JamesDenverAdams drafted like someone who arrived to the board with a list of favorites and refused to let the board talk them out of any of it. The crown jewel of the carnage is D'Andre Swift, a RB24 projection hauled in at pick 4.10 against an ADP of 8.02, a 3.3-round overpay that consumed a pick that could have bought something real. Quinshon Judkins arrived three rounds early in round five. Kyle Monangai cost a fourth-round premium to land a RB33. In a 20-round draft, burning that kind of capital on running backs ranked 22nd, 24th, and 33rd at their position is not aggressive roster construction, it is a compulsive disorder with a waiver wire problem. Caleb Williams projects as a QB6 and is the legitimate anchor here, and Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 is genuinely elite, but those two bright spots are doing load-bearing work on a roster sitting dead last in the division and in the 2nd percentile of the field. The bones were there. The draft decisions buried them.

DynastyCLE enters 2026 sitting at the 5th percentile of the field, and the draft chart offers little comfort for anyone hoping this is a team on the rise. The most damning number on the board is the quarterback situation: Tyler Shough projects as a QB20 and Cam Ward as a QB23, meaning DynastyCLE is leaning on two of the weakest projected starters in the tournament at the most important position. That alone is often a death sentence in a field this deep. The skill position talent is not without names worth respecting, Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 give this roster a pulse, but the supporting cast thins quickly, and Mike Evans, who arrives in San Francisco after injuries limited him to just eight games last season, is a WR27 projection that carries real uncertainty. The draft featured one major reach in Josh Jacobs, pulled two-plus rounds ahead of his ADP, and zero steals. After a 33-percent win rate in 2025, DynastyCLE needed a reset. This does not look like one.

nomad sits 10th in the Legend of Zelda division and in just the 14th percentile of the field, and the draft record offers little reason for optimism: three major reaches against a single steal is a lopsided ledger. The damage is concentrated in the backfield, where Rachaad White (RB39), Jonathon Brooks (RB37), and J.K. Dobbins (RB36) were all taken well ahead of consensus, Dobbins by a full five rounds. Dobbins is the clearest emblem of the problem, a player returning from a Lisfranc injury into a Denver backfield that now also features RJ Harvey and Jonah Coleman, making his RB36 projection feel generous rather than conservative. The receiver group is the one genuine bright spot, with Jaxon Smith-Njigba (WR3), DeVonta Smith (WR14), and Jaylen Waddle (WR23) giving the lineup real upside at the top. But a strong receiver group can only carry a team so far when the draft burned valuable capital on running backs who may not even earn their workloads, and nomad finished at 50 percent wins last season with similar structural constraints. There is no obvious fix here, just hope.

Cubsrahn did almost everything right on draft day. Four values, twelve picks at chalk, zero major reaches, a draft sheet that would make a value-hunting analyst nod slowly in approval. And yet here we are: ninth in the division, 20th percentile in the field, a roster that reads like a lottery ticket where every number is almost correct. The foundation is real, CeeDee Lamb at WR5 and Colston Loveland at TE3 giving this team two projectable difference-makers, and Jeremiyah Love at RB13 adding a third. But below that tier, Cubsrahn leaned hard into receiver volume rather than receiver quality, stacking names like Tyreek Hill at WR77, Calvin Ridley at WR78, and Keenan Allen at WR99, players whose current projections suggest the market has largely moved on. Jake Ferguson falling 1.6 rounds was a genuine win. Chris Godwin falling a full round was another. Getting value is supposed to compound. Here it just cushioned the landing of a roster that, for all its disciplined construction, is still projected to lose more than it wins.

willythedeuce lands at 8th in the Legend of Zelda division and just the 35th percentile of the field, and the roster does not offer much reason to argue with those numbers. The real damage was done in the draft, where two major reaches haunt the sheet: Kyren Williams taken 2.5 rounds ahead of his ADP and Tony Pollard grabbed nearly four full rounds early. Both running backs are projected starters, but paying that kind of premium for a RB15 and a RB30 means willythedeuce burned early capital on players the market was happy to let sit. Josh Allen is a genuine QB1 anchor and there is real value scattered in the back half of the draft, but the ceiling on this roster is capped by the reaches up front. Even the Brenton Strange situation offers cold comfort: he projects as a receiving option in Jacksonville, but with a second-round tight end now in the building, Strange's role carries more uncertainty than his TE17 rank suggests. At 35th percentile, this team is not rebuilding. It is just stuck.

