beechman300 finished 44th percentile in scoring last year and is somehow trending in the wrong direction, sitting dead last in the Axel Steel division and in just the 3rd percentile of the broader field entering 2026. The roster is not without its pieces, Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Nico Collins at WR9 are genuine difference-makers, but the draft did this team real damage. Four major reaches in a single draft is how you burn capital without building depth, and the worst of the bunch was Jacoby Brissett, a QB28 projection yanked nearly three rounds before his market price. That is the kind of move that echoes all season. Meanwhile, Matthew Golden was grabbed nearly five rounds early and sits at WR52, meaning beechman300 paid a steep premium for a player who may never crack the lineup on merit. Robinson and Collins give this team a pulse, but a pulse is not a playoff plan, and with no obvious recourse left on the board, this one looks like a long fall in a short season.

Arthur Morgan drafted like a man who found a treasure map and still managed to dig up a septic tank. The RB group looks legitimate on paper, with De'Von Achane, Derrick Henry, Travis Etienne, Cam Skattebo, Quinshon Judkins, and Bhayshul Tuten all projecting as starters, but Tuten was a major reach taken 2.3 rounds early, Skattebo cost a minor reach, and the gains made there were essentially offset by the catastrophic QB situation waiting at the end of the draft. Bryce Young projects as QB26 and anchors the starting lineup, while Carson Beck sits at QB40 and was still somehow reached 6.4 rounds before his ADP, a move that consumed a pick so early it likely squeezed out real talent elsewhere. The WR corps beyond CeeDee Lamb thins out fast, with Rashid Shaheed at WR57 and a pair of major reaches in Malachi Fields and Jack Bech rounding out the depth. This team finished in the 8th scoring percentile in 2025 and is currently projected in the 7th percentile in 2026. Consistency, at least, is something.

The Factory of Sadness drafted like a team that had already accepted its fate. Three major reaches across the draft board, zero steals, and a 2025 record of 13-23 that offered no reason for optimism heading into 2026, yet somehow the lesson went unlearned. The reach on Deshaun Watson at QB34 is the most damning entry in this ledger: taken in the 14th round when the board clearly had no use for him, he projects as a depth piece so thin you can see through it. Meanwhile, Jonah Coleman was yanked more than three rounds ahead of his ADP to land at RB51, a price that would be questionable for a locked-in starter and is borderline indefensible for a RB51. The anchors here are real, Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and Omarion Hampton at RB9 are genuine assets, but surrounding those two with Watson cameos and Coleman lottery tickets is like building a house on a foundation and then finishing the walls with paper. This roster sits 10th in its division at the 37th percentile, and nothing in the draft suggests it will climb.

CDC440 drafted with patience and discipline, collecting four values across the roster and avoiding any catastrophic reaches, and the reward for all that restraint is a team sitting ninth in the Axel Steel division and hovering around the 39th percentile. That is the cruelest grade a draft can receive: a passing score that still fails to clear the curve. The clearest illustration is Brock Purdy, taken a full round and a half after his average draft position, a genuine value on paper, and yet Purdy heads into 2026 surrounded by question marks at every skill position, with George Kittle's Achilles recovery clouding his early availability and Ricky Pearsall's knee situation threatening his season entirely. A discount on a quarterback only matters if the quarterback has someone to throw to. The same logic haunts the roster elsewhere: the values were real, the process was sound, and the projected ceiling still lands below the tournament's median. CDC440 did not mismanage the draft. The draft just did not cooperate with the outcome.

ThatMetalJew drafted with genuine discipline. Josh Allen fell to pick 1.09, Jake Ferguson slid more than a round past his ADP, and the team landed Joe Burrow at a discount in a format where positional scarcity barely exists. Zero major reaches, mostly chalk, a few minor ones at the margins. The homework was done. The problem is that the sum of those patient decisions is a roster sitting at 46th percentile and eighth in the division, which is the part a spreadsheet cannot explain away. The Burrow-Tee Higgins stack is the engine, and it is a real one, but Burrow's injury history is not a footnote you can bury, it is the headline: a torn ACL, a torn wrist ligament, a grade-3 turf toe that wiped out most of 2025. When healthy, he is elite. He simply has not been healthy. So ThatMetalJew drafted right, avoided reaching, and is still staring at a roster where the margin for error is almost entirely controlled by one quarterback's medical chart.

hermanam87 sits at 53rd percentile with a roster that feels exactly like what that number implies: competitive enough to beat the teams below them, not quite enough to rattle the teams above. The clearest strength is at tight end, where Brock Bowers (TE1), Colston Loveland (TE3), and George Kittle (TE9) give this team a genuine edge most opponents cannot match at the position. The problem is that the margins decide everything else. Bucky Irving (RB21) is the best non-TE option on the board, and while he arrived at good value after falling past his ADP, an RB21 as the top running back is a ceiling question more than an answer. The Justin Herbert and Ladd McConkey stack adds a correlation bonus with real upside, but Herbert is a QB8 projection that comes with the quiet anxiety of never quite knowing which version shows up. Last season's 39 percent win rate is a reminder that this roster has been here before, close enough to matter, just not quite enough to climb.

