JaredSmola enters 2026 sitting 12th in the Crash Bandicoot division and in just the 19th percentile of the field, and the roster itself doesn't offer much reason to argue with those numbers. The draft tells the story cleanly: zero steals, zero values, 14 chalk picks, and a Calvin Ridley who arrived 2.8 rounds ahead of his WR78 projection, which is the kind of transaction that ages like milk. The two headliners, Puka Nacua at WR1 and Derrick Henry at RB12, are genuinely good, but the supporting cast fades fast, and the projected weakest starter is J.K. Dobbins at RB36, a player who has to carry real lineup weight with very little behind him. Patrick Mahomes and Travis Kelce sharing a stack provides a real correlation bonus, but Mahomes grades out at QB12 and Kelce at TE10, so that partnership is competent rather than explosive. Last year's 72 percent win rate looks like a ghost haunting this

roster, because on current projections, JaredSmola looks like a team running out of miracles before the season even starts.

johnathanerb enters 2026 sitting 11th in the Crash Bandicoot division and in just the 21st percentile of the field, and the roster does not offer much reason for optimism. The headliners are real: Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Justin Jefferson at WR6 give this team a legitimate top end, and a manager can build around that. The problem is the drop-off. Tony Pollard projects as the weakest projected starter at RB30, and the supporting cast beyond the top names grades out soft. On the draft side, johnathanerb managed just one value pick across the entire board, against two major reaches, including Brock Purdy pulled 1.5 rounds ahead of his ADP and Christian Kirk yanked an eye-watering 5.3 rounds early. That is not a draft that improves a roster at the margins, it is one that mortgages them. Coming off a 15-21 record and a 24th-percentile scoring finish in 2025, this team needed a reset. Instead it got more of the same, McCaffrey and Jefferson carrying a structure that will buckle the moment either one misses time.

Last year AndyO5711 went 23-13, scored in the 89th percentile, and looked like a team that had figured something out. This year's projection puts them at the 21st percentile, 10th in the Crash Bandicoot division, and the distance between those two data points is genuinely hard to look at. The roster is built around some real talent, De'Von Achane at RB6 and Drake Maye at QB2 give this team a legitimate ceiling, and George Pickens at WR10 is the kind of WR1 most managers would take. But the draft process offers little comfort. Josh Jacobs, reached 1.6 rounds early, is projecting as RB16, meaning AndyO5711 paid a premium for a player who isn't returning that price. Deebo Samuel came off the board two rounds ahead of his ADP and is projecting WR70. The gap between what this team was in 2025 and what it looks like now is not a slump, it is a structural argument, and the projections are not winning it.

Last year's 83rd-percentile finish has a way of raising expectations that this roster may not be equipped to meet. The receiver group is genuinely impressive, with Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4), Drake London (WR7), Zay Flowers (WR16), and Garrett Wilson (WR17) forming a legitimate top tier, but in a positionless format, the rest of the lineup has to pull weight too, and that's where the cracks show. The quarterback situation is thin enough to be a real drag, with Tyler Shough (QB20) leading the room and Kirk Cousins (QB35) behind him, and neither projects as a weekly difference-maker. Kyle Pitts (TE7) provides a credible anchor at tight end, but the projected floor sits at 33rd percentile, placing alyssah209 ninth in the Crash Bandicoot division, a long fall from where this manager was just a year ago. Reputation built on one strong season is a fine thing to carry into a draft, but it doesn't score points, and this roster, for all its receiver depth, looks more like a team living off last year's highlight reel than one positioned to repeat it.

nytman enters 2026 sitting eighth in the Crash Bandicoot division and at just the 35th percentile of the field, and the roster gives little reason to expect a dramatic reversal. The tight end group is legitimately strong, with Colston Loveland (TE3), Tucker Kraft (TE5), and Harold Fannin (TE6) all projecting as starters, but nytman paid a premium to get there, reaching on all three and burning a major reach on Chigoziem Okonkwo (TE19) two and a half rounds early to build what amounts to their best asset. The problem is that the rest of the roster has to carry its weight too, and it mostly cannot. Jaxon Smith-Njigba (WR3) is a genuine star, but the drop-off after him is steep and long. Justin Herbert (QB8) is the quarterback anchor, though with Mike McDaniel now running the offense in a run-heavy system built around winning games, Herbert's ceiling stays frustratingly capped. Coming off a 59th-percentile scoring season, nytman needed to find new edges in the draft and largely did not, ending up with one steal against four reaches. The levers have been pulled.

masonspain finished 75th percentile in scoring last year and is now sitting 7th in the Crash Bandicoot division with a 37th percentile projection, which tells you most of what you need to know about where this roster is trending. The foundational problem is not mysterious: four major reaches in the draft, all of them at receiver, produced a receiver room headlined by Rashid Shaheed at WR57 as the projected second starter. That is not depth, that is expensive mediocrity. Saquon Barkley at RB8 and Trey McBride at TE2 give masonspain genuine star power, but Barkley is 29, coming off a down year, and there are real questions about whether Philadelphia will protect him from the workloads that made him a fantasy force in the first place, which puts the ceiling on even that asset. Joe Burrow at QB4 keeps the lights on, but star quarterbacks do not compensate for projections stacked with late-round receivers taken far too early. There is no obvious move that fixes this quietly.

