Chad Simpson sits dead last in the CrazyTaxi division, and the draft log explains exactly why. The story is not that Simpson went running back heavy early, it is that he paid a surcharge on every meaningful decision he made. Ashton Jeanty at RB7 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 are legitimate starters, but Simpson reached nearly a full round early on each of them, which means he was essentially drafting from a hole before the fourth round began. Then, as if determined to prove a point, he spent three separate picks on quarterbacks, all major reaches, and walked away with Bryce Young at QB26, Geno Smith at QB30, and Kirk Cousins at QB35. Three reaches, zero of them projected to start. The zero-steal, six-major-reach draft profile is not bad luck, it is a philosophy, and that philosophy cost Simpson real draft capital that never came back. Zay Flowers and Garrett Wilson keep this roster from being a complete write-off, but the ceiling is firmly capped by the price Simpson paid to get here.

There is no way to put a flattering spin on what happened in Nikky Hill's draft room, and at this point in the analysis, trying feels like a waste of everyone's time. The headline damage is the Bo Nix situation: Hill took a QB15 in the third round, reaching over three full rounds ahead of his ADP, in a positionless format where late-round quarterbacks routinely start alongside elite skill players. That pick did not just cost Hill Nix, it cost Hill whatever better player was sitting there at 3.02. Then came Cam Skattebo, a reach of over two rounds, and Zach Charbonnet, reached over five rounds early and projecting as RB42, a player who projects as a fringe contributor. The receiver group is thin at the top, with Wan'Dale Robinson projecting as WR47 in a Tennessee offense now adding a rookie wideout to compete for his targets, making even that ceiling feel optimistic. Hill finished 13th percentile in scoring last season and currently sits 11th in the CrazyTaxi division. The draft was a chance at a reset. This was not a reset.

Justin Christopher drafted like a man with a system, and the cruelest thing you can say is that the system mostly worked. Five values across the roster, zero steals, and the discipline to let the board come to him produced a team that ranks 10th in the CrazyTaxi division and sits at the 32nd percentile. That is the draft equivalent of executing a recipe perfectly and still producing a mediocre meal. The foundation is legitimate: Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 are the kind of anchors that make a roster survivable. George Pickens at WR10 came at a reasonable discount. But then there is Jared Goff, taken two full rounds ahead of his QB16 projection, and Tony Pollard, dragged nearly three rounds early to land as the weakest projected starter on the board at RB30. Those two reaches did not blow up the roster, they just quietly deflated it, converting real draft capital into the sort of middling production that keeps a team out of contention without ever giving the manager a clean reason why.

4T9ERS4EVER played the value game correctly and has almost nothing to show for it. The draft efficiency numbers look respectable: Jalen McMillan fell nearly four rounds to pick 17.10, Mike Evans slid a full round to round seven, Xavier Worthy and Jalen Nailor both came late enough to feel like gifts. But value only converts to wins when the underlying players are good enough to matter, and that is where this roster quietly comes apart. Brock Bowers at TE1 and Colston Loveland at TE3 are legitimately elite, and the Brock Purdy and Evans stack adds a correlation bonus. The problem is that everything above the TE group tops out in the middle of its tier, and the projections reflect it: a 38th-percentile tournament ranking and ninth in the CrazyTaxi division. Getting Cam Ward two rounds early at QB23 is the kind of move that ages badly, and when your weakest projected starter is Jalen Coker at WR55, you have assembled a bargain-hunting masterpiece that somehow underperforms its receipts.

Akim Smiley arrives in the CrazyTaxi division sitting eighth and projecting at just the 42nd percentile, and the roster tells you exactly why. The strength is real but concentrated: Puka Nacua at WR1, Tyler Warren at TE4, Tucker Kraft at TE5, and a stack pairing Jordan Love with Kraft give this team genuine upside at the top. The problem is that once you get past those names, the floor drops fast. Love grades out at QB17 and Baker Mayfield at QB18, meaning the quarterback room projects as a liability no matter who starts. The backfield is thinner still, with Nicholas Singleton at RB57 and Jaydon Blue at RB70, and Blue himself was a major reach taken nearly six rounds ahead of his ADP, so Smiley overpaid for a player who projects near the bottom of the position. Last season's 32nd percentile finish in scoring was a warning, and this roster does not look like it has answered it. The stars are shining, but the foundation underneath them is quietly crumbling.

Addison Dovie sits at 44th percentile in the field and 7th in the CrazyTaxi division, which is the kind of placement that forces a team to win on execution rather than talent gap. The backfield is legitimately strong, with De'Von Achane (RB6), Kenneth Walker III (RB10), Derrick Henry (RB12), and Travis Etienne (RB18) all projecting as starters, and Henry arriving as good value after falling 1.2 rounds past his ADP. That foundation is real. The problem is that the draft decisions around the edges quietly chip away at the ceiling. Etienne was taken nearly two full rounds early, and C.J. Stroud (QB22) cost a pick at 7.03 that his projection at QB22 does not justify as an early expenditure. Courtland Sutton (WR37) arrived as the one clear windfall, falling two full rounds to the 10th pick of round 10, but he is projecting as the WR37, which means the margin for error at the top of the lineup is thin. Dovie is not losing this season on paper. The question is whether the math at the margins ever breaks the right way.

