There is something genuinely sad about watching last year's golden ticket become this year's participation ribbon. John Romaker finished in the 90th percentile in 2025, a legitimate contender by any measure, and now sits at a 9th percentile projection and last in the Tecmo Super Bowl division. The roster still has real pieces: Josh Allen is a QB1, Tyler Warren checks in at TE4, and Saquon Barkley at RB8 gives Romaker a true difference-maker. But the draft tells a quieter, grimmer story. Zero steals, zero values, and five reaches, including Tua Tagovailoa pulled 2.1 rounds early and TreVeyon Henderson grabbed 2.3 rounds ahead of his ADP. Those are not aggressive swings that occasionally pay off; those are the moves of a manager chasing a roster that no longer exists, trying to rebuild last year's magic by overpaying for pieces that project nowhere close to what he once had. Romaker knows what a championship-caliber team feels like. This one is not it.

Kevin Payne lands in the Tecmo Super Bowl division at 11th, sitting in just the 14th percentile of the field, and the roster does not offer many reasons for optimism. The draft tells the story bluntly: 15 chalk picks, three major reaches, and zero steals. Payne reached nearly two full rounds early for Tucker Kraft, who projects as a TE5 and is a fine player, but burning a third-round pick on a tight end when the board had plenty left to give is the kind of decision that compounds quietly over a season. Justin Herbert at QB8 came off the board almost a full round before his ADP suggested, too, leaving Payne light on the draft capital that separates contenders from also-rans. Jahmyr Gibbs is a legitimate RB1 anchor and the brightest light on this roster, but after Gibbs the trajectory drops fast, with the projected receiving corps topping out at Carnell Tate at WR29. Last season Payne finished in the 65th percentile in scoring, and with this construction it is hard to project anything better than a slow slide in the wrong direction.

The Fantasy Nobody sits 10th in the Tecmo Super Bowl division and in the 21st percentile of the field, and the roster does not offer much reason for optimism. The positional anchor is a strong tight end group headlined by Harold Fannin at TE6, but the manager paid dearly for that depth, reaching roughly two rounds early for both Fannin and Isaiah Likely. Likely follows John Harbaugh to New York and projects as a genuine contributor in a light Giants tight end room, so the gamble on him may yet pay off, but banking two early picks on a single position is a steep price when the rest of the roster grades out near the league floor. The projected starter list runs through Chris Olave, Tetairoa McMillan, Ladd McConkey, and Davante Adams at receiver, which is respectable, but Bijan Robinson at RB2 is the only elite-tier name on the board, and Geno Smith at QB30 is the kind of quarterback situation that quietly bleeds points every single week. There is no obvious lever left to pull here, and the 2025 season at the 30th percentile in scoring suggests this is a team that has been here before.

Run Like Pants on Fire enters 2026 sitting ninth in the Tecmo Super Bowl division and in just the 23rd percentile of the field, and the draft log does not offer much reason for optimism. The team's two major reaches tell the story: Tee Higgins, pulled 2.1 rounds ahead of his ADP at pick 2.08, is projected WR19, a fine player but a steep price for someone who grades out as a good-not-great starter rather than a difference-maker. Jonathon Brooks, snatched 2.3 rounds early, comes in at RB37, the kind of projection that makes an early investment look like a panic buy in hindsight. Those two picks represent capital that could have landed something closer to Brock Bowers, the one unambiguous win on this roster as TE1, but instead the draft bent toward wishful thinking at the margins. Jaxson Dart and Kenneth Walker III give the team a functional ceiling, but functional ceilings in a field this deep tend to collect early exits, and with no obvious recourse available, the pants are very much on fire.

Matt Lapensee enters 2026 sitting eighth in the Tecmo Super Bowl division and in just the 24th tournament percentile, and the roster does not offer much reason for optimism. The brightest light is Puka Nacua, a projected WR1 whom Lapensee snagged one spot past her consensus landing zone, but one elite receiver cannot carry a squad this thin at the margins. The real damage was done in the draft room, where Lapensee reached 2.3 rounds early for Kyren Williams, a projected RB15, and another 1.6 rounds early for Matthew Stafford, a projected QB14. When you are burning draft capital that aggressively on players ranked in the middle of their position groups, you are essentially betting your season on things breaking perfectly. Last season's 17 percent win rate and eighth-percentile scoring suggest things rarely break perfectly around here. George Kittle at TE9 and Colston Loveland at

TE3 give the roster some legitimate depth to lean on, but with no steals and three major reaches already baked in, Lapensee looks less like a contender and more like a cautionary tale waiting to be written.

DanClasgens is a 51st-percentile team wearing 51st-percentile clothes, and in the Scott Fish Bowl that is exactly as precarious as it sounds. The foundation is real: Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and James Cook at RB5 give this roster a backfield core that most managers would trade for without blinking, and the Jayden Daniels / Terry McLaurin stack adds a ceiling that the raw numbers undersell. But ceilings only matter when the floor holds, and that is where the questions live. Brock Purdy sits at QB13 and looks like a sensible insurance policy until you remember that his receiver room is essentially a rehabilitation ward, with Kittle recovering from a torn Achilles, Ricky Pearsall's 2026 availability reportedly in doubt, and the 49ers banking on Mike Evans to paper over the damage. If Purdy is needed as a starter, that context matters enormously. DanClasgens jumped him two rounds early and got genuine value, but value only converts to wins if the player converts to production. This team lives and dies in the margins.