CooterDoodle is the kind of team that wins eight games and either squeaks into the playoffs or watches the bubble burst on a bad week, and nothing about the roster argues otherwise. Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Kenneth Walker III at RB10 give this squad a genuine top-end backfield that can carry a week, and Chris Olave sliding in at WR11 after falling nearly a full round past his ADP is the sort of quiet win that separates competent drafting from lucky drafting. That is roughly where the good news plateaus. Jayden Daniels projects as a QB5, which is real value, but the manager reached a minor 0.4 rounds to get him, and the tail of this roster gets thin in a hurry, with Jaylen Warren projecting as the weakest projected starter at RB27. The two major reaches on Tory Horton and Elic Ayomanor, taken nearly three rounds early apiece, suggest the back end of the draft chased upside that the projections have not rewarded. Sitting 40th percentile and sixth in the Crash Bandicoot division, CooterDoodle does not lose the season in any one spot, but the margins are unforgiving, and this roster has exactly enough rope to either climb or hang itself.

RotoSurgeon finished 2026 at 56 percent wins and the 43rd percentile, which is basically the fantasy equivalent of a firm handshake, competent but not memorable. The floor here is legitimate: Ashton Jeanty at RB7 and Brock Bowers at TE1 are the kind of weekly anchors that keep a team afloat when everything else goes sideways, and Tee Higgins at WR19 and Emeka Egbuka at WR18 round out a credible core. The margins, though, get decided further down the roster. Brian Thomas Jr. projects as a WR31 starter, but two injury-interrupted seasons and a murky connection with Trevor Lawrence make him a shakier building block than his ranking suggests. The draft chart tells a similar story: 15 chalk picks, two major reaches in Keon Coleman and Elijah Sarratt, and exactly one genuine value in Rachaad White. Nothing disqualifying, nothing that separates RotoSurgeon from the field in the

Crash Bandicoot division either. Fifth place is the projection, and fifth place is what mediocre margins tend to produce.

ep5105 enters 2026 looking like a team that knew exactly what it was doing, even when the draft board suggested otherwise. The headliner is Ja'Marr Chase at WR2, a genuinely elite anchor that gives this roster a ceiling most managers in the Crash Bandicoot division would trade for, and the Williams/Burden stack layered on top adds a secondary motor that could quietly do real damage. But the draft story is where things get complicated. Two major reaches, Germie Bernard at WR79 and Keenan Allen at WR99, were pulled nearly four and six rounds ahead of consensus, respectively, the kind of moves that draw raised eyebrows in draft recaps. And yet the finished product landed in the 66th percentile of the field, which reads less like a cautionary tale and more like evidence that ep5105 had a plan. Whether Bernard and Allen develop into contributors or quietly fade into irrelevance will help answer whether this was conviction or simply fortune. Coming off a 99th percentile scoring season in 2025, the track record at least suggests the benefit of the doubt is earned.

cesar6ruiz landed in the 69th percentile of the field and sits third in the Crash Bandicoot division, and the draft board tells you exactly why: three steals, two values, and just one major reach across the entire roster. The foundation is immaculate, with Jonathan Taylor projected as RB4, CeeDee Lamb as WR5, and Breece Hall as RB14 all slotted as projected starters. But the real craftsmanship shows in the middle and late rounds, where Malik Willis fell nearly three full rounds past his ADP to be snagged at 13.12, and Isaiah Likely slid a round past his number before being grabbed at 10.01. Those are not accidents, those are a manager who knew the board and stayed patient. The Justin Fields reach at pick 16.01 is the one wrinkle worth noting, but Fields as a late-round flier barely dents an otherwise disciplined sheet. TreVeyon Henderson as a projected starter at RB19 quietly might be this roster's most underrated asset. Clean draft, real upside, and very little to argue with.

Jorodigi landed in the 89th percentile of the field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The foundation is Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and A.J. Brown at WR8, two projected starters who give this roster a genuine ceiling, but what separates a good draft from a clean one is the discipline shown on the way down. Six values across the board, zero reaches, not a single round where the manager got impatient and overpaid. James Cook fell half a round to pick 2.10 and became RB5 on this roster. Tyrone Tracy slipped more than two full rounds before jorodigi grabbed him at 16.10. That is not luck, that is someone who did the homework and trusted it. The projected weak link is Jadarian Price at RB26, which in a positionless format is less a flaw and more a footnote. A 67 percent win rate and 81st percentile scoring in 2025 tell you this manager knows how to convert a good roster into actual results. The Crash Bandicoot division is already on notice.

Bernli didn't win the draft with one flashy move. They won it by being right, over and over again. Lamar Jackson at QB3 slipped to 2.07 while the room looked elsewhere, and Bernli was there. Chase Brown fell nearly two full rounds past his ADP and landed in Bernli's lap at 5.06. Bucky Irving followed a round later, same story. That's not luck shopping, that's a manager who knew what things were worth and waited. The anchor underneath all of it is the Lamar Jackson and Mark Andrews stack, a connection that has hurt people in this tournament before and could do it again. Josh Allen at QB1 sits behind Jackson as insurance that most rosters can't match. Malik Nabers projects at WR12, Nico Collins at WR9, and Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33 gives this team a third option who, health permitting, carries upside the projections may be underselling after a difficult two seasons. Bernli sits first in the Crash Bandicoot division and in the tournament's 90th percentile. The draft earned both of those.
