There is no charitable read available for UgGMoE, and the draft board confirms it at every turn. The team sits second percentile in the tournament field, dead last in the Clash Royale division, and the draft itself reads like a cautionary tale: zero steals, zero values, ten minor reaches, and two major ones. The most egregious of those major reaches is Kenneth Gainwell, a RB34 scooped up two-plus rounds ahead of his ADP and projected to be the weakest starter on the roster, which is its own kind of achievement. The other major reach, Ashton Jeanty, at least has the RB7 projection to justify some affection, but pulling him nearly a full round early when the board was still loaded with value sets the tone for how this draft unfolded. Colston Loveland at TE3 is genuinely good, and Jeanty and Derrick Henry give this team a real foundation, but when your draft's defining characteristic is that you consistently paid a premium for players without extracting a single surplus pick in return, the ceiling closes fast.

Fire Flowers sits at 5th percentile in the tournament and 11th in the Clash Royale division, and the draft tells you exactly how it got there: three major reaches against zero steals, a roster that was actively constructed backward. The most glaring exhibit is Kyler Murray, pulled nearly three rounds early at pick 5.09 to land a QB19. In a positionless format, burning a top-five pick on a borderline starter is the kind of decision that echoes through every round that follows, and sure enough the roster never recovers its footing. Justin Jefferson is genuinely excellent at WR6, and Jaylen Waddle is a projected starter too, but Waddle cost nearly two rounds of premium to acquire, which means Fire Flowers essentially paid twice for the same lineup spot. Parker Washington rounds out the receiver group with real ceiling concerns: he led Jacksonville in targets last season despite being behind Brian Thomas Jr. and Travis Hunter on every organizational depth chart, and nothing about that situation has been resolved. This roster did not get unlucky. It got outmaneuvered by itself.

Moore Coker in Ma Homes enters 2026 sitting tenth in the Clash Royale division and in the bottom tenth percentile of the entire field, and the roster grade offers little reason for optimism. The top of the lineup has genuine talent, Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4) and Tyler Warren (TE4) are legitimate cornerstones, and the Caleb Williams and Rome Odunze stack adds a ceiling-raising wrinkle. But after that, the drop-off is steep and real. Quinshon Judkins (RB22) is an intriguing name coming off a fractured fibula, and if he arrives at Browns camp healthy he could outperform that projection, but betting a season on a recovering leg is exactly the kind of prayer a desperate roster invites. Last year's 28 percent win rate and 31st-percentile scoring were not flukes to correct but a baseline to confront. The draft produced zero steals and leaned heavily on chalk, meaning the path to improvement runs almost entirely through player development rather than draft-day cleverness. There is no obvious lever left to pull, and the schedule does not care.

There is no polite way to dress this up: the TEabaggers are sitting at 12th percentile in the field, ninth in the Clash Royale division, and the draft did not do much to change the trajectory. The receiver group is the soft underbelly of this thing, with Courtland Sutton checking in at WR37 as the lone projected starter at the position, and while he did fall to 10.01 against an ADP of 8.10, getting a discount on a WR37 is a bit like finding a coupon for something you did not really want. The real problem is that the draft leaned heavily on chalk with ten picks at or near consensus value, and the two major reaches, Deshaun Watson at QB34 and Ray Davis at RB62, did not move the needle upward. Joe Burrow and Trey McBride give this roster a genuine foundation, and the Jalen Hurts and Dallas Goedert stack adds a layer of upside, but when your projected weakest starter is Aaron Jones at RB38, the margin for error is essentially gone before the season even starts.

There is a specific kind of exhaustion that comes not from catastrophe but from accumulation, and Boston FPL is deep in it heading into 2026. The team sits at 8th in the Clash Royale division and projects in just the 16th percentile of the field, and the roster itself explains why there is not much room for optimism. The top-end talent is real but not elite: Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and A.J. Brown at WR8 are legitimate contributors, but Brown came at a significant cost, taken a full round ahead of his ADP, and Luther Burden was pulled even earlier than his projection supported. Paying a premium for your best players leaves you thin on surplus value everywhere else, and this roster has none. RJ Harvey, projected at RB28, is caught in a Denver backfield that added Jonah Coleman while keeping JK Dobbins, and that is not a situation that trends toward clarity. The quarterbacks grade out weak. The margins are too small and the draft too chalk-heavy to manufacture a different outcome.

kingjerseyduck ran a disciplined draft, landing 13 chalk picks and converting three more into genuine value, including Chuba Hubbard at RB29 snagged two full rounds after his ADP and Jadarian Price at RB26 taken a round late. The problem is that discipline and wisdom are not the same thing. The wide receiver group is legitimately good, with Ja'Marr Chase at WR2, George Pickens at WR10, and Garrett Wilson at WR17 forming a top-end that most managers in the Clash Royale division would envy. But the tier drops off fast after that, the quarterback room is a fog of uncertainty, and Dalton Schultz at TE22 is the kind of streamer-tier anchor that quietly sinks totals. A 28th-percentile projection tells the real story: the foundation was built carefully, and the ceiling arrived anyway at a frustrating medium. Coming off an 88th-percentile scoring season in 2025, kingjerseyduck knows what this roster is capable of. This version is not that.

