimate 99th-percentile contender, and the transformation is not subtle. The foundation is a receiver corps headlined by Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and A.J. Brown at WR8, two projected starters who give this roster a ceiling that simply did not exist in 2025. The backfield matches that ambition, with De'Von Achane projected as RB6, Travis Etienne at RB18, and David Montgomery at RB23 all slotted as starters, giving the manager layered, high-quality options at every turn. The draft execution made it possible, as Patrick Mahomes fell three full rounds past his ADP before the manager scooped him at QB12, and Jalen Hurts landed nearly a round and a half late at QB9. Both quarterbacks project as starters. The tail end of the draft leans speculative, with a cluster of late receivers taken ahead of their ADPs, but when your core looks like this, you can afford to swing. Last year was a nightmare. This year looks like vindication.