BAR1/AARON2 built something real here, and the draft board will not fully explain how. The analytical read is skeptical: fourteen chalk picks, zero steals, and two major reaches. The roster read is considerably warmer. Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 form a backfield core that most managers would mortgage a mid-round pick to assemble, and Jeanty actually came to BAR1/AARON2 as a value, sliding a full round past his ADP. Up top, Justin Jefferson at WR6 and Chris Olave at WR11 give this lineup a receiving ceiling that sits comfortably above the division median. The reaches are where the story gets interesting. Tory Horton was drafted 6.2 rounds ahead of his ADP, and Ted Hurst came off the board 3.2 rounds early. Those are not typos, those are convictions, and whether they pan out will determine if this team climbs from its current 55th percentile standing or stays parked there. The bones are good. The gambles are real. That tension is the whole season.

There was no lottery ticket moment in jamike's draft, no single pick that swings the entire outlook, just round after round of quiet competence that added up to something genuinely dangerous. The clearest example is Saquon Barkley, a projected RB8 who slid nearly a full round past his ADP before jamike scooped him at 3.11, a small edge that compounds when the rest of the board looks this clean. Pair Barkley with Chase Brown at RB11 and Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, and the top of this roster has real teeth. Lamar Jackson at QB3 and Kyle Pitts at TE7 keep the floor elevated at positions where the gap between tiers is brutal. Even the weakest projected starter, Michael Pittman at WR44, is a serviceable name, not a liability. With 16 chalk picks and only three minor reaches across the entire draft, jamike was not gambling, just drafting with conviction. The 2025 résumé backs it up: a 64 percent win rate and a 71st percentile scoring season. Fifth in the division right now, but this team has the profile to move.

davidbredemus didn't try to be clever. There were no lottery tickets cashed in, no desperate reaches, just a draft that kept grinding out favorable exchanges round after round. The clearest example is Jahmyr Gibbs, a projected RB1 anchoring the lineup, paired with Kenneth Walker III at RB10 and Josh Jacobs at RB16, giving this team a backfield depth that makes the top of the roster genuinely hard to beat. Drake Maye landing at QB2 while barely slipping past his ADP is the kind of quiet win that doesn't show up on a highlight reel but absolutely shows up in the standings. The Jared Goff and Jameson Williams stack adds a connected scoring upside that could spike on the right week. The weak point is real, Kenyon Sadiq projects as a TE21, and that ceiling matters, but in a positionless format the strength concentrated elsewhere offsets a lot. A 62nd percentile projection and fourth in the Axel Steel division feels like a floor for a roster this consistently constructed, not a ceiling.

We Are Both Carls didn't win the draft with a single flashy moment. They won it by being right, over and over again. The cornerstone is Christian McCaffrey at RB3, paired with Harold Fannin at TE6, two players whose projected output alone would anchor most lineups in the Axel Steel division. But the real story is how the rest of the roster filled in without a single major reach. Jayden Daniels, projected QB5, slid nearly a full round past his ADP and landed at 3.08, then comes paired with Terry McLaurin in a stack that adds a WR24 starter essentially as a bonus. The depth below those pillars holds up, too. Three projected starting tight ends in Fannin, Dalton Kincaid at TE11, and Oronde Gadsden at TE16 give this team flexibility that most managers can only sketch out on paper. Coming off a 23rd-percentile scoring season in 2025, there is clear room to climb. A 62nd-percentile projection and a third-place divisional standing feel like a floor, not a ceiling.

sward12 lands at second in the Axel Steel division and the 80th percentile of the field, and the draft board tells you exactly why: this was a roster built through consistent, quiet execution rather than any single flashy moment. The headliner is Puka Nacua at WR1, a genuinely elite projected finish, flanked by A.J. Brown at WR8 and Garrett Wilson at WR17 to form a receiving core that simply wins. The real craftsmanship shows up deeper. Jeremiyah Love lands as RB13 despite slipping all the way to pick 6.12, nearly two and a half rounds past his ADP of 4.05, the kind of gift that usually goes to someone paying closer attention than everyone else in the room. The stacks add structural juice, pairing Jalen Hurts with Dallas Goedert and Matthew Stafford with Nacua, so when Philadelphia or Los Angeles has a big week, sward12 tends to collect twice. Fifteen chalk picks and only one major reach across the whole board is not a coincidence. That is a manager who showed up with a plan and stuck to it.

Biggamejames777 did not stumble into first place in the Axel Steel division and the 99th tournament percentile by accident. This is a roster assembled with the kind of patience and precision that makes other managers question their life choices. The centerpiece is Ja'Marr Chase at WR2, a projected starter who needs no further introduction, flanked by Drake London (WR7), Malik Nabers (WR12), and Tetairoa McMillan (WR15), all starters, all acquired with discipline. And Nabers is the crown jewel of the draft process: taken at 6.08 when the field had him priced at 3.11, a steal of nearly three rounds that borders on theft. Patrick Mahomes arriving at 7.05 against an ADP of 5.08 adds further evidence that Biggamejames777 was not just drafting talent but hunting value with a list and a plan. Tyler Warren anchors the tight end spot at TE4. The weakest projected starter is Makai Lemon at WR40, which, given the company he keeps, is less a concern and more a footnote. Last season was a different story. This one looks nothing like it.