NickJGrdina didn't win the draft on one flashy pick. This team was built pick by pick, round by round, with a quiet consistency that adds up to something real. The foundation is a receiver group that genuinely belongs at the top of the field: Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Drake London at WR7 give this roster a ceiling that most managers would trade half their bench to reach, and Garrett Wilson at WR17 came as a value, slipping more than a round past his ADP. Caleb Williams at QB6 fell a similar distance, arriving in the fourth round when his ADP suggested he'd be gone in the third. Neither was a heist, just a draft that kept collecting small advantages and letting them compound. The reach on Elic Ayomanor three rounds early is the one moment the strategy got ahead of the evidence, and Tony Pollard projecting as the weakest projected starter is worth watching. But at 55th percentile with upside baked into multiple starters, NickJGrdina is squarely in the conversation.

TheToymaker didn't win the draft with one flashy pick. This team won it by being right over and over again. The clearest example is David Montgomery, who slid two full rounds past his ADP before TheToymaker scooped him up at 10.01 to land a projected RB23. That kind of patience compounds. Add Rome Odunze, a projected WR30 starter grabbed a full round late, and a receiving corps headlined by CeeDee Lamb (WR5) and Justin Jefferson (WR6), and you start to understand why this roster finished in the 63rd percentile in scoring last season and is now projecting into the 70th percentile of the field. The Bo Nix and Jaylen Waddle stack gives TheToymaker a built-in ceiling game when Nix gets right. The quarterback group overall is the shakiest part of the roster, but in a positionless format, the top-end firepower at skill positions can mask a lot. This team won't sneak up on anyone in the Tecmo Super Bowl division. It's too well-constructed for that.

Last year Bodking finished in the fifth percentile in scoring, a 7-29 record that was less a fantasy season than a public humiliation, and the 2026 roster reads like a direct response to every miserable Sunday that came before it. The receiver group alone announces the comeback: Jaxon Smith-Njigba projects as WR3, Nico Collins as WR9, and Emeka Egbuka as WR18, all three penciled into the starting lineup and all three acquired with genuine draft savvy, Egbuka in particular sliding more than a round past his ADP. The running back corps keeps pace, with Omarion Hampton projecting as RB9 and Josh Jacobs as RB16 giving the team a backbone that last year's roster simply did not have. A Jalen Hurts and Dallas Goedert stack adds connective tissue to the scoring upside. Bodking lands at the 79th percentile in the field, a figure that would have seemed like science fiction twelve months ago. The rebound is not coming. It is already here, baked into every pick.

Dibs on Bo Jackson. isn't hoping their stacks pay off, they built the whole architecture around them. Joe Burrow and Ja'Marr Chase sit at QB4 and WR2 respectively, the kind of pairing where a big Chase game almost guarantees Burrow had a hand in it, and Patrick Mahomes with Travis Kelce at his side gives this roster a second lever to pull if the Cincinnati connection goes cold. That's not depth as a fallback, that's a deliberate plan to spike the ceiling twice over. The manager also showed real patience at the draft table, landing Burrow at 2.10 despite a 2.05 ADP and Mahomes at 6.10 despite a 5.08 ADP, letting value come to them rather than chasing it. Pair those two quarterback stacks with A.J. Brown at WR8 rounding out the projected starters, and this roster projects as a correlation engine designed for one outcome: when the stacks hit, the scoreboard gets embarrassing. Sitting third in the division and in the 84th tournament percentile, the blueprint is already working before a snap is taken.

ProfessorIDP didn't build this roster with one big swing. They built it pick by pick, quietly coming out ahead on almost every transaction. Lamar Jackson, taken at 3.08 with an ADP of 2.03, is the centerpiece, a QB3 who slipped more than a full round past where he should have gone. Derrick Henry followed a similar path, sliding to 5.08 despite an ADP of 4.01, and he projects as a RB12 with genuine starter upside. Add a Dak Prescott and Jake Ferguson stack, both taken at discount, and the connective tissue of this roster starts to feel deliberate rather than lucky. Trey McBride at TE2 anchors the flex options, and the supporting cast, from Ashton Jeanty to Dalton Kincaid, gives ProfessorIDP real flexibility in how they deploy their best players on any given week. After a 33rd-percentile finish in 2025, this team looks structurally better, sitting second in the Tecmo Super Bowl division and projecting into the 86th percentile of the field. The professor graded the draft. The marks came back high.

Mighty Bomb Jacks didn't win their division by accident. Sitting first in the Tecmo Super Bowl division and in the 94th percentile of the entire field, this roster was built the way good ones usually are: not with a single home run swing, but with consistent execution up and down the board. The crown jewel is Drake Maye, projected QB2, who fell nearly a full round and a half past his ADP before landing here at pick 3.07. That kind of value doesn't happen often, and the Bomb Jacks caught it. Rashee Rice at WR13 and Jameson Williams at WR21 both slipped similarly, padding a receiver group that already features DeVonta Smith at WR14 and Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33. The honest caveat on Rice is real: the off-field concerns and the knee procedure create genuine uncertainty about his availability, and the Bomb Jacks priced that in at pick 5.07. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and De'Von Achane at RB6 anchor the backfield and give this team a floor that most rosters in the field simply cannot match. Thirteen chalk picks tell you this manager was disciplined. Four values tell you they were also paying attention.