Fumble Factory did not swing for the fences and whiff, nor did they stumble into a great roster by accident. They simply drafted well, pick after pick, and the cumulative effect landed them in the 67th percentile of the field. The foundation is genuinely hard to argue with: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and De'Von Achane at RB6 give this team a top of the roster that most managers would take without hesitation. Malik Nabers at WR12 and Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 keep the quality rolling, and the minor early investment on Nabers at pick 3.03 looks justified given where he projects. David Montgomery adds meaningful depth as he heads to Houston to compete for a starting role, which gives him a real path back toward relevance. The one place where Fumble Factory gets a little thin is at the projected starter level, where Josh Downs at WR46 is doing a lot of work as the floor. Still, finishing 6th in the Clash Royale division with this kind of top-end talent suggests the standings may not tell the whole story.

LilHous finished this draft without a single steal or value pick on the board, yet somehow landed at the 68th percentile of the field, and the how of that is worth examining. The major reach was Alvin Kamara, pulled nearly three full rounds early at 13.05 when his ADP sat at 16.03, a move that looked panicked on paper and projects as the weakest individual investment on the roster given his RB50 ranking. But here is the thing: while LilHous was busy paying premiums on late-round names like Calvin Ridley and Brandon Aiyuk, the top of the roster was quietly becoming something real. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and Nico Collins at WR9 are projected starters who form as strong a foundation as almost anyone in the Clash Royale division can claim, and DeVonta Smith at WR14 pushes that ceiling further. The Kamara overpay stings, but in a positionless format where that top-end talent gets deployed freely, LilHous may have bought themselves just enough rope to climb with.

theDude sits at 86th percentile in the field and fourth in the Clash Royale division, and the draft sheet looks like it should not have worked out that way. Three major reaches, including Michael Mayer pulled nearly eight rounds ahead of his ADP and Malik Willis grabbed more than three rounds early, are the kind of moves that get a manager roasted in draft chat. But here is the thing: the top of this roster is genuinely excellent. Christian McCaffrey fell nearly a full round past his ADP and landed at 2.05, which is the kind of gift that covers a lot of sins elsewhere. Josh Allen anchors the QB room as a projected QB1. Omarion Hampton projects as RB9. Harold Fannin slots in as a TE6 starter. The reaches did not hurt the ceiling because the value at the top was real enough to absorb them. Whether theDude saw something in those later picks that the field missed, or simply got lucky on the players who mattered most, the roster itself is not arguing the point.

thedtrain lands at third in the division and the top 10 percent of the field, and the draft record tells you exactly why: 15 chalk picks, three genuine values, and almost nothing wasted chasing upside that wasn't there. That kind of discipline compounds quietly. Bijan Robinson at RB2 gives this roster an anchor that most managers in the field would envy, and then Bucky Irving falls a full round and a half past his ADP to land at RB21, a second high-end contributor acquired at a discount when others apparently stopped paying attention. The receiver corps follows the same pattern: Chris Olave, projected WR11, slipped nearly a full round before thedtrain grabbed him in the fourth. The one real blemish is Dontayvion Wicks, taken more than four rounds ahead of ADP in round 17, which is a curious early commitment to a WR96 projection. But one late-round reach does not unravel a draft built on patience and precision. This team did not need a single splashy moment to come out ahead. It just kept winning the transaction.

VaperWare sits at 99th percentile tournament-wide and second in the Clash Royale division, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. This roster was built with the kind of patience that wins leagues, landing six good values and two outright steals without a single major reach on the board. Kyren Williams and Tyjae Spears both slipped nearly three rounds past their ADPs, gifts that a disciplined manager pocketed without flinching. The top end is where this team really earns its reputation: Saquon Barkley at RB8, Brock Bowers at TE1, and CeeDee Lamb at WR5 form a projected starting core that almost any team in the field would envy. Trevor Lawrence adds another dimension as QB10, coming off a career year that featured nearly 30 passing scores and a career-high nine rushing touchdowns, even while the offense around him produced confounding fantasy narratives. A floor this high, built this cleanly, with this little draft inefficiency to pick apart is not luck. It is craft.

CalvinSGF sits atop the Clash Royale division at the 100th tournament percentile, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. Eight values and a steal across the roster, zero reaches, and a starting lineup that projects Puka Nacua at WR1, James Cook at RB5, and Drake Maye at QB2 before you even get to the depth. This is a draft built on patience and discipline, not luck. The steal of the board is Brian Robinson, scooped up 3.6 rounds past his ADP, but the more interesting upside play is Bhayshul Tuten, a projected RB25 who lands in Jacksonville's suddenly open backfield after Travis Etienne departed for New Orleans. The Jags brought in competition, but Tuten's draft pedigree outranks it, and if he claims that featured role, CalvinSGF gets starter-quality production from a player taken like an afterthought. Add Rashee Rice at WR13 and Terry McLaurin at WR24 rounding out a starting group where the projected weakest link is Michael Pittman at WR44, and this roster looks less like a fantasy team and more like a statement.
