caino37 finished 2026's SFB draft sitting 12th in the Tetriz division and in the 16th percentile of the field, which means the process of getting there is worth examining. Five major reaches will do that to a roster. Joe Burrow at QB4 is a fine player, but taking him nearly a full round early in the first round cost real draft capital at a moment when the board was still rich. Then came Tyreek Hill, Tua Tagovailoa, and Dontayvion Wicks, each pulled before the market said to pull them, the reaches compounding like bad debt. Wicks alone was taken six full rounds ahead of his ADP, which is less a draft decision than a declaration of intent to ignore consensus. The irony is that Justin Jefferson fell into caino37's lap at WR6, a genuine value, and the response was to follow it up with Hill at WR77 taken 3.4 rounds early. Good fortune met poor discipline and discipline won. This roster has talent, but it was acquired at prices that left the back end thin and the overall construction 12th in the division for a reason.

ScottieBallgame did almost everything right in the draft room and still landed at 11th in the Tetris Division, which is the kind of outcome that makes you question the whole enterprise. The discipline was real: three values, twelve chalk picks, zero major reaches across the board. Jonathan Taylor at RB4, De'Von Achane at RB6, Kenneth Walker III at RB10, the top of this roster is genuinely formidable. But then the tiers fall away fast, and the projected starters at the skill positions away from running back tell the story plainly. Christian Watson projects as WR28, Brian Thomas Jr. as WR31, and Chigoziem Okonkwo, the weakest projected starter on the team, sits at TE19. In a positionless format those players do not represent a positional problem, they represent the ceiling of the roster beyond its top four, and that ceiling is firmly middling. ScottieBallgame bought the right tickets at the right prices and still ended up in the 19th percentile of the field. The value game is supposed to protect you. Here, it only made the disappointment harder to explain.

susteve09 enters 2026 ranked 10th in the Tetris division and sitting at the 24th percentile of the field, and the roster construction explains exactly how they got there. The draft tells the story pretty clearly: three major reaches in rounds seven through nine, where Jadarian Price (RB26), Tony Pollard (RB30), and Rhamondre Stevenson (RB31) were each taken more than two rounds ahead of their ADPs. That is an aggressive bet on a trio of backs who, by projection, grade out as fringe starters at best, and Stevenson is currently penciled in as the weakest projected starter on the roster. Josh Allen (QB1) and Colston Loveland (TE3) give this team a genuine foundation, and Harold Fannin (TE6) was a legitimate value at 6.10. But premium talent at the top only stretches so far when the middle of the draft is full of players taken well above market rate who have not yet justified the price. Last season's 22 percent win rate was not a fluke, and nothing about this roster construction suggests a dramatic reversal is coming.

COhnmeiss finished 2025 in the 94th percentile, and someone apparently decided the best way to celebrate that was to build a completely different team. The 2026 roster sits at the 32nd percentile in tournament scoring and ninth in the Tetris division, which is the kind of fall from grace that deserves its own highlight reel. The backfield is genuinely excellent, Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Derrick Henry at RB12 anchoring a group that will keep this team competitive in any given week. But the receiving corps drops off sharply after Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, with Michael Pittman projected as the weakest starter at WR44 and not much behind him to change that conversation. The draft did not help close the gap, either. Jared Goff cost a fourth-round pick despite projecting as QB16, a reach of 2.2 rounds that prioritized a Goff/St. Brown stack over roster depth at a moment when depth was already the problem. Last year's résumé is real. This year's roster is what it is.

GiantGemini sits eighth in the Tetris division and in the 33rd percentile of the field, and the roster tells you exactly why. The receiver group is genuinely impressive, led by Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and a cluster of starters that includes Garrett Wilson, Ladd McConkey, and Mike Evans, so there is real weekly upside at the top of the lineup. The problem is that the rest of the roster does almost nothing to support it. Justin Herbert comes in as a QB8, which is serviceable, but the RB group grades out weak across the board, and the draft offers almost no reason for hope: two major reaches, zero steals, and an overall approach that reads more like panic-buying than a plan. Reaching nearly two and a half rounds early for Oronde Gadsden at TE16 captures the draft philosophy in a single pick. Last season's 53 percent win rate and 57th-percentile scoring suggest a team that was already leaning on Chase and hoping for the best. In 2026, not much appears to have changed.

GWichard sits at 52nd percentile and seventh in the Tetris Division, which is basically the fantasy equivalent of a perfectly centered parking job: technically fine, accomplishing nothing remarkable. The core of this roster is genuinely good. Bijan Robinson at RB2, Ashton Jeanty at RB7, and A.J. Brown at WR8 give GWichard a ceiling worth respecting, and the margins are where this thing either climbs or collapses. The draft tells that story bluntly: not a single steal, and five major reaches, including Jake Ferguson burned three rounds early at pick 5.04 and Darnell Washington grabbed a staggering five-plus rounds before his ADP. Those picks absorb capital that could have sharpened the back end of the lineup, leaving Khalil Shakir projected as the weakest starter at WR51. That is not a disaster by itself, but at 52nd percentile, GWichard does not have the cushion to absorb weak links. Robinson and Jeanty deliver big, this team sneaks up the standings. They don't, and seventh place starts to look generous.