Mike Alrick's 2026 season lives and dies in the margins, which is exactly the kind of sentence that sounds ominous until you realize the margins are actually pretty interesting. The foundation is legitimate: James Cook at RB5 was a touch of good value at 2.09, and pairing him with Jeremiyah Love at RB13 and Josh Jacobs at RB16 gives Alrick genuine top-end production to build around. The drama, though, is at the edges. Drake Maye cost Alrick nearly a full round of draft capital before his ADP, a reach that only pays off if Maye takes the next step from QB2 to something approaching a weekly difference-maker. Meanwhile, Quentin Johnston sits as the projected weakest starter at WR41, a number that doesn't wreck anyone's season but quietly bleeds points in weeks where everything else is merely fine. Alrick sits 6th in the CrazyTaxi division and at the 52nd percentile, which is the fantasy equivalent of being exactly, stubbornly average. The margins will find him either way.

Jeffrey MacDonald's 2026 roster in the CrazyTaxi division isn't built around one flashy centerpiece, it's built around a draft that kept winning small battles. The tight end group headlined by Trey McBride (TE2), Kyle Pitts (TE7), and George Kittle (TE9) is the kind of positional advantage that compounds quietly over a long season, and all three project as starters. At receiver, Drake London (WR7) and Malik Nabers (WR12) anchor a group that gives MacDonald real flexibility at the top of his lineup. The draft itself was overwhelmingly disciplined, fifteen picks landing right at chalk with a Michael Mayer reach late in round seventeen as the only notable overpay, a cost that's easy to absorb when the rest of the board went exactly as planned. Add a Justin Herbert (QB8) and Patrick Mahomes (QB12) quarterback pairing and this roster lands in the 75th percentile of the field for good reason. MacDonald didn't swing for the fences. He just didn't miss.

After finishing in the bottom 19 percent of the field last year, Adam Levitan has rebuilt this roster into something that looks genuinely dangerous, and the difference is written all over his top-end talent. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Justin Jefferson at WR6 give this team a foundation that most managers in the CrazyTaxi division can only envy, and Nico Collins at WR9 and Ladd McConkey at WR20 were both acquired a full round past their ADPs, meaning Levitan got elite production at a discount while other managers were still figuring out the board. The result is a squad projecting at the 86th percentile in the tournament, a swing of nearly 70 percentile points from that painful 2025 campaign. Harold Fannin at TE6 rounds out a starting core that has almost no obvious soft spots. Levitan drafted mostly chalk, which is the right call when your early picks are this good, and the values he sprinkled in late only make the floor higher. This looks less like a rebuild and more like a correction.

Michael Hoffman enters 2026 sitting third in the CrazyTix division and in the top 10 percent of the field, and the draft record explains exactly why. Eight values, nine chalk, one minor reach, zero major reaches: this is a manager who understood where the market was and let it come to him. The centerpiece is the Joe Burrow and Ja'Marr Chase stack, a QB4 feeding a WR2 on the same offense, and Hoffman landed Chase at 1.06 when the average draft position was 1.02, essentially getting the best receiver in the field for free. Jaylen Waddle came along a round and a half later than consensus said he would, Stefon Diggs fell nearly three rounds past his ADP, and Oronde Gadsden and Chigoziem Okonkwo at tight end were both taken well after the market cleared them. The weakest projected starter is Jayden Reed at WR48, which on most rosters would be a minor nuisance and here barely registers. Hoffman drafted like someone who did the homework twice, and the roster looks exactly like that.

Tim Pease sits second in the CrazyTaxi division and in the 95th percentile of the field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The foundation is a receiver room built around Jaxon Smith-Njigba (WR3) and CeeDee Lamb (WR5), with Lamb arriving as genuine value, taken half a round after his ADP with a Dak Prescott stack already in place. That pairing is not a coincidence, it is architecture. Prescott connects to both Lamb and Jake Ferguson, and Ferguson himself was the draft's cleanest steal, sliding two full rounds past his ADP to land at 10.05. The discipline holds throughout: five additional values scattered across the roster, only one minor reach, and zero major reaches. The one soft spot worth watching is Michael Pittman (WR44), who heads to Pittsburgh to catch passes from Aaron Rodgers at age 43 on an offense still searching for its identity. Pittman projects as the weakest starter on this roster, which is less a concern than it is a testament to how well the rest of this thing was built.

Aaron Sandquist didn't need one transcendent pick to build the best roster in the CrazyTaxi division, sitting at the 98th percentile of the entire field. He just needed to keep winning small battles, and he did, repeatedly. Lamar Jackson at QB3 slid to pick 2.08 while his ADP sat at 2.03, a modest gap that compounds when you notice the same discipline showed up all draft long. D.J. Moore fell a full two rounds to 8.08, landing as a projected starter alongside a receiving corps that also includes A.J. Brown at WR8, Chris Olave at WR11, Jameson Williams at WR21, and Davante Adams at WR25. Carnell Tate, building a connection with Cam Ward in Tennessee, adds WR29 upside with a ceiling that could make him look like a steal in hindsight. The Jackson and Mark Andrews stack at TE14 gives Sandquist a structural edge on scoring nights when that pairing catches fire together. Four good values, one major value, and twelve chalk picks: not flashy, just correct.