Last year, I'm Your Huckleberry posted a 30-6 record and scored in the 98th percentile. This year, they're projected 38th percentile and seventh in the Legend of Zelda division, which is the kind of fall that demands an explanation. The backbone of the 2025 version was almost certainly built on players who have aged out, moved on, or simply aren't here anymore, because what's left doesn't carry the same weight. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Kenneth Walker III at RB10 are genuine anchors, and Drake Maye at QB2 gives the manager a high-ceiling asset most of the field can't match. But the projected starters beyond that core thin out fast, with Romeo Doubs sitting at WR53 as the weakest projected starter, and the draft did nothing to mask it: fourteen chalk picks, two major reaches in Brian Robinson and Rashod Bateman, and zero steals. The reputation says contender. The roster says prove it.

jking31 sits at 52nd percentile in the field, which is exactly as comfortable as it sounds: not sweating, not celebrating, just watching the margins. The core is genuinely solid. Lamar Jackson at QB3 is a weekly weapon, Trey McBride at TE2 and Tucker Kraft at TE5 give the team an embarrassment of riches at the position, and George Pickens at WR10 alongside Terry McLaurin at WR24 and Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33 means the receiving corps can go punch for punch with most rosters in The Legend of Zelda division. The problem is that "most" is not "all," and in a tournament decided by margins, the soft edges matter. Christian Kirk at WR100 cost nearly five rounds of draft capital above his market price, a reach that likely displaced a player who could have shored up the depth that now separates a first-round exit from a run. Nothing on this roster screams weakness, but nothing screams destiny either. Jackson stays healthy, McBride stays elite, and jking31 makes some noise. One stumble in either direction and the margins win.

Last year, CLynched Fish finished in the 7th percentile in scoring, a campaign so bleak it barely registers as participation. The 2026 roster looks like a genuine answer to that misery. Justin Jefferson at WR6 and Rashee Rice at WR13 give the team a legitimate foundation at the top of the lineup, and Malik Nabers, despite a recovery from a torn ACL that had the dynasty community holding its breath all offseason, showed enough explosive burst in training camp to creep back toward his WR12 projection heading into the season. That trio alone represents a meaningful upgrade over anything CLynched Fish deployed in 2025, and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 adds a backfield anchor to match. The draft was largely disciplined, with Oronde Gadsden falling more than two rounds past his ADP into round 11 standing as the clearest windfall. None of this guarantees a turnaround, and the 73rd percentile projection suggests a team on the rise rather than a contender already arrived, but the direction of travel is unmistakable.

WyattBFF finished 2025 in the 65th percentile, and 2026 looks like a meaningful step forward, projecting into the 81st percentile on a roster built less on one defining swing than on consistent, quiet accuracy throughout the draft. The receiver group is the engine here, with Puka Nacua (WR1), Chris Olave (WR11), Jameson Williams (WR21), and Christian Watson (WR28) all projecting as starters, and Olave arriving as one of five values on the board, falling more than a round past his ADP. The quarterback picture carries real uncertainty: Jordan Love (QB17) is the kind of player analytical circles love for all the reasons that don't always show up in fantasy scoring, and Green Bay's receiving room still lacks a true alpha to push his numbers into elite territory. But WyattBFF also landed Love later than his ADP, which softens that risk considerably. This is a team that won 64 percent of its games last year and looks structurally better now, not because of any single move, but because almost nothing went wrong on draft day.

Criimedog doesn't have a signature moment to point to, no single audacious swing that defines the roster. What it has instead is a draft that kept winning small. Drake London at WR7 and Nico Collins at WR9 both slipped past their ADPs, giving Criimedog a receiving core that would be the envy of most managers in the field. Jaxson Dart fell a full round and a half to land as a projected QB11 starter. Brock Bowers at TE1 was a minor reach, sure, but that is the kind of reach you make without apology. Layer in Garrett Wilson at WR17 and Ladd McConkey at WR20 as projected starters, and the picture sharpens: this is a team built through consistent, compounding advantages rather than lottery-ticket gambles. Last season's 91st-percentile scoring finish suggests the process is sound. A third-place divisional projection and a tournament standing in the 84th percentile don't announce themselves with fireworks, but they are the quiet credentials of a team that simply kept coming out ahead.

Triforce of Power didn't need a single lottery-ticket pick to build one of the stronger rosters in this field. The secret is in how consistently they came out ahead of the board: seven values across the draft, zero major reaches, and the kind of quiet positional pillaging that only shows up when you study the pick-by-pick tape. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 anchors the whole operation, but the real craftsmanship shows in the mid-round work. Patrick Mahomes landed nearly two full rounds after his ADP, and Travis Kelce followed him off the board 1.2 rounds late, gifting this team a functional stack at a discount. James Cook at RB5 slipped past his number too, and even late-round targets like De'Zhaun Stribling came in cheaper than the market expected. The result is a roster sitting at the 85th percentile in the tournament with six projected starters carrying top-15 marks at their position. Division rank of second feels, if anything, modest. This team drafted like it already knew the answers.

After finishing 2025 in the fifth percentile with a record that would make most managers delete their account, Death_Dealers have rebuilt into something genuinely formidable, and the 2026 roster reads like a formal apology to the scoreboard. The foundation is Joe Burrow, a QB4 projection anchored to Tee Higgins at WR19, a stack that gives this team a weekly ceiling most managers can only envy. Around that core, Bijan Robinson at RB2 and A.J. Brown at WR8 were acquired with the draft discipline to match, Brown falling nearly a full round past his ADP before Death_Dealers pounced. The tight end group quietly represents some of the sharpest value on the whole roster: Dalton Kincaid at TE11 slid nearly three rounds past his ADP, and Isaiah Likely at TE13 fell nearly as far. The result is a team sitting first in the division and in the 98th tournament percentile, which is less a roster preview and more a statement of intent from a franchise that spent a miserable year storing up motivation.
