The weary truth about MortonSaltBoy is that six major reaches in a single draft is not bad luck, it is a philosophy, and this roster is its logical conclusion. The most damaging pair came back to back: Matthew Stafford, a QB14, yanked off the board in the third round at a cost of 2.2 rounds over his ADP, followed immediately by Bo Nix, a QB15, taken at the fourth-round turn at the same premium. Two consecutive picks spent on quarterbacks ranked 14th and 15th at their position, in a positionless format where both of those players project to sit anyway, and MortonSaltBoy still added Tyler Shough, a QB20, two rounds early in the sixth. That is three reaches at one position, and the rest of the roster absorbed the damage. CeeDee Lamb at WR5 is legitimately good, and Tee Higgins slipping to WR19 was a real value, but the draft board punished every detour, and this team lands third in the division, deep in the bottom three percent of the field, with a construction that never really gave itself a chance.

There is no kind way to frame what Poopbutt69, M.D, Ph.D is looking at in 2026. Sitting 11th in the Super Smash Bros. Ultimate division and projecting at just the 6th percentile of the entire field, this roster is in genuine distress, and the draft did nothing to paper over the cracks. The two most consequential draft decisions were both major reaches: Trevor Lawrence, a QB10 projection, was taken nearly two rounds early, and Baker Mayfield, projecting as QB18, went almost three rounds before his market value. In a positionless format where every pick carries opportunity cost, burning that much capital on a QB10 and a QB18 is the kind of move that haunts a team all season. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 is a legitimate anchor, and A.J. Brown at WR8 gives this roster something real to build around, but after those two the drop-off is steep and the draft produced zero steals and zero values to compensate. Poopbutt69, M.D, Ph.D came well-credentialed into 2026. The prognosis is not good.

There is not much to argue about with rssmoove's 2026 outlook, and that is the problem. The roster grades out in the 12th percentile of the field, and the draft did almost nothing to change the math, producing zero steals and sixteen chalk picks against a combined three reaches. The most damaging of those reaches was Brock Purdy, taken 2.2 rounds early at 3.07 despite projecting as QB13, which means rssmoove surrendered real mid-round equity for a quarterback who may not even crack the starting lineup on his best week. The top end shows genuine promise, Brock Bowers projects as TE1 and Drake London checks in at WR7, but the talent falls off quickly after that, with Rhamondre Stevenson slotting in as the weakest projected starter at RB31. After a 2025 campaign that was genuinely fine, 74th percentile in scoring, this roster looks like it has been quietly hollowed out, with no obvious upgrade path and a draft that mostly confirmed the ceiling rather than raising it.

FakeKramer enters 2026 looking like a team that drafted with confidence and arrived at the wrong party. The roster sits at the 25th tournament percentile, ninth in the Super Smash Bros. Ultimate division, and nothing in the construction suggests a hidden gear waiting to engage. The draft was almost entirely chalk, eighteen picks at or near consensus value, with the one genuine deviation being a reach on Tyler Warren at TE4 that cost a full round of capital to land. Warren projects as a legitimate starter, and so does Kyle Pitts at TE7, but the upside clustered at that position while the rest of the lineup depends on volume more than explosion. Justin Jefferson at WR6 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 are the genuine stars here, and if both stay healthy this team is in every game. The problem is the falloff is steep, with Tony Pollard projecting as the weakest starter at RB30 and Tua Tagovailoa grading out at QB31. Last season's 31 percent win rate was not an anomaly. This year's projection does not argue it was.

Sneaky Link sits eighth in the Super Smash Bros. Ultimate division and down in the 27th percentile of the field, and the draft sheet does not offer much reason for optimism. The team's two major reaches tell the story: Jaxson Dart came off the board 2.1 rounds ahead of his ADP to land a QB11 projection, and Bucky Irving was grabbed 2.6 rounds early to return an RB21. Neither player is bad, but spending capital that aggressively on players who graded out as mid-tier is how rosters end up thin on upside, and this one did. Ja'Marr Chase is a genuine WR2 anchor and Drake Maye profiles as a real QB2 asset, so the ceiling exists in isolated pockets. But Romeo Doubs, the projected WR53, is what the lineup leans on as a starter, and Quinshon Judkins, recovering from a late-season fractured fibula, is an injury question mark the team cannot afford to lose. There is no obvious lever left to pull, and the standings are probably going to reflect that.

Caillou sits at 55th percentile and seventh in the division, which is exactly as comfortable as it sounds. Christian McCaffrey, Kenneth Walker III, and Kyren Williams anchor a strong backfield, and Malik Nabers gives the passing game a genuine WR12 to build around. That is a real core. The problem is that everything around it asks a lot of questions without offering many answers. Lamar Jackson checks in as a QB3 but comes with the asterisk of uncertainty that follows any aging star, and the depth behind him is a procession of reaches: Malik Willis at QB24, Fernando Mendoza at QB27, Kirk Cousins at QB35, all taken well ahead of where the market valued them. RJ Harvey, one of only two players the manager drafted past his ADP, lands in a Denver backfield that now features JK Dobbins and Jonah Coleman alongside him, which makes his RB28 projection feel optimistic at best. Caillou

has enough talent to win the weeks it should win, but the margin for error when things go sideways is uncomfortably thin.

