JustinBauerle lands at the bottom of the Roller Coaster Tycoon division and in the 1st percentile of the field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The reach count is staggering: eight major reaches against zero steals, a draft that reads less like a strategy and more like a slow-motion collapse. The most damning stretch comes at quarterback, where Bauerle burned a sixth-round pick on Sam Darnold, a QB21 in an offense that already funneled its passing volume almost entirely to one receiver last season, then doubled down by taking Daniel Jones, a QB25, in the eighth. Two early picks spent on quarterbacks ranked outside the top 20 at their position, and nothing to show for the investment. The receiver group surrounding those quarterbacks offers no relief, with Courtland Sutton checking in at WR37 as the projected top pass-catcher. James Cook and De'Von Achane give this roster a pulse, but in a positionless format that rewards top-end talent at every level, a roster this lopsided in the wrong direction projects to be exactly as bad as it looks.

There is a particular kind of exhaustion that comes not from one catastrophic mistake but from a pattern of small, compounding ones, and TE Party! knows it well. After a 2025 campaign that produced a 12-24 record and landed in the 20th percentile of scoring, the 2026 outlook is grimmer still, with the team sitting 11th in the Roller Coaster Tycoon division and projected in just the 14th percentile of the field. The roster's ceiling rests almost entirely on a tier of elite talent headlined by Brock Bowers (TE1) and Tyler Warren (TE4), but the supporting cast thins out quickly, with Denzel Boston (WR58) projecting as the weakest starter. Then there is Dalton Kincaid, a TE11 projection who comes with the usual disclaimer: paired with Josh Allen he can contribute meaningfully, but the knee injury that clouded his late 2024 still has Bills GM Brandon Beane hedging publicly, which is not a reassuring sound from a manager who has precious little margin for error and no obvious move left to make.

There is a specific kind of fantasy fatigue that sets in when you look at a roster, squint at it from a few angles, and realize the ceiling is not hiding somewhere you missed. Monty1996 sits 10th in the Roller Coaster Tycoon division and checks in at just the 14th percentile of the field, and the draft did not generate the surplus value needed to outrun those projections. The receiver group grades weak, with Carnell Tate at WR29 as the projected top option after Monty1996 reached 2.2 rounds early to get him. The saving grace was supposed to be Trevor Lawrence, grabbed 2.2 rounds ahead of his ADP at pick 2.09, but Lawrence is a QB10 projection built on a genuinely strange foundation: his career year came without a reliable alpha receiver, with lesser names driving the production. That is not a blueprint, it is a puzzle. Josh Allen at QB1 is real, the RB group is serviceable, but when your clearest strength is a position that projects strongest and your receiver group is projected weak, you are not building toward something. You are hoping.

There is no flattering angle here. MattMontyFF arrived at this draft with apparent conviction and left with a roster that reads like a case study in misplaced confidence. The three major reaches tell the story cleanly: Kyle Pitts at TE7 cost two full rounds of draft equity before his ADP, Josh Jacobs at RB16 went a round and a half early, and Jonah Coleman, a projected RB51, was yanked off the board nearly four rounds ahead of schedule. That is not aggressive drafting, that is a manager bidding against himself in an empty room. The lone counterpunch, Davante Adams at WR25 falling a round past his ADP, barely registers against that kind of structural damage. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 is a genuine asset and Joe Burrow at QB4 gives the team a real anchor, but neither can paper over a roster sitting ninth in the division and in the 19th tournament percentile. After an 8-28 finish last season, MattMontyFF needed a reset. This draft was not one.

AndrewHallFF did almost everything right on draft day and has very little to show for it. The value column reads like a patience rewarded story: Tee Higgins at WR19 fell a full round past his ADP, Chris Godwin dropped a round to land at WR38, and Trey McBride, the TE2, came off the board nearly a round early at pick 2.01 when most managers were still asleep on the position. Five values across the roster, zero steals, and a grand total of two major reaches, which is about as clean a draft as you can run. The problem is that "clean" and "good" are not the same thing. Jayden Daniels was pulled a full round early at QB5, and Michael Pittman, hauled in two rounds ahead of schedule, projects as the weakest starter on the team at WR44. You can shop the discount rack all day and still leave with the wrong things. AndrewHallFF sits 8th in the Roller Coaster Tycoon division at the 44th percentile, which is exactly where teams land when the process was sound and the outcomes were not.

JMicCheck is the kind of team that wins a fantasy championship or finishes one spot out of the money, and the difference lives entirely in the margins. The backfield is genuinely dangerous, with Jonathan Taylor (RB4), Kenneth Walker III (RB10), Breece Hall (RB14), and Travis Etienne (RB18) all projecting as starters, giving this roster a legitimate elite core to build around. The problem is that the draft board shows a manager who reached, often. Four major reaches, including Germie Bernard (WR79) taken more than four rounds early and Ray Davis (RB62) taken nearly four and a half rounds ahead of his price, mean roster spots were spent on upside that may never arrive. Brock Purdy (QB13) offers a floor, but he's walking into a San Francisco situation where Mike Evans is the steadiest weapon and question marks surround nearly everyone else. That floor matters in a field this competitive, but floors don't win championships. JMicCheck lives at 46th percentile for a reason, and closing that gap requires things to go right, not just avoid going wrong.

