There is no polite way to say this: Total Nonsense is in trouble. The team sits at the 8th percentile of the field, which is the kind of number that tends to look worse once the season actually starts. The draft did not help matters. Fourteen chalk picks and a major reach on Jaxson Dart, taken nearly two full rounds before his ADP, ate up the goodwill that a positionless format can otherwise provide. Joe Burrow grades out as QB4 and CeeDee Lamb as WR5, so there is a real floor here, but below those two the roster thins into a collection of mid-tier contributors like Breece Hall at RB14 and Courtland Sutton at WR37, bracketed by late-roster names that project as filler. Rhamondre Stevenson, the weakest projected starter, sits at RB31, and there is no obvious upgrade path waiting in the wings. The Chrono Trigger division has Total Nonsense ranked last. When your best draft move is that Hall fell one round past his ADP, you are not managing a rebuild so much as you are hoping the calendar turns kind.

There is no kind way to frame what Tline29 did in this draft. The headline is Jordan Love taken at 4.10, nearly three full rounds before his ADP, burning a fourth-round pick on a QB17 when the quarterback market was nowhere near exhausted. That is the kind of reach that poisons a draft board, and Tline29 went back to the well with Carson Beck in round 17, a QB40 taken more than seven rounds early as if the supply of quarterbacks had suddenly dried up. The rest of the roster is genuinely good, Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Nico Collins at WR9 are real assets, but in a positionless format that rewards balance and value, torching two high picks on quarterback surplus leaves the team threadbare where depth matters. The draft logged zero steals, five minor reaches, and three major reaches. Tline29 lands 11th in the Chrono Trigger division and in the 15th percentile of the field, and there is nothing in the construction of this roster that argues the projections have it wrong.

There is a particular kind of fantasy exhaustion that sets in when you look at a roster, squint, look again, and realize the ceiling just isn't that high. AngriestDragon sits 10th in the Chrono Trigger division and in just the 16th percentile of the field, and the draft data does not offer much of an alibi. Fifteen chalk picks, zero steals, and a major reach on Braelon Allen, taken nearly three rounds early only to project as RB58, suggest a manager who trusted the process and got mostly the process back. The top end is genuinely fine: Drake Maye and Lamar Jackson give this team real QB upside, and Kenneth Walker III at RB10, Javonte Williams at RB17, and Travis Etienne at RB18 form a credible core. But the drop-off is steep. Rashee Rice at WR13 is the only receiver among the projected starters worth circling, David Njoku grades out at TE29, and the weakest projected starter is Kenneth Gainwell at RB34. There is no obvious move left, no buried asset to flip, no late sleeper ready to pop. This roster is what it is.

There is a particular kind of exhaustion that comes not from losing but from running out of ideas, and scrogad appears to have arrived at that place. The roster sits ninth in the Chrono Trigger division and in the bottom 20th percentile of the field, and the draft did not do much to change the trajectory. The positional groups tell the story in two halves: a genuinely strong backfield anchored by James Cook (RB5) and Ashton Jeanty (RB7) gives the roster a real foundation, but the receiver group runs out of steam quickly, with D.J. Moore (WR26) and Mike Evans (WR27) projected as starters and nothing behind them worth leaning on. The draft introduced three major reaches, including Jayden Daniels at QB5, a first-round commitment that cost scrogad the kind of positional flexibility a bottom-tier roster desperately needs. Last season's 39 percent win rate and 38th-percentile scoring were not anomalies to overcome, they were symptoms of a structural ceiling that this offseason did not raise. The lever is not pulled. The lever may not exist.

CoachVas50 drafted with discipline in 2026, landing Justin Jefferson at WR6 past his ADP and Chris Rodriguez as a late-round value, and doing so without mortgaging future picks to do it. The process was sound. The product is an 8th-place division projection sitting at the 24th percentile, which is the kind of outcome that makes you question not the decisions but the game itself. The receiver group is genuinely excellent, with Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, Jefferson at WR6, and Malik Nabers at WR12 giving this roster a top-end that most managers would sign for immediately. The problem is that the support underneath them is thin on upside, with Rico Dowdle projected as the weakest expected starter at RB32 and the backfield depth trailing off sharply after D'Andre Swift and Jaylen Warren. CoachVas50 also burned a fourth-round pick on Bo Nix, a QB15 who cost 1.8 rounds of premium in a positionless format where quarterback scarcity barely exists. Good values, sensible chalk, one damaging reach, and a roster that projects as merely average anyway. The draft did everything right except matter.

Easy Pickings enters 2026 sitting seventh in the Chrono Trigger division and at just the 30th tournament percentile, and the roster itself does not offer much reason for optimism. The foundation is genuinely solid: Omarion Hampton (RB9), Derrick Henry (RB12), and Kyren Williams (RB15) give the team real firepower at the top, and Trey McBride (TE2) is an elite asset by any measure. The problem is what surrounds that core. The receiving group is anchored by Quentin Johnston (WR41) and Chimere Dike (WR84), the latter of whom was taken nearly three rounds ahead of his ADP and projects as one of the weakest contributors on the roster. The draft also produced zero steals and zero values against six total reaches, which means this team essentially paid full price or more for everything it got and still came away thin at the margins. After a 2025 campaign that landed in the 5th scoring percentile, Easy Pickings needed a retooling draft. It did not get one.