El Jojos came out of the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl draft with a roster that looks better than the draft board has any right to explain. The headliners are legitimate: Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 give this team a thunderous foundation, and Tucker Kraft slipping to TE5 in the sixth round when his ADP sat nearly two rounds earlier is the kind of quiet win that separates good drafters from lucky ones. But El Jojos did not just cash in on value, they spent it too. Kyler Murray was taken three and a half rounds before his ADP, and Trey Benson came off the board nearly five rounds early, the kind of aggressive bets that make draft analysts wince. Here is the thing: the projected lineup is still sitting at 62nd percentile in the field, which is not a championship ceiling but is a real one. Whether the Murray and Benson gambles look like conviction or wishful thinking by Week 10 is the whole season in miniature for El Jojos.

Samus didn't win the draft with one flashy pick. They won it by being right, over and over. Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Nico Collins at WR9 form a top end that most managers would build an entire strategy around, and Samus got Collins a full round later than his ADP suggested he should be available. The same pattern holds deeper in the roster: Emeka Egbuka slid a round and a half to WR18, Carnell Tate fell more than a round to WR29, and Colston Loveland landed at TE3 for roughly what his ADP demanded anyway. The one real blemish is Jared Goff, taken more than two rounds ahead of his positional rank, though the Goff and St. Brown stack and the Goff and Sam LaPorta stack give that investment some upside to grow into. The 2025 squad finished in the 81st percentile, and this roster, built on consistent value rather than any single swing, looks capable of improving on that number.

Jims14 didn't build this roster with one flashy move. They built it pick by pick, coming out ahead often enough that it added up to something real. The foundation starts with Josh Allen (QB1), and the stacks with D.J. Moore (WR26) and Dalton Kincaid (TE11) mean Allen's best games should ripple through the lineup twice over. Kincaid himself was a value, falling more than a round past his ADP and landing as a projected starter at TE11. Rashee Rice (WR13) was another, sliding eight spots in the order before Jims14 stepped in. Neither pick required any heroics, just patience and a willingness to take what the draft offered. The honest question mark is Caleb Williams (QB6), reached nearly a full round early at pick 2.10, which is a steep price even for a QB6. But in a positionless format where depth fuels flexibility, a roster with this many projected starters, Rice, Moore, Kincaid, George Kittle (TE9) and Allen anchoring everything, sits comfortably in the conversation for the division and at the 66th percentile of the field, it has room to climb.

claytonriley did not swing for the fences and miss, or load up on one big name and pray. This roster was built pick by pick, with the draft board doing most of the talking. Ladd McConkey came off the board at 6.05 when his ADP sat at 4.10, a full round and a half of free equity that most managers never found. Garrett Wilson fell a similar distance, landing at WR17 projection for the price of a WR who should have gone earlier. Those are not flukes, that is a manager who stayed patient and let the draft come to him. Anchoring the top end is Trey McBride at TE2 and Joe Burrow at QB4, which means claytonriley is not hoping for league-average production at the positions that matter most. The Herbert and McConkey stack adds a connected upside thread without forcing anything. Sitting third in the division and in the 82nd percentile of the field, this is a team built the quiet way, and quiet tends to hold up deep into the season.

BeenTrilll didn't win the draft with one thunderclap pick. They won it by consistently coming out ahead, and the receipts are in the numbers: just one major reach across the entire board, against a haul that includes Puka Nacua at WR1, a Jalen Hurts and DeVonta Smith stack that printed points last season, and a Dak Prescott at QB7 who arrived slightly early but at a price the market has since validated. The real story is the value column. Derrick Henry at RB12 slipped more than a round past his ADP, C.J. Stroud at QB22 fell over three rounds before BeenTrilll quietly picked him up in Round 12, and Oronde Gadsden at TE16 came in nearly two rounds late. That kind of discipline compounds. It means the back end of this roster has upside baked in at prices that other managers paid for lesser players. After a 2025 campaign that landed right at the tournament median, BeenTrilll enters 2026 sitting second in the Super Smash Bros. Ultimate division and projected in the 85th percentile, a product of a draft built not on luck but on patience and a refusal to overpay.

erinbaran14 sits atop the Super Smash Bros. Ultimate division and at the 100th percentile of the entire field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. This is a roster built on discipline and patience, the kind where the board does the work because the manager let it. George Pickens, a WR10 projection, slid a full round and a half past his ADP and landed at 4.07. Jameson Williams, projected WR21, fell the same distance and arrived at 6.07. De'Von Achane came off the board at 3.06 when his ADP sat nearly a full round earlier. That is not luck, that is a manager who understood when the room was wrong and acted accordingly. The result is a starting corps anchored by James Cook at RB5, Achane at RB6, Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, Pickens, Williams, and Tetairoa McMillan at WR15, with Dallas Goedert providing serviceable TE production behind them. Sam Darnold is the soft spot at QB21, but when six of your picks qualify as value or better and you record zero reaches across the entire draft, one thin position is the smallest possible price to pay.