Juice7318 didn't swing for the fences and miss, didn't mortgage the middle rounds chasing one elite name. They just drafted well, repeatedly. The headliners are legitimate: Lamar Jackson at QB3 anchors the passing game, and a starting group that includes Chase Brown (RB11), Kyren Williams (RB15), CeeDee Lamb (WR5), and Chris Olave (WR11) gives this roster the kind of top-end quality that separates contenders from pretenders. What makes it click is the consistency that built it. Sixteen chalk picks and only three minor reaches tells you a manager who stayed disciplined rather than chasing, and the one real value on the board, RJ Harvey sliding to RB28 more than a round past his ADP, shows they were patient enough to let the draft come to them. Sitting at the 55th percentile of the field and sixth in the Tetris division may not sound like a triumph, but the underlying construction is cleaner than that standing suggests. This team belongs in the conversation.

bengalbuck didn't need a single knockout punch to build something worth watching in 2026. The wideout corps alone makes this roster dangerous: Puka Nacua at WR1, Nico Collins at WR9, Rashee Rice at WR13, and DeVonta Smith at WR14 all project as starters, and that last name deserves a longer look. Smith has spent five years operating in A.J. Brown's shadow in Philadelphia, but Brown is now in New England, and the Eagles' attempts to fill that void leave Smith as the unquestioned focal point of that passing game for the first time. bengalbuck grabbed him at 4.11 when his ADP sat at 4.03, a modest slip that now looks like quiet foresight. Pair that with Tucker Kraft at TE5 and a Jordan Love stack connecting the two, and there is a real floor here. The draft featured four value picks, zero major reaches, and consistent execution from top to bottom. Fifth in the Tetris division and 62nd percentile tournament-wide feels like an undercount for a team this steadily constructed.

JWSmallz08 didn't build this roster on one flashy move. They built it pick by pick, and the cumulative effect is a team that quietly belongs in the conversation. The anchor is Brock Bowers, the TE1, who gives this lineup a near-unmatchable advantage at his position every single week. Layer in a projected WR10 in George Pickens, snagged about half a round early, and a WR16 in Zay Flowers, who fell a full round past his ADP before JWSmallz08 scooped him up, and the core takes real shape. The Dak Prescott and Pickens stack adds a bonus layer of upside that could spike the ceiling on any given week. Beyond that, Carnell Tate projects at WR29 but carries genuine breakout range if his pairing with Cam Ward in Tennessee develops into the dynamic the Titans are counting on. Three values, eleven chalk, zero major reaches. That draft profile doesn't tell the story of someone gambling. It tells the story of someone executing. The 63rd percentile standing feels like a floor, not a ceiling.

There is not much to nitpick here, and that is the point. rjhj landed at 78th percentile in the tournament and third in the Tetris division by doing the boring thing exceptionally well: taking good players at fair prices and letting the two steals do the rest. Jordan Mason fell nearly three full rounds past his ADP and came home at RB41, and Adonai Mitchell slipped almost as far before rjhj scooped him at WR67. Those are the kinds of finds that separate a disciplined drafter from a lucky one. Up front, Jayden Daniels at QB5 and James Cook at RB5 anchor a lineup that does not need to get cute, and the Jalen Hurts and Dallas Goedert stack gives the team a built-in multiplier on Philadelphia passing game weeks. Even David Montgomery, signed to Houston to compete for carries after his role in Detroit diminished, adds meaningful depth behind a starting core that is already hard to knock. Clean sheet, no major reaches, nothing to apologize for.

There was no single moment where sam915 swung for the fences and connected. Instead, this draft was built on the kind of quiet, compounding edge that wins tournaments. Four players landed as genuine values, including Bo Nix at QB15 slipping a full round and a half past his ADP and Luther Burden arriving at WR22 a round later than he had any right to. The foundation those savings helped build is legitimately impressive: Drake London at WR7, Tetairoa McMillan at WR15, Tee Higgins at WR19, and Burden himself form a starting core that very few rosters in this field can match at the top, and Trey McBride at TE2 is one of the most valuable players on the board at any position. The Nix and Jaylen Waddle stack adds a ceiling game that the rest of the construction almost doesn't need. Sitting second in the Tetris division and in the 81st percentile overall, sam915 looks exactly like what it is: a team assembled with patience and precision, and fully capable of going deep.

DraftAuctioneer didn't steal the show in the Scott Fish Bowl's Tetris Division, and that's precisely the point. Sitting first in the division and in the 89th percentile of the field, this roster was built the old-fashioned way: find the market inefficiencies and keep cashing them in. Caleb Williams slipping a full 1.2 rounds past his ADP was a gift, and DraftAuctioneer took it. Marvin Harrison Jr. falling nearly a round and a half to land at WR33 on a roster that needed exactly that kind of depth at the position was another quiet win. Even Drake Maye, projected as QB2, came in half a round cheaper than he should have. None of these moves made anyone gasp at the draft board, but added together they represent a team that entered the tournament with consistent surplus value baked into its construction. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 anchors the whole operation, and the floor underneath him is legitimately deep. This team didn't need a miracle. It just needed to be right more often than everyone else, and it was.
