As the 2025 fantasy football season kicks off, Shake & Bake finds itself in a precarious position, desperately clinging to the bottom of their division. Despite a solid performance last year, finishing in the 66th percentile, this season's prospects appear bleak. The team's quarterback situation is particularly troubling, with C.J. Stroud and Tua Tagovailoa struggling to inspire confidence as they rank outside the top 15. Tua, in particular, seems an ill-advised gamble, expected to be a regular starter despite his lowly ranking. In a TE Premium setup, the team's tight ends are its only saving grace, but even their strong performances might not counterbalance the glaring weaknesses elsewhere, especially among wide receivers like Tetairoa McMillan and Keon Coleman, who rank far below expectations. The running back corps, while strong on paper, may struggle to carry the team

on their own. Additionally, questionable draft decisions, such as reaching for Brian Robinson and others, have compromised the roster's overall value. With an average starter age of 24.5, this youthful lineup lacks the experience and cohesion needed to compete at a higher level, leaving Shake & Bake in the unfortunate position of being last in their division and ranked in the 4th percentile overall. Without significant improvements, this season could prove to be a disheartening one for the team and its supporters.

However, the team's wide receiver lineup remains a concern, with Emeka Egbuka, Khalil Shakir, and Jakobi Meyers bringing moderate rankings that might struggle to bring in high scores. The tight ends, on the other hand, bolster Skunkdrool's potential with George Kittle and Evan Engram both poised to deliver impactful performances, especially vital in this TE Premium setup. Dallas Goedert, while a potential weak link, could still be a pivotal player if he outperforms expectations. Draft-day strategies paid off

with great value picks like Zach Charbonnet and George Kittle, but time will tell if reaching for Jakobi Meyers pays dividends. Currently ranked 8th in their division, Skunkdrool aims to climb the ranks, leveraging their strengths and addressing their weaknesses to move up from the 39th percentile standing overall.