Go Birds walked out of this draft looking like a team that ignored the consensus and got away with it. The foundation is legitimate: Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Jonathan Taylor at RB4 anchor a roster that could win weeks on the strength of those two names alone, and Taylor actually came at a discount, sliding past his ADP to land at 2.07. From there, the manager started coloring outside the lines. Parker Washington, Brock Purdy, Calvin Ridley, Brandon Aiyuk, all taken before the board said to. Most of the reaches were minor, a round here and a round there, the kind of thing you can defend over a beer. Then came Elijah Sarratt at WR98, grabbed nearly four rounds ahead of schedule, which is either a deep conviction play or a very confident accident. The thing is, the overall roster sitting at the 55th percentile suggests the strategy mostly held. Robinson and Taylor give this team a floor that most managers would envy, and if the conviction picks hit, Go Birds could be the team the Chrono Trigger division is talking about in November.

anththeman did not win the draft on one big swing. They won it by simply not losing it. Christian McCaffrey fell nearly half a round past his ADP and landed at RB3, a quiet discount on one of the most reliable fantasy assets available. Then look at the receiver group: Chris Olave at WR11, Zay Flowers at WR16, Terry McLaurin at WR24, Davante Adams at WR25, and Brian Thomas Jr. at WR31 all project as starters, giving this lineup a floor that most managers in the field would take without hesitation. The stack with Tyler Shough adds some connective tissue, and the Shough context is interesting enough to watch: he looked polished in Year 1 and now has Olave as a genuine WR1 option. The concern is that the 2025 season landed in the 28th percentile in scoring, so anththeman is building off a rough base. Still, sitting at the 72nd tournament percentile with a receiver group this layered, the arrow points up.

Some rosters spread their talent thin and pray for depth to save them. rspratt built this thing the opposite way, concentrating elite producer after elite producer at the positions that matter most in a positionless format where your best players simply play. Josh Allen is a QB1 and the anchor of everything. Drake London at WR7, Tetairoa McMillan at WR15, and Garrett Wilson at WR17 give this team three projected top-20 receivers starting at the same time, and Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33 is waiting in the wings if someone stumbles. Then there is the tight end situation, which is genuinely absurd: Tyler Warren at TE4 and George Kittle at TE9 are both projected starters, with the caveat that Kittle is working back from an Achilles tear and his Week 1 availability is legitimately uncertain. Even with that cloud hanging over Kittle, Jake Ferguson at TE12 is right there. This is a 79th percentile roster in the Chrono Trigger division because the talent at the top is suffocating, and that is the whole argument.

Team Melchior didn't build this roster on one splashy moment. They built it pick by pick, and the board kept rewarding them for it. Puka Nacua at WR1 is the kind of foundation that makes the rest of the draft easier, and the rest of the draft delivered: Josh Jacobs at RB16 landed a round and a half after his ADP, Kyle Pitts came at TE7 with similar discount, and four total values across the board add up to a roster that consistently cost less than it returned. The stack connecting Caleb Williams to Luther Burden could be the unit that separates this team from the rest of the Chrono Trigger division. Burden's 2025 second half already looked like the leap everyone was waiting for, and with Ben Johnson now comparing him to Amon-Ra St. Brown heading into camp, the Williams-Burden connection has legitimate upside baked in. Third in the division and 88th percentile in the field, Team Melchior is exactly where a quiet, well-executed draft tends to land you: quietly dangerous.

Aargyle81 didn't win the draft with one flashy pick. They won it by consistently coming out ahead on value, round after round, and that quiet accumulation has them sitting second in the Chrono Trigger division and in the 89th percentile of the field. The foundation is genuinely elite: Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and De'Von Achane at RB6 give this roster a top-shelf core before the conversation even gets interesting. Then the values kick in. Colston Loveland fell nearly a full round past his ADP and landed as a projected TE3 starter. Tucker Kraft fell almost two rounds and slots in as a projected TE5. Travis Kelce, somehow still a TE10 in this format, slid more than a round beyond where he was supposed to go. Three premium players at the same position, all acquired below market rate, is not luck, it is a manager reading a room. The Baker Mayfield and Emeka Egbuka stack layers in one more upside angle. There are no glaring mistakes here, just a draft that kept finding edges where other managers left them sitting.

Frog enters 2026 as the cleanest draft in the Chrono Trigger division, and the numbers back that up. Division rank first, 96th percentile in the field, zero reaches on the board, and a 2025 campaign that finished at 83 percent wins and 97th percentile in scoring. This is not a team that got lucky. The foundation is Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and Saquon Barkley at RB8, two projected starters who give Frog an upper-crust floor before the lineup even gets interesting. From there the value picks up: Harold Fannin came off the board nearly two rounds late, Dalton Kincaid fell over three full rounds past his ADP, and DeVonta Smith slid close to a round beyond where he was expected to go. Three good values and a steal, all absorbed without a single reach in return. The weakest projected starter is Chris Godwin at WR38, which tells you everything about how well this roster was constructed. There is not much to argue with here.