davidisking1690 did not build this roster by swinging for fences and missing. They built it by consistently coming out ahead on value, round after round, and the cumulative effect is a team that lands in the 67th percentile of the field with real upside baked in. The receiver group is the engine here: Malik Nabers (WR12), DeVonta Smith (WR14), Zay Flowers (WR16), and Mike Evans (WR27) are all projected starters, and Smith in particular carries extra intrigue now that AJ Brown is gone to New England and Philadelphia's top target role is finally his alone. Marvin Harrison Jr. (WR33) rounds out that group as another projected starter taken at good value. Colston Loveland (TE3) was the other quiet win, a top-three tight end secured in the second round right around his ADP. The quarterback room is the one area where the projections are modest, but in a positionless format, the strength of the skill players can carry that weight. This is a measured, well-constructed roster that earned its standing.

Zurlacher didn't make any splashy moves that will dominate the offseason chatter, but when you tally the draft sheet, the results speak quietly and clearly. George Pickens fell a full round and a third past his ADP before Zurlacher scooped him at WR10, and Justin Jefferson landed at 2.05 when the board had him valued closer to a late first, a meaningful discount on a player who looks primed to remind everyone what he is now that Kyler Murray has taken the reins in Minnesota. Jaylen Waddle came along a round later than expected as well, giving Zurlacher a projected starting trio that holds up against anyone in the Roller Coaster Tycoon division. Drake Maye as a QB2 starter is the kind of quarterback anchor that quietly tilts close weeks, and the 74th percentile projection feels conservative for a roster built with this much consistent efficiency. Eleven chalk picks kept the foundation steady, and the values layered on top of that foundation are what push this team into the conversation.

Wadekhaos didn't need a flashy draft to build something real. The foundation is Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Saquon Barkley at RB8, two players who project as genuine difference-makers rather than roster decoration. From there, the draft showed a consistent ability to find value without forcing the issue: Chris Olave, Brian Thomas Jr., Quentin Johnston, and Jalen McMillan all fell past their ADP, each landing in Wadekhaos's lap at a round or more of discount. Four values across a single draft is not luck, it's patience working in a manager's favor. Caleb Williams coming off the board 0.7 rounds early qualifies as a reach, but Williams projects as QB6 and anchors a stack with Luther Burden that gives the team a ceiling worth building toward. The result is a team sitting 76th percentile in the tournament and fourth in the Roller Coaster Tycoon division, not because of one brilliant swing but because the draft quietly came out ahead, pick after pick, until the roster simply looked better than it should have.

Lightning Strike did not win the Scott Fish Bowl last year by accident, and the 2026 roster reads like a manager who learned exactly the right lessons. The foundation is Christian McCaffrey, a RB3 projection landed at pick 2.02 when his ADP sat nearly a full round earlier, and CeeDee Lamb, a WR5 who stacks neatly with Dak Prescott to give the team a built-in ceiling play every week. Those two picks alone signal a drafter who stayed disciplined while the board moved in their favor. From there, Rashee Rice at WR13 and Emeka Egbuka at WR18 were added as projected starters, Egbuka arriving more than a round after his ADP suggested he would. Thirteen chalk picks out of the whole draft sounds unglamorous until you consider that chalk is only boring if your baseline consensus is wrong, and Lightning Strike's baseline keeps producing, a 99th-percentile scoring season and an 86-percent win rate last year being the evidence. The floor here is formidable. Third in the Roller Coaster Tycoon division is almost certainly a temporary address.

Toddrew221 didn't build this roster on one splashy gamble. They built it pick by pick, and the ledger reflects it: one steal, four values, twelve chalk selections, and only three minor reaches across the entire board. That kind of quiet consistency is what lands you in the 89th percentile of the field and second in the Roller Coaster Tycoon division. The foundational piece is Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1, taken right where the market priced him, and paired with Ashton Jeanty at RB7, who slipped nearly a full round past his ADP to fall into Toddrew221's lap. At the top of the depth chart, Lamar Jackson at QB3 came a handful of picks later than his ADP suggested he should, and he arrives here already stacked with Mark Andrews, a connection that adds a layer of upside to an already-settled lineup. There are no hero picks holding this thing together. Toddrew221 simply kept finding the market asleep, kept taking the value, and kept building something that looks, round after round, exactly like a contender should.

Receiver? Just met her sits atop the Roller Coaster Tycoon division and at the 100th percentile of the entire field, and the draft sheet explains why. The headliner is A.J. Brown, a WR8 projection snagged at pick 4.07 against an ADP of 2.10, nearly two full rounds of free equity on one of the best receivers in the game. Pair that with Puka Nacua landing at WR1 despite slipping to 1.06, George Kittle coming in a round late at TE9, and Dallas Goedert falling over a round past his ADP, and you are looking at a roster built almost entirely on patience and board awareness. The discipline shows in the numbers: two steals, seven values, and zero major reaches across the whole draft. The Matthew Stafford and Nacua stack gives the team a correlated ceiling in the weeks it matters most, and the weakest projected starter is Goedert at TE15, which is not a weakness so much as a reminder of how little there is to criticize here.
